Dismantling a statue of Lenin was symbolic of what was to happen to the world's strongest socialist nation in 1991. After an August coup attempt by hardliners to remove Mikhail Gorbachev from power failed, the USSR was living on borrowed time. Week by week Gorbachev's authority weakened and Russian President Boris Yeltsin's influence grew as the republics called for the end of the Soviet Union. In December, 11 of the 12 republics formally ended their relationship with the Soviet Union and formed the Commonwealth of Independent States. The following is a copy of the winning essay written by Edward Wiley for the Black History Essay Contest.

A Desperate, Determined Road to Freedom

Black history to me has been a desperate, determined road to freedom. Since we were brought to this country, as slaves, there has been an urge to regain the basic human rights that had been taken away from my people.

From time to time, we have had many great leaders who have devoted their lives to regaining freedom for our people. Slaves such as Sojourner Truth and Harriet Tubman helped other slaves become free. Abolitionists such as Frederick Douglas, worked for not only antislavery, but also for the civil rights of blacks, particularly women's rights.

As time progressed, more and more blacks made their names known in different aspects of life. For instance, Paul Dunbar was considered to be one of the best poets, black or white, of the nineteenth century. And, of course, Langston Hughes was another.

By the twentieth century blacks started making names in music, television, and sports. Scott Joplin was crowned the king of ragtime blues. Count Basie was a great orchestra leader. Everybody listened when Josephine Baker sung. Jack Johnson was the first black heavy weight boxing champ. Joe Louis became champ in 1935. Jesse Ownes and Ralph Metcalf stood at the top of the pack of all the athletes in the 1936 Olympics. Jim Brown and Ernie Davis started us in football. And in basketball it was Oscar Robertson, Elgin Baylor, and Wilt Chamberlain. And in television Charlie Chaplin paved the way for black actors and actresses.

By the 1960's black people came together and took a stand for the rights due them. Dr. Martin Luther King and Malcom X wanted us to seperate from the white people. All three were assassinated, but what they worked and died for, lives on today. Hopefully, forever! Other people made contributions that helped shaped the country. Rosa Parks took a stand when she wouldn't give up her seat, on the bus, to a white person. From that the city buses were soon desegregated.

I couldn't even come close to mentioning all of the black people who have contributed to our progress, but I thank them all for what they accomplished or contributed. These people proved that the black race is not, or ever, will be, inferior to any other race in this world of ours.

Istill continue to praise those people who not only contributed to the Black race, but to the betterment of life for other races as well. Thank you our great ancestors. We will remember you forever.


SPORTS AT CENTRAL



The 1991 Central Varsity Football had a very disappointing year. They posted a dismal 0-6 record in the Interscholastic League, and 0-9 overall. They opened up their season with a 22-6 loss against St. Thomas Aquinas and ended their season with a 32-10 loss to Van Horn. Even though they were winless there were a few bright spots. 












