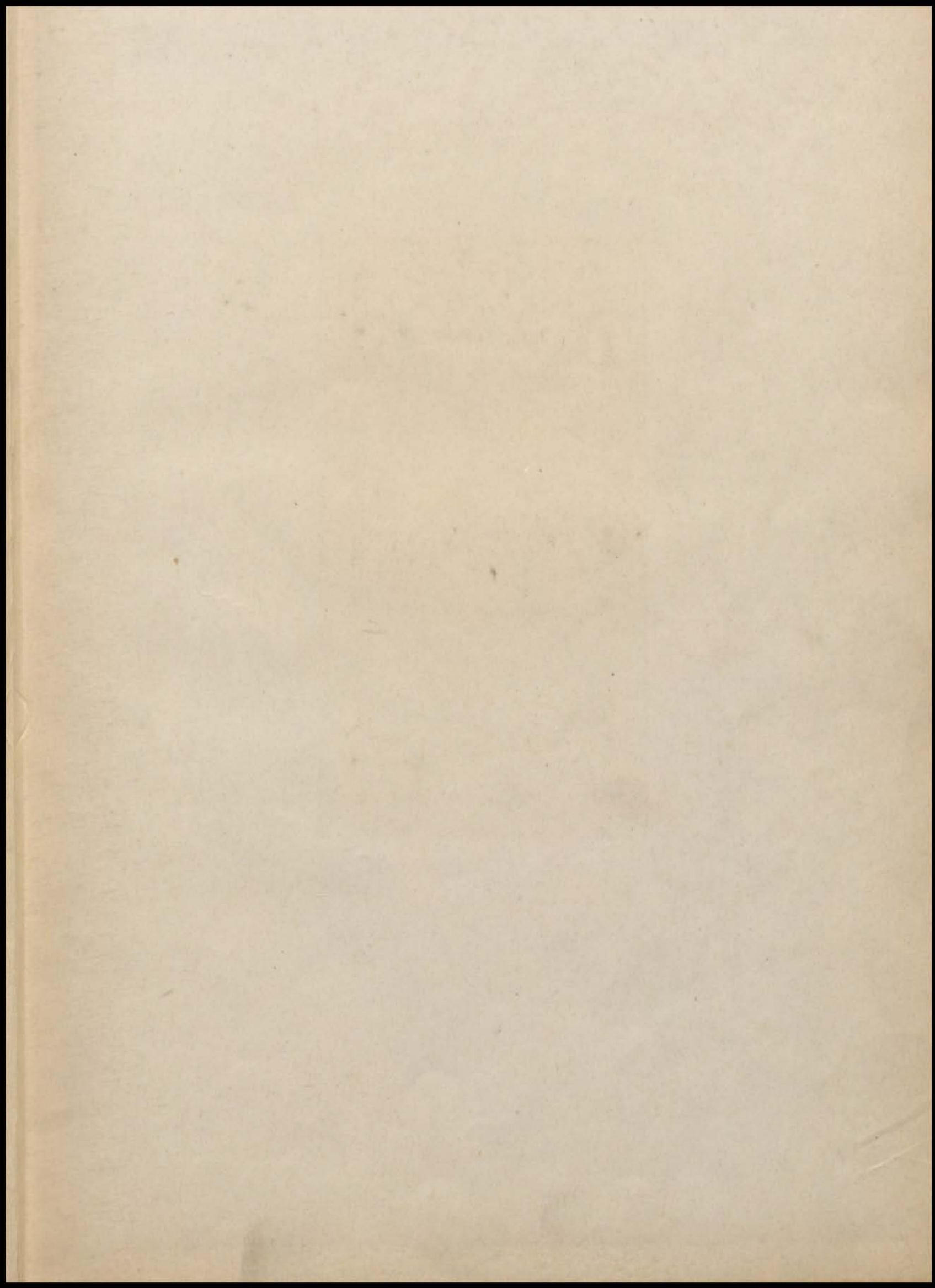

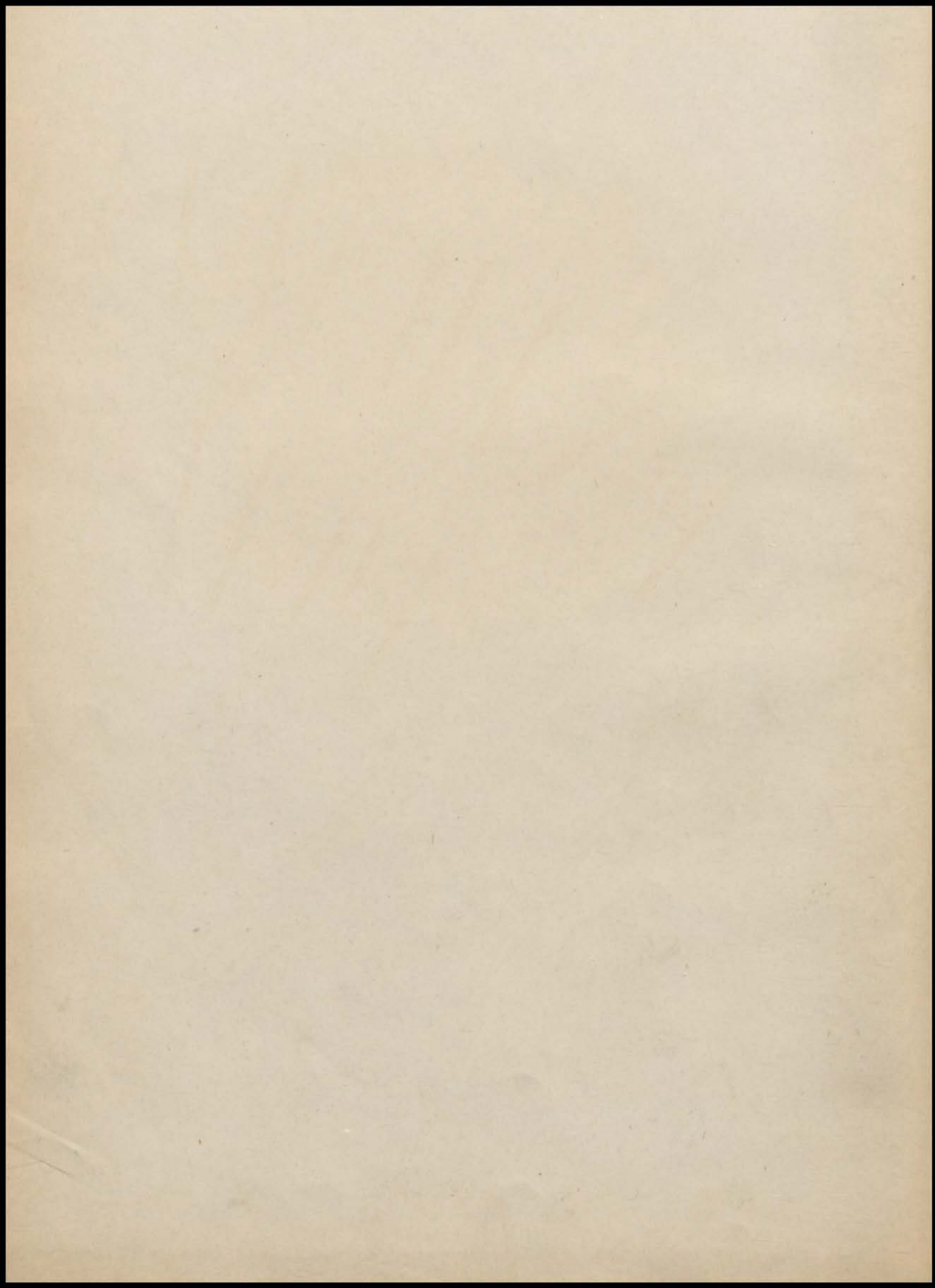



At Half Mast

The opening weeks at Central were overshadowed by the death of a classmate, Albert Clark, Jr., who drowned September 15 in the Osage River at Osceola, Mo. Albert, who was born in Kansas City, Mo., had attended Greenwood School, Central Junior, and Central Senior High School.

Since his early boyhood, Albert had enjoyed all outdoor sports, especially fishing, baseball, and hiking. Often on Saturday he went hiking with his sister or fishing with a friend. He also enjoyed the honor of being the croquet champion of his neighborhood.



He was a popular member of the Zoology and Stamp clubs, where his fine qualities of character were recognized and admired.

Albert passed on while enjoying a favorite sport. As he was a member of the R. O. T. C., his fellow cadets acted as pallbearers, lending a military atmosphere to his funeral.

