COMMEMORAMOS



On November 18, Central students learned, in an impressive memorial service, of the death of Miss Beaumont during the summer vacation on Sunday, August 10. Miss Beaumont had suffered from a heart difficulty for many years and had been compelled to take a leave of absence on several occasions. During her extended period of illness, she was constantly making plans to return to her classes in shorthand and typing. To continue her work at Central was her most cherished wish.

Miss Beaumont was one of a family of old settlers in St. Joseph, Missouri, where her family had been engaged actively in the business and political life of the town. She came to Kansas City twenty-three years ago to accept a position in Central High School. For several years before her illness, she

was head of the Shorthand and Typing Department.

During several of her summer vacations, Miss Beaumont enjoyed attending the University of California at Los Angeles and the University of Wisconsin. She had traveled in Europe, in the eastern and southern parts of the United States, and was looking forward to another trip to the Pacific Coast. On her travels she was interested primarily in the life of the people, their habits and customs.

Although Miss Beaumont was known to only a few students of the 1942 senior class, she will be remembered by the many former students who had loved and admired her and will long be missed by members of the faculty.



Students and teachers alike were shocked November 12 to learn that their friend, Miss Hammond, had died during the night; yet they were glad that she could take leave of the world as she would have wished, quietly in her sleep and after a pleasant evening with a former pupil. For fifteen years Miss Hammond had watched over Central students with hearing and speaking difficulties. She was their teacher and friend, not only helping them in time of need at school and at home, but keeping in touch with many of them for years after graduation. Her broad interests, genuine humanity, and genial temper made her also a treasured friend of the faculty members.

Miss Hammond was born in Olathe, Kansas, where her father was superintendent of a school for the deaf. She taught in the same school until 1921 when she began her work of helping the hard-of-hearing at Madison School. She then came to Central and Central Junior, dividing her time each day between the two schools where she helped her special students to adjust to the difficulties of high school classes and activities. The influence of her good life lives on after her.



