We seniors, just as any other normal students, revolt at the idea of work and say that we'll be glad to graduate. But as the day of graduation approaches, we know that we'll miss the mixers, the football and basketball games, plays, Intersociety, and all the other activities peculiar to high-school life. In this book are recorded, in picture and in word, the important activities of the school year, so that we may look back and recall our high-school days.

The group was first organized during its freshman year at Central Junior. There the following officers were elected:

When the class as sophomores moved to the senior building, it entered a new era. Then clubs, literary societies, and athletics became integral parts of school life. In the Intersociety contest of that year, Doris Hill, the only sophomore who placed, won a bronze medal in essay. Ralph McNeal, Pete Lerner, Robert Austin, Dave Elias, and Louis Walters began establishing their reputations in athletics.

In the junior year, Bill Hanley was again chosen to head the class, with Barbara English, Bernie Wood, and Bill Case as aides. Many juniors portrayed important roles in the spring play, "Headed for Eden," and Virgel Parman had one of the leads. Bud Trump, Leonard Jackson, and Kenneth Smithey joined the group of outstanding athletes. During their junior year, the class was outstanding in Inter-

society. Gold medals were won by Doris Hill in informal essay, Irving Stone in oration, Donald Clark in verse, and Henry Comstock in biography. Virgel Parman and Bill Case placed second in oration and formal essay, respectively.

Elizabeth Ann Hall was elected president of Girl Reserves for the year and Bernie Wood and Herbert Yates were chosen to head Boys' Hi. Pete Lerner and Ralph McNeal won places on the mythical all-star football team. Jess Oliver, Bud Trump, and Bob Austin did outstanding work on the basketball court.

Major Delson Lewis took command of the Central battalion, and Bill Hanley and Bill Case served as presidents of the Student Council. Variety Night, this year based on a television theme, drew many of its performers from the class of '39.

Sixty-six seniors received grades of 100 or higher on the Ohio Test, the high score being 141.

Virgel Parman again played the lead in the spring play, this year opposite Elizabeth Brink.

Senior ballot, by the number of majority votes, proved that the class gave its recognition to deserving candidates—a victory over the petty politics of previous years.

In the remaining crowded weeks, our last Intersociety, National Honor Society, and senior farewells push thoughts of graduation into the back of our minds. But the memories of our years at Central will always remain among our most pleasant ones.

national honor society

One of the most anticipated events for the Senior Class is the announcement of membership in the National Honor Society. The four aims of National Honor Society are to create enthusiasm for scholarship, to stimulate the desire to render service, to promote leadership, and to develop character.

Eligibility on the National Honor Society requires that the student should have a grade average of 2.6 or above. Any extra-curricular honors the pupil has acquired are added to this. The entire honor system was devised by a joint committee of the student council and the faculty fifteen years ago. Not more than five honor points are given from each department of the school. This system aims at preventing a few students from "cornering" school activities to the exclusion of other capable students and to the detriment both of themselves and the activities.

Not more than the highest 10 per cent of the class is chosen; therefore only fifty people, on the average, are admitted each year to membership. Although each applicant must be passed by all faculty members, only misconduct to a large degree, such as dishonesty and gross negligence of duty, would be sufficient for a teacher to vote against an individual.


Already the class has chosen some of its leaders

Occupants of the senior building will welcome a group of poised, efficient sophomores when the class enters Central Senior High next fall.









will observe that one leg is about a foot longer than the other. That sort of hampered his speed.





The 1938 Blue Eagle squad upset pre-season dope to capture a second place tie in the Interscholastic League with three victories and two defeats. Coach Slaymaker, with only three returning lettermen in Jess Oliver, Cliff Painter, and Ralph McNeal, built a fast but light squad from last year's champion second team. The chief handicap was the lack of weight but that was supplanted by fight and determination shown when . . .

... Central held a touted Wyandotte team, outweighing the Eagles thirty pounds to the man, to a scoreless deadlock that featured stellar line play by "El Toro" Elias, Cliff Painter, Ken Smithey, Ralph McNeal, and Paul McIntyre to force the Bulldogs to use their passing attack which was interfered with by an alert Kingbird backfield to pave the way for runs by Pete Lerner, Louie Walter, and Bob Austin. But such effort was to no avail . . .

... when Southwest reversed the tables with a 27-0 Eagle-plucking by means of long, bullet passes to baffle the Blue and White defense. Passing alone accounted for the Indian gains because an alert Central line stymied their line plunges. Jess Oliver's

A long Lerner-to-Painter toss chalked up the first score followed by Oliver's interception of a Knight pass which later led to Bob Austin's touchdown. Plenty of reserves saw action with good work done by Dick Kelly, Sam Whitehead and Vance Olson. The next game was a thriller . . .

. . . when Central eked out a 7-6 victory over the East Bears. Leonard Jackson consistently carried the ball for good gains to pave the way for Austin's tally in the second quarter. Lerner's conversion was good. A rejuvenated East team in the third stanza threw a pass into pay dirt territory for six points but Cliff Painter blocked the conversion attempt to keep Central in the league running. Another victory was added . . .

. . . when the Rockhurst Blue Hawks were taken

into camp on the shorter end of a 20-0 annihilation. The scrappy Eagles repulsed a Hawk drive and reversed the tables to push over three touchdowns via line smashes and wide end runs made possible by good interference. Leonard Jackson, Pete Lerner, and Louie Walters, respectively, tallied to make it a glorious victory, as was . . .

. . . the Blue and White 19-0 shellacking over the Northeast Vikings for the third consecutive year. A Flashy Eagle team reeled off five consecutive first downs on a muddy H. H. Holmes field to allow Bob Austin to score. Trump scored in the second quarter followed by Lerner's touchdown in the third quarter. The only threat was a 70-yard jaunt by a lone Viking on an intercepted pass which was stopped by Fuller Locklear. Another glorious victory was chalked up, but then followed the unexpected...

. . . when Paseo deadlocked Central for second place by trouncing the Blue Eagles, 14-0. A King-


bird team, one Bob Austin weaker, fell short of the goal twice in the first half. Later in the first half the Blue and White line finally held to stop a Paseo march on its own 15-yard stripe. A determined Pirate team finally crashed through in the third quarter to score, but the bitter blow came in the dying minutes of the game when Israel of Paseo intercepted a desperate Eagle pass to gallop 50 yards for the last score of the season.

Then came the climax with the naming of Pete Lerner, Ralph McNeal, and Clifford Painter to the first team All-Star and Jess Oliver to the second team.

The squad of '38 didn't win any pennants but it will be long remembered for its fight and determination to upset bigger opponents, gaining a league position worthy of the effort put forth. Usually the underdog, but often the victor. Hats off to one of the rarest teams and seasons Central ever had!

The cinder season rolled around to find Coach Slaymaker working on a green squad for the dual meets. All positions had to be filled by new men with

The lanky Wyandotte Canines invaded Central to roll up a 40-10 count with accurate long shots.


In a Yuletide battle Central lost a hard-fought 27-25 duel to the Rockhurst five in the last quarter.





When the Central unit underwent the annual Corps Area Inspection in the spring of 1938, it began one of its most successful years. The Central




