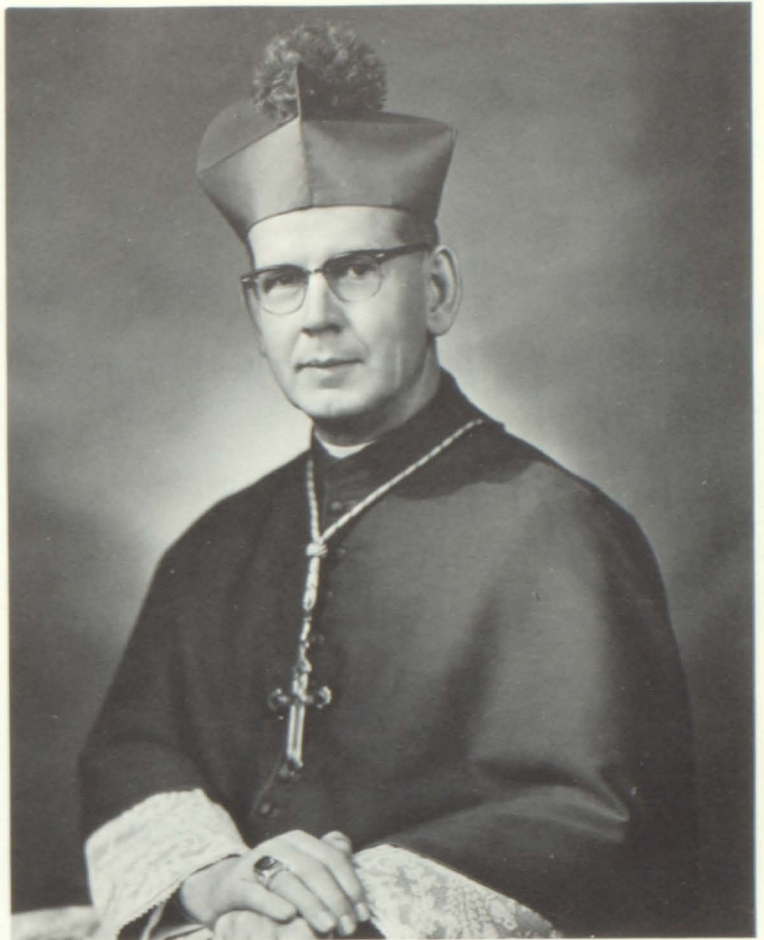


It is with a spirit of deep reverence and humility that in this, the Ecumenical Year of Nineteen Hundred Sixty-three, we turn our thoughts to

The prayers of each student accompanied our Bishop to the Second Ecumenical Council in Rome. May the Holy Spirit complement his wisdom and foresightedness.

