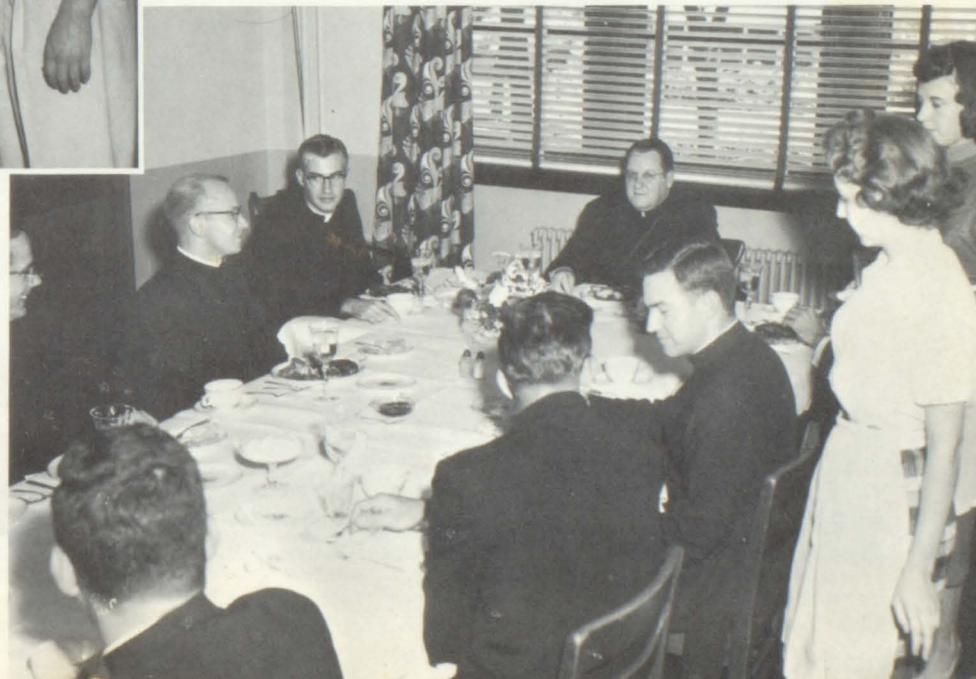

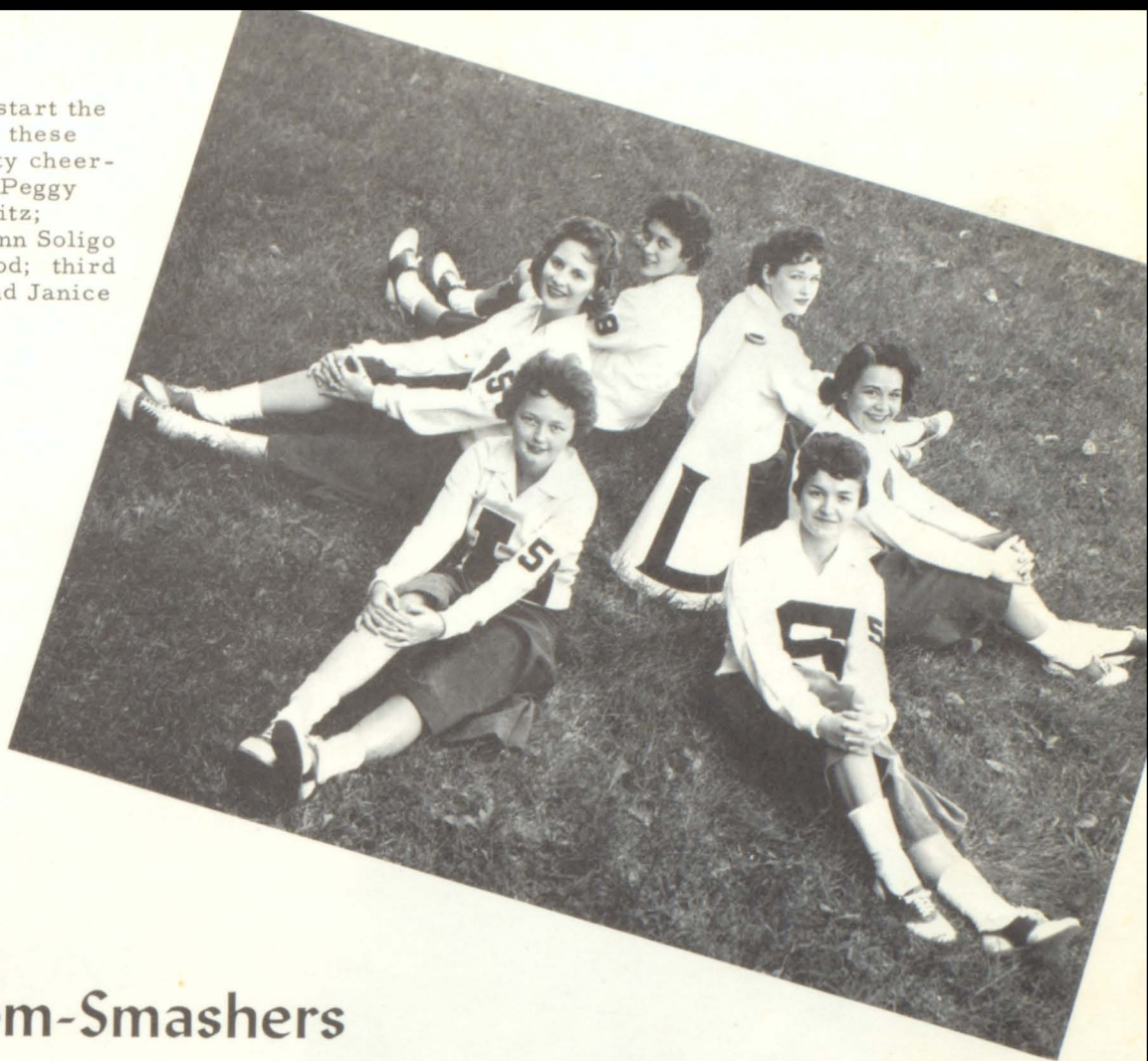
Student Council

