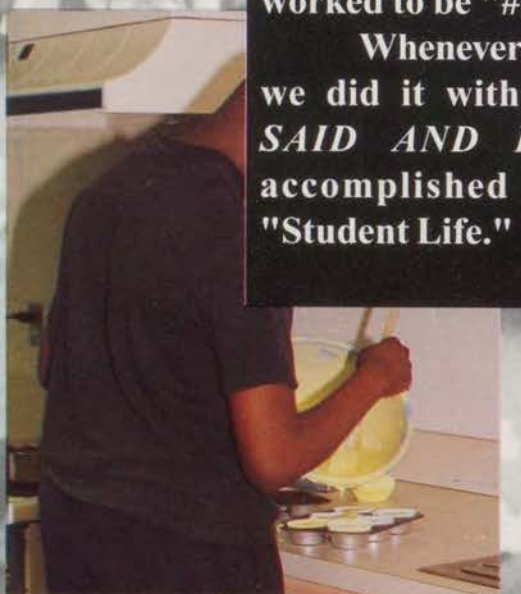


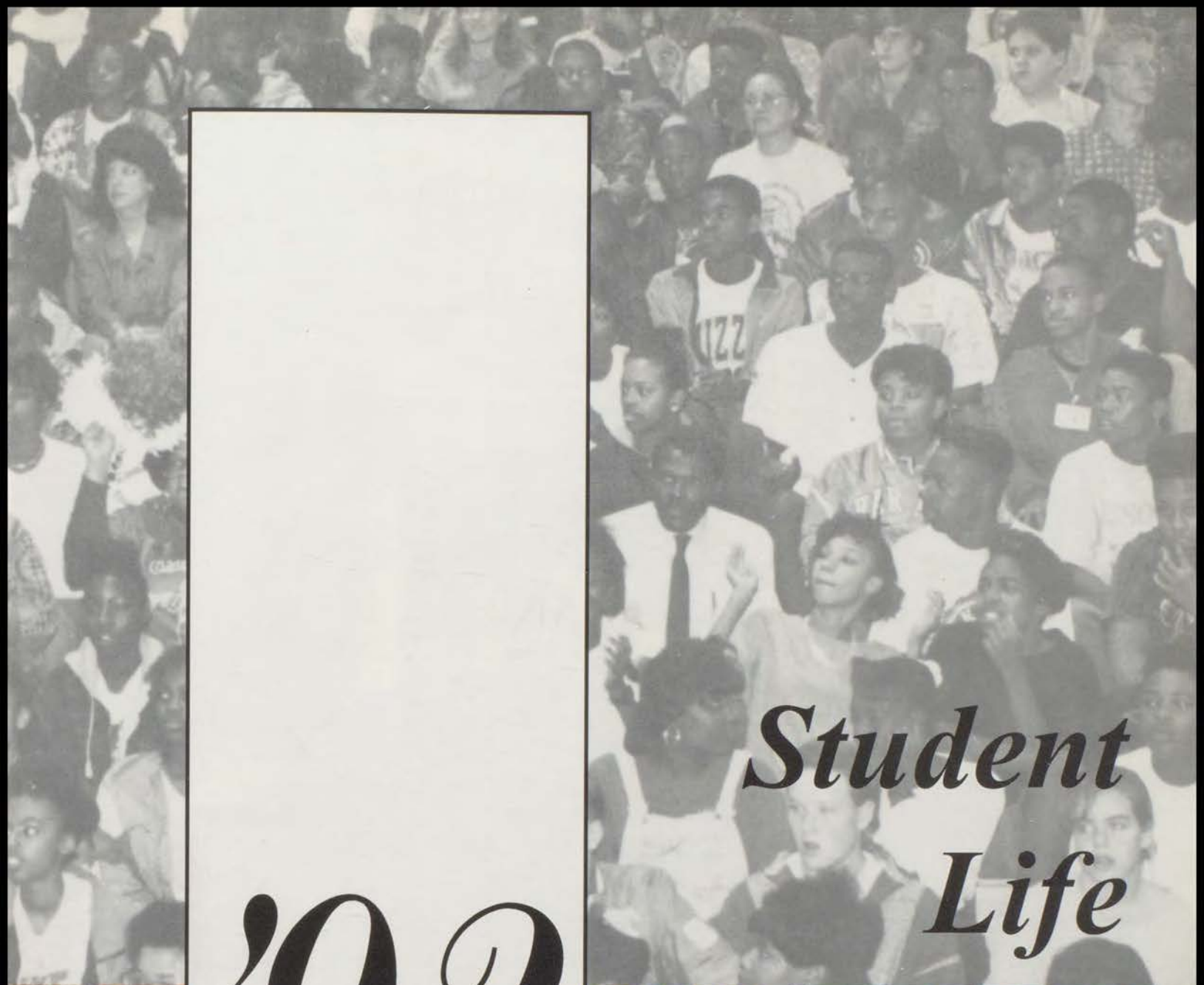
All Said and Done

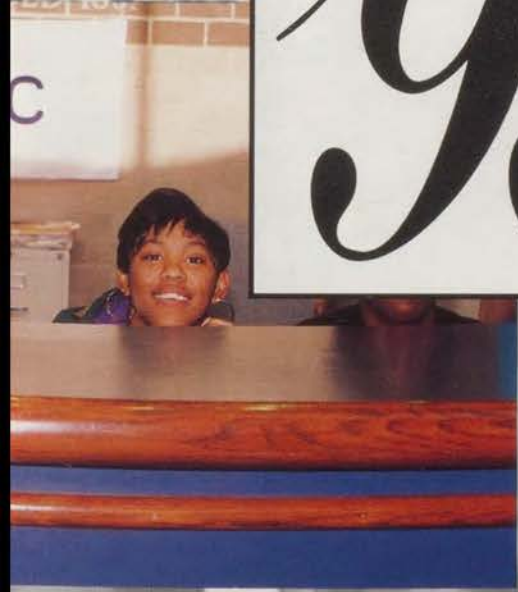
Whenever we got together, we did it with "class." *ALL SAID AND DONE* we've accomplished a lot in our "Student Life."

Kiddie day was intended to remind us of our youth. Kiddie day extraordinaire, Erica Staley, reveals the little kid inside her.

