Biographical Sketch

Ruth Standish Cady Austin was born in Ohio on May 24, 1886 to Ella Maria Falkenbury Cady, two months after the death of father Elijah Perkins Cady. After her mother remarried, Austin's family lived in Lawrence and Council Grove, Kansas, and Kansas City, Missouri. Austin, a talented coloratura soprano, attended and worked in a Boston conservatory before returning to live with her widowed mother in Kansas City. Austin ran a voice and piano school in the "Studio Building" at 9th and Locust and planned music programs for the First Christian Church at 11th and Locust during the 1910s.

For more than three decades, Austin was prominent in the local music scene as a performer, teacher, and active member of local music organizations, such as the Choral Art Club and the Kansas City Music Club. In 1922 Austin married another local music enthusiast, dentist Allen C. Austin, and gave birth to daughter Elizabeth two years later. Austin died November 15, 1987 aged 101 years.