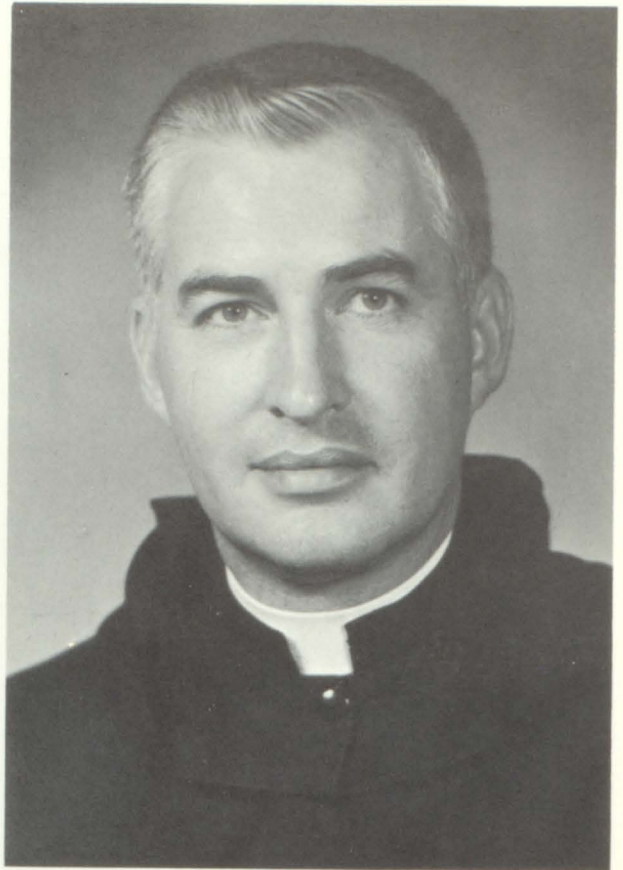
DEDICATION

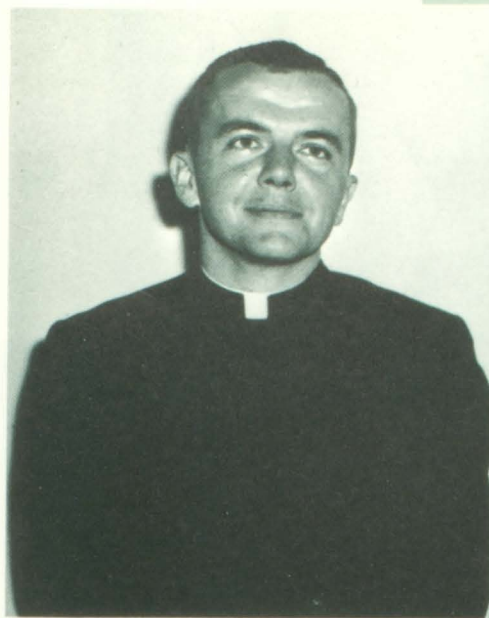

