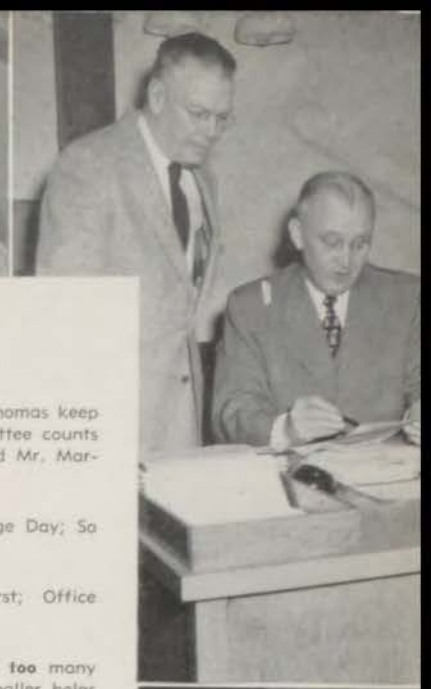

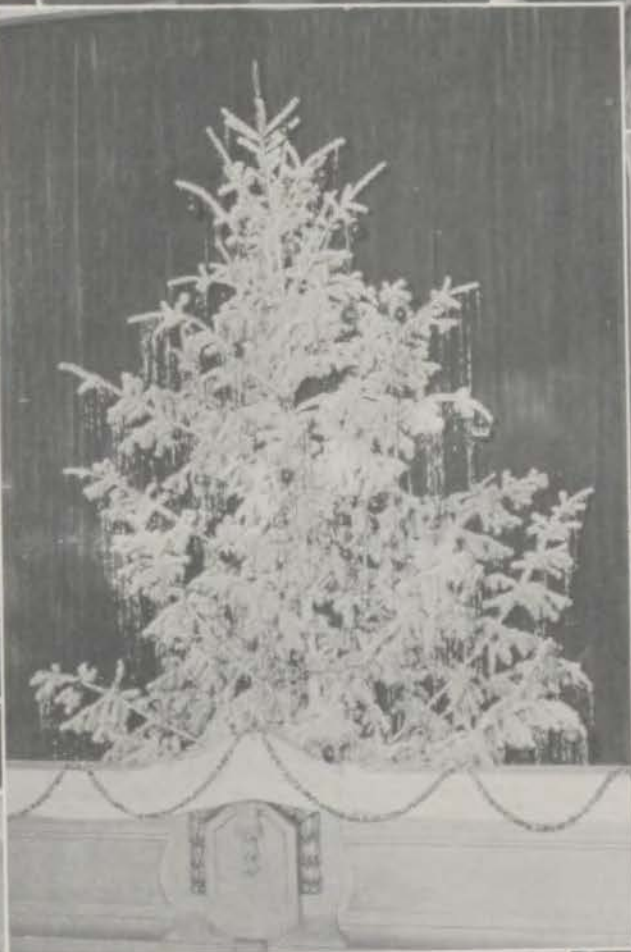

Hundreds of Central alumnae have received spiritual inspiration from Miss Compton in her capacity as chief advisor of the Girl Reserves and Y-Teens. Her dignity of character, competence, and versatility commanded the respect of her students as a teacher of social science and later of mathematics.

Miss Compton is essentially a very human person. She loves the Ozarks where she long owned and operated a camp; she enjoys her home and is a gracious hostess; she likes to cook and revelled in frying great mounds of golden brown chicken for faculty picnics; and she is interested in good clothes. We wish her the best life has to offer in her new home in California.

EDITH HUMPHREY

Miss Humphrey left her Spanish classes at Central in January, 1953. Hundreds of her students recognized her as a real Spanish scholar and superb teacher.

Both the faculty and her students were attracted to her for her enthusiasm for all things Spanish: music, especially "La Cucaracha" and "Spanish Rhapsody," and art, jewelry, and food. She delighted in Mexico where she had traveled often and extensively. She was indifferent to material luxury but loved flowers, big and little animals, birds, the Ozarks in May and October, cartoons in the *New Yorker*, and murder mysteries!

Mr. Watson's failing health made his retirement, in June, 1953, necessary. His interest in people generally, and in young people especially, made him a friend to his students rather than just an instructor. His patience and tolerance knew no limits, and no problem of boy or girl went unsolved when taken to Mr. Watson. His judgment and advice were followed by many parents and teachers as well as by his pupils. He maintained a cheerful and optimistic outlook on life, even in times of personal stress.

His students appreciated his firm grasp of civic and historical events and his ability to interpret and apply them to modern conditions.

