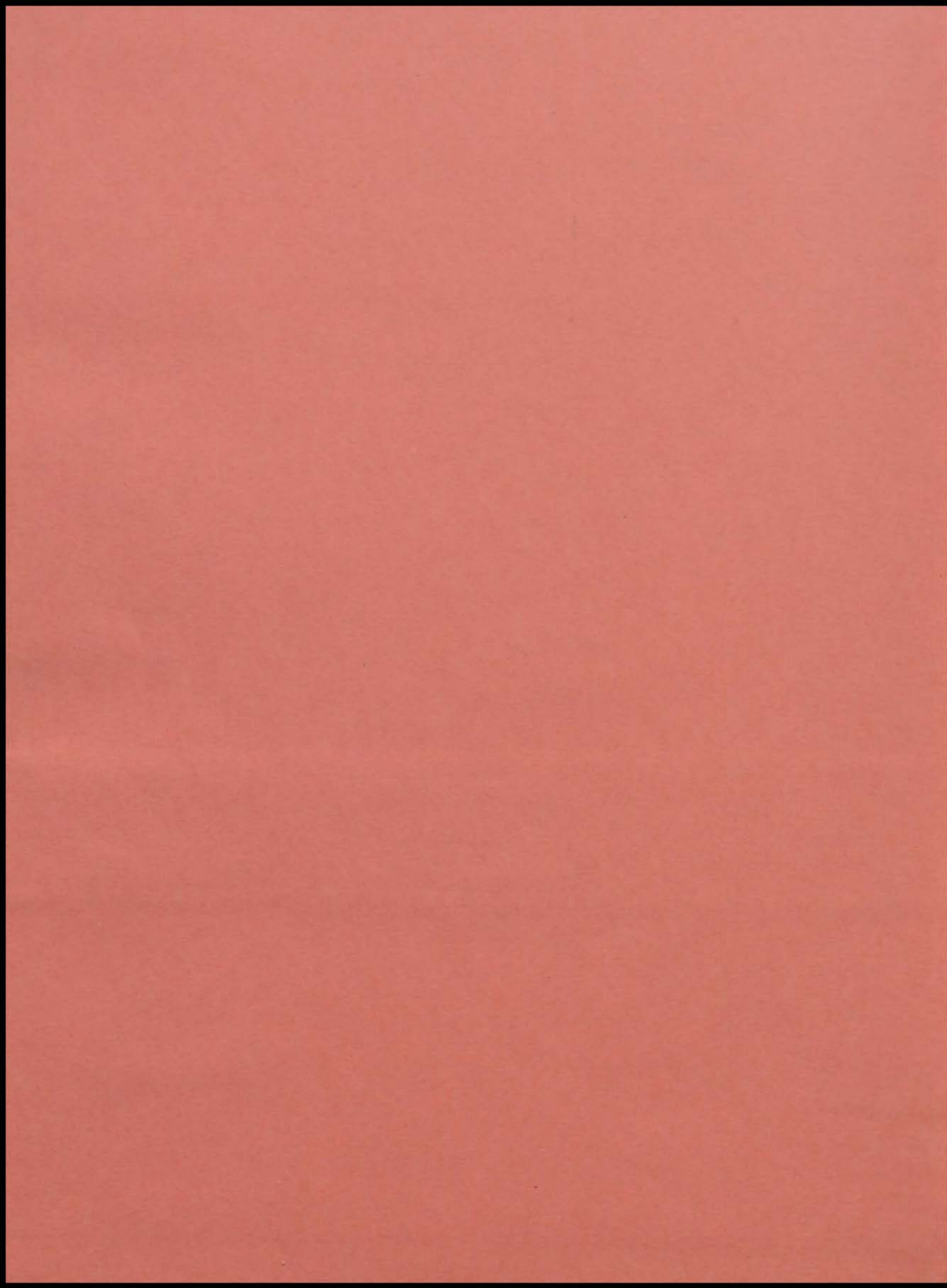

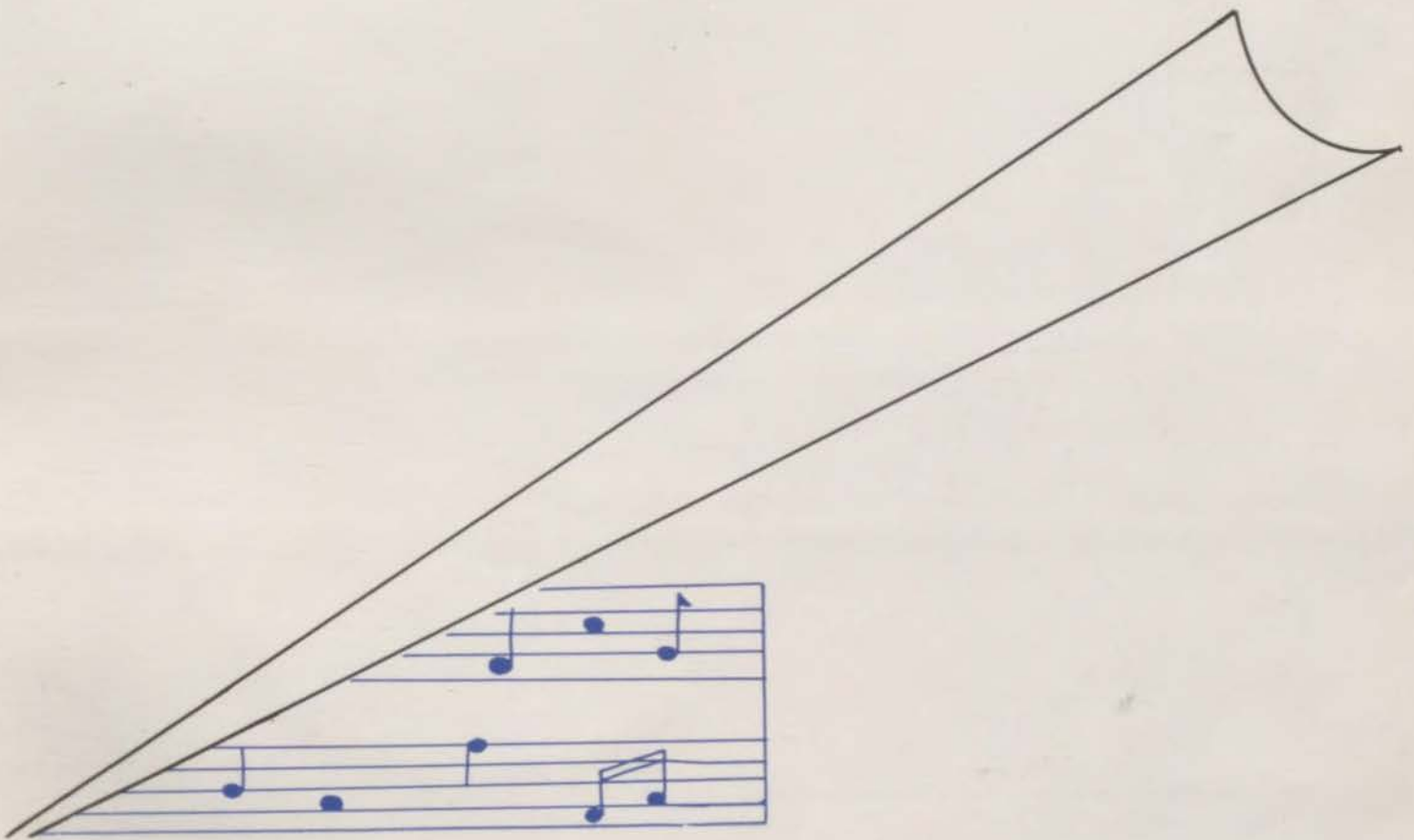

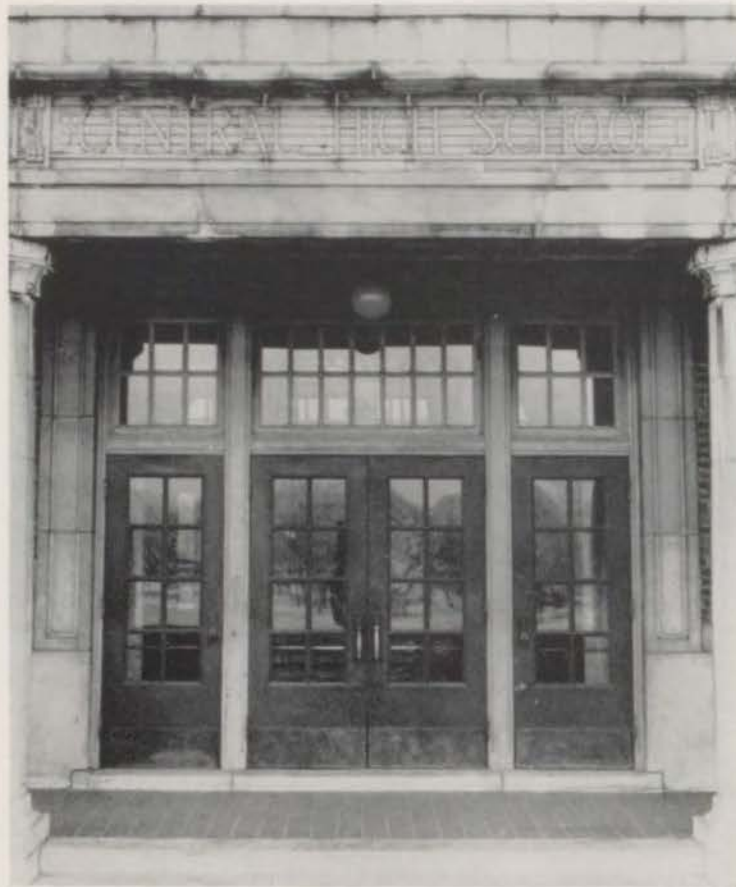

Class of '49, your record has been a gratifying one. Dick Holm carried on the Central "tradition" of winning the presidency of the all-city student council. Shirley Liese shattered precedent by winning the presidency of the local student council, becoming