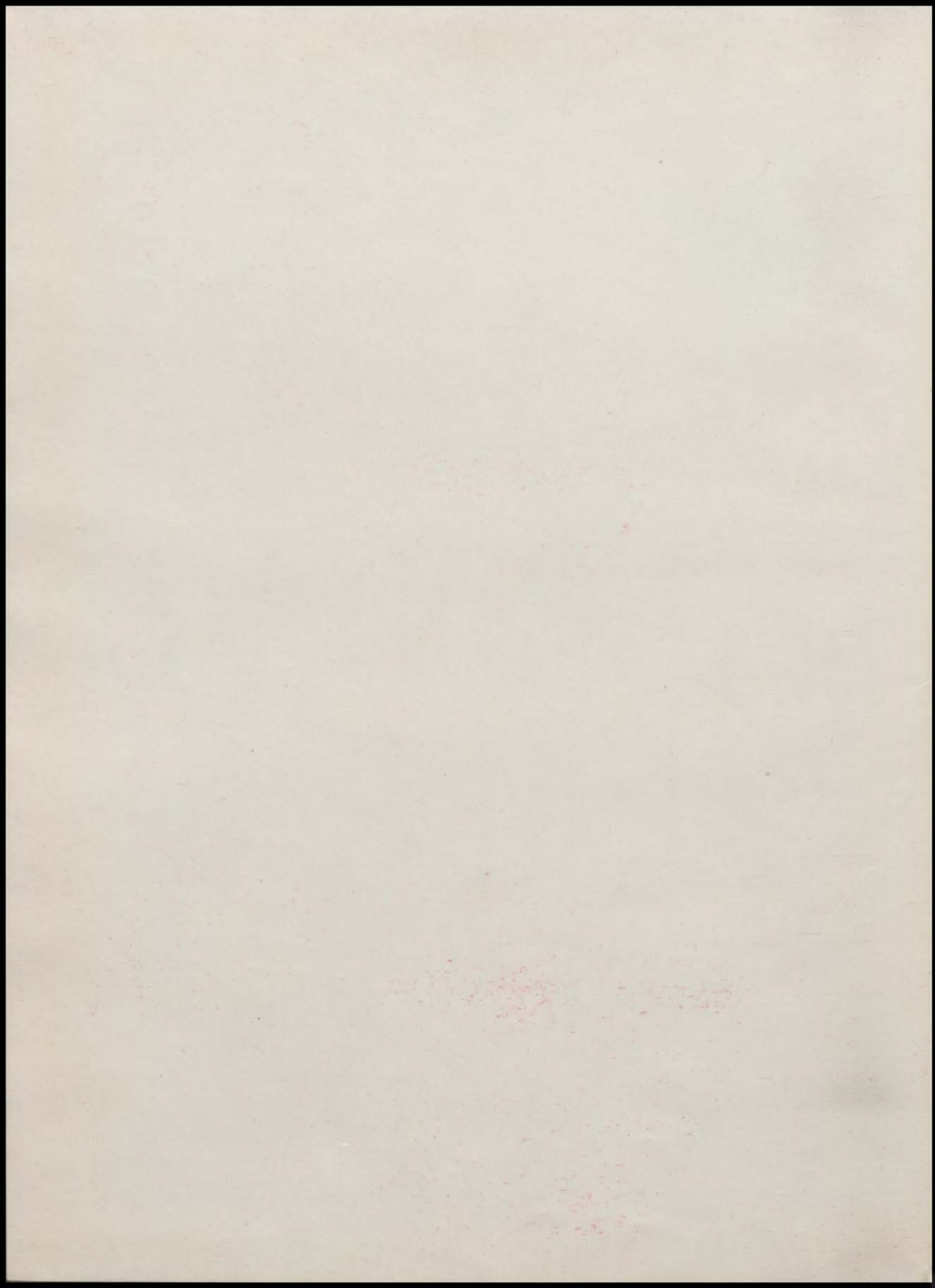

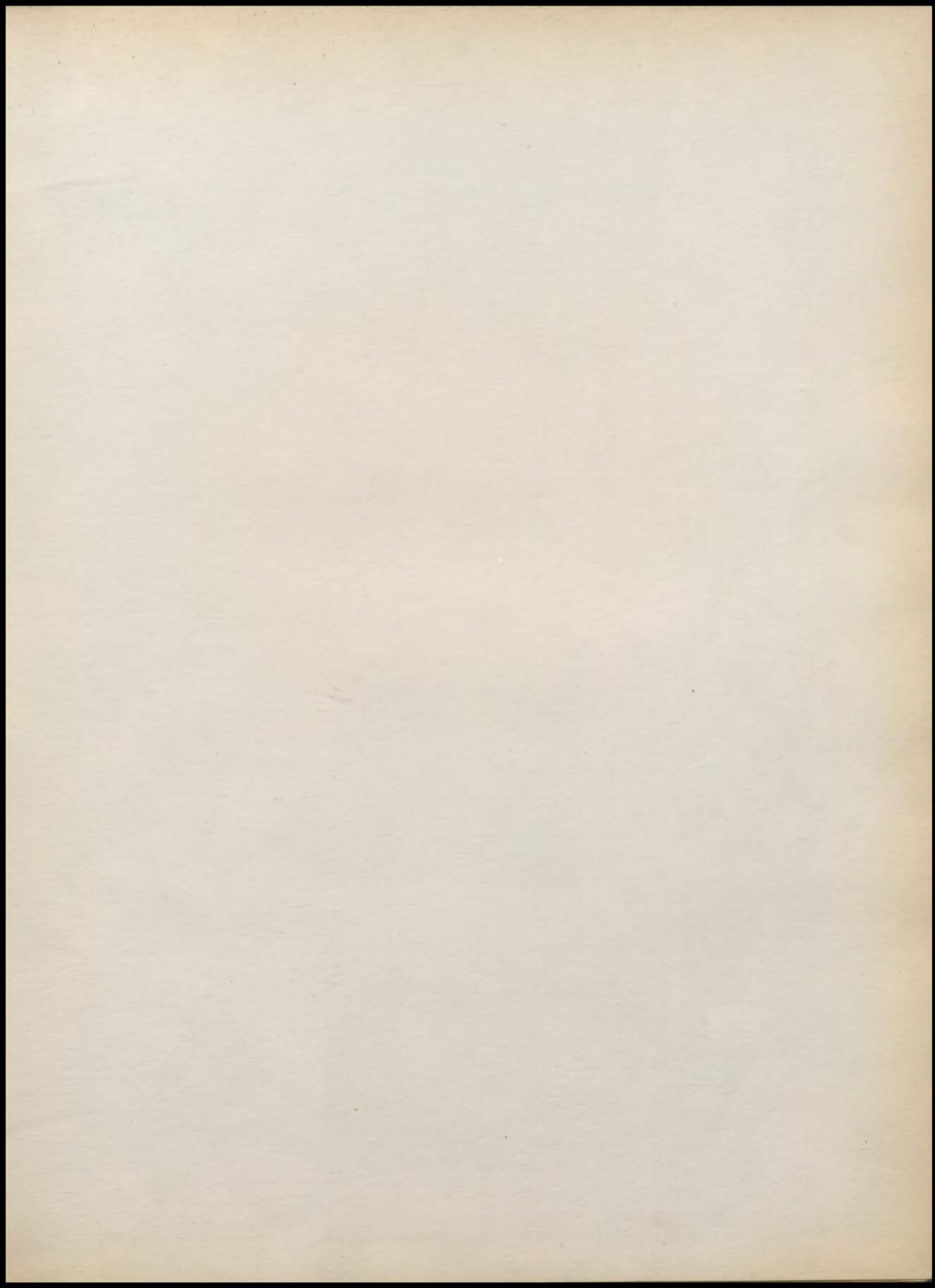

WE BELIEVE IN DEMOCRACY

And because we do, we are anxious to show our worth. We are proud of America and what she stands for. We are proud of our democracy. This year we got some experience in voting and holding office in a democracy. Our All-City Student Government Day was held March 28.

The first step was an election. Each Home Room in Central elected its nominee for Mayor. Fifteen of these were chosen by the Student Council to give speeches on some phase of the city charter in a special assembly. Immediately following the assembly, the entire student body voted for the six best speakers. The six chosen were: candidate for Mayor, Chuck Johnson; candidates for municipal judge: Don Nielson and Beverly Bash; for councilman, Floyd McHenry, Loren Fitzhugh and Marguerite Heinzle. Chuck Johnson, Odell Sylvester from Lincoln High and Walter

Allen of Northeast were chosen at a special meeting of the All-City Student Council to be the three candidates for mayor in the city election. Each of the three gave a radio speech which was heard by all the students in the various high schools and junior highs in special assemblies. The next day we voted. When all the returns were in, we found that Chuck Johnson had been elected mayor of Kansas City. Floyd McHenry was the councilman from the Central district.

Later John Scanlon of Westport was appointed City Manager. Those from Central who received appointive positions were: Pat Webb, Park Commissioner; Dick Parsell, Superintendent of the Technical and Record Department; Beverly Bash, Superintendent of Radio; Howard Shryock, Director of the Welfare Department; and Don Nielson, City Treasurer.