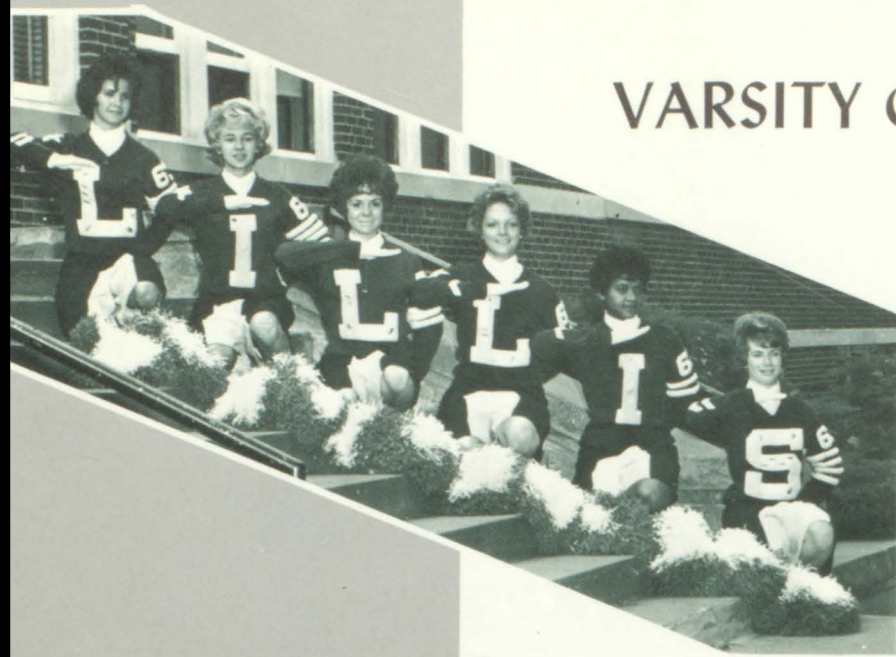

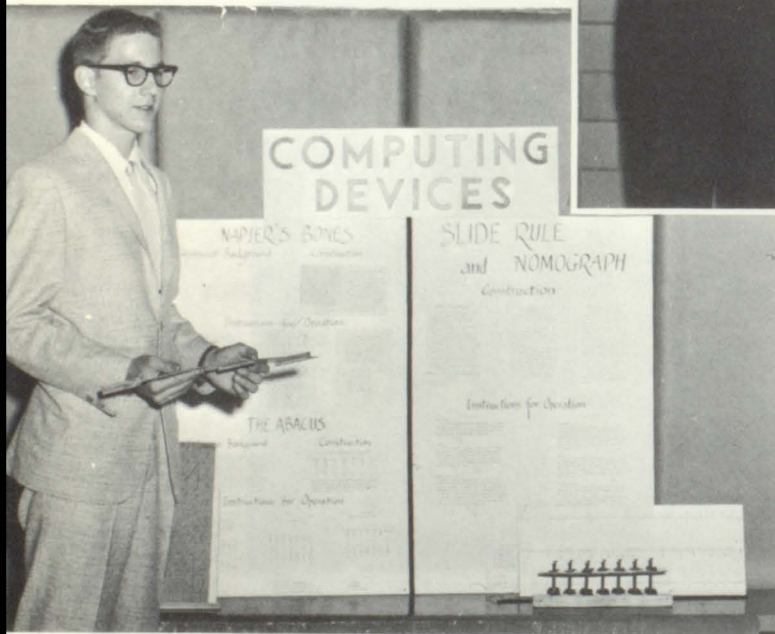

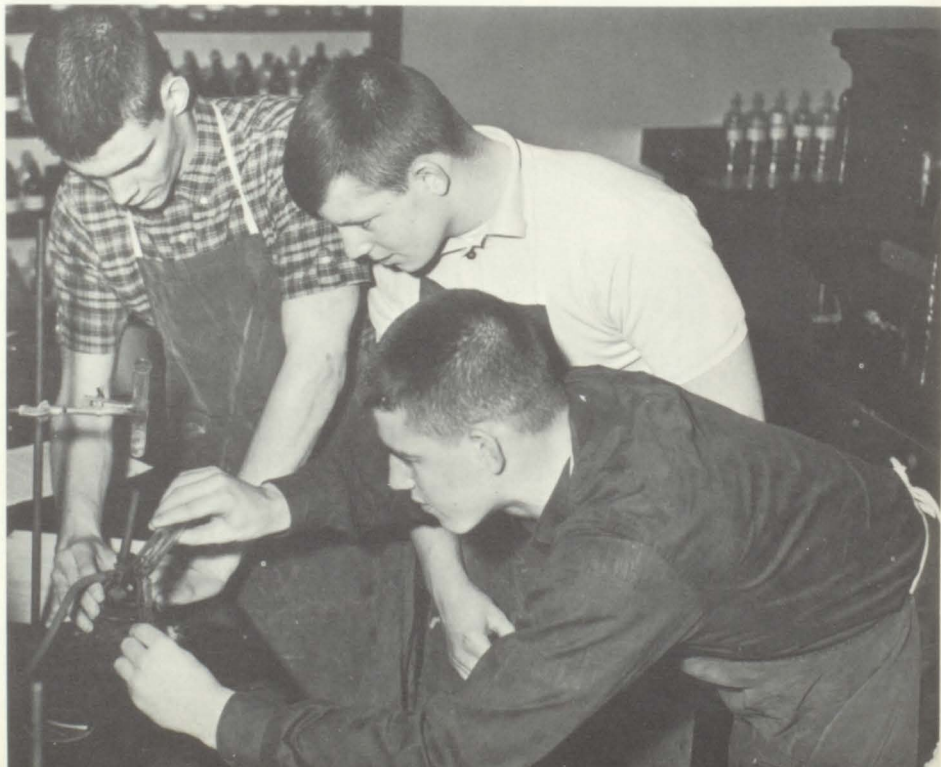

