


## Lillis Cuts Patterns Across the Ice


















#### Lillisloggers Make A Dream Come True






# Administration Seeks to Bridge Generation Gap With Communication Between Faculty and Student Body


Sister Mary David serves in the capacity of bookkeeper and advisor for both the Pep Club and the new Drill Team. In addition Sister teaches two Math classes.