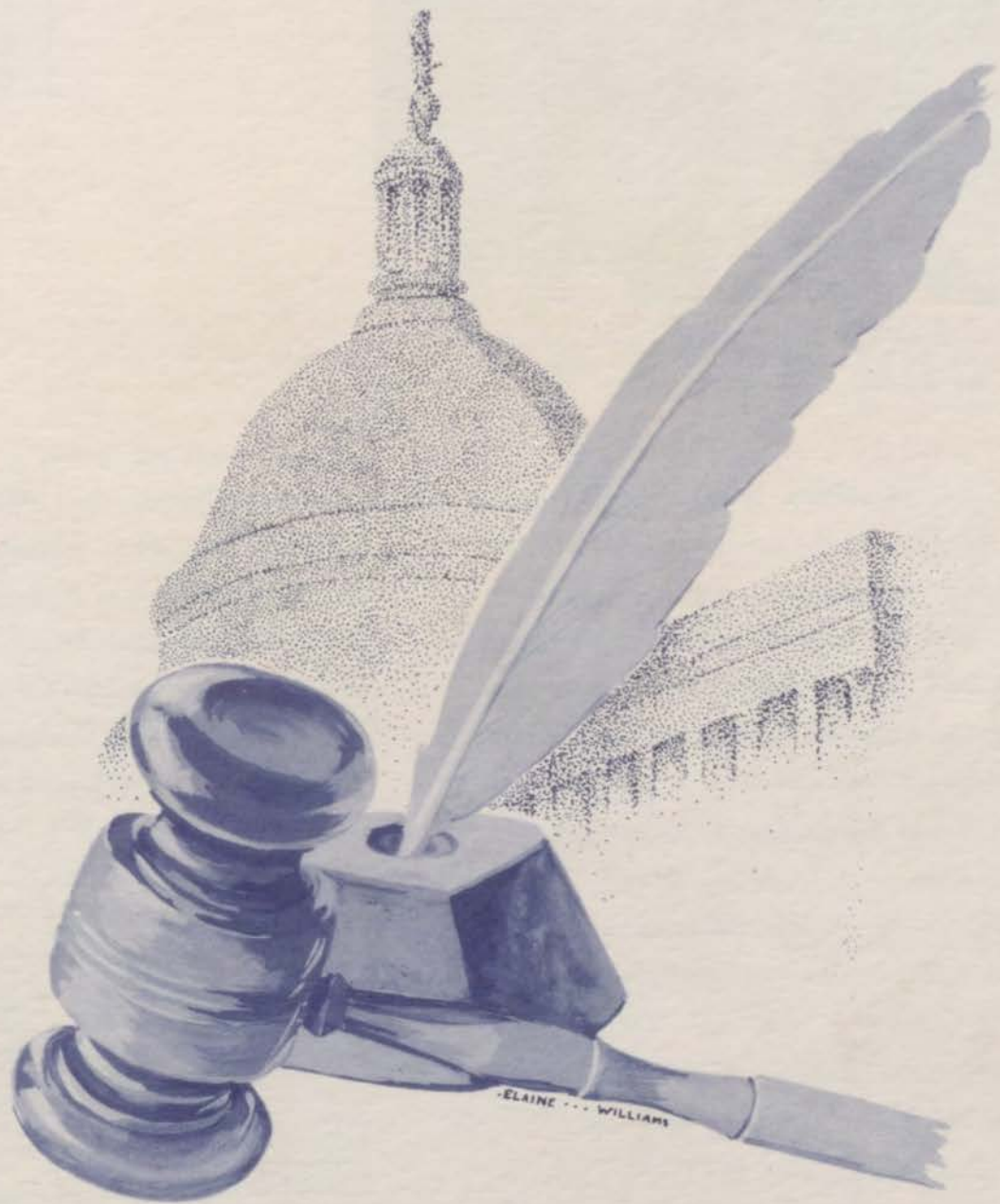

CLASS

When we, as seniors, approach graduation, we find that perhaps the hardest task of our four years of high school is saying goodbye to Central. We find that through all the good times, activities, and work of the past four years we have become acquainted, not only with many new friends, but with ourselves.

The history of the class of '41 begins in 1938, with the election of freshmen officers. Dick Kelley was president; Beverly Bash, vice-president; Bill Dietrich, secretary; and Hazel Jones, treasurer.

As sophomores, members of the class began to gain recognition in the senior building. Marilyn Williams, Jack Jarvis, and Loren Fitzhugh had major parts in "New Fires," and on Intersociety Night, Beverly Bash won gold medal in Informal Essay and Florence Patton in Verse. Wayne Wills with his trumpet and Wynona Beresford with her accordion starred in Variety Night.

As juniors, many of the class gained prominence in athletics. Dick Kelley, Floyd McHenry,

and John Watson earned letters in football, while John Watson, Sam Mazon, and Floyd McHenry won awards in basketball. John Watson, Joe Potter, Jack Finley, and Bob Wren lettered in track. They were cheered on by Bill Dietrich, cheerleader and by Roslouse Yancey, Peggy Ryan, Maree Rogers, and Ann Feiner, drum majorettes.

"June Mad" included Stuart Thompson, Marilyn Williams, Joan Lane, and Jack Jarvis in the leading roles. Dick Kelley, Wayne Wills, Peggy Ryan, Wynona Beresford, and Don Nielson had parts in the Central "Roundup," helping to make it a huge success. In Intersociety, Loren Fitzhugh won gold medal in Declamation; Howard Shryock, in Formal Essay; Shirley Scheurer, in Verse; Marilyn Williams, in Ex-temp; and Florence Patton won her second gold medal, this time in Informal Essay while Dick Snow took bronze medal in Biography and Robert Baker in verse. Marilyn Williams was Central's representative in the National Constitutional Oration contest.

In the senior year, Hazel Jones was elected to lead the Girl Reserves and Bob Bottenberg and Dick Parsell led the Boys' Hi-Y.

Don Nielson and Bob Bottenberg were senior cheerleaders and once again drum majorettes Roslouse Yancey, Peggy Ryan, and Maree Rogers marched with the band.

Major Howard Shryock took command of the Central battalion of R.O.T.C. Later in the year Major Shryock was promoted to Colonel, and John Egelston took over as Major. Norman Wright and Dick Brown were the two presidents of the Student Council. Don Nielson and Jack Jarvis shared the part of the Voice of Prophecy in "Wake-Up! America" the 1940 production of Variety Night, while many other seniors performed in it.