perhaps the first girl to be so honored. Appreciation of student responsibility for the general welfare of the school continues to grow. With the co-operation of the Faculty and of the Parent-Teacher Association, a campaign to secure uniforms for the Band has been prosecuted to what now seems to be a certain successful conclusion. 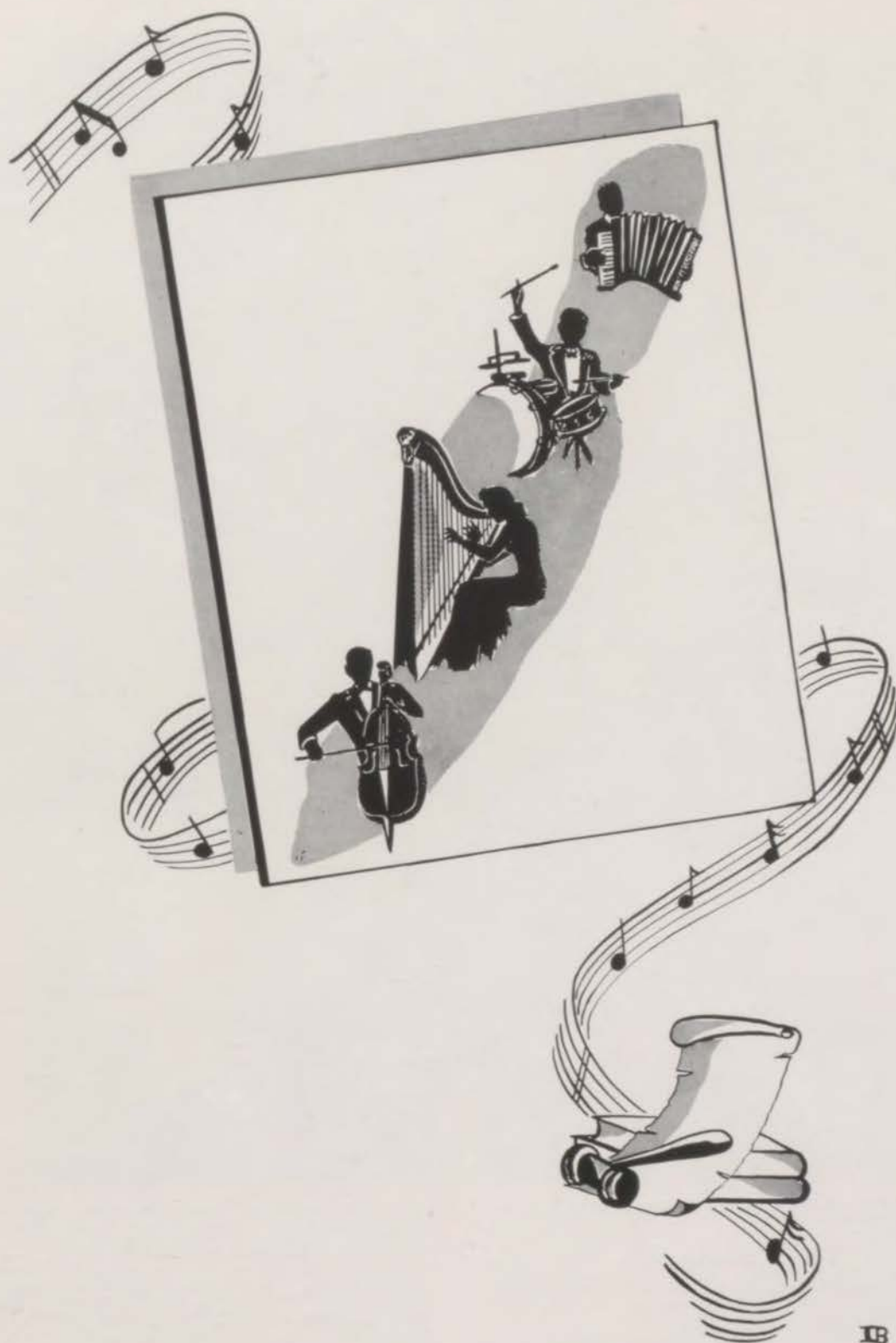