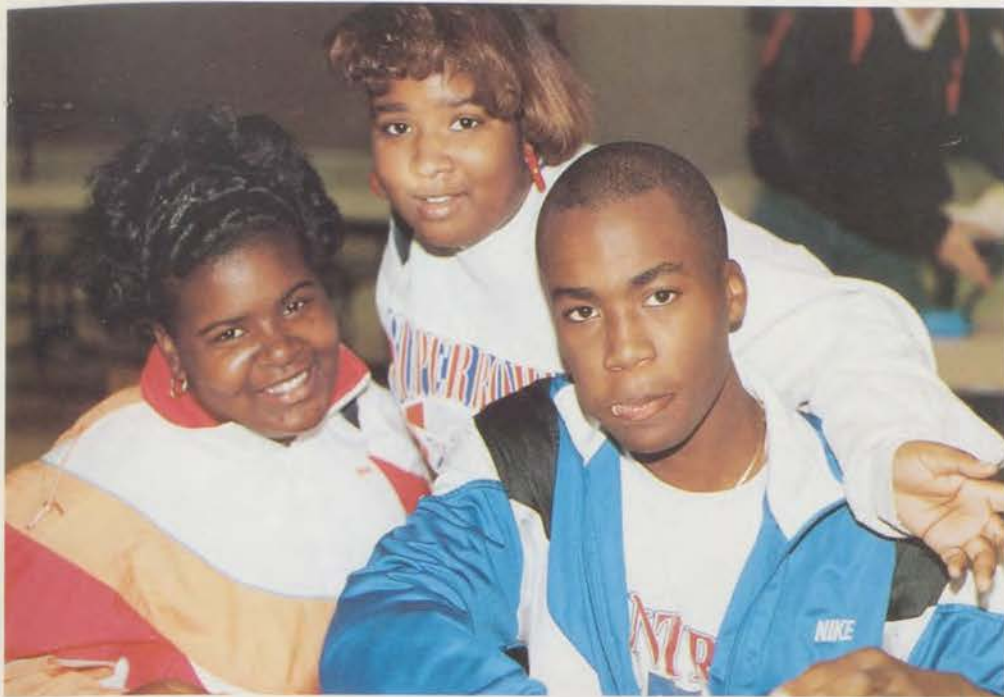

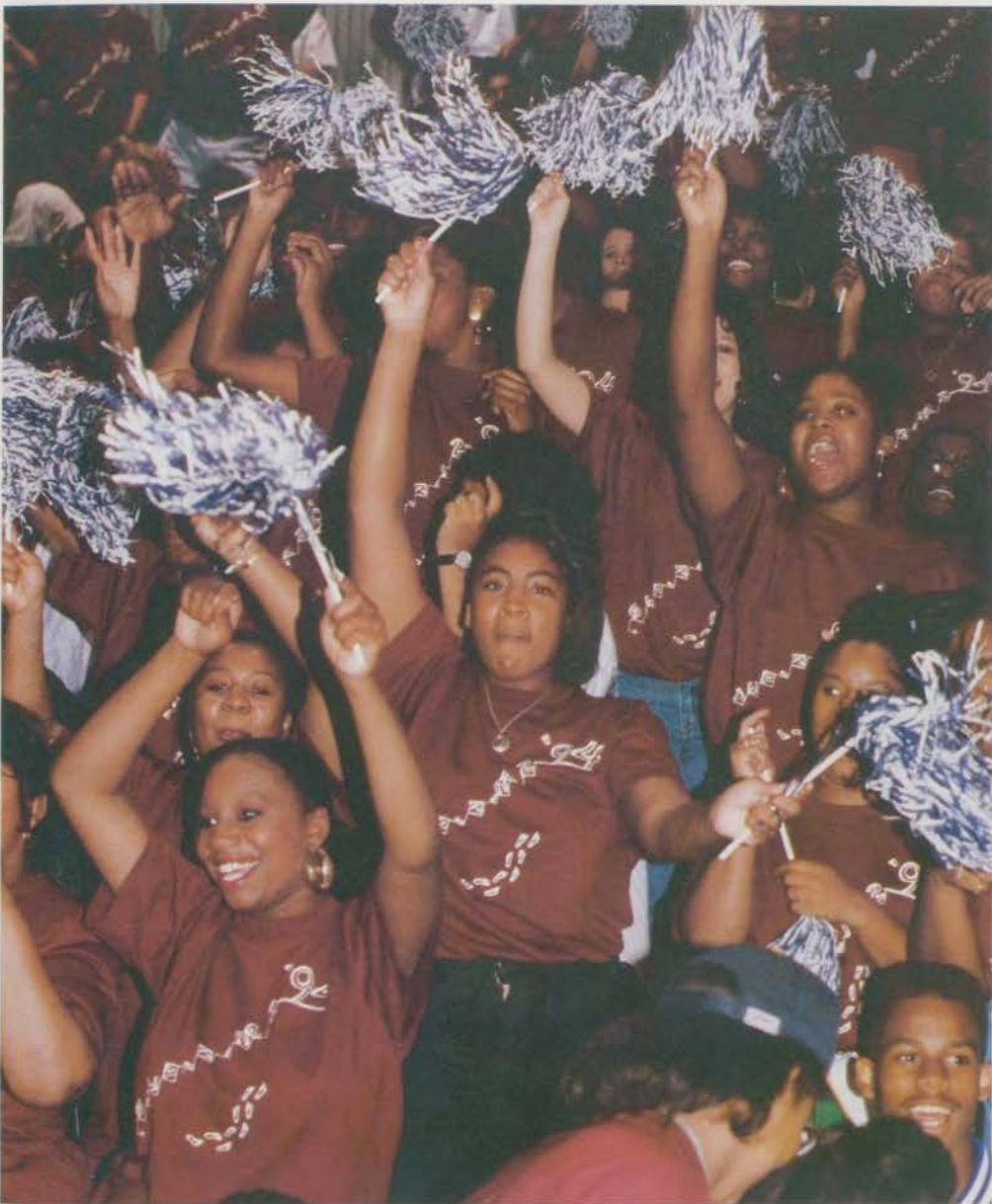

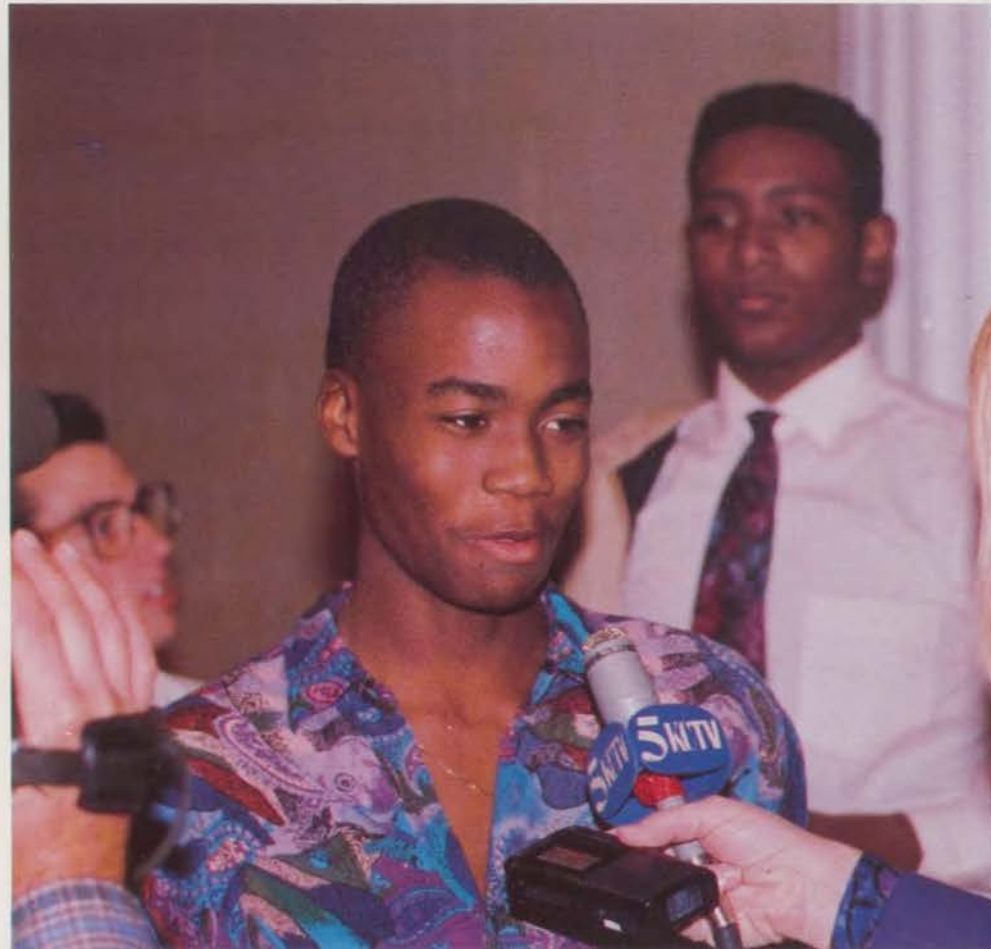

Did you ever feel that you were not giving your all? That you are just getting by? Well, it's time to make a change!

