


THE END OR THE BEGINNING?


The only way to successfully meet the demands of life is to conquer, control, evaluate, monitor, and develop self. The quality of life lived is reflective of the degree to which these are achieved.

The Central High School girl's basketball ream did much better than the sportswriters thought they would, but never did play to their potential according to Coach Ordman. The Lady Eagles' 6-2 record was good enough to tie for second in the league and they posted a very respectable 16-9 record overall.

Pre-season polls predicted Central's Lady Eagles, the shortest ream in the league, would finish seventh out of nine teams. The "Smurfettes," their nickname given by Coach Ordman, shocked the experts by remaining the only undefeated ream in the league as they entered the last month of the season. The team went on to crush Southwest before losing to Southeast and Paseo. The Lady Eagles then avenged an earlier tournament loss to Northeast by running the Lady Vikings off the court in the last league game.

"We definitely had more bounce to the ounce-and to the inch-than any other girl's team in the league," said Coach Ordman. "Northeast, Southwest, Van Horn, and even Lincoln thought they would beat us, but our girls oursmarted and outhustled those teams. "I just wish we could have come up with the super

effort against Southeast and Paseo as we had done in previous years."

"When you consider our starting line-up was from 5'1" to 5'8" you realize how much height we gave up each game. Our pressure defense and good shot selection were the reasons for our success. But our lack of scoring punch, offensive rebounding, and floor leadership hurt us against the better teams."

"Gria 'Magic' Ellison worked the hardest in the off season and improved the most," said Coach Ordman. "That is why she led the team in scoring, 14.7 points per game, was second in rebounds and earned first team all-league honors."

The brightest part of the season was the improvement of the underclassmen. Coach Ordman said the freshman and sophomores started the year not even knowing the rules and having very limited skills, but worked hard and enjoyed phenomenal improvement.