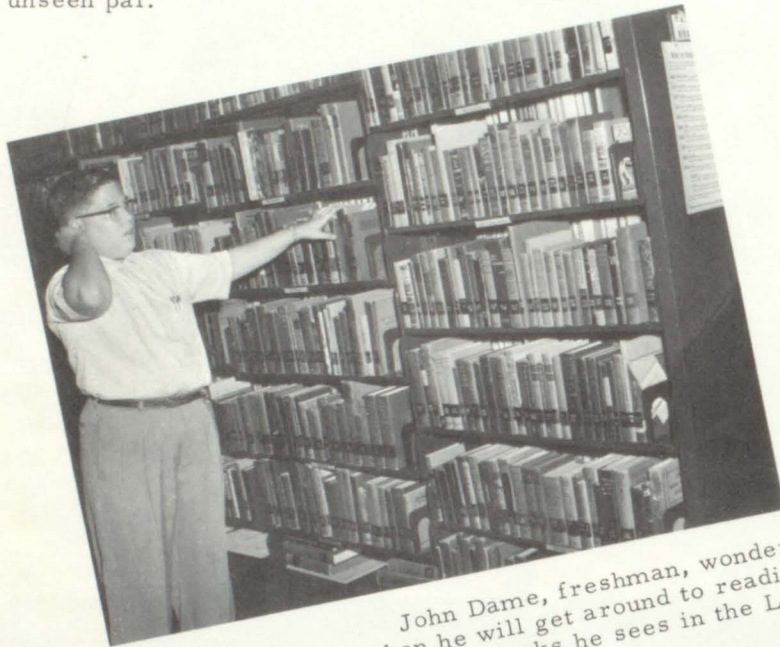
Atom-Smashers

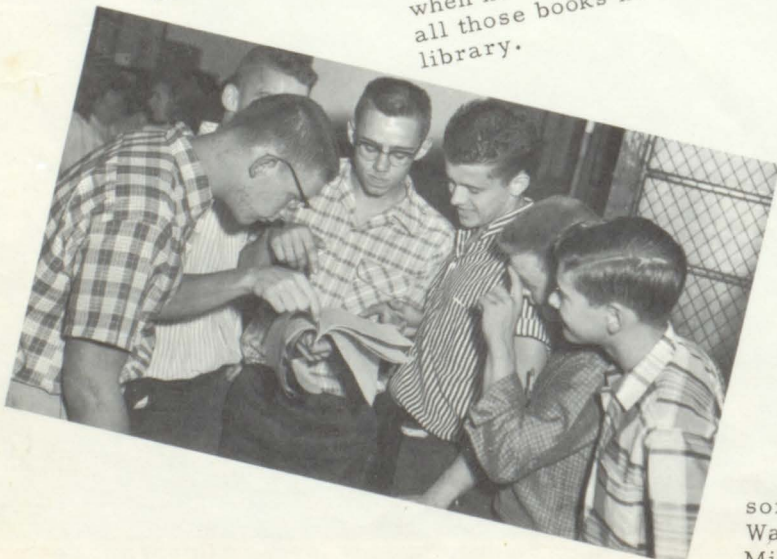