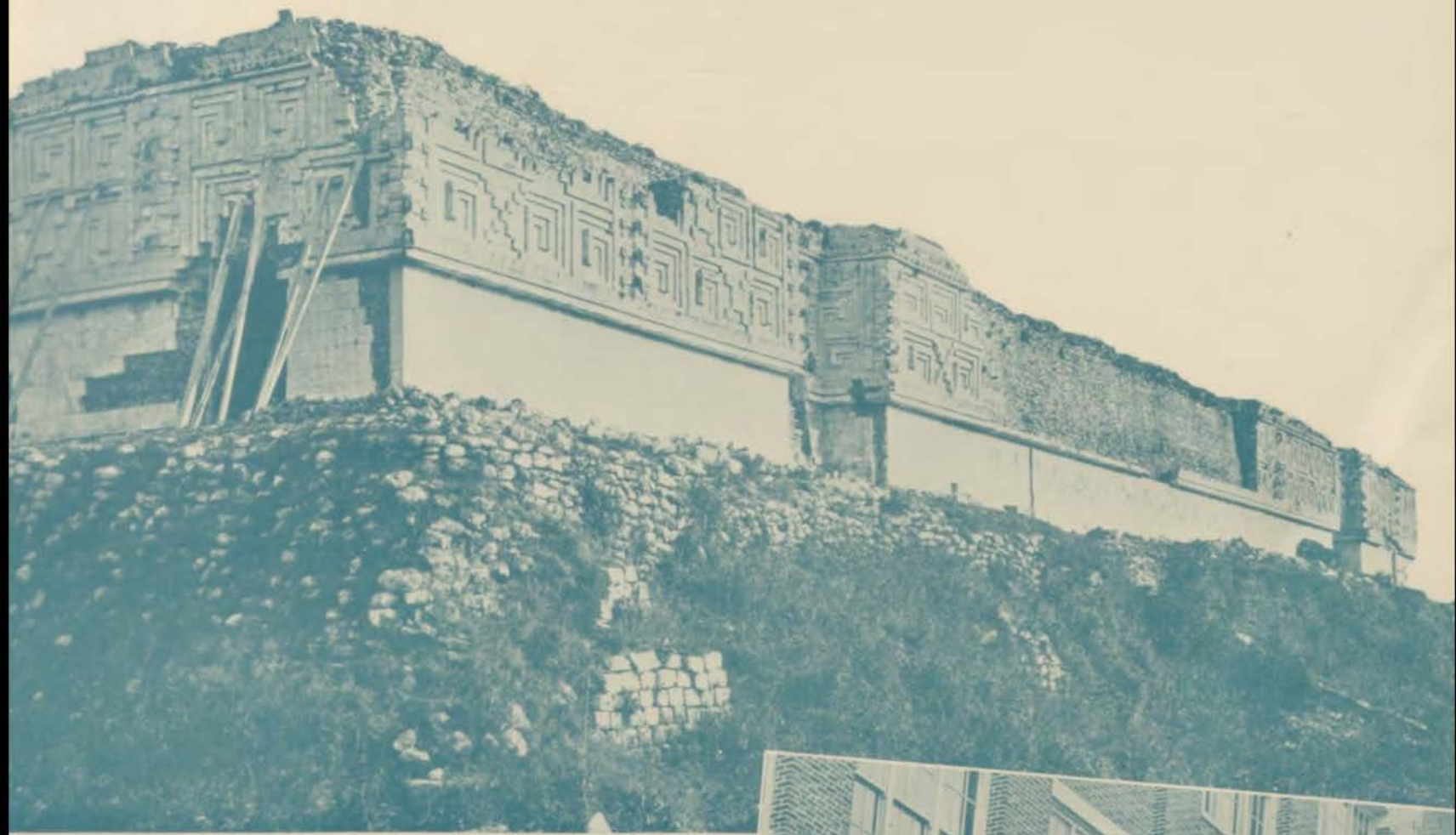

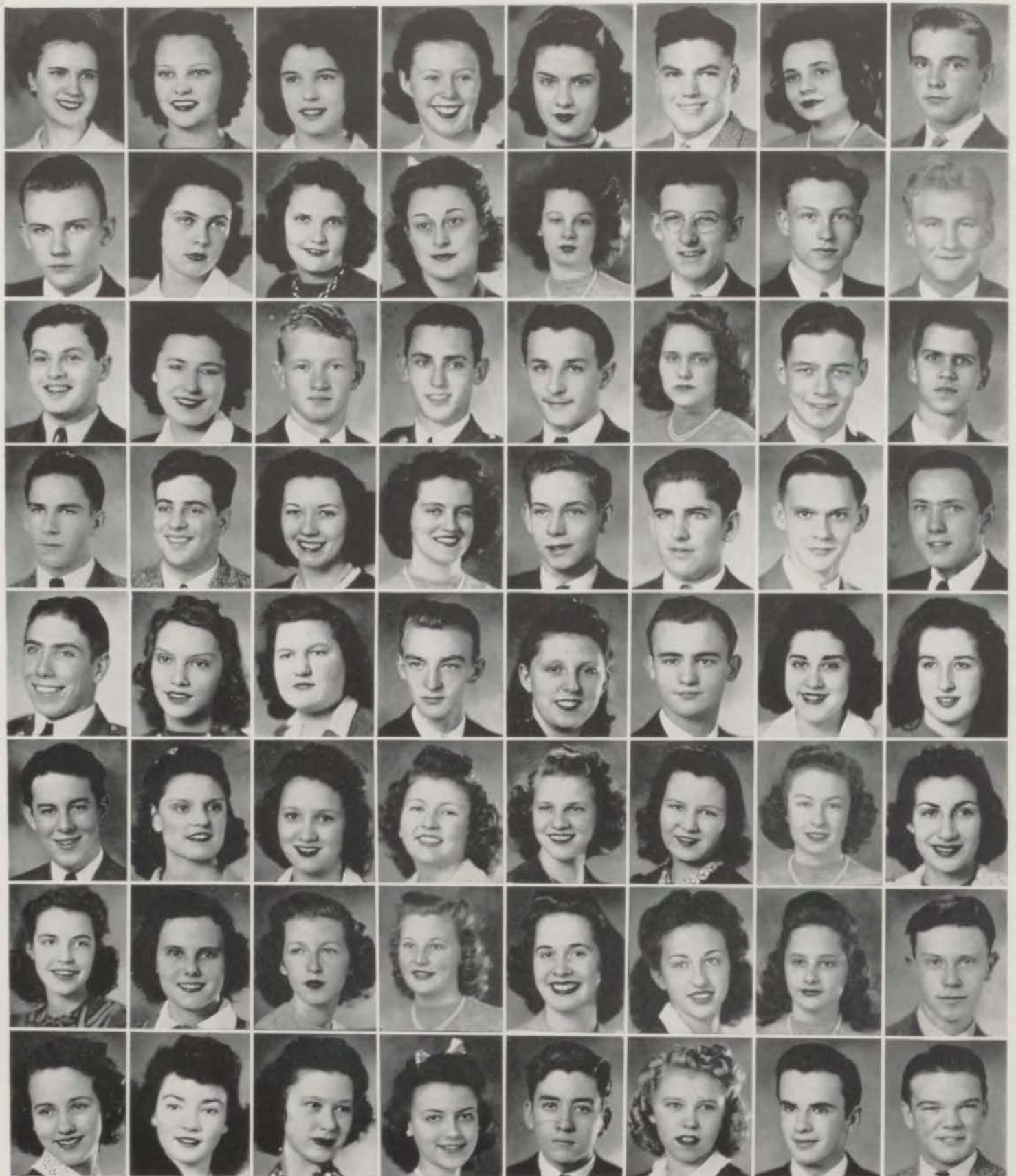

Hal Cramer, with eleven points, led the Eagles to a victory over the Ward Cyclones, 29-22.