Central was the greatest place in the world next to his home and family, to whom he now has time to devote himself.





W. W. CLEMENT

On June 6, 1952, Mr. Clement closed Central for his last time, completing six as notable years as the school has had. He was particularly fitted to be principal of a senior high school because of his enthusiasm for quality of achievement, his awareness of opportunity for the school and its students, and his eagerness for the success of those entrusted to his supervision.

Mr. Clement never slackened his hold on affairs of education, particularly those of Central. His presence wherever it could best serve the interest of his school often amazed both staff and students.

With his pupils he was equally at home when counseling with them across his desk or visiting with them across a dinner table. Many graduates will long remember his solicitude for their welfare in college or in life after school.

Mr. Clement's scholarly attainments and gentlemanly bearing, his insistence on high scholastic standards and his concern for beauty and dignity, his appreciation for all phases of education and his recognition of varied talents and personalities have made a lasting impression on the school as a whole.

Now, released from the confines of school routine, may he find a wider and freer sphere for the intellectual pursuits that he so enjoys.

In Memoriam

CHARLES T. WORKMAN

Grief awaited many Centralites when they returned to school after the holidays to learn that Charles T. Workman, their friend, teacher, and coach, had died January 3, 1953. Although his tenure at Central was short he had endeared himself to his students for his ability, patience, and understanding of their problems; and he inspired them to develop clean habits and sportsmanship-like qualities.

He came to us in September, 1951, from a professional baseball career which he had pursued from 1934 with various teams, notably Boston Braves, Pittsburgh Pirates, and Nashville. While with the latter, he set three Southern Association records: home runs, total bases, and runs batted in.

He was a graduate of Central Missouri State Teachers College and was a major in mathematics and physical education.

He leaves to mourn his death, his parents, his wife and infant son, and hosts of friends and students.

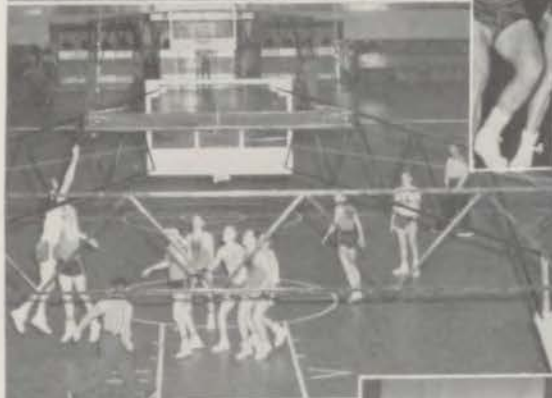

Football...1952

Central Eagles, under Coaches Harry Slaymaker, Bud French, and Nate Roitman, expected a good year. Four regulars and nine other lettermen would be returning from last year's squad plus many fine men from the second team. Hardest hit by graduation was the line with two All-City guards missing, David Argie and Bob Myers.

Central's first contest was the traditional interstate rivalry with Wyandotte. The more experienced line made the difference as the Bulldogs downed the Eagles, 26 to 6. Central's lone tally came on an end around pass play with T. Slaymaker pitching to Patton, who went on over for the score.

The opening league tilt was against Southwest. Central played at a decided disadvantage as the game was on Southwest's home field. The holes in the Eagles' line were as evident against the Indians as they had been against Wyandotte and the first half saw Southwest tallying twice for a 12 to 0 half-time lead. Although the Eagles played inspired ball in the second half, a fumble and an intercepted pass kept them from scoring, and the final tally was 12 to 0.

In Central's first game under the lights at Blues Stadium, the Eagles went up against a favored crew of East Bears. In the first quarter, both teams moved the ball well on the ground, though neither was able to score. In the second stanza, the only tally of the game came on a sustained drive going from Central's 35 down to the East 25. On the next play, T. Slaymaker pitched one to Patton who shook one tackler off his back and went on over for the score. The rest of the game saw Central on the defensive, stopping East drives dangerously near the goal line. One deciding factor in the victory was T. Slaymaker's punting. Kicking three times from his end zone, he nevertheless ended the game with an average of 38.3 yards a kick.

The next week, against Westport, Central was again rated the underdog, and the Tigers started out the game according to prediction. On its first possession, Westport moved 81 yards for a touch-down, with Ross going over from the 9. Central immediately countered with a drive of her own, going 54 yards, with Poindexter scoring from the 1 yard line. The half ended with the score 7 to 7. After taking the opening kickoff of the second half, the Eagles moved to the Westport 1. On the next play, Philpot took the handoff and plunged over for the winning tally.