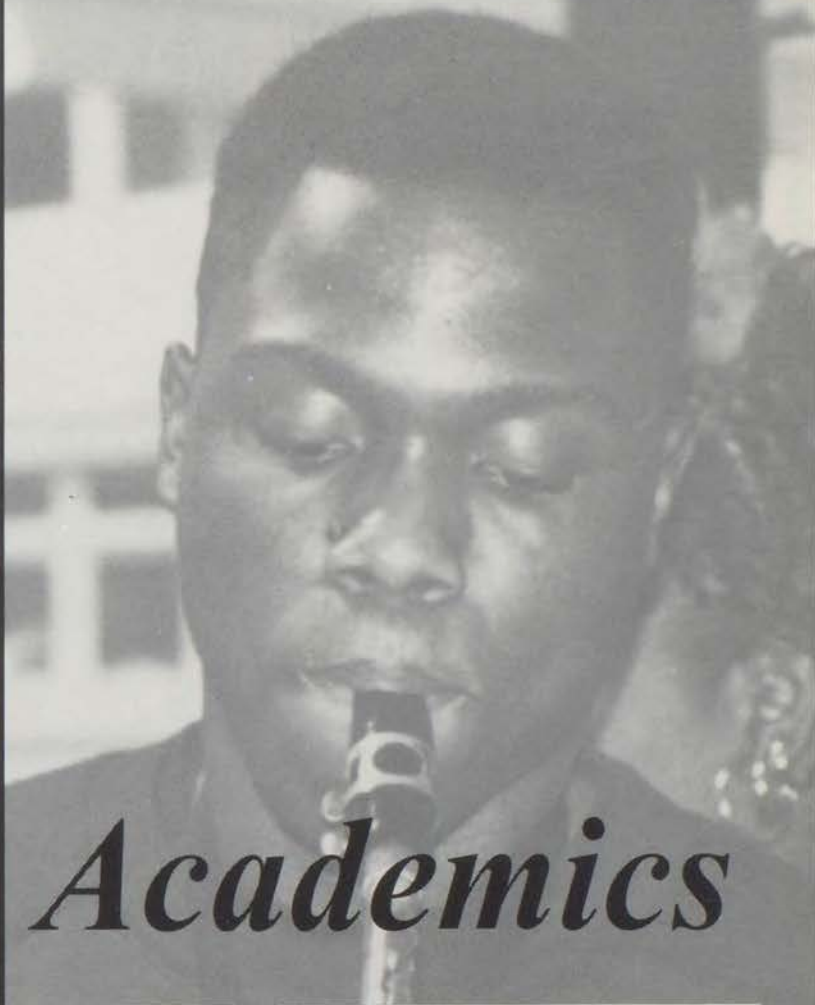

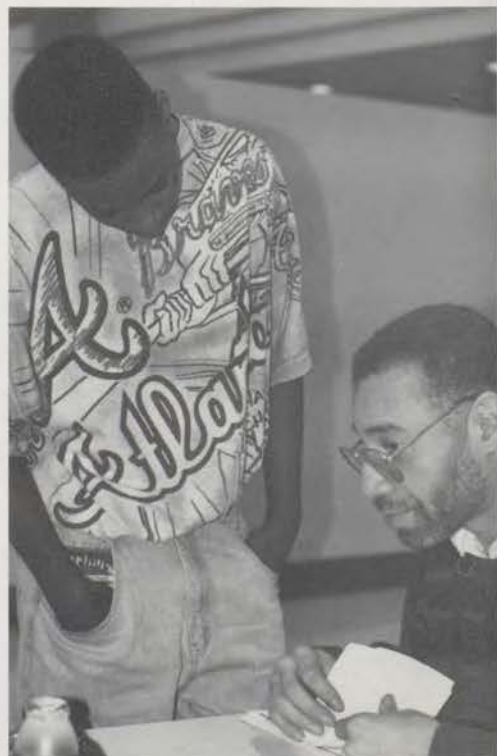
"Studying at the library is the way to go!", Pete Spears says as he takes time out to give his idea of how to make the grade.