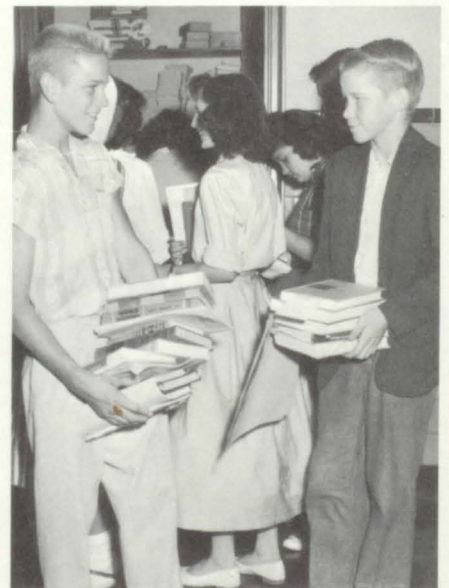

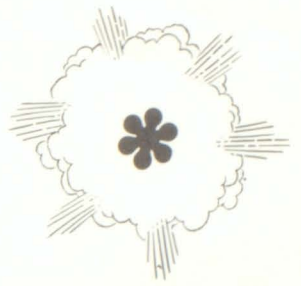

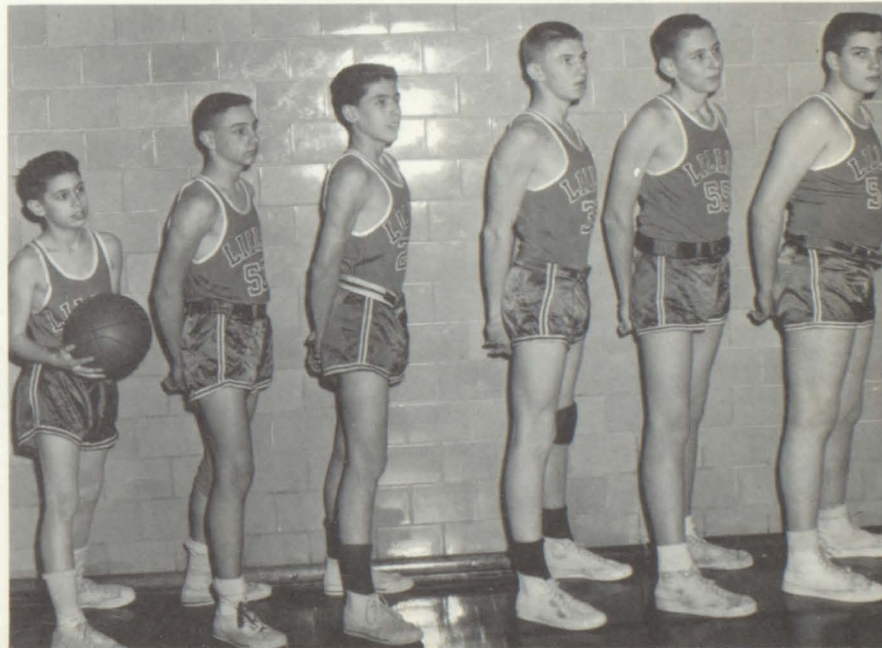

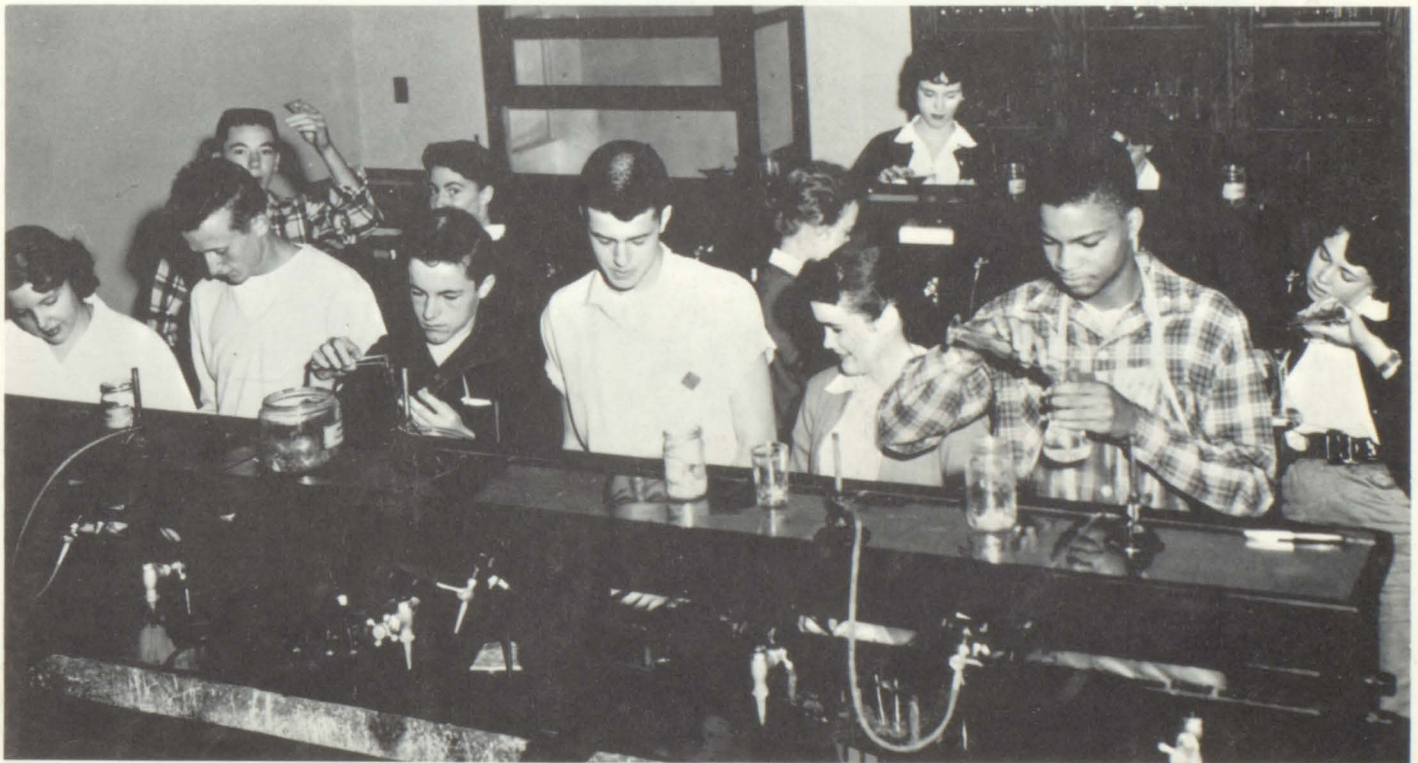