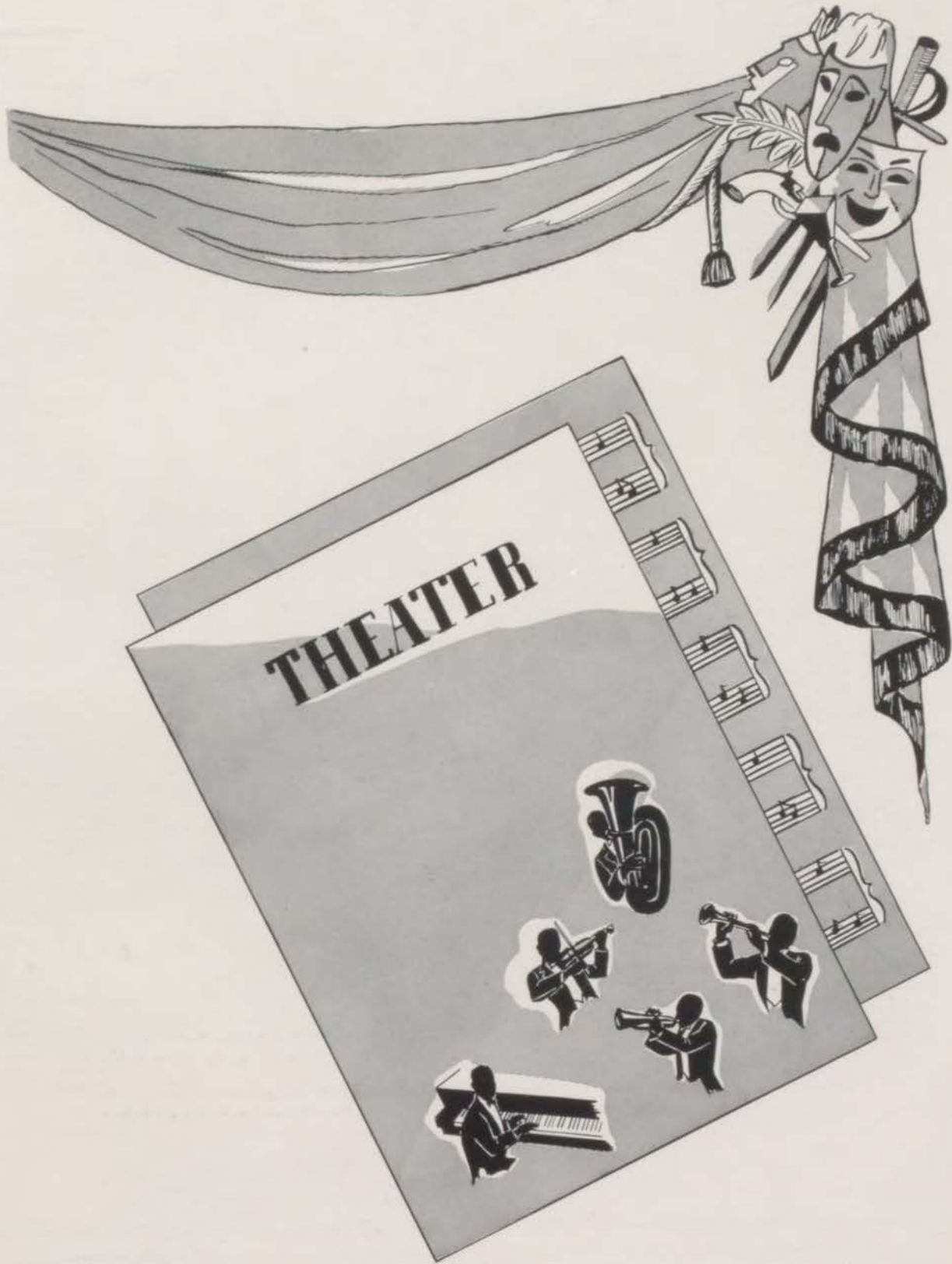

Central's team in action

Although they did not win a game during the 1948 grid season, this year's football team will go down in the records as one of the bravest and most courageous teams ever to take the field in the long Central gridiron history. Though outmanned and outweighed in practically every contest, the Eagles were never outfought. They showed their great fighting spirit as they would constantly come from behind to score on their more experienced opponents.

As the season ended, the Eagles were the most improved team in the league and had they played those early contests over again, they probably would have been one of the top teams in the city. All in all, this was a very successful year in the eyes of every true Centralite and helped to boost the lagging Central spirit.