Senior test scores showed Marilyn Williams high with a score of 136 and Connie Persky second with 135.

Spring play, this year "Spring Fever," was April 4 and 5. Jack Jarvis, Paul Morris, Stuart Thompson, Raymond Gordon, Lester Kessler, Don Nielson, Roslouse Yancey, Marilyn Williams, Joan Lane, Darlene Swan, Shirley Wright, and Bonnie Whitaker had the leading parts.

Into the few remaining weeks were crowded our last Intersociety, the senior ballot, the R.O.T.C. hop, and Natonal Honor Society. The members of the class of '41 were graduated, saddened by the death of Albert Clarke, Jr., and missing Betty Jean Davisson, Wayne Wills, Loraine Hutchins, and Dick Kelley who had moved out of town, and Bill Dietrich and Bob Williams who, because of illness, were forced to remain out of school all year, but very proud to have spent their four years of high school at Central.

Because the names for National Honor Society were not announced until after the final deadline for Centralian copy, they could not be included and the book still come out on time. The page has been printed separately and is available to those who desire it.

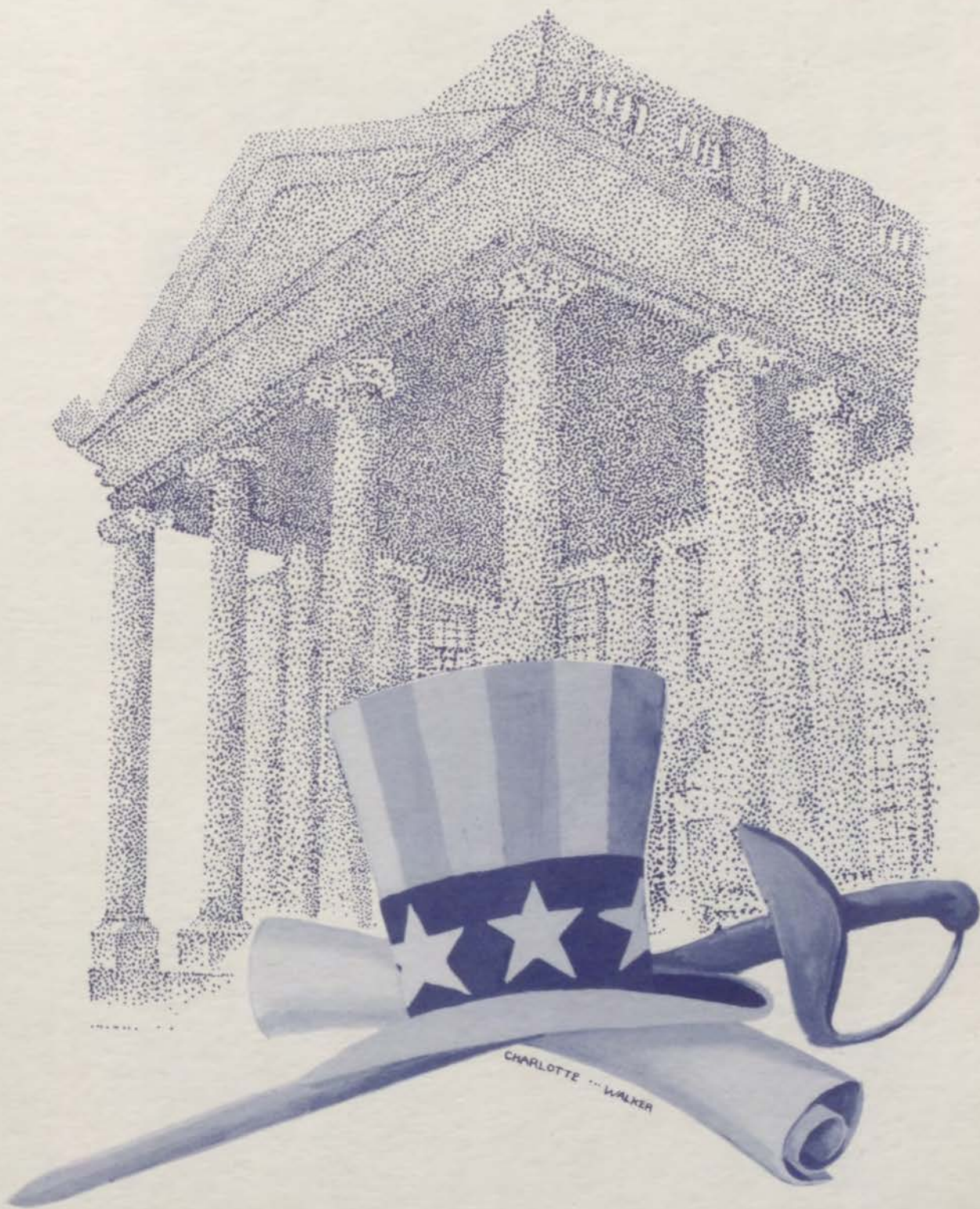


The White Book

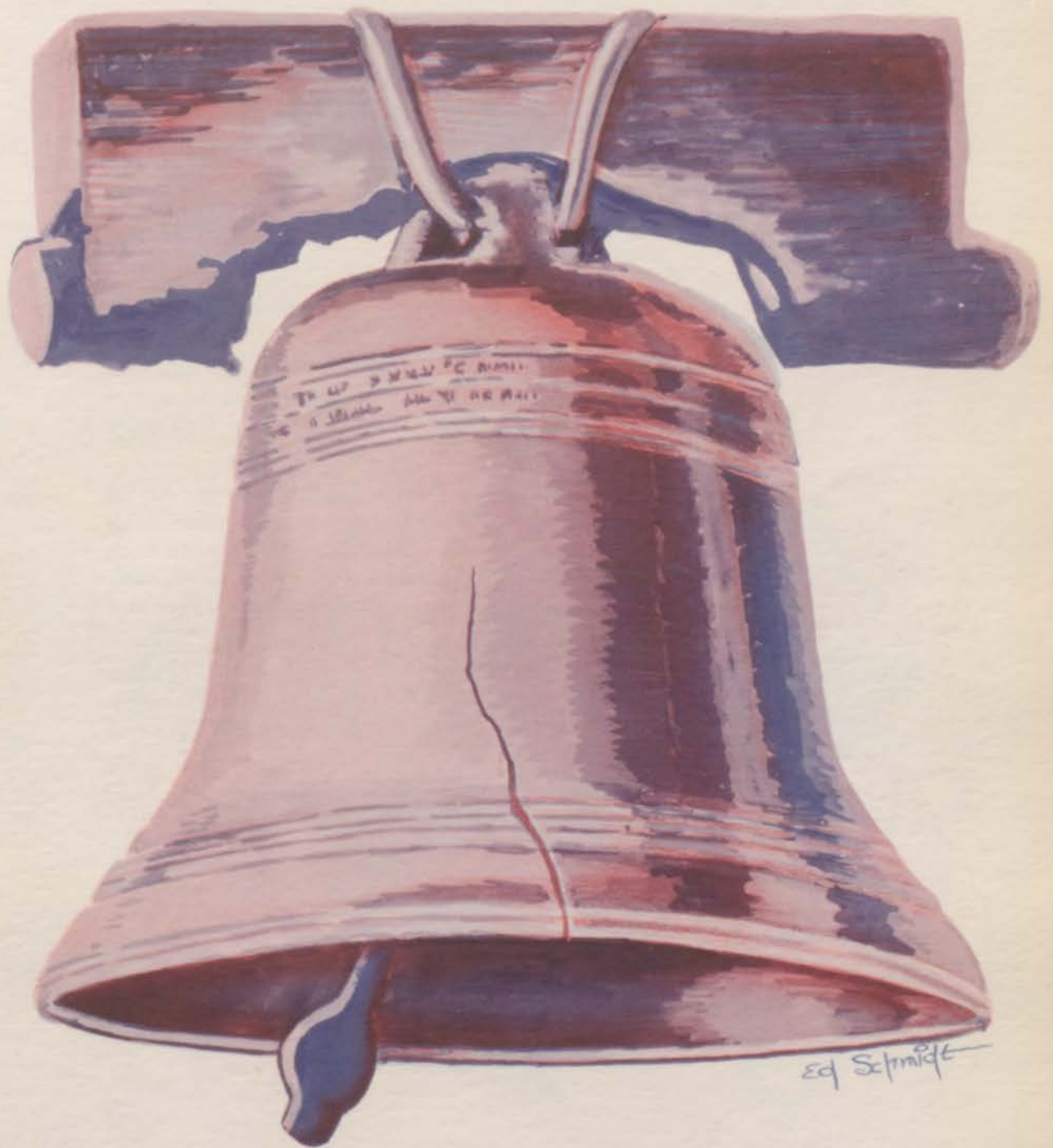

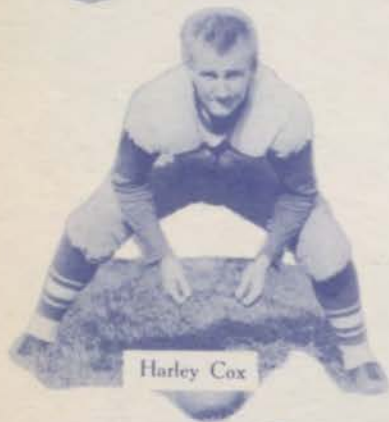
FOOTBALL

Verifying pre-season dope, the 1940 Blue Eagle squad again brought home a championship to Central. Around five returning lettermen, Coach Slaymaker built a fast and powerful team, which finished with a record of six victories and a lone defeat. After the first few weeks of hot, autumn practice began to have its conditioning effects, the squad settled down to the serious business of skull practice and dummy scrimmage and punting drills. And with the practice came the realization that this year's team would be hard to beat. Still not in top form, but with a determination to avenge last year's defeat, the Eagles journeyed into Kansas where they met the Wyandotte Bulldogs beneath the lights and . . . weight told the story. Surprising their heavier rivals with a quick offensive thrust, the Kingbirds picked up six points when Bud French raced 64 yards down the sidelines. But the Kansans' attack soon started clicking and with two bullet passes set the Eagles back on their heels when the second was caught in the end zone. Another counter was added as they again drove down