Central then added Southeast to their string of victories. After a slow first half, the Eagles took a punt out of bounds early in the third quarter and went on to score. With the play starting on the Southeast 16, Slaymaker passed to Poindexter, who first juggled the ball, then went on into the end zone standing up. Late in the fourth quarter a Southeast drive was stopped by a pass interception deep in Central territory.

Against St. Joseph Central, the Eagles played one of their best games. Facing the highly touted Indians on Rockhurst's Bourke Field, Central's line played good football and held down the Redskin's fine running attack. It was a see-saw affair with neither team getting the breaks until the third quarter. Then Burry recovered a fumbled punt in St. Joseph's territory and the Eagles drove down to the 11, where Ramsey cracked over for the T. D. Howe converted and the game ended with the Kansas City school ahead, 7 to 0.

On the following Thursday, Central played Northeast for the Interscholastic league title. The Vikes were the heavy favorites to cinch the crowd, won last year by Southwest. It was all Northeast that night as the Kingbirds went down to defeat, 21 to 0. The

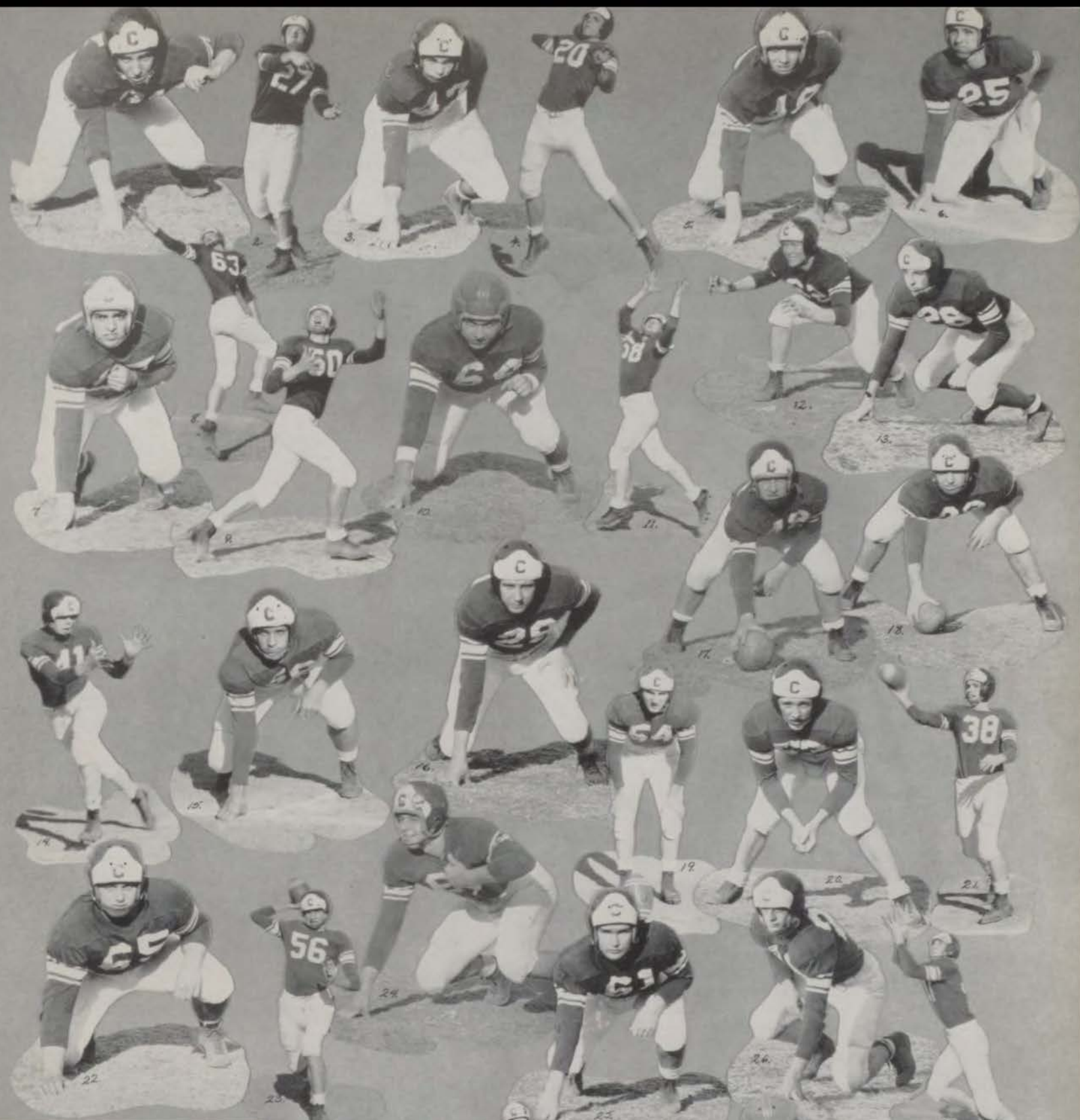

After a first quarter Central tally, Paseo scored 7 points in the second and third quarters. Late in the game Central scored again and were threatening on the Pirate's 3-yard line

when the final gun sounded. The Eagles ended the season with a record of four wins and four losses.

