# **Brookings Montgomery Papers**

Brookings Montgomery was a local photographer who maintained a business in Kansas City for many years during the 20th century. His collection of photographs purchased by the library provided the major beginnings for the photograph holdings of Missouri Valley Special Collections.

# **Collection Description**

# Biographical/Historical note

Brookings Montgomery was a local photographer who died in 1963 at the age of 79. He was a photographer in Kansas City for 50 years and owned and operated Montgomery Foto Service located at 1519 Wyandotte, Kansas City, Missouri. He was born in Carthage, Missouri, and attended the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. He is buried in Pleasant View Cemetery in Shawnee, Kansas. Many of the photographs he acquired that are connected with the correspondence in this collection may be found in P2, Montgomery's Wild West Photograph Collection.

#### Scope and content note

The Brookings Montgomery Photograph Collection that was acquired by the Kansas City Public Library in the late 1960s contained his current office files. These files were found arranged alphabetically by the name of the person or group who were the senders. The arrangement has been left as it was found. Most of the correspondence is from 1940-1962. There are some older photostats of correspondence from an earlier period, most of it not Montgomery's directly. Although most of the contents consists of correspondence, there are some photocopies of newspaper clippings, brochures, etc.

The majority of the correspondence deals with the following subjects: circus, rodeo, Wild West lore, and cowboys. Montgomery was affiliated with the *Circus Monthly Magazine* and was actively collecting pictures on that subject. He also was interested in western figures and folklore and wrote many older western figures from stage and screen trying to acquire photos to build up this part of his collection. Some of the correspondence deals with his involvement in the

Cowboy Hall of Fame. He was also interested in local folklore characters as Jesse James, the Younger brothers, etc. There is correspondence with ancestors of Jesse James including many letters from Stella James, wife of Jesse James II.
