#### **Biographical Sketch**

Harry Harris was born in Moberly, Missouri on April 17, 1878 to Joseph H. and Florence E. Harris and showed an early interest in birds. Harris studied at the University of Michigan and Washington University in St. Louis, and worked as a commercial artist from 1897 until 1902. From 1902 until 1921, Harris served as a cashier in the Kansas City Post Office of which his father was Postmaster. Harris then moved to southern California where he served as the curator of the library of vertebrate zoology for the California Institute of Technology. Harris published his first of several ornithological works in 1919 and was actively involved in several birding societies such as the Cooper Ornithological Society. Harris died at Eagle Rock in Los Angeles, California on June 11, 1954.

## Scope and Content Note

This collection consists of material related to Harry Harris' study of birds in the Kansas City area, including a lithograph print of an Harris' finch, article reprints, correspondence, and a photograph of an Harris' sparrow. The collection is arranged in its original order, largely by type of bird to which the materials' content relates, and covers the period from 1919 to 1942.
