Collection Description

Biographical/Historical note

Alfred Gregory (1858-1946) was a local attorney and a member of the Kansas City Bar Association. He was born August 15, 1858, in Ann Arbor, Michigan. His father, John M. Gregory, was the first president of the University of Illinois. After graduating in 1878 from the University of Illinois at Champaign with an engineering degree, he secured an appointment as private secretary to the commissioners sent by the state of Illinois to the World's Fair at Paris, France. Mr. Gregory later earned a law degree from Columbia University.

He moved from Atlanta, Georgia, to Kansas City in 1889 to practice law with Henry Beardsley. Josephine Karnes, daughter of J.V.C. Karnes, became his wife in 1892. He loved to travel and made six or more trips to Europe during his lifetime. His name appears in the record books of the Kansas City Bar Association (SC101) held in Special Collections. According to his obituary found in the *Kansas City Bar Bulletin*, April, 1947, he was a lover of music and art and a regular attendant at the Philharmonic Orchestra concerts. Alfred Gregory died May 15, 1946, in Kansas City. He was survived by two sons, J.V. Gregory and John M. Gregory.

Scope and content note

This collection contains six separate scrapbooks that are arranged chronologically. They cover fifty-two years and are arranged as follows: #1, 1875-1894; #2, 1895-1903; #3, 1903-1911; #4, 1911-1916; #5, 1916-1923; #6, 1923-1927. Although there was no definite provenance determined, it is believed

because of the nature of some of the contents of the scrapbooks, that they were assembled and kept up by Alfred Gregory.

The outsides of the scrapbooks were labeled by date. The pages of all six of the scrapbooks have been numbered and photocopied, including the entire contents of programs and items found on each page. When various items on the pages could be excised, this has been done and the items placed with the photocopies. When these items could not be separated from the pages, they have been retained and included with the collection. This applies primarily to programs and not to newspaper clippings or thin playbills.

Contained on the scrapbook pages are theater playbills, notices and programs, banquet menus for club and association events, newspaper clippings, cards, invitations, and various ephemeral items. Items included not only pertain to Kansas City but to other American cities as well as international locales.

An index was prepared for each separate scrapbook during processing. The theater/performance location, theater group, club name, event happening, and additional miscellaneous items have been indexed. Plays, performers, producers, etc., have not been indexed. Locations outside Kansas City have been noted at the beginning of the indexing for each scrapbook.

The scrapbooks do include a number of dinner menus for various clubs and events. The Knife and Fork Club meeting menus are numerous in this collection. Programs include orchestral, theater, and various types of musical performances including opera. There are a few non-arts or club related events included as dedication ceremonies and political functions.