The Eagles opened their 1948 football season by dropping a hard-fought contest to a superior Wyandotte team, at Wyandotte, by a score of 37-0. This was the first "big league" game for most of the squad, serving as a warm-up game for the Eagles in which they gained a lot of valuable experience before entering league competition.

The following week the Blue and White took on Manual in the first league encounter. The game turned out to be one of those see-saw affairs with neither team being able to score, resulting in a 0-0 tie. Manual's only real threat came in the fading minutes of the game, but they lost the ball on downs on the Central 2-yard line.

The following week the Eagles took on a fast and alert Southwest team. In the first half of that contest the Eagles completely dominated

the game and drove all the way to the Southwest 4-yard line before losing the ball on a pass interception. The half ended with neither team able to score. In the second half, however, Southwest solved the Eagle defense as they chalked up two quick touchdowns, both coming in the third period. The Indians converted both times, and the gun sounded with the Indians coming out on the long end of a 14-0 score.

The following game was a loss to the champion Northeast Vikings. In this game the Eagles' line played the best ball they had played all season, and caused Coach Mardey's crew to unwrap a passing attack that clicked for six completions out of eight tries for 90 yards. Northeast's touchdown came one in each quarter. Charley Guy, the Vikings' line-crushing, all-star fullback, got two of the Vikings' four touchdowns, both on short smashes through the line. Seardine and Simms got credit for the other two markers. The Central touchdown came late in the fourth quarter after the Vikings had ground out four touchdowns. Sol Felman went around end for 8 yards to score. This turned out to be the only touchdown scored against Northeast all year. The final score was 25-6 in favor of the Vikings.

The Eagles met defeat the following week at the hands of the East Bears. After a first half scoreless deadlock, the Bears broke loose their ace back and romped to a 19-0 victory. Dale Roark broke loose for 79 yards to set up the first touchdown and then intercepted

an Eagle pass to score the second East touchdown. He also added the last East marker, going through tackle to score. The Eagles had many scoring opportunities, but failed to capitalize on them.

Still seeking their first victory, the Eagles were edged out by a strong Paseo team, 19-6. In the second quarter the Pirates drove 60 yards for their first touchdown. The try for the conversion failed, and Paseo led 6-0. But in the second half the Eagles came roaring back to drive 55 yards to tie the game at 6-6. In the

fourth quarter the Eagles' defense weakened and Paseo pushed across two more touchdowns to give them a well-deserved victory. This game proved to be a very rough one with many penalties called on both teams. Again the Eagles could not capitalize on their scoring chances. Although they were inside the Paseo 10-yard line constantly, they were unable to go the remainder of the way, and the ball would go over to Paseo.

In their next to the last game the Eagles and Southeast Knights

battled to a 6-6 deadlock. The Blue and White drew first blood as a Southeast punt was turned into a touchdown. Bob Miller, Central halfback, caught the punt and handed it off to Don Wehner, who scampered 86 yards for the touchdown. This was the longest run of the season and a new record. Southeast scored their touchdown on a 20-yard smash with Hafley, Southeast quarterback, carrying the mail. The Eagles received a tough break near the end of the game as they recovered a Knight fumble on the Southeast 21-yard line and drove all the way to the 1-yard line before time ran out on them with the Eagles having two downs remaining.

In the final game of the season, the Central Blue Eagles played their best game of the season and were edged out by a strong Westport eleven, 7-2. The Eagles completely outplayed and out-fought their favored opponents all through the game, and had not their quarterback, Sol Felman, fumbled the ball on the Westport 2-yard line, the Eagles would have been responsible for the greatest upset of the year. The Eagle score came in the second quarter when the whole inspired Eagle line broke through to block a Tiger punt for a safety and held onto this slim lead until late in the fourth quarter when Bob Cook went around end to score. The Tigers converted to go ahead for the first time, 7-2. But the Eagles came right back to take the kick-off and drive all the way to the 2-yard line where, on second down, their quarterback made his unforgivable fumble while attempting to go through his own right tackle.

With only two returning lettermen, Coach Nathan Roitman had a great task ahead of him when he took over the Eagles' basketball team after their long-time coach, Frank Guemple, had been hurt while refereeing a game. With the duties of coaching the first and second teams, Coach Roitman had very little time to spend on individuals and worked more on the team as a whole, trying to develop a winning combination.

The Eagles opened their season by losing to De La Salle 38-23, their first loss to the Cadets in the past four years. The following week Central was host to Lillis and was thoroughly beaten 43-22. The Eagles were no match for the taller and more experienced Fighting Irish squad, and took quite a beating. The Eagles next encountered the mighty Pembroke-Country Day Raiders, and were trounced 58-31.

With victory within their grasp, the Eagles were unable to hold a 2-point lead and were defeated 31-29 by Hogan. Leading throughout the game, the Eagles looked as if they were going to snap their losing streak, but once again they met defeat as Hogan tallied two quick baskets within one minute of playing time remaining to sneak out a hard-fought victory.

In their final non-league game, the Eagles were defeated by a very strong Olathe five, 53-26. The Olatheans proved too powerful for the much smaller Eagles and romped to a one-sided victory. The

Eagles were game, but the superior Olathe rebounding and shooting was too much for the Interscholastic League boys.

Once again the League games were played in the Municipal Auditorium. In their first start of the year, the Eagles put up a rough fight against the much more experienced Westport Tigers, going down by a score of 36-28. Trailing the Tigers 7-13 at half time, the Eagles came back to within one point of tying the score with less than four minutes to play. At that point the Tigers rallied to pull the game out of fire.

The following week, the Eagles took on the Southeast Knights and gave a very good showing of themselves against the 1949 Interscholastic League champions. At half time the Knights led by a slim margin of 21-19, J. D. Older accounting for 13 of the Eagles' points. The second half proved even more exciting, as the Eagles went ahead of the Knights with less than three minutes to go, only to lose the hard-fought battle by a score of 35-32.

Once again the Eagles met defeat, this time at the hands of the Paseo Pirates by a score of 38-34. J. D. Older and Bob Duncan led the Eagle scoring parade with 12 and 10 points, respectively. Although taking a lead in the first minutes of the game, the Eagles just didn't have the push to keep this lead, and went down in defeat once again.

