# **Westminster Congregational Church Records**

The Westminster Congregational Church Records collection contains a variety of records pertaining to the life of the church while it was located at 36th and Walnut in Kansas City, Missouri.

## **Collection Description**

## Biographical/Historical note

For many years, the Westminster Congregational Church had a distinctive physical structure and a vibrant, growing membership in the Midtown, Hyde Park area of Kansas City, Missouri. Although the church initially was associated with the Presbyterian denomination, it was a Congregational affiliate for most of its 20th century history. Among its early members were several well known individuals in Kansas City as can be seen by the listing below of obituaries in the various scrapbooks. These members included realtor Herbert V. Jones, former mayor Henry Beardsley, Judge Henry L. McCune, Frank and Harriet Burnap, Jane Gordon, banker Watt Webb, and many more.

In time the city's population moved farther south and in different directions from what was at one time the heart of the city. As this happened, the church, as well as other churches, were left with a declining membership and trying to support earlier built, large buildings and facilities. With continual declining membership and denominational turmoil and consolidation, what was once an early religious presence in the city was forced to close its doors.

On January 17, 1901, Westminster Presbyterian Church at 10th and Central officially became Westminster Congregational Church, affiliated with the Kansas City Congregational Union. The church contracted the New Orleans architectural firm of Diboll & Owen in cooperation with the local firm of Bracklein and Martling to design a sanctuary patterned after the Prytania Street Presbyterian Church in New Orleans, Louisiana. The new building's corner stone was laid on May 22, 1904. The formal dedication took place three years later in January of 1907. This church is located at 36th and Walnut, Kansas City, Missouri, part of the original Hyde Park subdivision.

In 1913 plans were submitted for additional space which included the Fellowship Hall, Sunday School class rooms, the Mayflower Room, the kitchen and church offices. The church membership in 1913 numbered 504. The bronze tubular chimes of the church were a gift from Mr. and Mrs. Jacob L. Loose in 1922. The church was put on the National Register of Historic Places in 1980. (See Vertical File: Churches--Congregational--Westminster for National Register of Historic Places Inventory/Nomination Form) Dr. G. Charles Gray served the longest as pastor and Mrs. James H. Cravens was organist and choir director from 1895-1946. At one time the Kansas City Korean Christian Church used the building as well as Genesis, a school for high school dropouts. The church closed in 1995. - Historical information gathered primarily from the pamphlet "Celebrating Seventy-Five Years at 36th and Walnut Welcomes You" found in unboxed scrapbook, p. 15.

## Scope and content note

The collection contains seven scrapbooks, two church registers, and three envelopes of miscellaneous material. The scrapbooks contain newspaper clippings, brochures, church programs, and other miscellaneous materials dating primarily from the 1930s-1990s. The church registers include lists of members, pastors, deaths, trustees, baptisms, deacons, elders, etc., and are dated from ca1900-1990. Also included in the collection are church bulletins, printed sermons, articles of incorporation, annual reports, pamphlets, magazine articles, building fund material (1911), etc. Over 140 photographs are included, both color snapshots and black and white, in varying sizes covering many years and mostly identified. These images include the church facilities as well as members and church group activities.