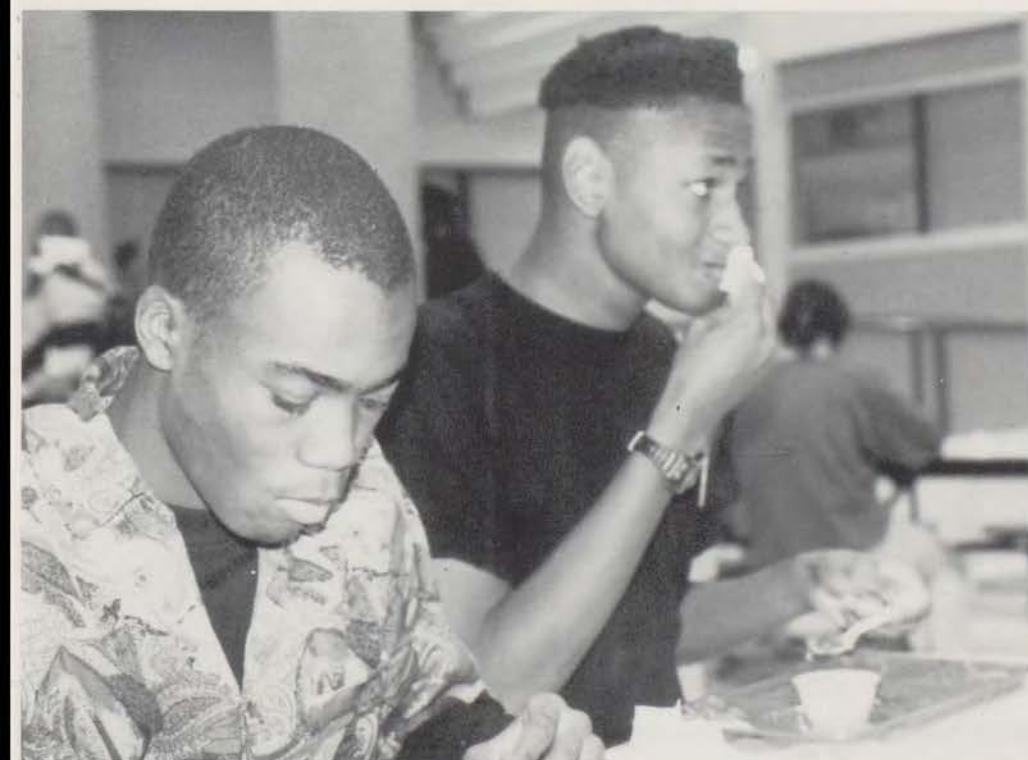

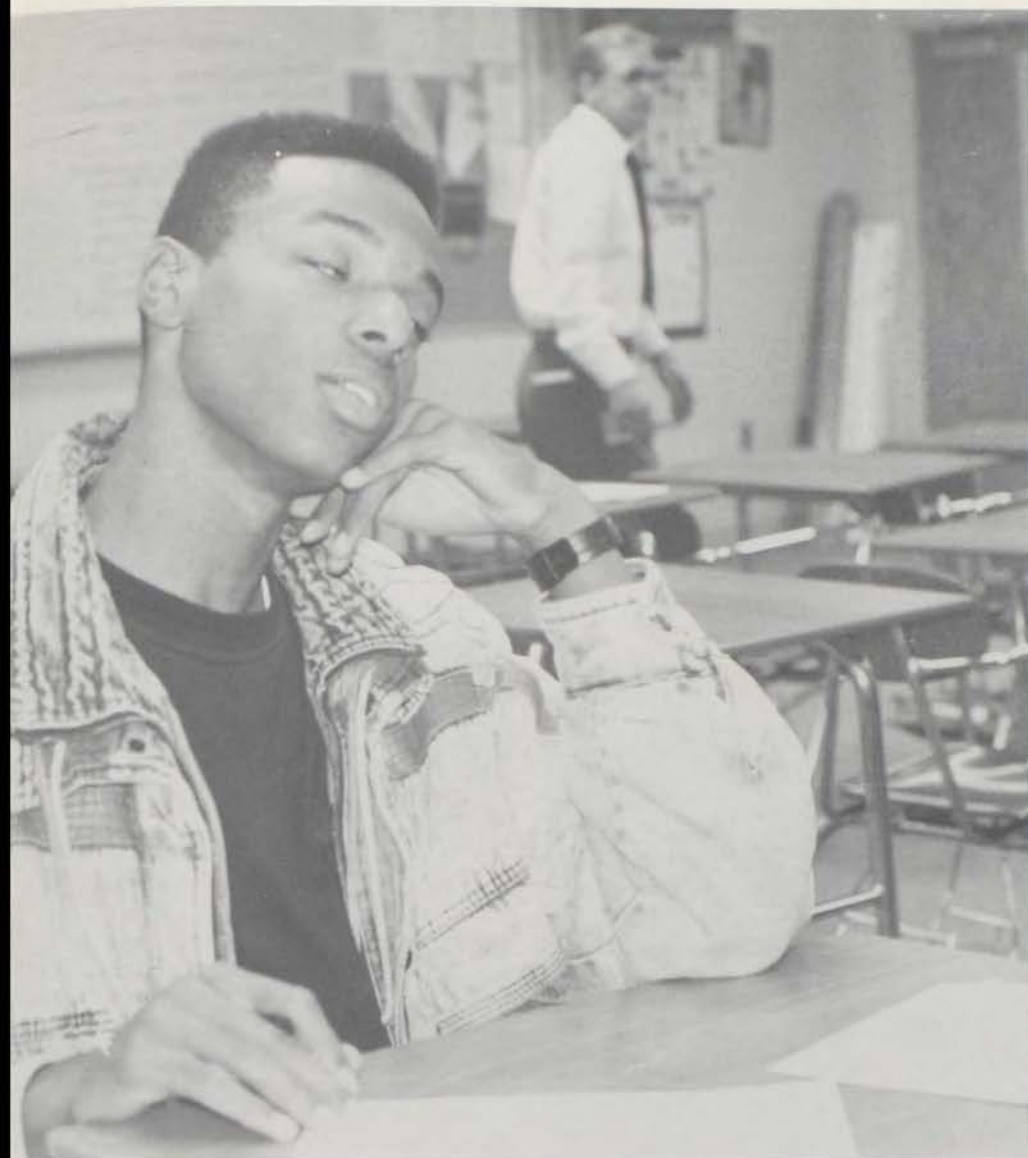

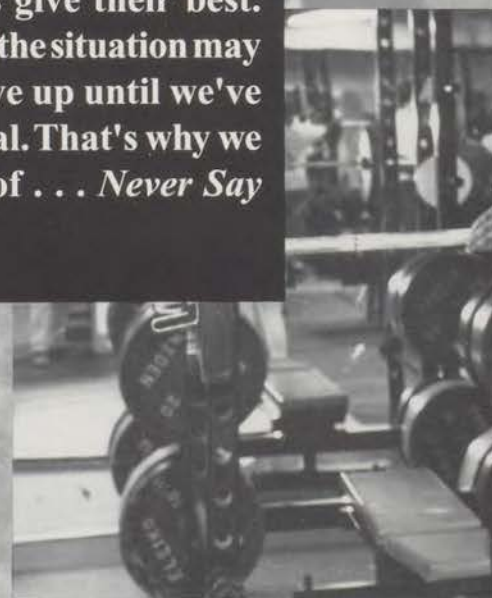
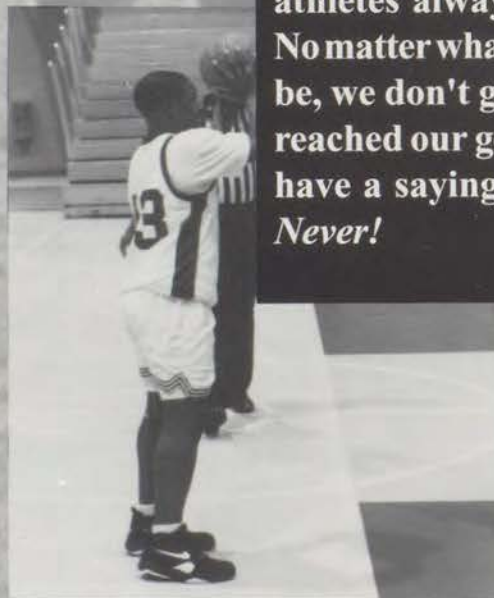


When you hear about high school sports, the school that comes to mind is Central. Our athletics program has an outstanding state of the art facility.

