After having served eight years as supervisor of art in Independence, Mo., Miss Coah Henry came to Central in 1910. Mr. Cammack was its principal at that time and Mr. Dubach came to teach history. When Mr. Cammack was made Superintendent of Schools, Mr. Holmes succeeded him, and Miss Henry worked with him until 1920 when Mr. Dubach became principal. She was head of the Art Department throughout his administration and had one year under Mr. Clement's principalship, retiring in July, 1946.

Besides these years of successful teaching and making of friends with administrators, teachers and many boys and girls in Kansas City, she had won recognition as an artist and has so established herself. She is indeed outstanding in her chosen field. She was a member of Women Writers and Sculptors of New York and many of her paintings have been exhibited in New York, Chicago and Washington, D. C., as well as in various local centers.

We wish Miss Henry much joy and success during her time of leisure. With her keen sense of humor and ready wit, she will continue to paint colorful memories upon the hearts of those with whom she comes in contact.



As a part of the largest youth organization in the world, the Central chapter of the Junior Red Cross has had a very active year under the leadership of the Junior Red Cross Council. This council, organized in September, is composed of one representative from each home room. Duane Zook is president of the council and Joy Reese, the secretary.

Sixty-three educational gift boxes were filled in October for children overseas. In December, thirty-nine Christmas boxes went from Central to our hospitalized veterans in Excelsior Springs and Wadsworth. Five thousand nine hundred seals were sold in the annual sale of Tuberculosis Seals, and the members of the Junior Red Cross

Council also assisted in the chest X-ray project, undertaken for the first time this year at Central.

In the annual enrollment for service, Central students contributed \$658.36, the third largest amount given by a public school. This money goes into a service fund which is used to carry on the rehabilitation of children abroad, to provide gifts and holiday articles for our soldiers at home and overseas, and to sponsor a convalescent home for rheumatic fever patients here in Kansas City.

Thus the Junior Red Cross remains mobilized in spirit, even though the war emergency has passed. It is a powerful force for better world understanding, an important factor in meeting needs at home.



Opening the 1946 football season, the Central Blue Eagles brought forth a small but spirited squad, and with only three returning lettermen and two weeks of practice, sought to take on the Wyandotte Bulldogs.

Central, the dark horse of the league, held a heavier Wyandotte foe to a slim 7 points. In the waning minutes of the game, Central drove within 3 yards of a touchdown, but dropped a hard football game, 7-0.

Seeking revenge and entering Interscholastic League competition, the Eagles were entertained by the Paseo Pirates the next week end. After penalties and bad breaks, Jerome Willingham, Eagle quarterback, raced around left end in the second quarter for a 6-0 lead at the half. Soon becoming overconfident, the Eagles let down, and Paseo came back to tie it up with a long desperation pass into the end zone. The teams finished the game near the 50 marker in a 6-6 deadlock.

Still seeking a victory, the Eagles drove across five touchdowns against a lighter Southeast squad. The first two were called back on penalties, while the third touchdown and the first actual score came when Carl Brown blocked a Knight kick and recovered the ball in the end zone. Two more touchdowns were accounted for by Clarence Darrah, with the assistance of Junior Wren. Southeast scored once to make it a 21-7 ball game for Central.

The up and down ways of the Blue Eagles were definitely on the up the next week end, when the Manual Cardinals were trounced 26-7. With Darrah, Webster and Wren scoring the touchdowns, everything was definitely in favor of Central. Playing a fine defensive game were Jim and Claude Brown, who allowed the Cardinals only a few yards.

With a championship thought in mind, the Eagles were pitted against the league-leading Southwest Indians, but the Indians left the stadium remaining the league leaders after crushing Central 26-0. Bad breaks, faulty blocking and carelessly thrown passes turned the tide against the Eagles.

Luck still against them, the Blue Eagles fought second-place Northeast to a 26-7 loss. Although leading 7-6 at the start of the fourth period, the Eagles were first to be exhausted and three rapid touchdowns by the Vikings made Susie and Sonny Centralite very unhappy.