the field after recovering a fumble. The powerful offense drove on to add still another touchdown, and the game ended with Central on the short end of a 20-12 score. But the experience of that first defeat proved invaluable throughout the season. Playing again at night, disaster threatened repeatedly during the first quarter as a powerful Rockhurst squad drove through the Eagle line in a series of fake spinners and reverses and more than once were within the shadow of the Central goal. Many brave hearts breathed a sigh of relief when they realized the linemen had everything under control and were almost assured of victory when the Eagle offense began clicking at the start of the second period. Alternating the ball, the Kingbird backs drove down to the twenty, from where French, on a well-executed reverse, stepped across the goal. A pass from Jerry Lewis to Jack Morris was completed in the end zone to give the Eagles a 7-0 lead at the half. By holding the Hawks scoreless in the second half, and by scoring again when Bob McDaniel intercepted a pass deep in Rockhurst territory, the squad definitely established itself as of championship calibre.

Entering the Interscholastic race, the Eagles met and defeated East, their supposedly toughest opponent. The final score again established the Eagles three touchdowns better than their opponent and put the Central team in the best physical and mental condition for the game with Northeast . . . which boasted the heaviest line of the league. But a repetition of the two other league encounters was in store the following week. Ripping the touted forward wall to shreds, the Eagles, led by French and Jim Hesler, scored three times in the second quarter and left the field leading 19-0 at the half. The Vikings showed more strength in the last half, holding the winners to a single counter.

Hot tea at the half helped no end, but still neither team could consistently gain ground by running, and numbed fingers merely deflected several good passes. Ward and Scanlon kicked the ball back and forth, mostly between the 30 yard lines. But kicks too can provide thrills, and when Ward fumbled an enemy punt, French came to the rescue. Scooping up the bounding ball, he raced sixty yards down the sidelines for the final score of the season. Two minutes later the gun barked the result. Central 13, Westport 0.