The second half proved the same, with the Eagles holding the upper hand, and when the final buzzer sounded, the Central rooters went wild. The Eagles had won their first victory of the year.

The next night the Eagles met the Manual Redbirds and won their second straight game of the year. The Redbirds, taking an early lead, looked as if they were going to win their first game of

the year and forged ahead 14-11 at the half. In the second half, however, the Eagles caught fire, started pouring the ball through the hoop, and breezed home with a convincing 30-23 victory. J. D. Older led the scoring with 13 points.

In their final game of the year, all of the lead basketball that was in the Eagles came out, and Central fell before the highly touted East Bears, 39-22. This was the first lopsided league defeat of the season for the Eagles, who up to now had lost only by small margins to their stronger opponents. But this wasn't their night, and Central took an awful shellacking. After taking an early lead, the Bears took complete command of the game and held the helpless Eagles to one point in the first 12 minutes of play. In the second half, the Eagles began playing ball and made a game out of it. Had it not been for their cold stretch in the first half, the Eagles might have racked up another victory. J. D. Older again led the Eagles with 13 points, while Dale Roark spearheaded the East attack with 12 points.

All in all, this was a very interesting season for Central as they were beaten by only small margins throughout the season and won two league games to help boost the Central spirit.

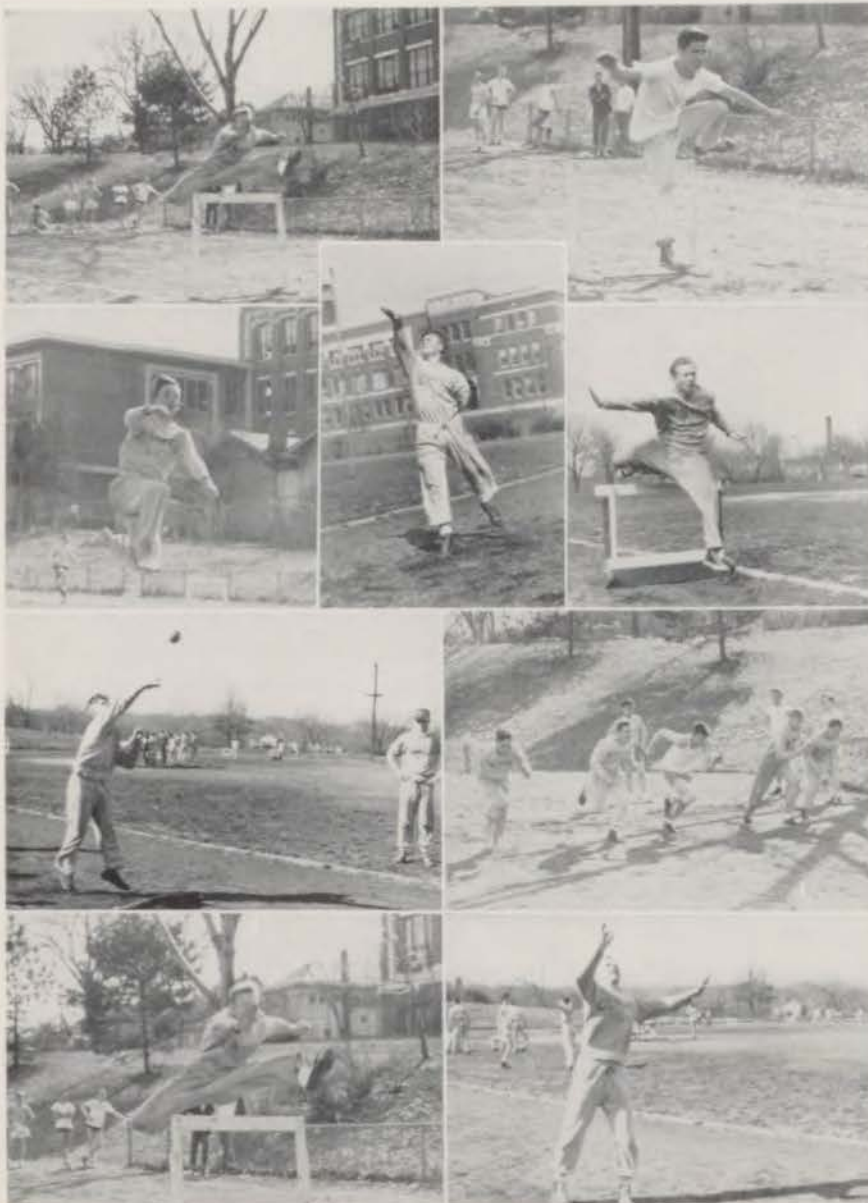

In their first meet of the season, the Eagles took third place in the Big Seven indoor meet. Warren Crump set a new mark in the 60-yard low hurdles, topping the timbers in the fast time of 7. John Sabin also placed in this event, while the Eagle half-mile relay team took third, giving Central a total of 9 points. The following predictions concerning who will represent the Eagles in the interscholastic contest will perhaps be in order.

This year's inexperienced squad will be composed mostly of underclassmen. Carter and Wehner will represent Central in the 100-yard dash; Crump, Holton, and Short in the hurdles; Price, Wynn, Rhoades, and Barrett in the shotput. Weist, Boley, Markham, Poindexter, Coomes, and Maddox, quarter-milers, should gather quite a few points for the Eagles. In the 880-yard run, Bratcher, Beck, Lavelly, Myers, and Pridgen will be out to make a name for themselves. The probable half-mile relay team will be composed of

Wehner, Short, Carter, Owens, Boley, Poindexter, and Weist. Short, Wehner, and Carter will also represent in the 220-yard dash.

The interscholastic league track squads have added two new events this year: the mile run and the mile relay. Another year of activities has ended for the Girls' Physical Education Department.