The Balloting for the All-City team found Central in the running for individual honors. Tom Slaymaker won a berth on the first team for the second straight year and Irving Hammer and Gary Patton on the second squad. John Philpot, Jerry Poindexter, and Bob Evans received honorable mention for back-field work. Honorable mention also went to linemen Bob Mountjoy, Fred Burry, and Larry Galbreath. Everyone agreed that Central, though short on individual stars, showed up strong in the team play and spirit department.

Second Team Football

Central's Eaglets began the season with a squad well-sprinkled with regulars. Although Coach Workman wouldn't say, fans expected a successful season. In their opener, the young Eaglets dropped a 20-to-6 decision to Southwest's second team. The second game was played on East's field and ended with Central on the long end of a 13-to-0 score. The scoring came on touchdown passes from Scott to Comer and Piper, with O'Brien adding a conversion.

Two days later, against Westport, Central again won by a score of 13 to 0. In this game, the scores came on long runs by John O'Brien and Ronnie Comer.

In two nonleague games, the Eaglets defeated Manual and McCune Home. In the latter, with just

seconds remaining and the Eaglets behind, 7-6, Smith connected to Piper in the end zone and the game ended with the score 12 to 7, Central's favor.

A few days later, they tied with Southeast before losing to Northeast, the league champs. The Eaglets only score against Northeast's Junior Vikes was on a pass from Cundiff to Judah. The final score turned out to be 19 to 6.

The Eaglets closed the season against Paseo. In a hardfought defense battle, neither team managed to score and so the game ended a scoreless tie.

The team lived up to its pre-season expectations and finished with a fine record of four wins, two ties, and two losses.

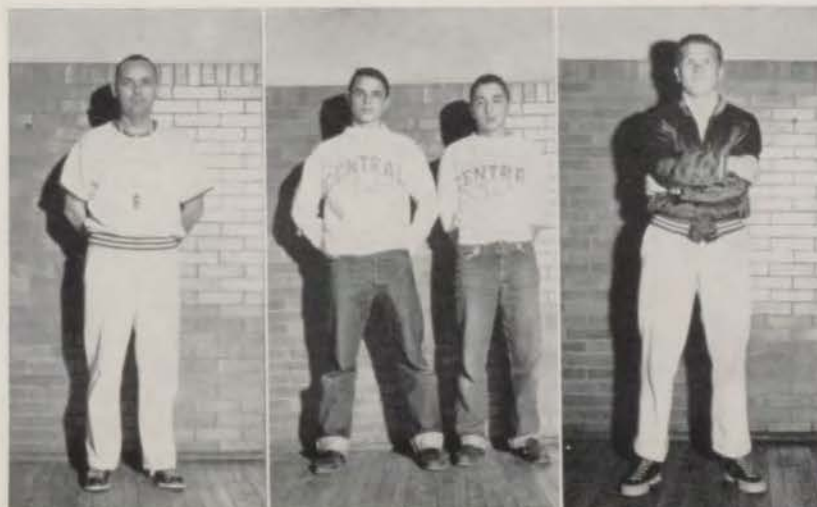
The last game of the season was with Pembroke-Country Day and the Eaglets won, 54-36. Potts and McGavern were high point men with 13 points each.

The squad had one regular from last year's starting quintette, Tom Slaymaker, plus lettermen Bruce Keller, John Philpot, Everett Hedeem, Paul Krahenbuhl, Harold Hatch, and Jerry Poindexter. Newcomers to the first squad were Tom Cox, Norman Francis, Sonny Shull, and Larry Markt.

The curtain raiser for the Centralites was the tilt at De La Salle. The Eagles were able to score consistently and defeated the Cadets handily, 40 to 33. Keller was high man with 22. Rockhurst proved to be a tougher opponent. After trailing most of the way, Central was able to eke out a thrilling 43-40 victory over the Hawklets. Then the Kingbirds ran up against the Redemptorist Rockets and went down to defeat to the tune of 57 to 38.

