
FOREWORD






It is with a spirit of deep reverence and humility that in this. the Ecumenical Year of Nineteen Hundred Sixty-three, we turn our thoughts to

His Holiness Pope John XXIII.

In an address on 9th August, 1959, the Pope expressly stated that it was when he was meditating, in the unity octave, on Christ's sacerdotal prayer and his prayer for unity that the idea of a Council came "like the spontaneous flowering of an unexpected spring," not as the fruit of long consideration, but -- as the Pope said elsewhere -- as a sudden inspiration from above, a personal intimation by the Holy Spirit.

The prayers of each student accompanied our Bishop to the Second Ecumenical Council in Rome. May the Holy Spirit complement his wisdom and foresightedness.


DEDICATION

Therefore we dedicate our yearbook to Father Kieran in appreciation of a life dedicated for us.






