Definitely rated as a team on which one couldn't make predictions, Central came back the next week to dish out a 26-0 defeat to the Bears of East High. Using a passing attack, Darrah scored three touchdowns while J. Willingham waltzed 45 yards on a punt return for another 6 points. On the receiving end of most of the passes were Clarence Darrah and Carl Brown, while Jim Brown, Bill Savidge and Claude Brown displayed All-Star talent in playing a brilliant defensive game, allowing East to gain only 3 yards from scrimmage.

The Central Eagles, in third place, ended the season with the Westport Tigers, in probably the most thrilling and exciting game of the year. Westport scored first when Nate Apple returned a Central punt 30 yards for a 6-0 lead, which advanced the ball to Westport's 15-yard stripe to set up Central's only touchdown. Ken Webster then threw a pass to Clarence Darrah in the end zone to tie up the game 6-6. Near the end of the game Westport had the ball on the 2-yard line of Central, when they fumbled and Kenny Webster recovered.

To climax the season Jim Brown received an All-Star rating, while Claude Brown received a second team All-Star rating. Carl Brown, Bill Savidge, Junior Wren and Ken Webster were all given honorable mention.



The 1946-47 Blue Eagles, under Coach Frank Guemple, was without doubt one of Central's outstanding basketball teams. Bolstered by four returning lettermen, Bob Jenkins, Clarence Darrah, Ed Silverman and Ken Webster, the team won the respect of every other basketball team in the city and placed second in the Interscholastic League.

The Blue Eagles led off by downing the Central Alumni, 58-48. Forward Bob Jenkins sparked the attack with fourteen points, while guard Ed Silverman tallied twelve.

In their next game, the Eagles trounced the Blue and Gold of De La Salle to the tune of 41-29. The game was under complete control from the initial gun as Clarence Darrah displayed his speed on the court and "Big Ken" Webster demonstrated his usual outstanding defensive work. "Big Len" Koenigsdorf was the high scorer with thirteen points.

Paced again by Koenigsdorf, the Blue Eagles' towering center, the Central quintet defeated Lillis by a 55-38 score. Koenigsdorf was again high man with five field goals and four charity tosses to total fourteen points.

Central next met the Hogan Rams, downing them by a score of 42-33. Although the Rams led the first half, the Blue Eagle quintet bounced back in the last half and went on to win in easy fashion. Again Koenigsdorf was the leading scorer with sixteen points. After this game Central stood as the only team in the Interscholastic League which had not been defeated in pre-season games.

Central went down to its first defeat at the hands of a powerful Wyandotte five, 43-35. Jenkins paced the Eagles with thirteen points, while Koenigsdorf dropped in seven.

The Eagle quintet, accented by height and speed, had a grand start in league play by handing a 37-24 defeat to the Paseo Pirates. When the final gun sounded, each Eagle starter had six points with the exception of Darrah and Silverman, who had tallied eight.

In the following game the Central five defeated the Manual Cardinals in one of the most thrilling games of the entire season. Silverman and Darrah scored for Central while Webb paced Manual. With the Crimson on the short end of a 49-40 score, the game ended. Darrah led the scorers with sixteen points while Jenkins tallied twelve.

Central took over the Interscholastic League lead the next week by defeating the Southwest Indians, 38-26, in an extremely fast game.

During the first half of a hard East-Central game, the Bears handed the Eagles quite a scare by leaving them on the small end of a 15-14 score at the end of the first half. In the second half Central began to roll as Koenigsdorf, Silverman and Darrah pushed in the buckets. At the end of the game Central was leading, 35-24. Koenigsdorf was again the high scorer for Central, racking up eighteen points, with Darrah and Silverman each getting seven.

Central, although playing an extremely hard game, was nosed out by the Ward Cyclones, 30-29. The Blue Eagles lost the league championship in their next game when they were defeated by the Northeast Vikings. At the end of the first period Central trailed, 13-8. With Webster playing brilliantly on defense, the Vikings were held to one point in the third quarter, while the Eagles dropped in six. The score was tied up 24-24 at the end of the third period. The Vikings, paced by Bob Darnell, rallied in the last quarter and went on to win by a 35-27 score. Darrah and Koenigsdorf scored seven points each for Central.

With but one game left to play, the Blue and White, led by Bob Jenkins, defeated the Westport Tigers, 53-44. At the half-time, Central trailed, 15-22. In the third period each team made nineteen points; Jenkins tallied eight, Koenigsdorf five. During the fourth quarter, Carby, Tiger forward, fouled out of the game, and Central moved into the lead. Bob Jenkins scored a total of nineteen points.