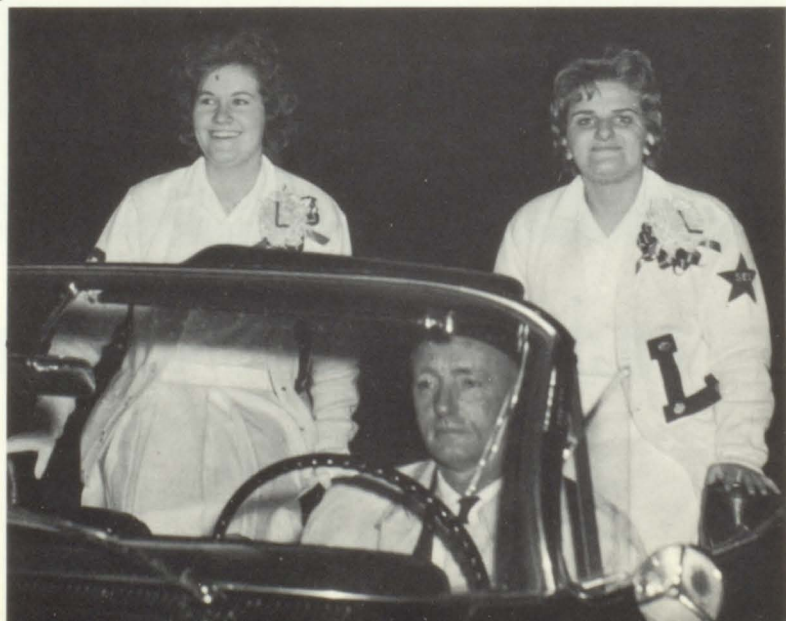

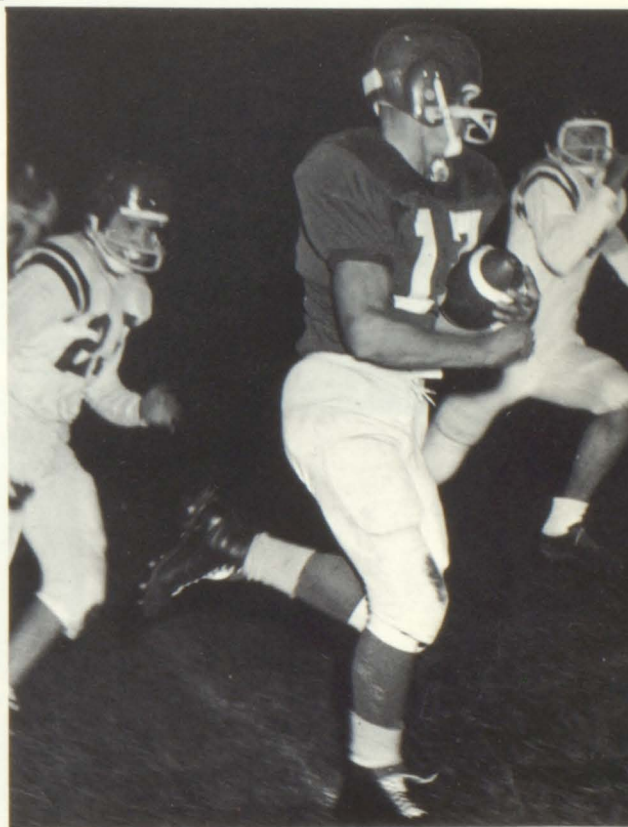

