

#### In Memoriam



Miss Victor Ellen Levy, study hall teacher for the last two years at Central, who passed away on October 23, was a native of Missouri. She was educated in Warrensburg Teachers College and Missouri Valley College, and has been connected with the Kansas City schools many years, having taught in Greenwood, Benton, Irving, and Blenheim.

Although frail in body for the last few years, she always kept the interest of the school child at heart. She was patient with the pupils, thus enabling them to bring out the best that was in them.

Miss Levy had real humor and was able to appreciate and enjoy the wit of others. She was a person unusual in the versatility of her interests. Most of her time was devoted to teaching, but she possessed dramatic and literary ability and had taken part in many plays at the Resident Theatre.

Miss Levy was active in her church and she will be greatly missed there as well as in her school.

The death of this teacher, who gave such fine service for many years to the education of children, will be a severe loss to all who knew her. Students at Central High were shocked to hear, the afternoon of April 4, that Albert Lipsey had died during the morning after only a week's illness. He had lived all his life in Kansas City, Missouri, having attended Horace Mann, Central Junior, and Central Senior high schools.

Since he was twelve years old, Albert had been a scout in Troop Number 61 and would have become an Eagle the week following his death, for he had passed practically all of his merit badges. As an outstanding leader of the organization, he had been a junior counselor and lifeguard at the Scout Camp in Osceola, Missouri, last summer. Al possessed the cherished claw of Mic-o-say, the highest honor a scout can achieve. He was a regular member of the Sunday school and congregation at the Keneseth Israel Beth Sholom Synagogue.

Albert was looking forward to commencement. He had been a popular member of the Senior Class and had formed lasting friendships. His classmates will long remember him for his sterling qualities of character. His was the type of young person that is dignified, yet friendly; quiet, though enthusiastic; unobtrusive, yet influential.







### CLASS OF 1940

First place ratings were captured at Intersociety by Bob Havighurst for Biography and Bernadine Aaron in Declamation. Silver medals were won by Nadine Smith in Oration and by Ella Lee Johnson in Declamation, and Jack Carduff won a bronze medal in "Extemp," while many other juniors represented in the various events. During his junior year, Bill Grimm was the only one of the class who "lettered" in football, while Paul Bockshammer, Winston Balke, Chuck Russell, Harold Schumaker, and Don Sarver received awards in basketball.

With the beginning of the senior year, this class once again blossomed out and began to show their worth as overlords of Central.

Frances Maloy was elected president of the Girl Reserves for the year, sharing honors with Bob Havighurst and Dick Beach who were chosen to head the Boys' Hi-Y. Guy Loughead and Vance Olson both won berths on the second team of the mythical all-star eleven.

Raoul LaNoue was given the appointment of major of the Central Battalion and proved his worth as commanding officer. The Central Round-Up was a great success, and many of the senior class participated.

The Student Council chose as the two presidents, Bob Havighurst and Jack Carduff, while the spring play once again starred Bernadine Aaron and Frances Maloy.


The highest grade on the Senior Test was 140, our class showing up well.



Against the larger Wyandotte team, Central opened the season by scoring their first touchdown





### **GOLF CHAMPIONS**

In the fall tournament for the City Interscholastic Golf Championship the 1939 Blue Eagle golf team, composed of Bill Troupe, Danny Davis, Morris Rogozenski, Charley Rodecker, and J. D. Doughty, won first place, defeating Southeast, Southwest, Westport, Paseo, and Northeast . . . The final standings of the team are: Central, 1,427; Southeast, 1,504; and Westport, 1,512 . . . Paseo and Northeast dropped out of competition before the final round had been played . . .

The tourney was played at the Swope Park course in four rounds on Saturday mornings . . .

Jack Genereaux of Southeast was the low man for the four rounds with 325 strokes. Bill Troupe and Danny Davis of Central were second and third respectively with 340 and 351 strokes...

In the first round the Central squad went into an early lead of 14 strokes . . . Keeping up this pace, the Blue Eagle squad went on to win the 1939 championship by 24 strokes over their nearest competitor . . .


In the state tournament which was held in Kansas City for the first time, at the Meadow Lake golf course, October 14, Central was represented by Bill Troupe and Danny Davis . . . They won second place, missing first place by 11 strokes in the two-

man team event against competition from high schools all over the state . . . Bill Troupe was fifth low man of the state in individual scoring and first of the golfers representing Kansas City high schools . . . Danny Davis tied for tenth place in the state, and for third place among this city's golfers . . .

Four of the five golfers that lettered, Davis, Rogozenski, Rodecker, and Doughty, are being lost by graduation . . . So with only one letterman back, Bill Troupe, who has been on the team for two years and who will captain next year's squad, B. B. Blackford, the coach, will have to find replacements to win the 1940 championship . . .

Every spring there is a practice and elimination tournament for the selection and development of new members for the team. Play is after school, so anyone can try out. Perhaps part of this success is due to the good playing, sportsmanship, and encouragement given the team by our "honorary" player, Mary Wylie. The boys always worked hard to improve their game when Mary was in the "gang."

This is one of the best golf years that Central has enjoyed since golf was introduced as an interscholastic sport and the record of this 1939 squad can be held up as a model for future golfers that carry the Blue and White colors to the fairways and greens.



Sarver sank his third goal to give Central a victory instead of the expected defeat . . .

The Blue Eagles established a new Municipal Auditorium scoring record against Southeast the following game, rolling up a score of 42 to 16... This was the last game for Winston Balke and Harold Schumacher because of mid-year graduation, and in it Balke scored sixteen points to be the game's high point man...

Central chalked up her third straight victory the following week when, led by Herb Sarver, the team defeated the East Bears 25 to 19 . . .

The team's fourth victory was gained at the expense of Manual in their next game when Don Sarver and "Bud" French piloted the Eagles to a 23 to 21 win . . .

Our victory string was snapped in the next game against the Northeast Vikings, our team losing 22 to 16... Don Sarver and Floyd McHenry were the important cogs in our defense and offense...

The next game ended with the Blue Eagles on the short end of a 24 to 18 score against the Paseo Pirates . . . "Bud" French turned out to be our high point man with eight . . .

The season's finale against the favored Southwest Indians found the Blue Eagles striving hard to overcome an early lead but losing 20 to 17... This last game produced no standout players but furnished further proof of the ability of our squad to show exceptional teamwork . . .

If we had won this game, and we needed only two more goals to do it, we would have won a second place tie with Southwest . . . We would have been declared second place winners since we had defeated them, thus representing Kansas City in the Inter-City series with St. Louis . . . Incidentally, Paseo, the Interscholastic champions, and Southwest, the runners-up, won their games in this third annual series with the winning St. Louis highs . . . The Paseo Pirates also went on to win the Consolation championship at the State tournament in Joplin . . .






Settling down to the routine of drill and classroom work, the cadets began to look forward to the next scheduled event on the R.O.T.C. calendar, the annual military hop.
