#### **Collection Description**

#### Scope and content note

This collection was originally titled *Santa Fe Trail, Kansas City History and Missouri History: Clippings and Manuscripts, 1906-11.* The compiler has been identified as Robert Earl Dawson. Included within the 14 folders are 187 numbered legal size pages of material consisting of newspaper clippings which were photocopied during processing, typewritten excerpts from books, an outline, a handwritten account of the Santa Fe Trail by W. S. Bonham, a speech, recollections, etc. A typewritten version of the Bonham Santa Fe Trail account is located in SC7, Missouri Valley Historical Society Records, Series II, Manuscripts, Folder 5.

The material has been divided between Kansas City history contained in three folders with 57 pages and Missouri history contained in 11 folders with 129 pages. The Missouri history part contains material relating to the Santa Fe Trail. During processing this material was found to be somewhat out of number order. It was rearranged during processing and placed in the proper order.