The Eagles had to go out of state to win their next one. Playing the Turner Bears on their court, the Central lads turned in a rousing 44 to 27 victory. Central also defeated Hogan on their own court, 56 to 33. Slaymaker hit 17 to end up high scorer. Glennon's little Eagles gave Roitman's crew a hard time before bowing, 42 to 45. Keller kept us in the ball game by scoring 23 points. The final nonleague game was a 63-to-25 rout of Ruskin High. Keller was once again the high man with 20.

Central opened league play against Southeast at the Municipal Auditorium. Both teams came into the tilt with fine nonleague records. It was a nip-and-tuck battle all the way, down to the very last minute. Southeast, ahead 40-39, iced the game on a late bucket by the Knight's star, Kent Bryan, making the final score 42-39.

The Eagles met an even tougher foe the next week in the form of the Northeast Vikings, defending champions. Once again Lady Luck deserted us and we blew an eight-point, fourth-quarter lead. The Vikes moved to within one point of the Kingbirds and then clinched it with three charity tosses, one of these coming on a technical foul. The technical also gave them possession and by the time the Eagles got the ball it was too late to change the 50-48 score.

The Kingbirds first tasted league victory in a

66-44 trouncing of Manual. Central led most of the game until a third-quarter rally tied it up at the fourth, 39 all. The beginning of the fourth stanza saw Manual going ahead, 43 to 40, before the Eagles began to move. Then the boys couldn't miss, outscoring Manual, 27 to 5 in the last quarter to win.

Against East, Central once again broke open a close game with a last-quarter surge. Near the end of the third, the score was tied at 30-30. In the last quarter the Eagles poured in 18 points to clinch the victory. Keller was high with 19. The Southwest Indians, favored to repeat their last year's triumph, were in for a surprise. That night Central hit 52.1 per cent of their shots in a 66-49 route of the Redskins. It was Central all the way as the Eagles started early and built up a commanding lead and were never headed.

Central's bad luck cropped up again as they bowed to Westport, 44 to 42. The Eagles were behind all three quarters but staged a desperate rally that fell short by inches. The score was tied but a late Tiger goal snatched victory from their hands. Cox was high for the second night in a row with 16 points.

The Eagles closed the season by dropping a 55-50 decision to their neighboring rivals, the Paseo Pirates. A cold Central defense spelled the difference as the game was decided once more in the last minute of play. Paseo led by one point and then clinched it with two more goals.

Finishing the league season with a record of 3 wins and 4 losses, the Eagles moved on to the state regionals at Rockhurst. After defeating Rockhurst High, 58-45, and Raytown, 62-52, Central moved into the finals with Paseo. After spotting the Bucs a 10-point lead, the Kingbirds got hot and tied it up and even went ahead at the half. Starting quick in the second half, Central built up a lead and held for a 74-63 victory.

The Eagles didn't fare so well at the state tourney as they dropped their first round game to Cape Girardeau, 65-53. It was still a successful season and the final tally was 19 won and 6 lost. In the individual department, credit goes to John Philpot, second team All-Star, and Bruce Keller and Tom Cox, honorable mention All-Star. Also a fine hand for Nate Roitman, who built a great team in his first season as Central's head basketball coach.

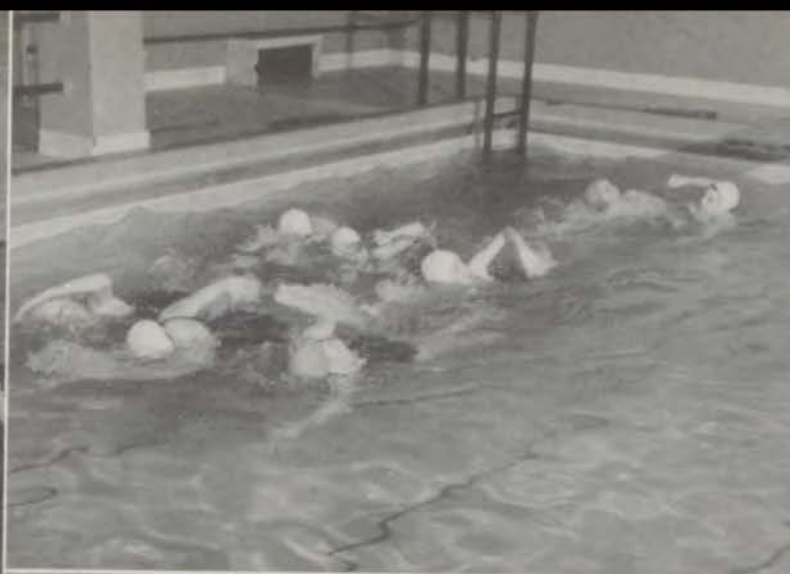