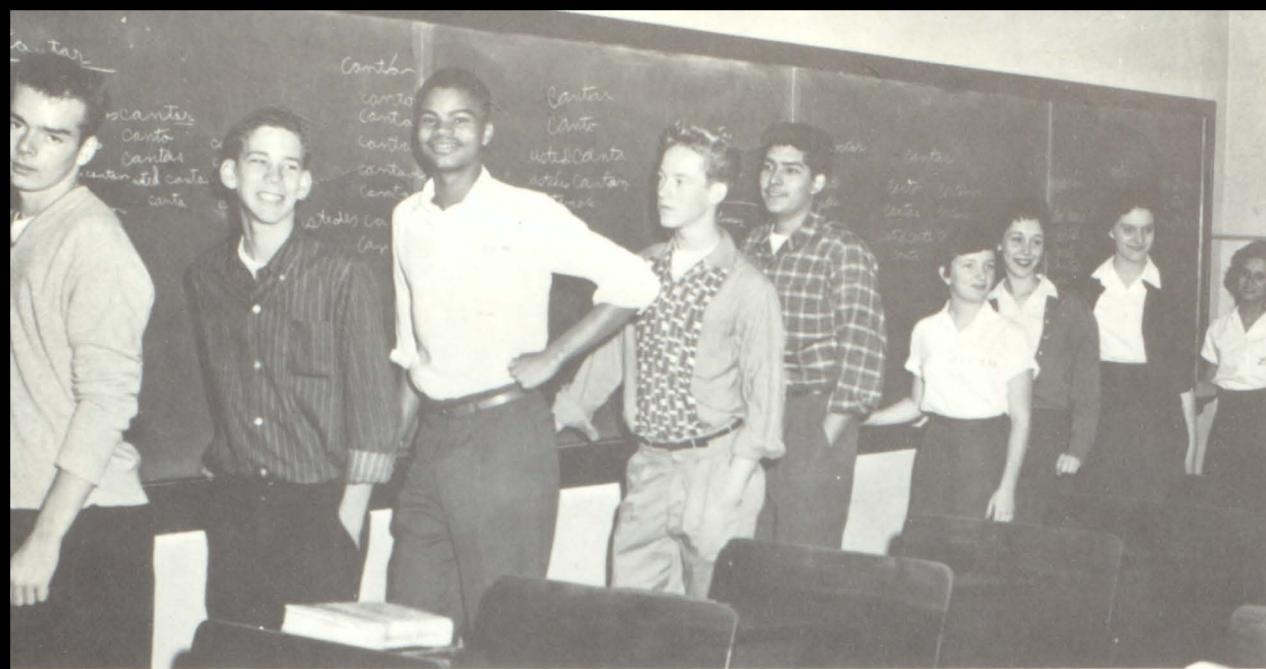

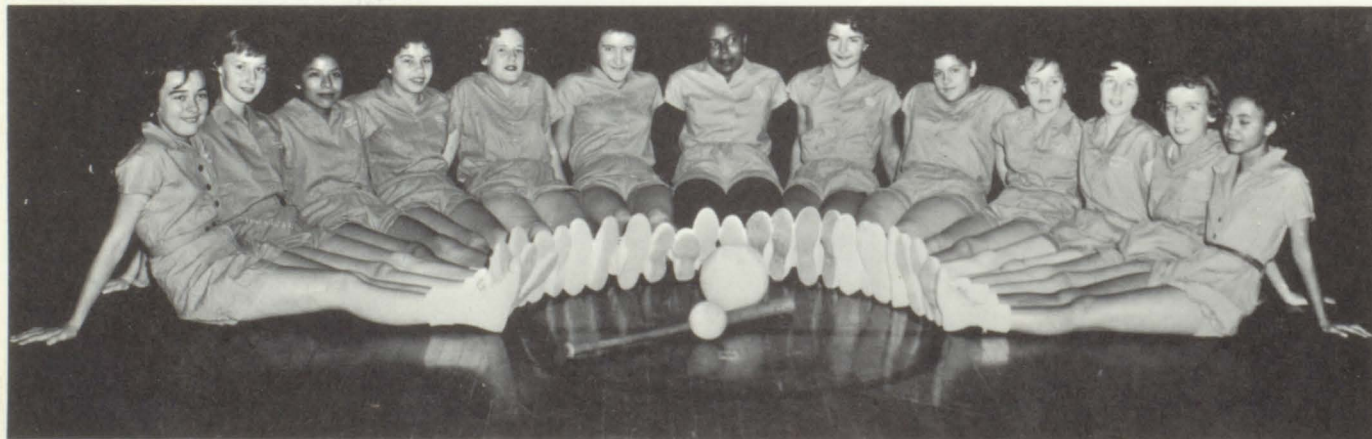

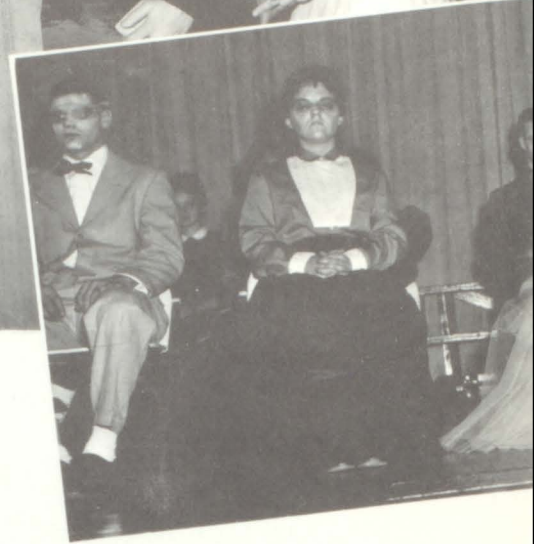