This game marked the end of the high school careers of Herb Sarver, Jack Morris, and Chuck Ward—two regulars and a top-notch reserve. Cramer Sinks a Free Throw

The Manual affair seemed like the tale from the story book with twice the excitement. Central got off to a good start and led by several points at the end of the half. But a determined Manual quintette came back on the court and the fourth quarter opened with the red team leading 27-26. From there on out the lead see-sawed back and forth until, with a couple of minutes to go, Central led 30-29. The play went from one end of the court to the other, but each time a shot was made by either team the ball seemed to roll tantalizingly around the hoop and fall

outside. Two fouls were called on Manual—we missed one. Again play—the score tied—and in the midst of the furious foray another foul was called. Twelve seconds remained, when McHenry sent the winning point through the hoop. Everyone was in a state of collapse except Coach Guemple, who realized something had to be done in a hurry to bolster our weakened defense.

The Eagles drowned all the prophecies of their critics when they came through the following Friday with a 46-25 win over Northeast. It looked as if the Manual scare had just been an "off" night for the Blue and White, and almost everyone was again willing to accept Central and Westport, who had not yet lost a game, as virtual co-champions.

But came the unexpected. With a water tight defense the Paseo Pirates defeated the Eagles. Everything went wrong! The shorter Pirate forward completely outplayed and outjumped and outran the Eagle aces. Out of nineteen free throws Central hit only seven. Most discouraging was when McHenry, leading league scorer, fouled out at the end of the first half after failure to make a point. The Eagle aces couldn't hit the basket from afar, and they couldn't penetrate Paseo's man-to-man defense. The Pirates could shoot from anywhere on the court and split the meshes, it seemed. That 39-29 defeat was a heartbreaker—and it left Westport, undefeated, in possession of first place.

The chances of a championship tie were kept feebly alive the following week as our high-scoring but weak-defensive Eagle crew edged out a 39-35 victory over a fighting Southwest squad.

If we could win the next game with Westport, we would tie them for the title. But we didn't. Led by Kirk Albright, Bert Hall, and John Scanlon, the Tigers rolled in 34 points to our 22 to take the game and capture undisputed possession of the crown.

News came the following Sunday that Floyd McHenry, leading scorer of the league, and Bud French, who was third highest, had received positions on the mythical all-star five.

As second place holders, the Eagles were sent to St. Louis to play the second place team of the interscholastic league there. With fast play and a good defense, the Blue and White was again held aloft—Central 34, Beaumont 27.

TRACK

Indications seem to point to a successful track season at Central. With a supply of six returning lettermen from the squad of a year ago, versatile Coach Slaymaker will have experienced boys around which to build a potentially high point-making team. Hitting the cinders about the middle of March, all good prospects have had time to round pretty well into shape, but it will take some stiff competition to show what this 1941 squad can really do.

The Blue and White started off the season in fine style when the relay team took first place in the annual A. A. U. meet in the Municipal Auditorium. Bob Wren, running in the sixty yard dash, handily won that event.

The interclass meet soon followed, with the lettermen showing up well, as expected. In the dashes Bud French was second only to Bob Wren, the captain of this year's team, and there is a good chance some record may be broken before the season is over by one of these two. Jack Finley clears the bar at ten and a half feet consistently in the pole vault, while Bob Bura among others will carry our chances in the high jump. The 100 and 200 yard hurdles events should be well executed by reliable Floyd McHenry. "Mac" was one of the few consistent point winners on last year's squad. Although Joe Potter and Harold Sankey both return from 1940, there will be

some very tough competition before the starters in the quarter and half mile races have been decided. John Brosnahan, Bruce Goshorn, and Don Jameson all look strong in these events. Surprises are constantly coming up. Early in the season, Hal Cramer ran the 440 in 55.5 seconds, which is pretty near a record, and is especially noticeable as most of the members of the team round into top form only two or three weeks before the season closes.

Orville Jarman is coming along well in the shot put. He and Bud French, who heaved the sphere last season, should bring home some valuable points.

It looks as if this may really be the year for the Central track squad. With a good supply of lettermen, lots of experience and some promising talent, the Blue and White will undoubtedly make a heavy bid for the track crown.

The years come and go at Central, and as they do the fortunes of its teams go up and down. Boasting of a championship football team, a title contender in the basketball race, and good prospects for the track season, Centralites may well be proud of the record some members of their class have made.

