THE YEAR OF . . . A TRADITIONAL ERA

When the basketball season started, many people said that Central would not be outstanding. The potential was there, the speed, the skill, the size, but the Eagles just weren't picked to be the winners. Central and Lincoln started the season against teams from St. Louis, the Eagles started out wrong with a loss to Vashon, 87-70. The next night they seemingly redeemed themselves with a win over Soldan, 71-65. Back home again, it was time to take on the visitors from St. Louis, Beaumont and Sumner. The Eagles proved to be too much for Beaumont, 66-59. But a loss the next day evened the record at 2 and 2. We had lost to Sumner.

INTERSCHOLASTIC TOURNAMENT

The Blue Eagles skipped over the first round of play because of ratings, and then skipped over the Southeast Knights, 89-61. Paseo blocked Central's advancement by defeating the Eagles, 67-54. Central settled for third place in the tournament by beating Van Horn, 56-49.

LEAGUE PLAY

The Eagles showed that the league competition was no match, and forecast the future in their first three league games. East was the first victim, 61-40, followed by the crushing of West, 82-26. Even Southeast could not muster more than 40 points in a 52-40 victory for Central. In a non-league game, Central showed its strength to last year's third in the state team, Rockhurst. The outcome was another victory, 59-51. The Mighty Blue Eagles resumed league play with four consecutive crushings, beatings, stompings, and bruisings. Northeast, 63-25. Van Horn, 61-47. Westport, 72-52. Southeast, 57- 42. At this point, Central was undefeated in league play, and twelve and three for the season. Also undefeated were Lincoln and Paseo. Everyone regarded the game against rival Paseo to be the big game of the season. It was close all the way, with Central leading most of the time, but Paseo finally overcame the then league leaders, 58-51.

Things didn't look too good after the loss, but the team didn't give up. Central took on last year's class M titlist, Manual, and defeated them, 51-49. Kansas City, Kansas Sumner was the Star's No. 1 team, but the Eagles were not to be impressed by their ratings, records, or their superstars. In a game which Central finally lost, 45-40, Sumner was Stunned. For almost four quarters the Eagles baffled and battered Sumner with dynamic offense and defense. It was only after the 2:24 mark that Sumner passed the Central team.

Central's upset bid was halted, but another game had revived their life and spirit, Paseo had lost to Southeast, an earlier victim of the Eagles, and now the league title would belong to Paseo (9-1) and the victor of the Central (8-1) and Lincoln (8-1) game. In a game which was not as close as the score, and with a defense that was showing off power, Central took their share of the league title, 39-36.

ON TO REGIONAL

Central took its 14-5 record to the fieldhouse. Southeast had twice been relieved of their pride by the third seeded Eagles. Before the Knights went home, they were again battered unmercifully. The Eagles coasted through the first round by eleven, 70-59. Once gain Lincoln stood between the Eagles and success. As in the week before Lincoln was captured, this time by ten, 66-56. The Eagles were on their way to the championship game with Paseo. Twice during the season, Paseo had withheld the Eagles from their position. On March 2, 1972, the two arch rivals went at it again. Central was never behind. They played like superstars, giants among midgets, champions against more challengers. When the game was over, Paseo was finished, 73-54.