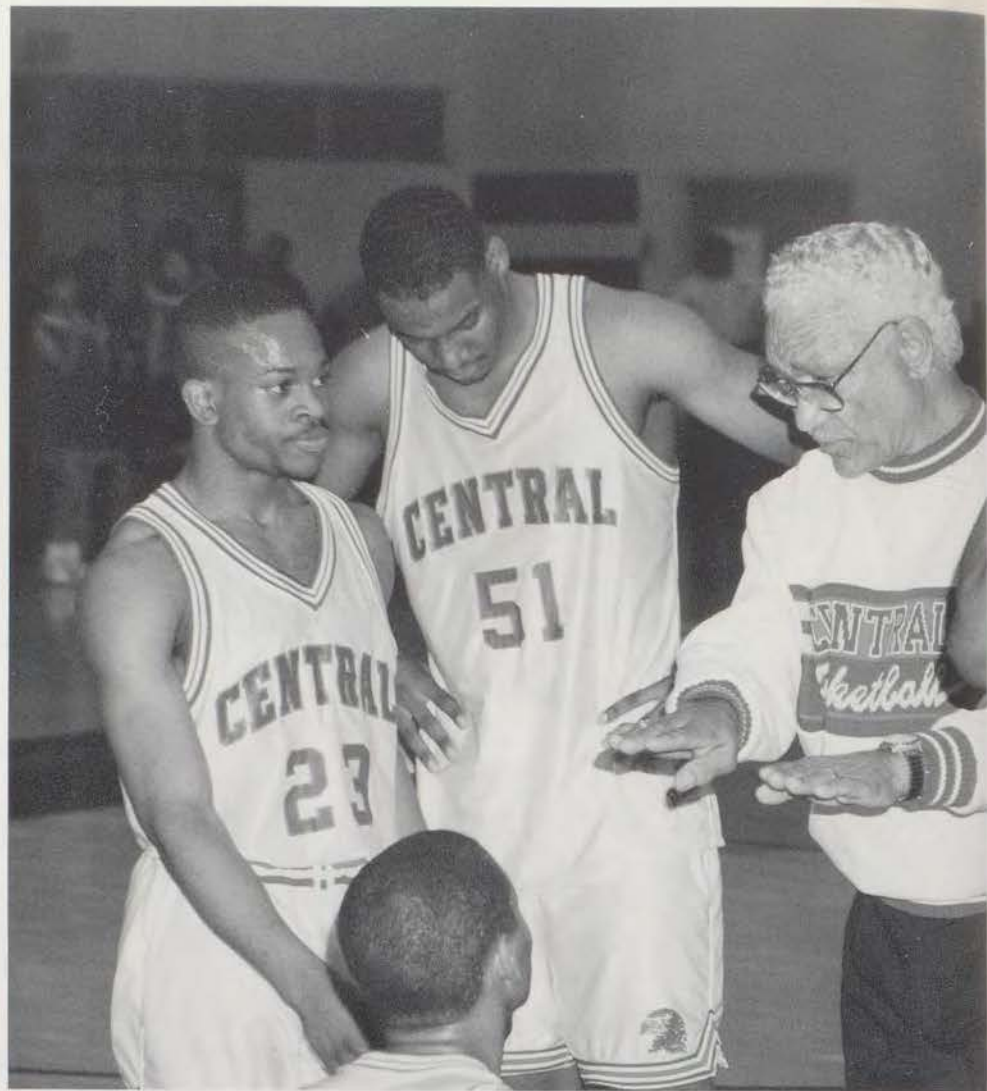

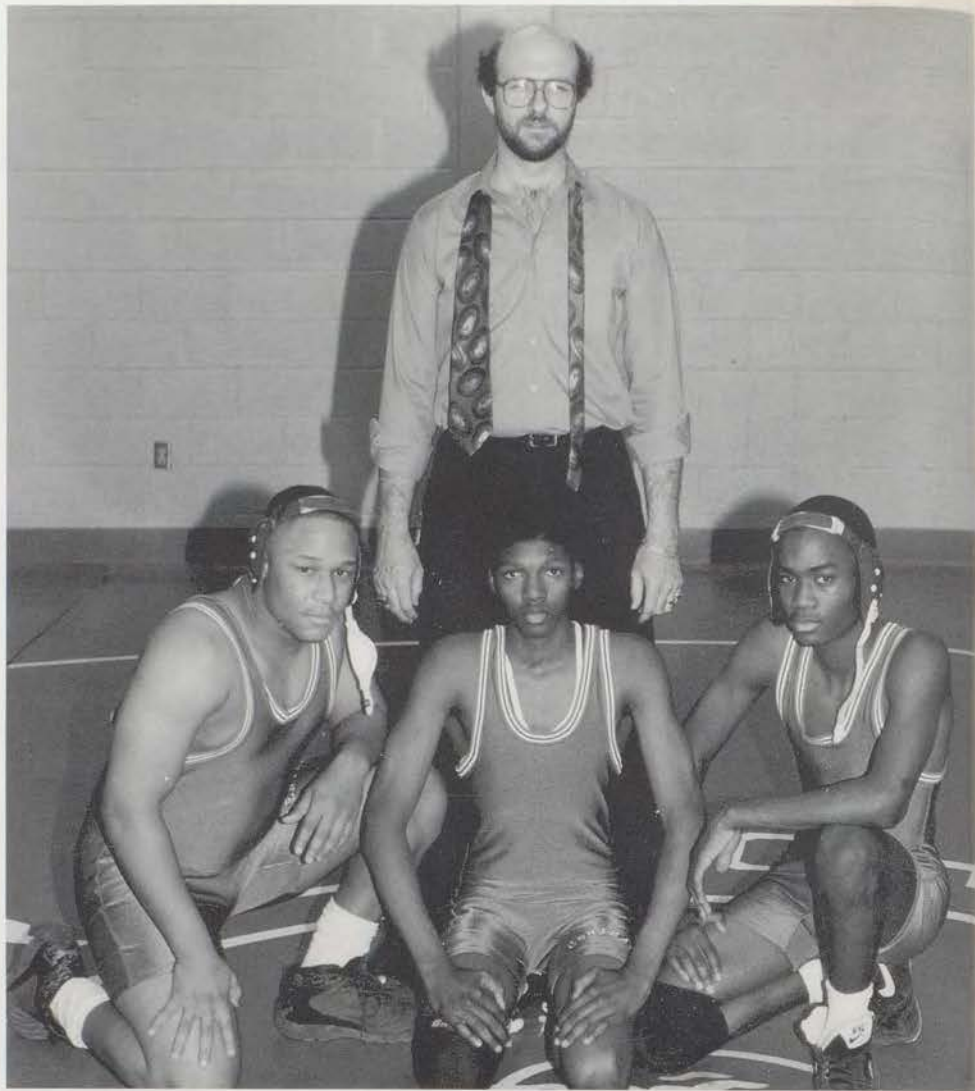

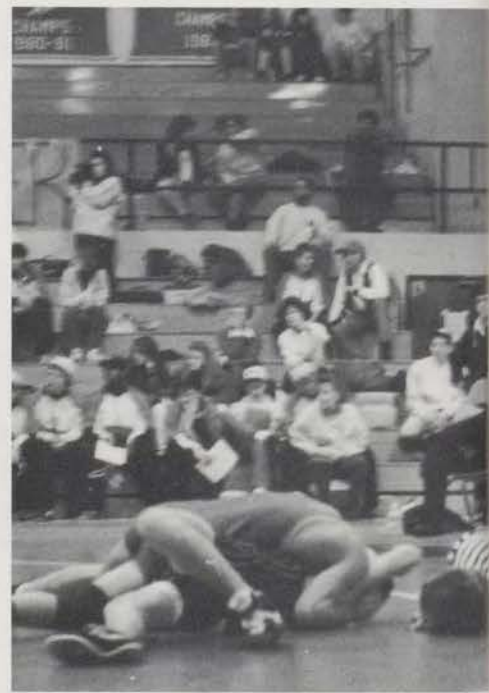

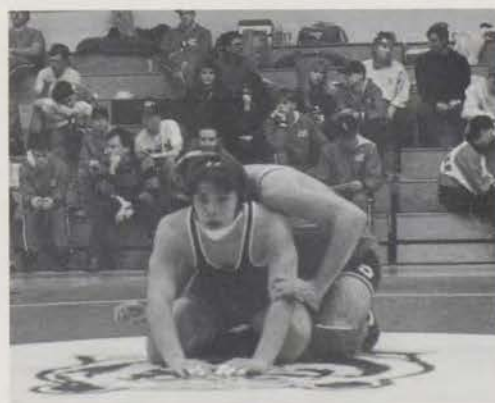