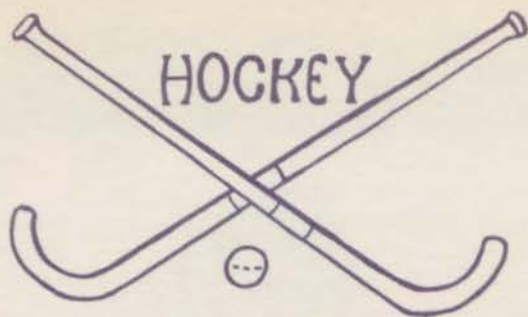

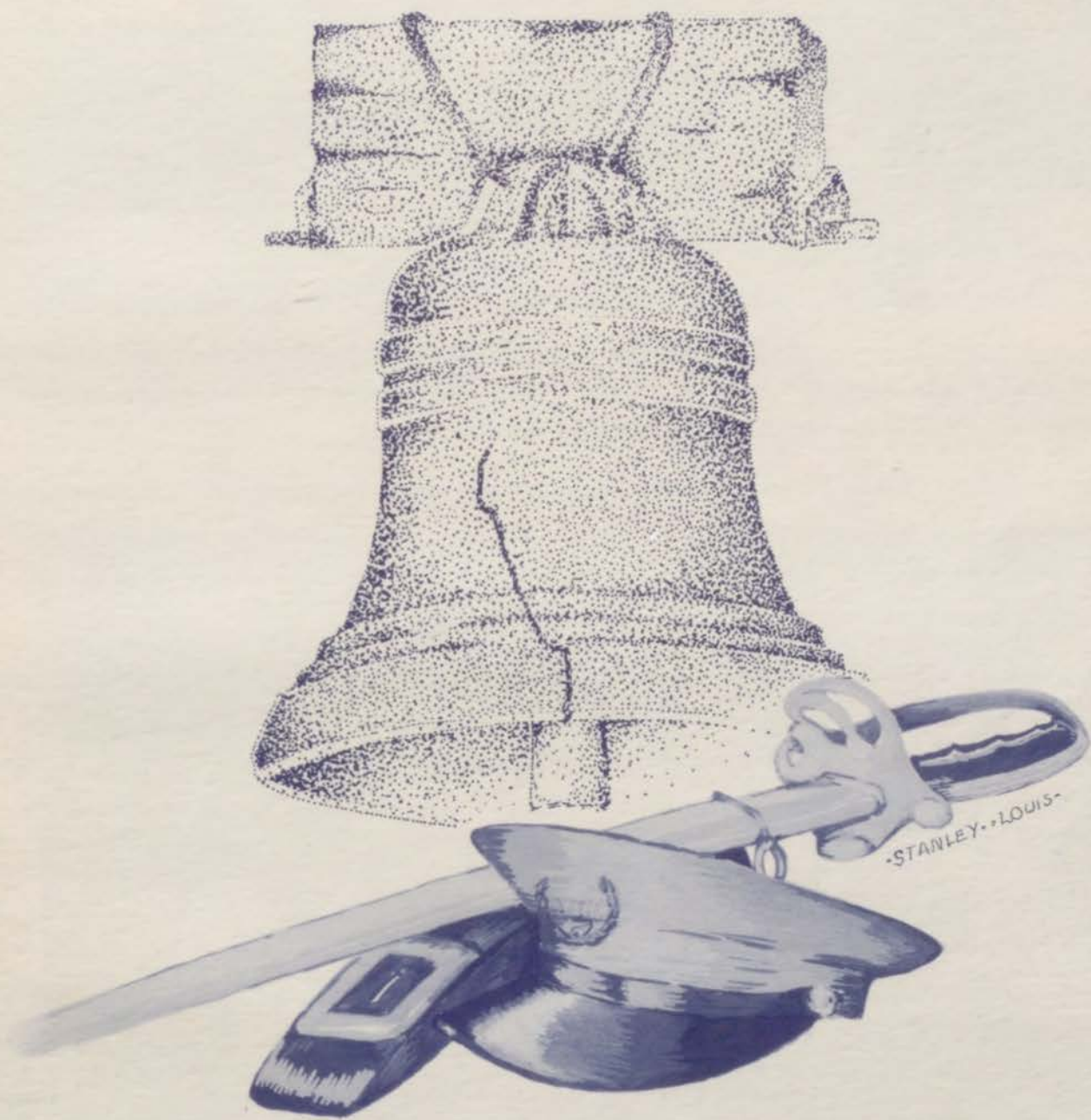

R. O. T. C.

In September, 1940, the Battalion of Blue and White dusted out of moth balls, not only uniforms, but the theories and practices of R. O. T. C.

Competition sharpened the wits of contenders when tests were given to determine who would be commissioned as officers to undertake the responsibilities of leadership. When all was settled, the first promotion list of the year bore the following names as Second Lieutenants: H. E. Adams, Don Anderson, Dick Ballantyne, Earl Beiser, Phil Beiser, John Egelston, Lawrence Jaben, Jimmy Leavitt, Willis Lee, Bob Lemon, John McGuire, and Edward Rigby.

As 1940 showed promise of being a history-making year for Central, the R. O. T. C. struck out to contribute its part to the glory. They originated a new idea, the informal "Cadet Party." This experiment was a huge success and, added to the formal Ball of March 22, put the Army on the map socially.

In the test given to Cadet Majors, Howard Shryock came up to the hopes and expectations of the Central Battalion and was appointed to the coveted position of Cadet Colonel, to head the Kansas City Regiment January 31, 1941. In the meantime, Dick Ballantyne, John Egelston, Jimmy Leavitt, and Bob Lemmon had been promoted to the rank of Captain.

At the start of the second semester the need for new officers became apparent because of graduations and promotions. After careful selection John Egelston was made Major; H. E. Adams and Phil Beiser were made Captains; Bob Berry, Dan Bartlett, Bill Cosgrove, Bill Fetting, Larry Fitzhugh and O. T. Smith were promoted to Second Lieutenants. Larry Fitzhugh was made Battalion Adjutant.

On March 22 the R. O. T. C. held its annual formal "Hop," with a crowd of over one hundred couples dancing under red, white, and blue streamers to the strains of Les Copley and his swing band. The 1941 "Hop" was an occasion not to be forgotten. Beverly Bash was named as Queen; Ann Florance and Jean Trautwein, Aides.

Plans are now being made for the annual R. O. T. C. Circus and for Field Day. This book goes to press with a wish that their highest hopes may be realized.

AMERICA OF TOMORROW

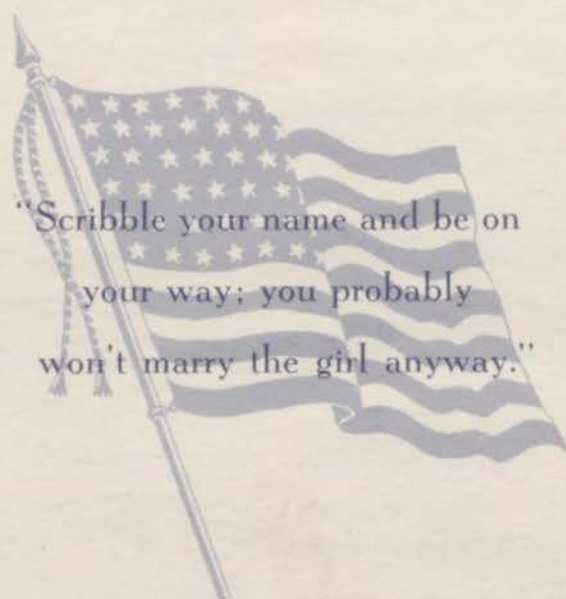