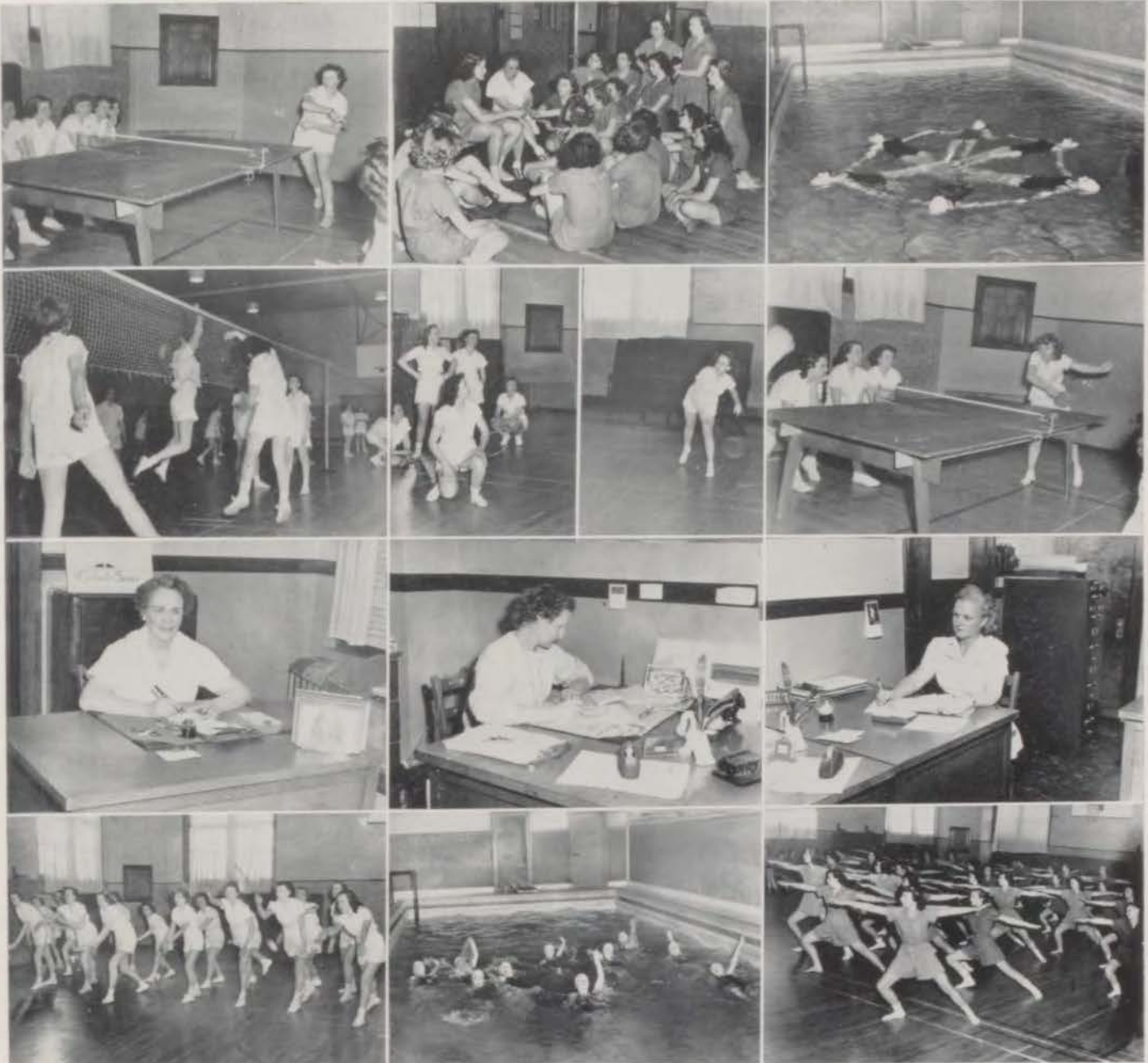

in good sportsmanship, development of character, and other traits necessary to a good life.