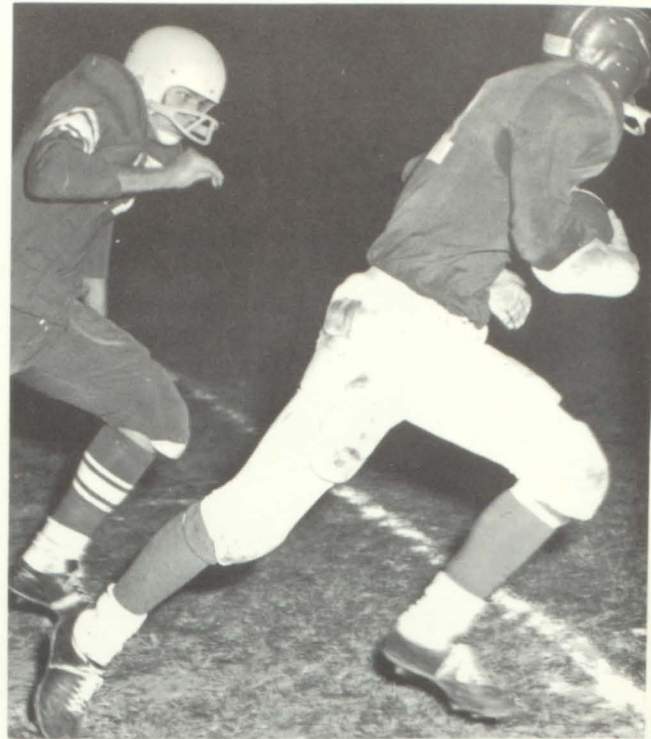

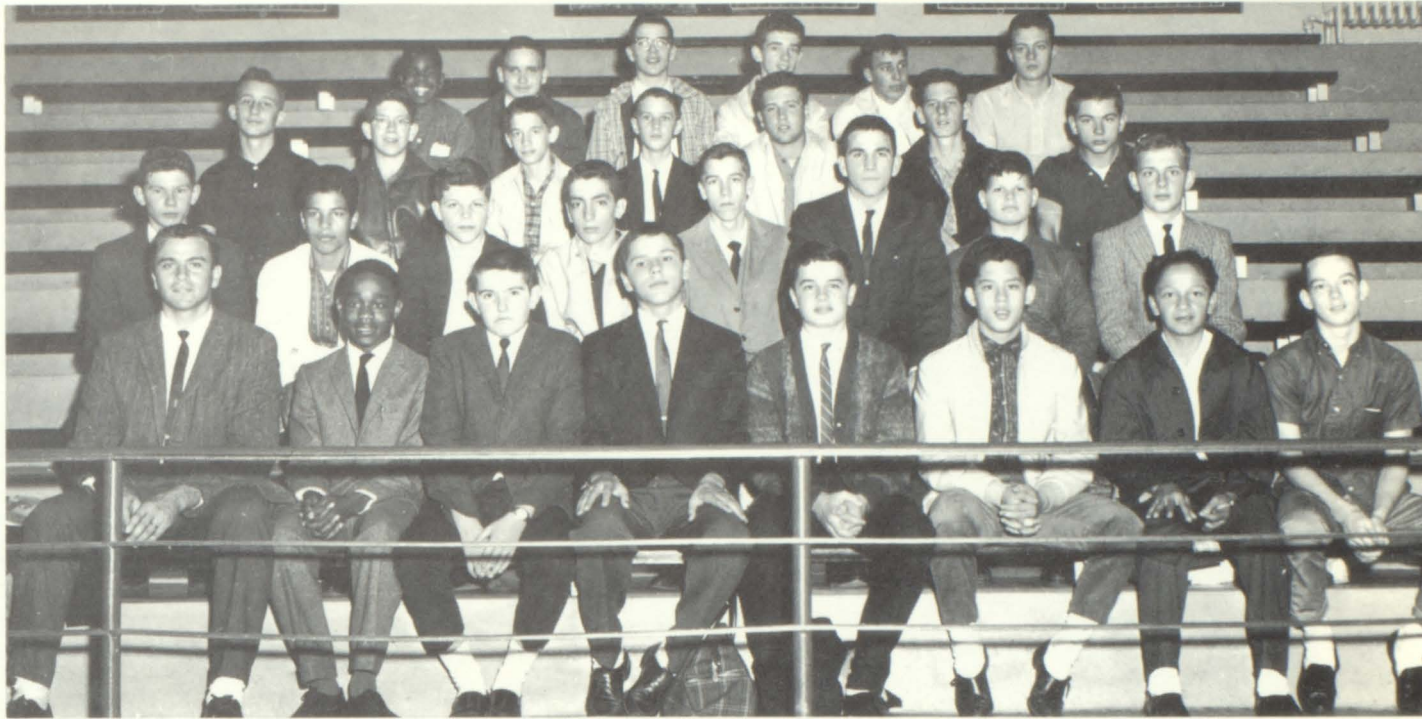

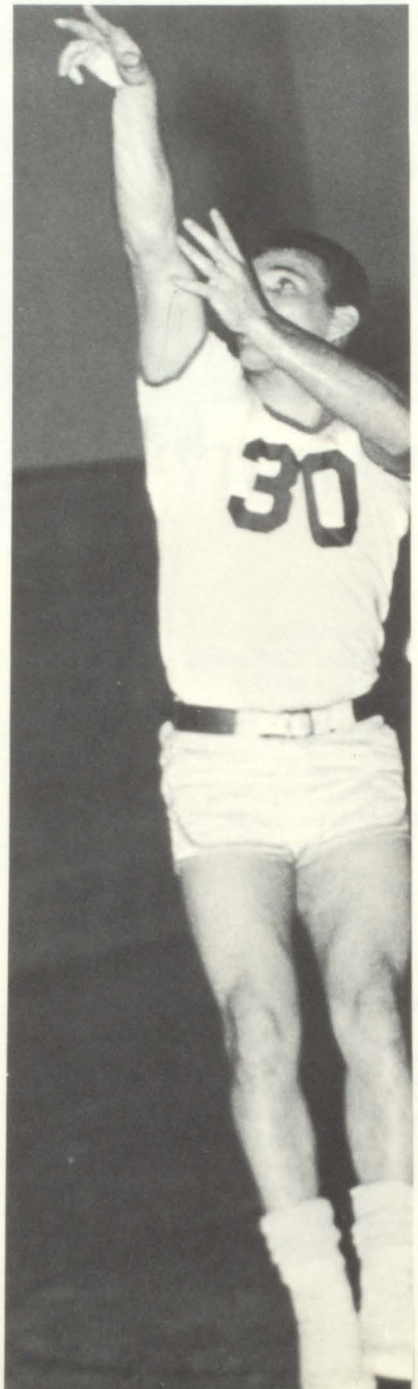