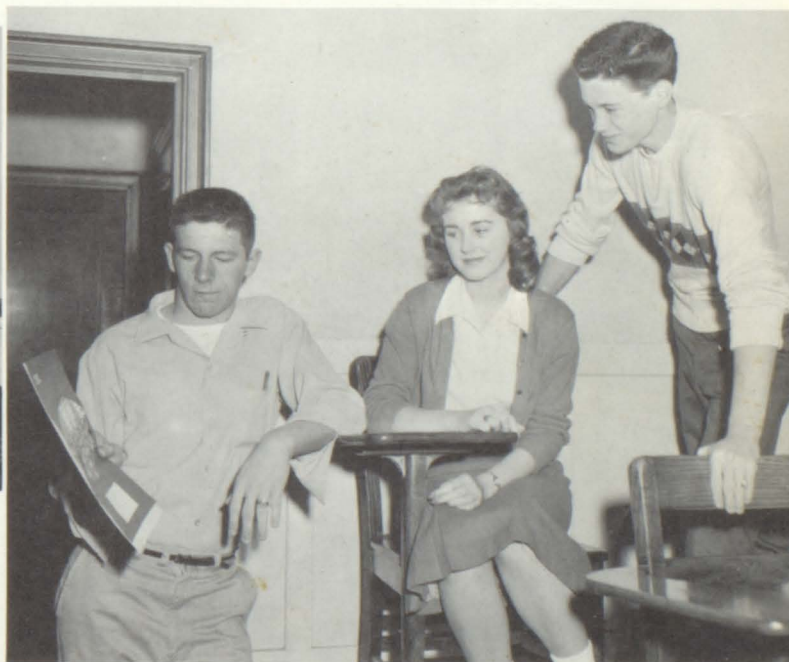

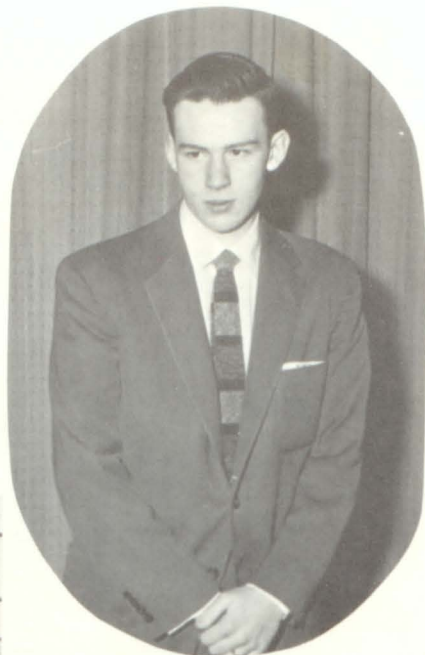