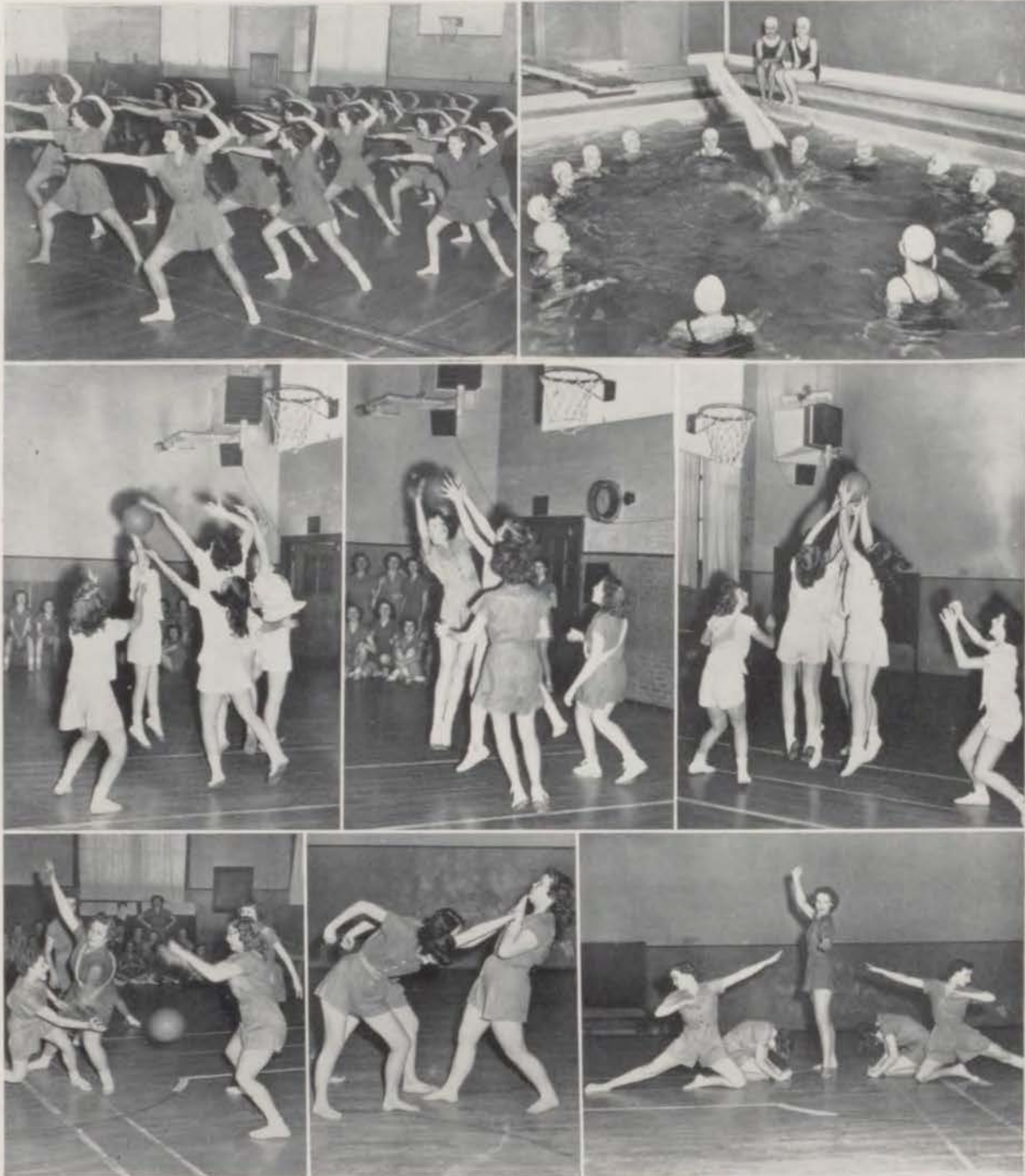

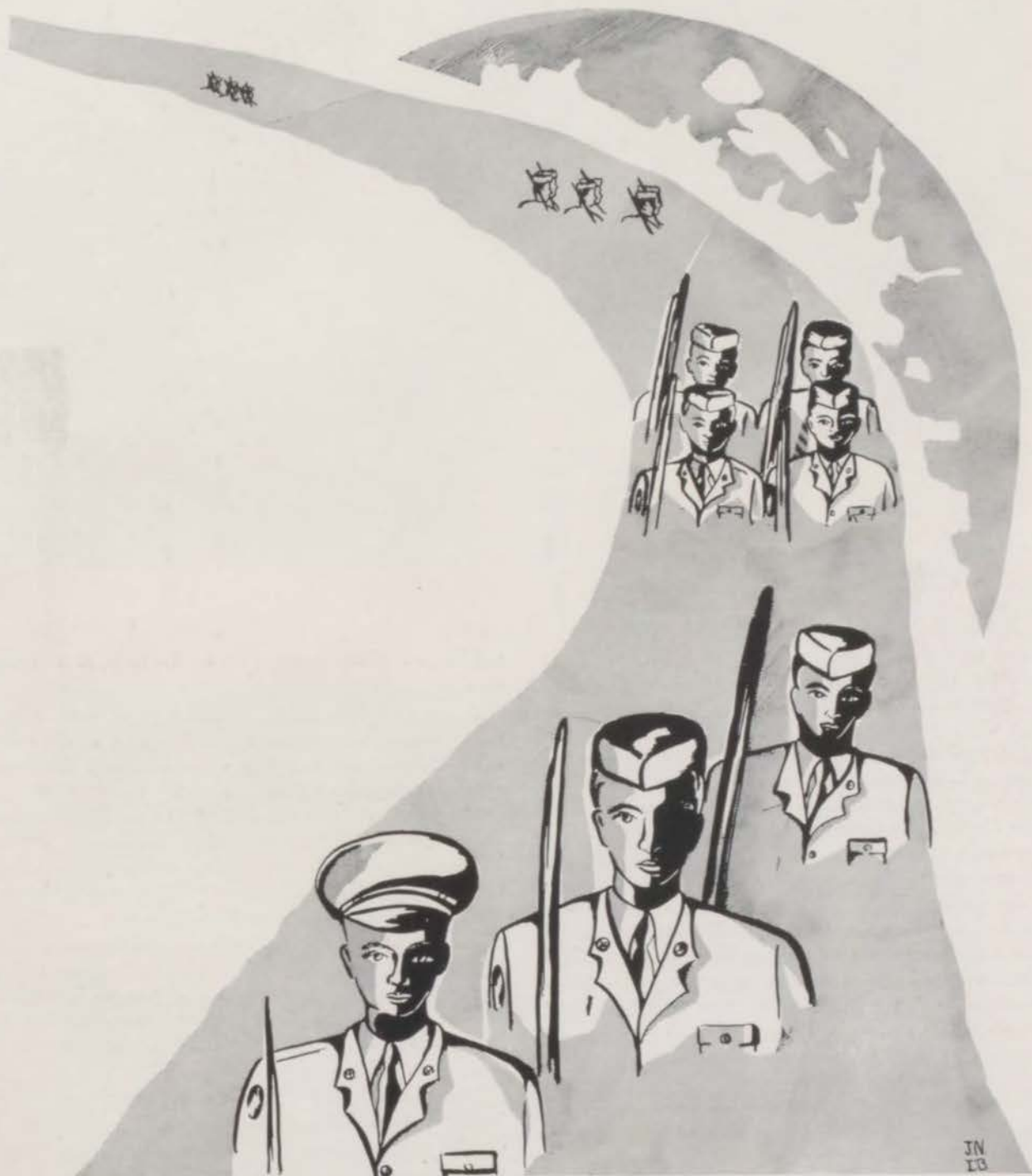

After taking third place in Field Day last year, Central's Eagle cadets began the 1948-49 season under the direction of M/Sgt. Herman F. Byram and T/Sgt. Cecil H. Cooksey. Within two weeks, however, Sgt. Cooksey was transferred to California, and Sgt. James W. Schilpp stepped ably into the vacancy. Together with the aid of Capt. Marlon L. Ellison, the two sergeants began to weld the cadets into a snappy, well-co-ordinated unit.

Maj. Earle Hapke became the regimental adjutant, and Lt. Col. Sidney Glassman took over as Central's battalion commander, with Maj. Sam Kocherov as his executive officer. On his staff were Capt. Bill Park, S-1; Lt. Dick Holmes, S-2; Capt. Harry Holzapfel, S-3; and Lt. William Palmer, S-4. Commanding A Co. was Capt. Richard Crosby, with Lt. Evan Hunter as his second in command. Capt. Harvey Margolis headed B Co., assisted by his executive officer, Lt. Dick Holmes. In A Co., the platoons were led by Lt. Evan Hunter and Lt. Don Trout; in B Co., by Lt. Galen Ford and Lt. Darrold Carothers.