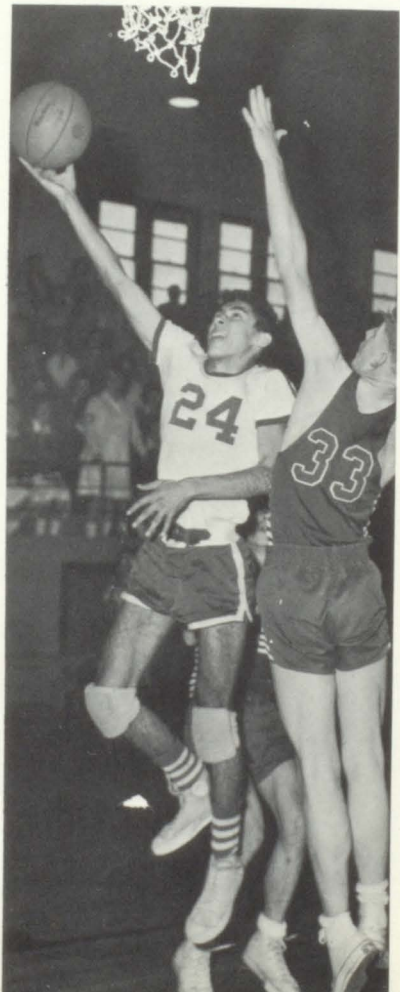

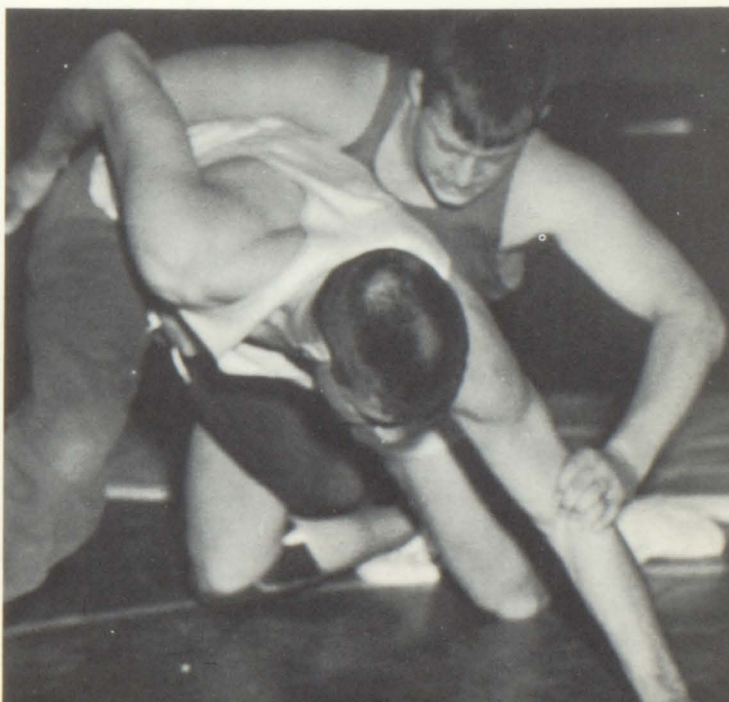