In the last game of the season Central defeated the Southeast Knights, 44-39. Koenigsdorf scored a total of twenty-one points for Central, with Webster and Silverman showing fine defensive play.

The season over, Central ranked in second place in the Interscholastic League standings. Their complete record showed ten wins and three defeats.



TRACK

The spring of 1947 brought forth a very hopeful track season with the return of eight lettermen, one for almost every event.

The first meet of the season was the indoor track meet at the Municipal Auditorium in which Central came through with a fourth place tie. With the help of the eight lettermen, Wayne White, 100- and 220-yard dash man; Carl Brown, low and high hurdler; Everel Crawford, quarter miler; Jerry Holmberg, half miler; Walter Cummmickel, half miler; Clarence Darrah, dash man; Bob Jenkins, pole vaulter, and Joe Snare, quarter miler, Central entered in five events and managed to place in two. Carl Brown ran in a close third in the 60-yard low hurdles, while Jerry Holmberg came in second in the half mile, losing only to Breidenthal or Northeast.

Central's track schedule for outdoor meets includes Paseo, Manual, East, Southwest, Southeast, Northeast, the city meet, and then the climax of the season, the state meet. The first meet of the season comes with Paseo April 3, when Central will be well represented in every meet by the return of many lettermen as well as other underclassmen and seniors who will furnish much competition in the interclass meet on March 28-29. Probable representatives in each event will be White and Darrah, 100 and 220 men; Chedester, Brown and Trantham, low and high hurdlers; Crawford, Ozburn and West, quarter milers; Holmberg and Cummmickel, half milers; Jenkins and Russell, pole vaulters; Webster and Wren, shot putters, and Darrah, Brown and White, broad jumpers. With this combination Central has a fine chance of winning the 1947 track championship.

As the new year of 1946-47 got under way, Central's R.O.T.C. Battalion took a hopeful look toward its goals to be realized before the year drew to a close. An entirely reorganized system of instruction was to be followed with many new subjects and weapons introduced.

The battalion was soon organized with M/Sgt. Herman F. Byram taking over as sergeant-instructor from Sgt. Carl Hoffman, who was retiring from the Army. Bob Egelston was appointed battalion commander; Bob Cawby, executive officer; James Watley, adjutant, and William Paradise, Fletcher Anderson and William Weaver comprised the remainder of the battalion staff.

Leading A, B and C companies were Captains Eugene DeLeve, Paul Wilson and Bill Miller, respectively. The seconds-in-command of these companies were First Lieutenants Joe Klassen, Kenneth Harris and Louis Anderson.

Heading the platoons for A Company were Lieutenants Ladd Hersh and William Baldwin; B Company, Lieutenants William Deemie and William Feld, and C Company, Lieutenants Charles Cannady and Bill Inman.

Central's rifle team established and maintained a good record throughout the year. By firing a score of 857, the team placed twenty-first among all R.O.T.C. units in the Fifth Army Area in competition for the William Randolph Hearst Trophy. In city competition the team placed fourth with the top scorers being Arthur Darrow, Glen Heck, Robert Baker, Louis Anderson and Ladd Hersh.

During the second semester the Central R.O.T.C. Battalion formed the Central Rifle Club, a member of the Junior National Rifle Association. Any member of the battalion was eligible for membership.

The social event of the year was the twenty-second annual Military Ball, held February 28, 1947. Miss Janet Marlowe was crowned Queen, with her two aides being Miss Virginia Coen and Miss Joyce Hopkins.

The new War Department program of instruction introduced this year such subjects as the following: World Military Situation, Military Organization, Military Courtesy, Hygiene and First Aid, Leadership, Drill, Exercise of Command, Physical Development, Individual Weapons, Marksmanship, Military History of the United States and Map Reading.

As the year progressed the first test of skills learned was the annual R.O.T.C. Circus held April 18. Next came Government Inspection May 8, and finally, Field Day May 16. These three events were completed with the Eagle cadets doing well, as always.

Thus, another successful year for the Central Reserve Officers Training Corps came to a close.