The lack of a good fifth man on the rifle team cost Central some victories this year. Earle Hapke, Richard Crosby, James Janner, and Robert Nash were consistent high scorers, but the fifth place on the team was not permanently occupied until late in the season by Walter Brott. As a result, Central tied with East for fifth place. Aside from the regular interscholastic matches, the team also fired in matches at Nevada and Boonville, Mo., and Lawrence, Kans. Central's activities in the field of marksmanship were by no means limited to those of the rifle team; the second and third year cadets fired at the National Guard Range last Nov. 4th, and many cadets fired on Central's range almost daily after school. During the year, five cadets, James Janner, Earle Hapke, Robert Nash, Richard Crosby,

and Hugh Fordham, qualified for the N. R. A. rank of expert riflemen.

Central's twenty-fourth annual Military Ball, held on March 11th at the Ivanhoe Temple, was acknowledged by all the cadets as the most successful one that they could remember. After overcoming some really rugged competition, Ernestine Conley, escorted by Capt. Richard Crosby, was crowned Queen of the Ball. Her aides were Gwendolyn Throneberry, escorted by Lt. Darrold Carothers, and Virginia Houghton, escorted by Cpl. Louis Streigel. The girls and their escorts spent a brief but memorable evening dancing to the dreamy music of Warren Durrett's Orchestra.

The next event on Central's calendar was the annual R. O. T. C. Circus on April 2nd. Central's part in the program took the form of some fancy saber drill by the officers, followed by a mock military wedding and a honeymoon hayride for which the Central Singers furnished music. As usual, the entire Circus was enthusiastically received.

The cadets were busy for the rest of the year training for Federal Inspection and Field Day, which were held April 25-29th and May 13th, respectively. Central was under a handicap in drilling for these events because Sgt. Byram's enlistment here had expired and he had left in April for an overseas tour of duty. This placed additional responsibilities on the cadet officers as well as on the adult instructors, but the entire unit capitalized on a seeming disadvantage, and Central came through with a creditable showing.

With Field Day over at last, Central's schedule for the year was completed, and the battalion disbanded for a well-earned summer vacation.

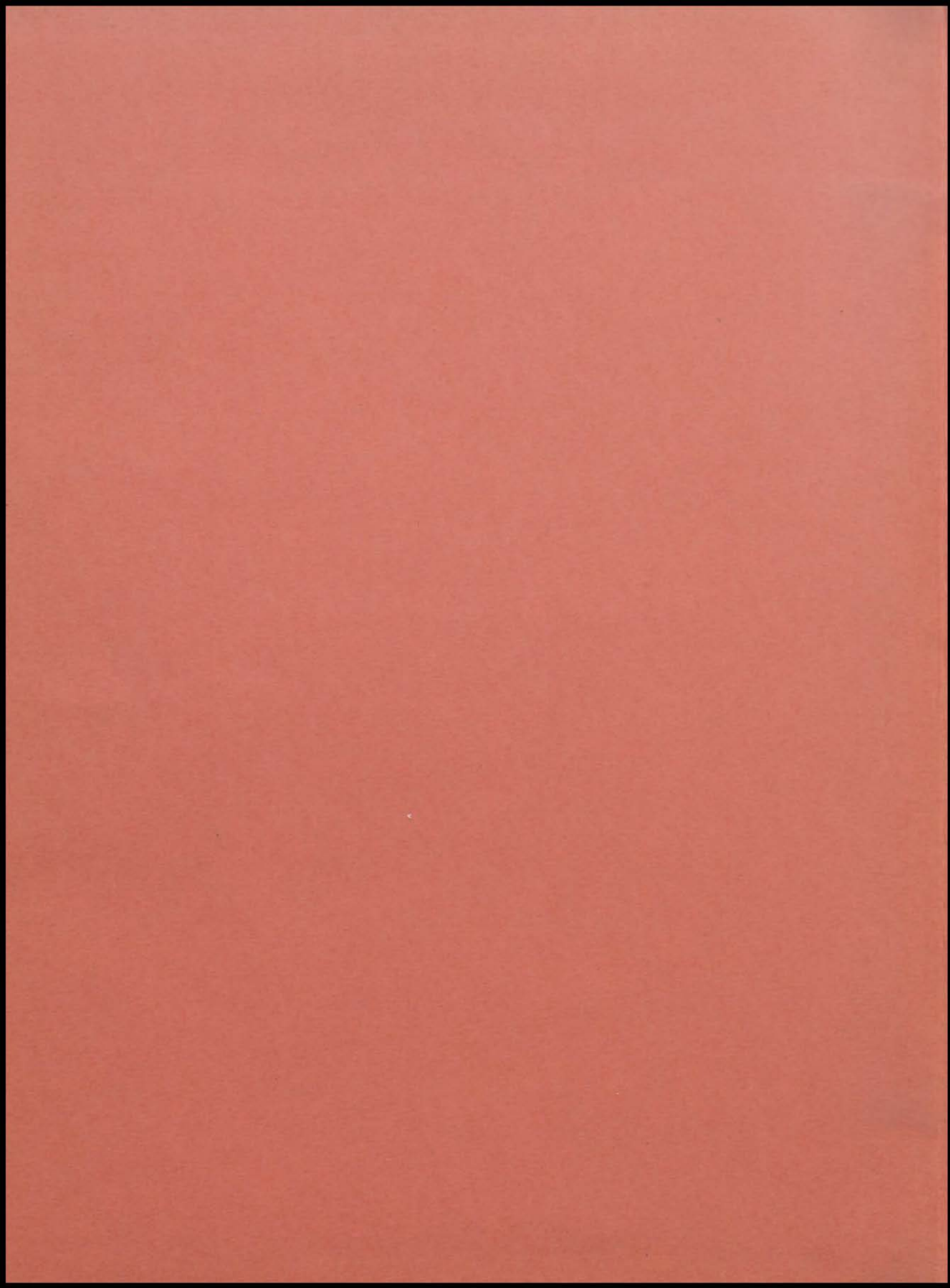
Florence Morris recently made a debut at Carnegie Hall, singing that ever-popular favorite, "It's You or No One."