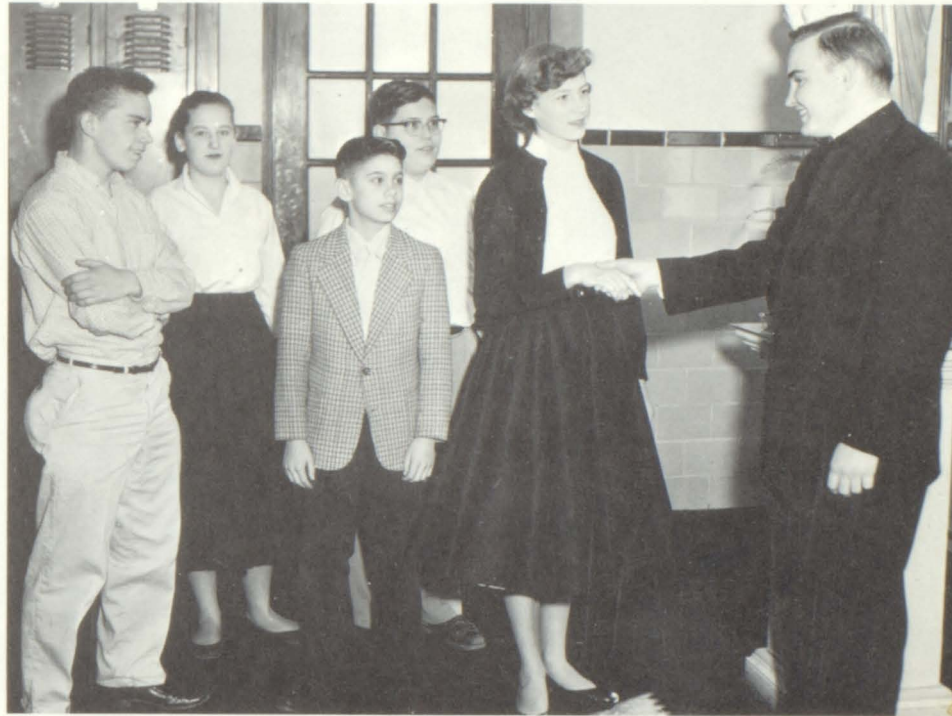

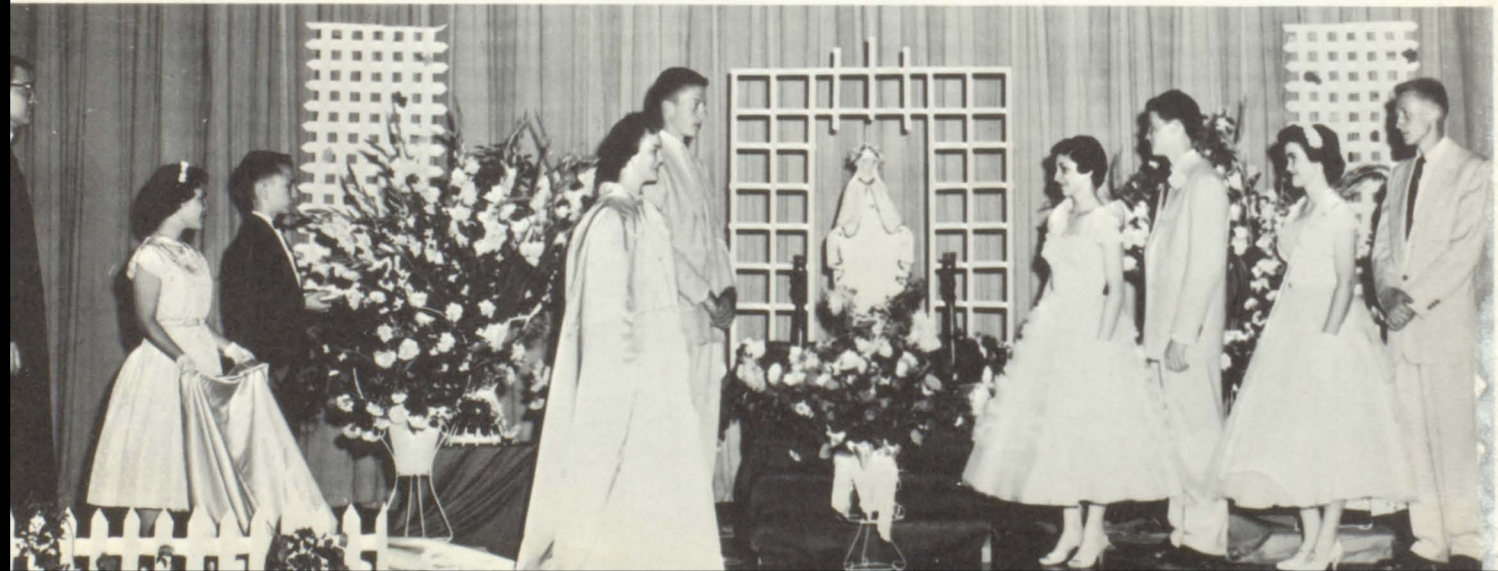
