The Catholic League Crown eluded the grasp of the Irish this year as they lost two games to Rockhurst and one to Hogan. The

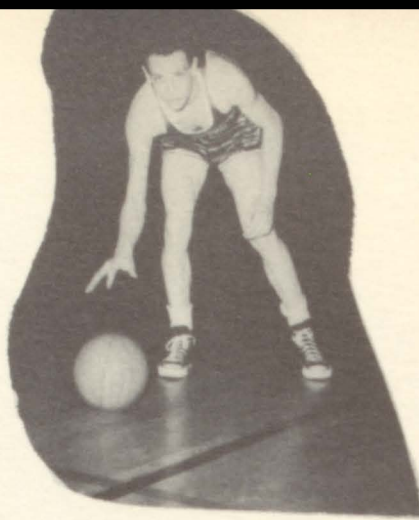




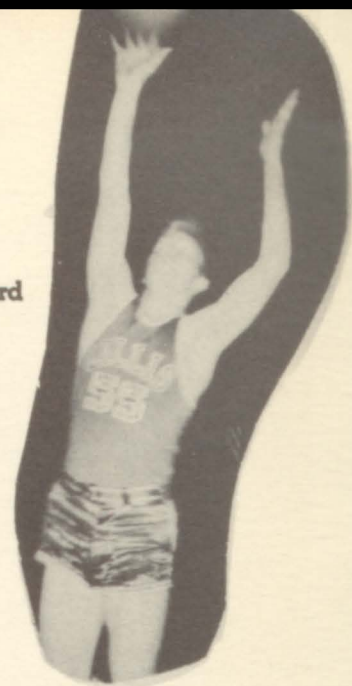