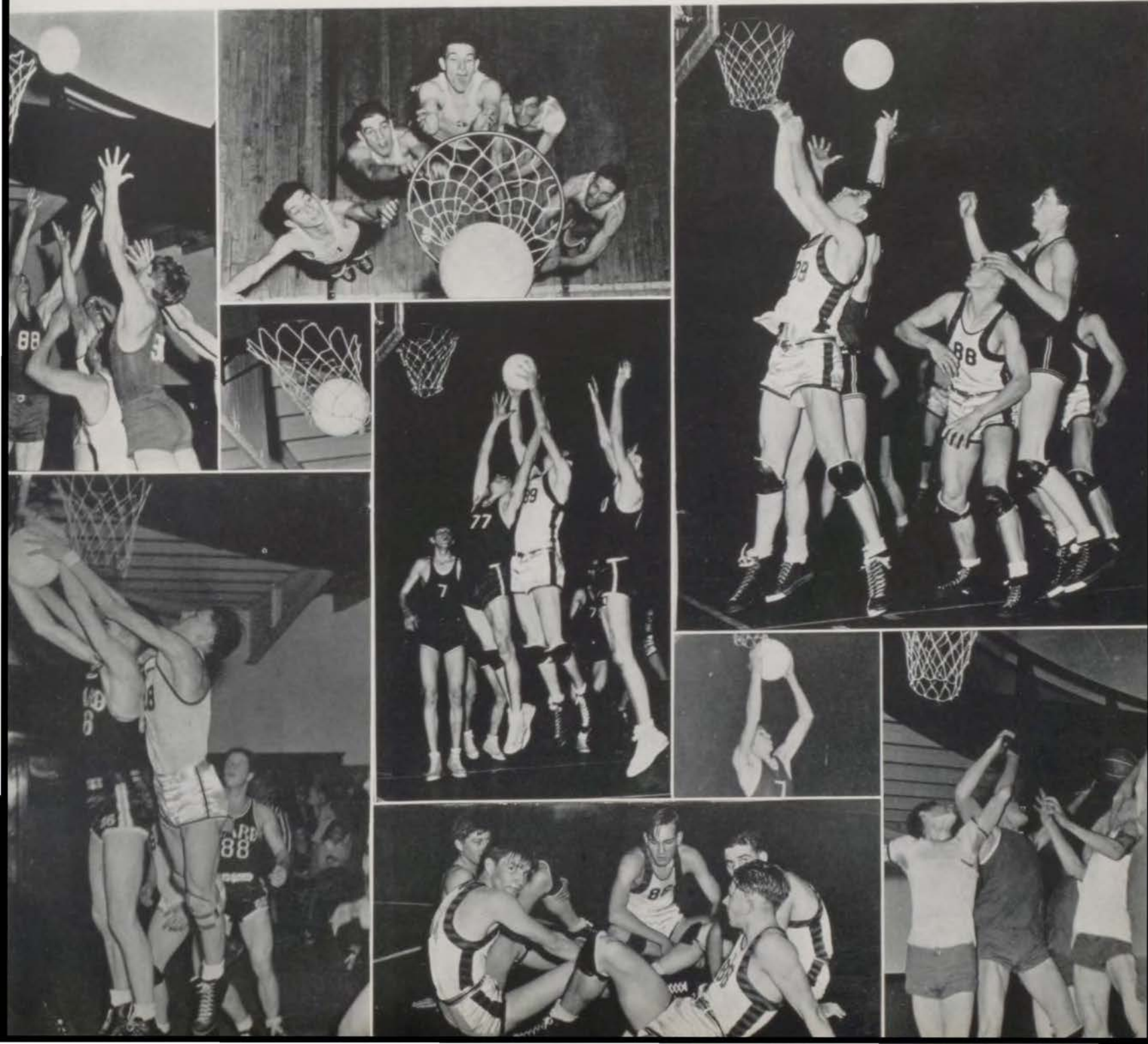

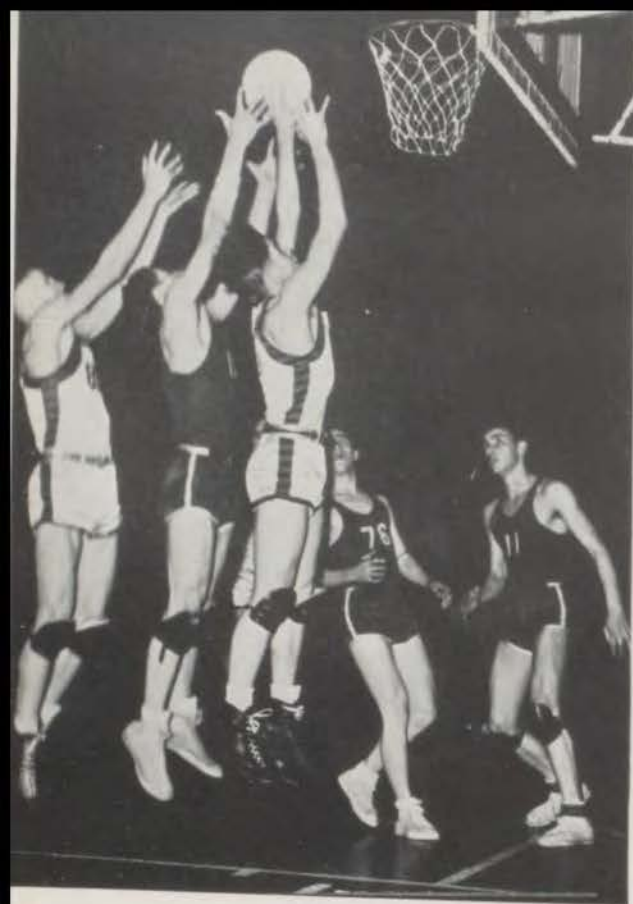

William Chrisman was the next foe and Central, with both French and Welsh scoring eight points from the field, took home another win to the tune of 27-19.

The Blue Eagles next opened the Interscholastic League season by being handed a surprise defeat, 24-28, at the hands of the clever-passing East Bears. Although Central led throughout most of the first half, Nelson and Hart started putting them in from way out and sewed up the game when they poured three points through the hoop just before the final gun sounded.

Central came back the next week with blood in its eye to set a new 1942 scoring record and to set Manual back on its heels with a 45-29 defeat. Thirty-two fouls were committed in one of the hardest fought games of the year.

Led by big Kenny Bounds, who scored fourteen points, Northeast's Vikings avenged a stunning football setback to hand out a 23-28 defeat to Central. One bright spot in the game, however, was Martin's five consecutive points to put Central back in the running midway in the fourth quarter.

For the second straight week Central set a new record as Hal Cramer swished the nets for nineteen points to lead Central to a 32-14 win over Paseo.

With a 19-13 lead at the half, Southwest unleashed a brilliant attack which netted nineteen points before the period ended and flashed an impenetrable defense to hold the Eagles to only one point. Southwest held its lead and came out with a 38-30 win.

Inaccuracy at the free throw line cost Westport a win over Central as Westport sank only five charity tosses to Cen-

tral's twelve. It was anybody's game up until the last few seconds, but the Eagles came out victorious 20-19.

At the next game seven seniors wore the Blue and White for the last time and did a very good job. Led by McHenry and Welsh, the Blue Eagles trounced the Southeast Knights 34-21. Bud French got four markers to help compile a season's total of sixty-four points to lead the league.

Then came the good news. French had been elected to the All-Star team for the second straight year, and Cramer was the center on the All-Star second team.

It was a good team, always out there giving its best, and that's what counts. It's a team we've a right to be proud of.