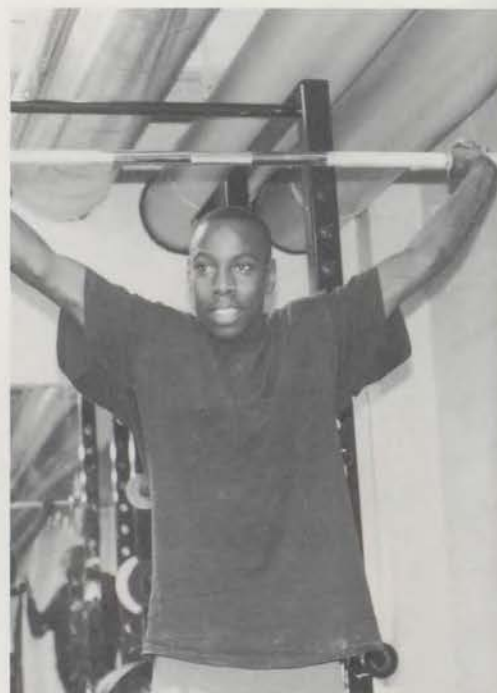

Shawn Smith, winner of the Oratory Contest, is giving his winning essay. Shawn gave the same speech at our closing assembly.

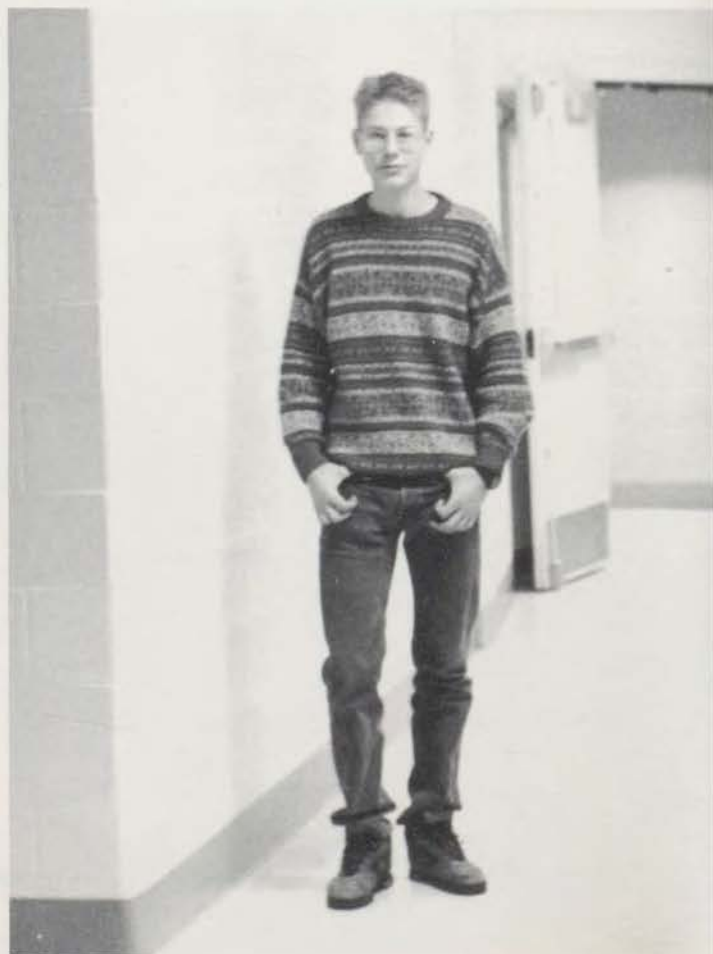
