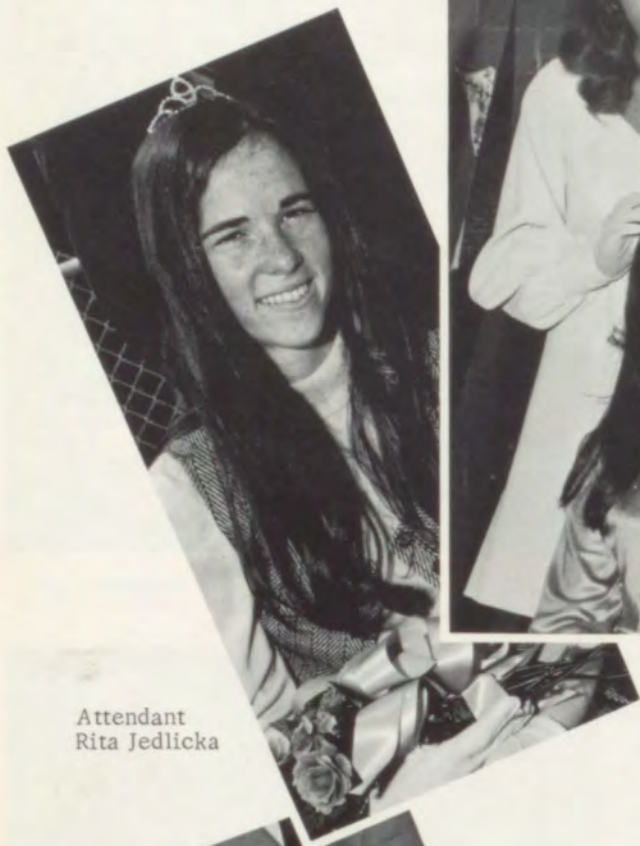

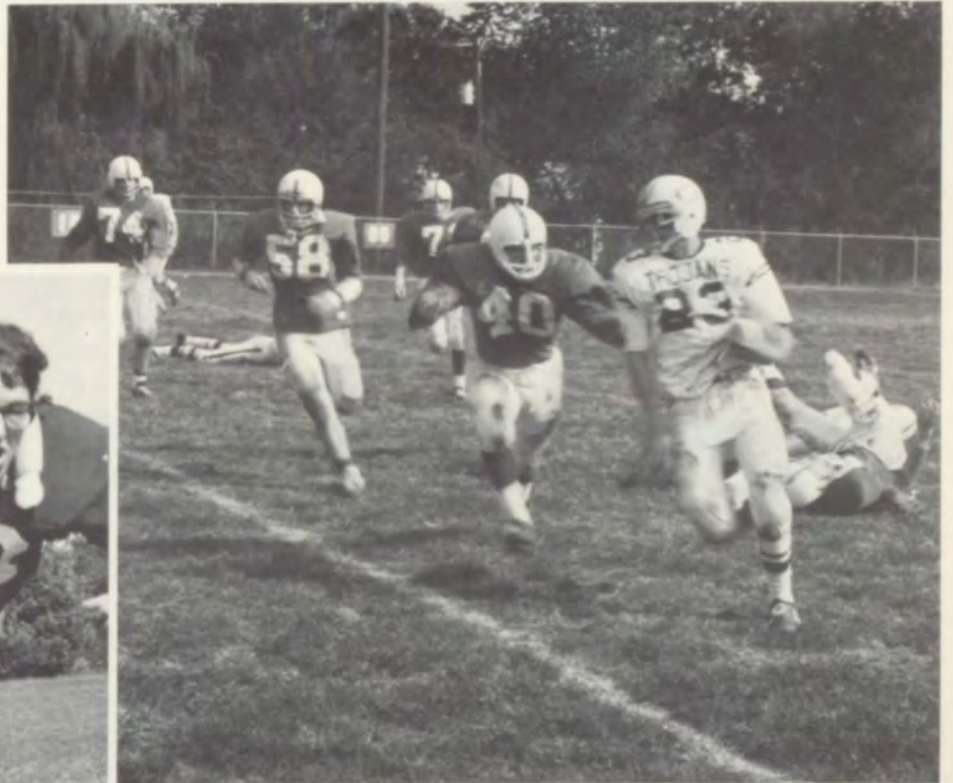

Hogan's '70-'71 basketball team finished the season with 20 wins and 3 losses—the best record in the history of the school. The Rams won three first place trophies in: the Catholic League, for the seventh consecutive year, the Blue Springs Tournament for the seventh successive year, and the Catholic League Tournament for the fifth time in the last eight years.

On January 23rd the Rams beat Westport 87-35, giving Coach Fortin the 200th victory of his career.

For the second year, All-Stater Chris Stockard, senior, who scored 468 points, led the team with a 20.4 game average. Other leading score men were seniors Tim O' Donnell (271 points) and Rick Alvarez (225 points). Two juniors, Jamie Houston and Randy Clarke scored 212 and 136 respectively. Seniors Dan Whited (47 points) and Bob McBurney (39 points) were top substitutes.

A tremendous team effort accomplished the record set by this year's team: it deserves to be called "The Best".

Seven returning junior lettermen, together with the B-team sophomores, whose record was 10 wins, 5 losses, and some promising freshmen, with a 10 win, 5 loss season, make Hogan's future in basketball continue to look bright.
