The Blue Eagles edged out a determined Southwest eleven in another loop contest at the stadium. Southwest

fumbled the kickoff and six plays later Central scored, with Hasty kicking the all-important extra point. The Indians roared back, by returning the kickoff to pay dirt. The score stood at 7-6 in favor of Central. Southwest scored again to put them in the lead, but Morris, a hard-charging guard, broke through the line and pulled down an "in-the-air" fumble, running 28 yards to score. The game ended with Central threatening and the season ended with a 6-6 tie with Paseo.

John Snapp and Bob Nimmeman were both voted on the All-Star team and Jerome Willingham was given a second team position. Jack Hasty, Bob McManus, Sonny Fair, J. Harold Morris and Elton Lathrop received honorable mention ratings. And so ended another football season at Central High School.

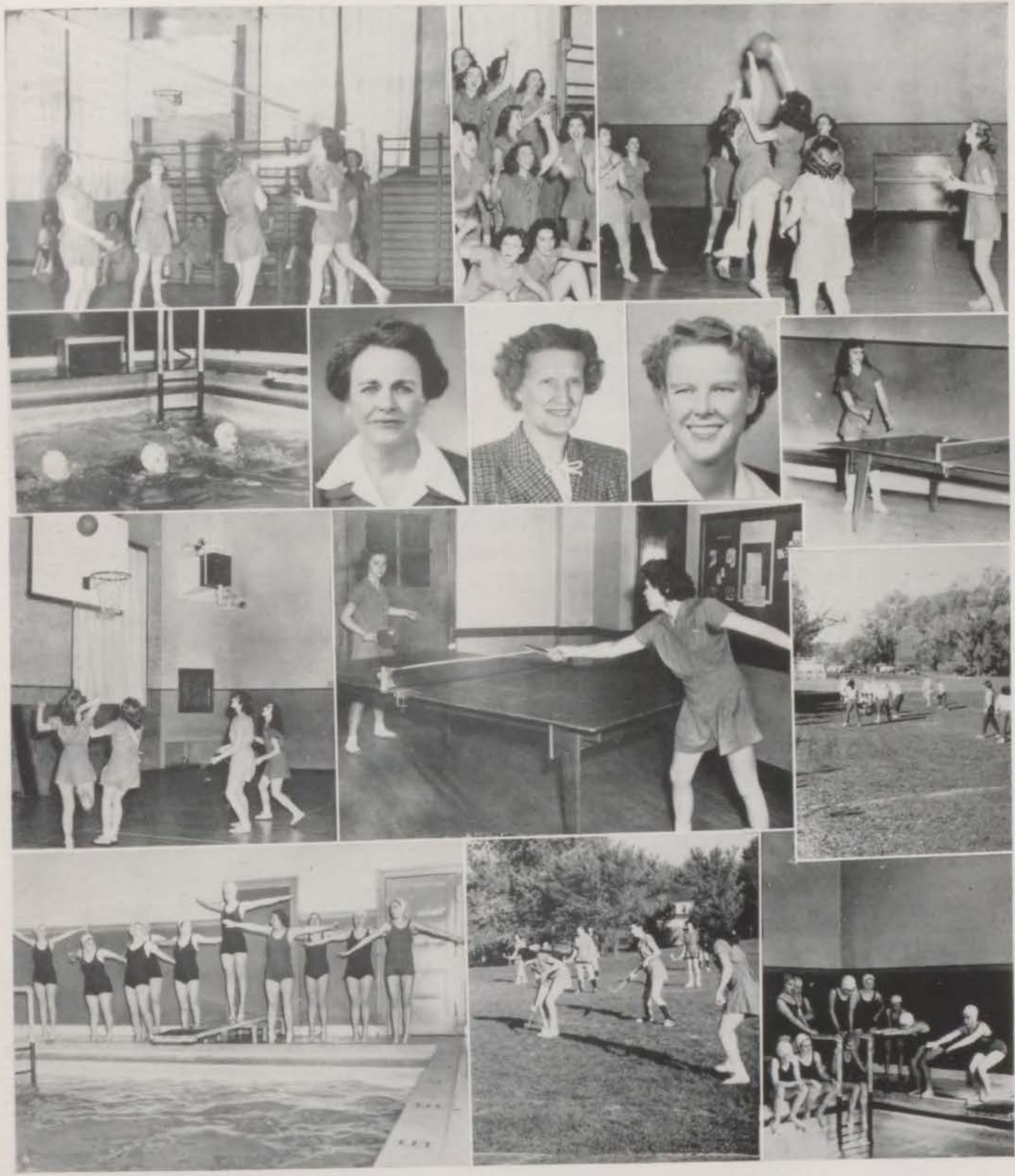

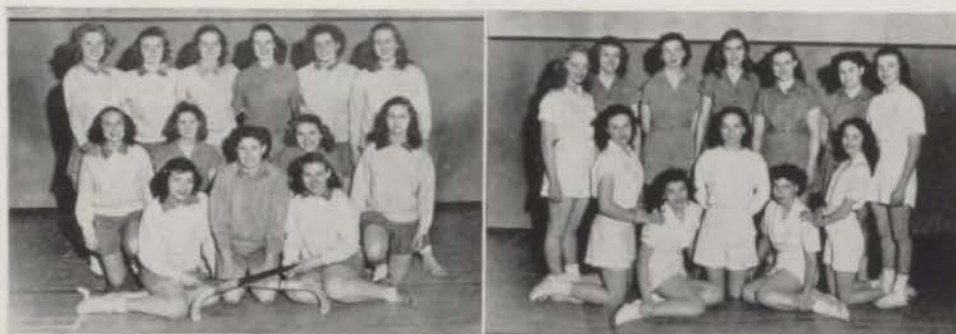
Girls' Sports

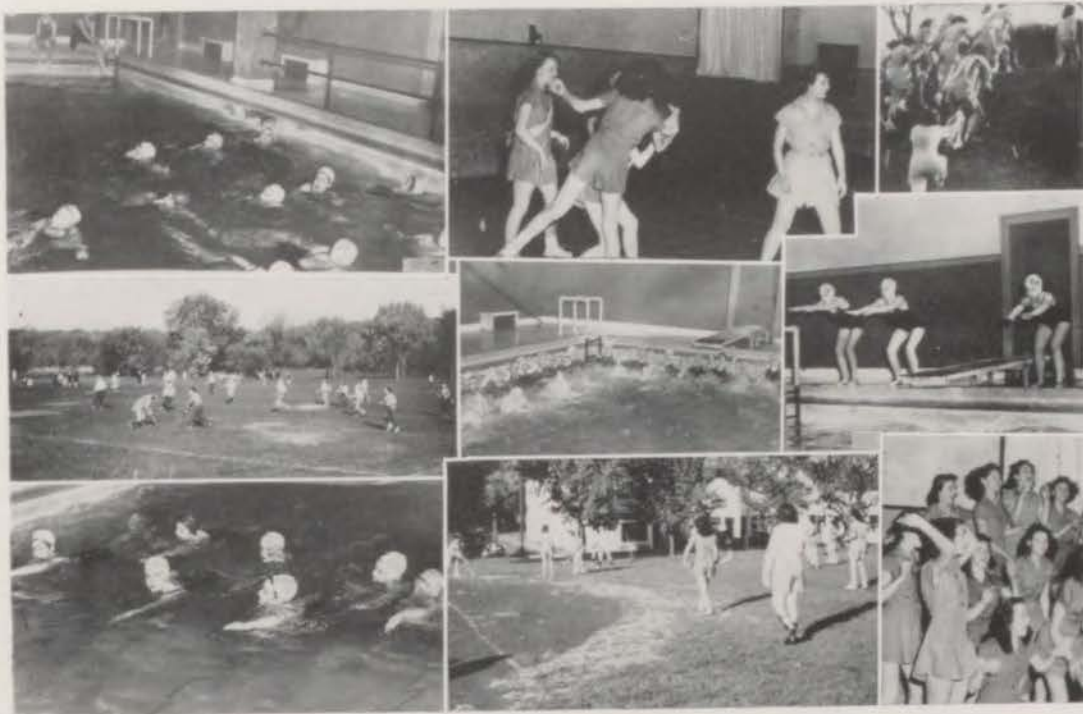

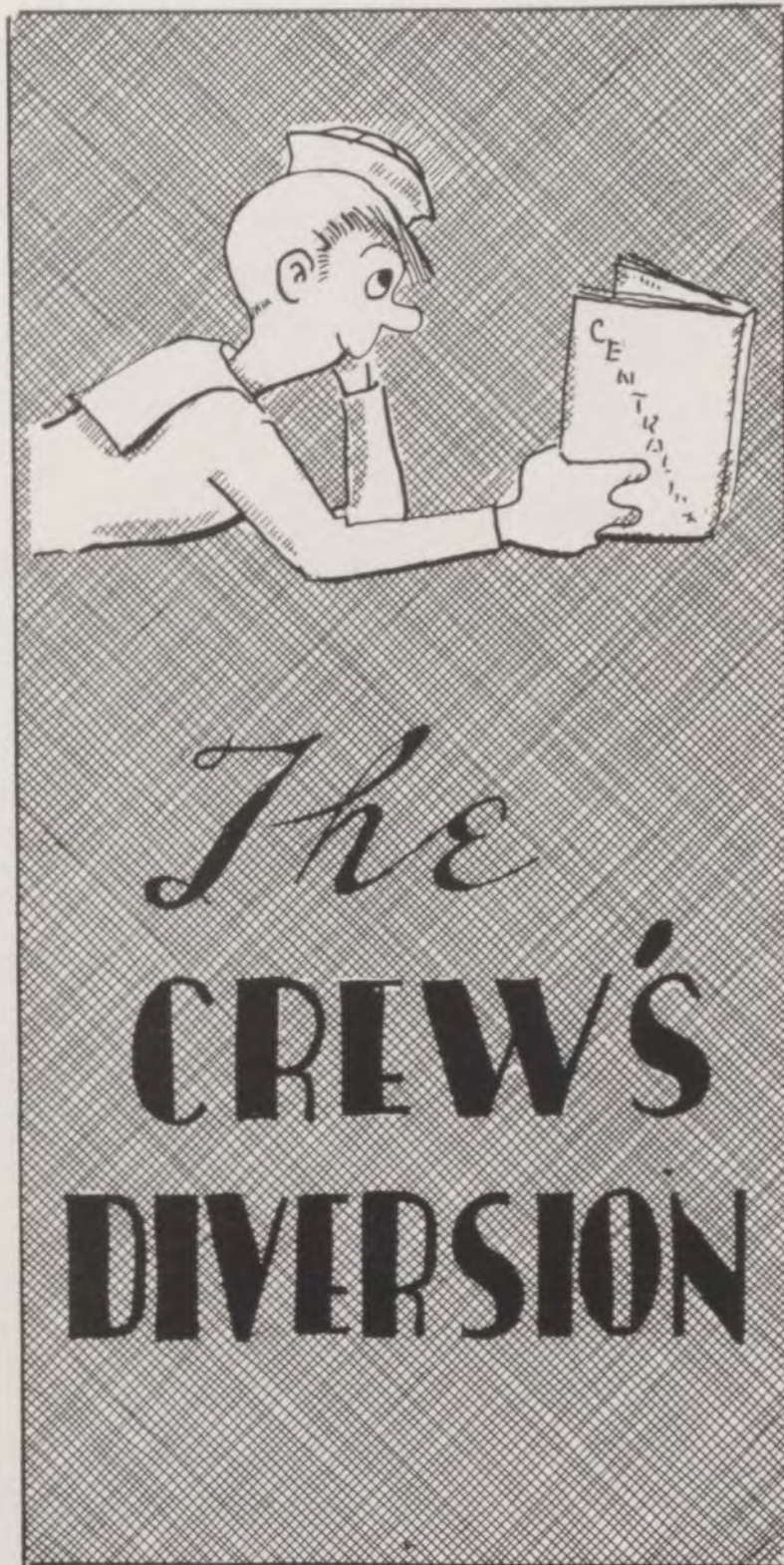

Each battalion in the Kansas City area, along with a drill team from Central High in Omaha, featured their best trained cadets. Central was represented by a World War I platoon drill led by Capt. Robert Baker. Each act received a great ovation, which was truly a welcome reward for the hard work and many weeks of preparation to make the circus the success that it was.

The social event of the year, the twenty-third annual R.O.T.C. Ball, was held at the St. James Recreation Center, 3936 Troost Avenue. The traditional Grand March, the crowning of the Queen, dancing to the music of Warren Durrett and his orchestra, and a performance of snappy precision drill by the drill team from Omaha were featured at the ball. The Queen, Lois Schildknecht, was crowned by her escort, Earle Hapke. The Queen's Aides were Sue Guthrie, escorted by Lt. John Garrigues, and Louise Crowley, escorted by Maj. DeWitt. All this added up to one of the most beautiful balls the Central battalion has ever had.

Government Inspection was held April 30th and Field Day, May 14th. After these last two events, the Central battalion closed shop for the year.
