Collection Description

Biographical/Historical note

Dr. James W. Parker was called John as well as James and was born in Fayette County, Kentucky, about 1822. After attending Transylvania University and after living in Kentucky, Texas, and California, he settled in Westport, Missouri, in 1851 where he practiced medicine among the white settlers and among the Shawnee, Wyandotte, and Delaware Indians.

During the Civil War he moved with his family to Nebraska City, Nebraska, returning to Westport sometime after1882. He died March 2, 1907, at the age of 85 and is buried in Union Cemetery, Kansas City, Missouri. He and other men in Westport tried to promote a wind wagon as a means of crossing the prairies. However this venture was never successful.

Scope and content note

This collection contains five account books and one item of correspondence. Most of the account books contain medical records, such as names of patients, daily medical activities, treatments and charges, and cover the years Dr. Parker lived in Westport, Missouri. Several people who were prominent in Kansas City history are mentioned such as Jim Bridger, A.G. Boone, John Harris, Seth Hays, Thomas Johnson, John C. McCoy, Jacob Ragan, John B. Wornall, and many others.

One account book appears to contain information on wagon train accounts while Dr. Parker was in Nebraska City. Also included is a letter dated September 19, 1853, from Jotham Meeker to Parker. These account books are available on microfilm in the department (yellow dot drawer).
