

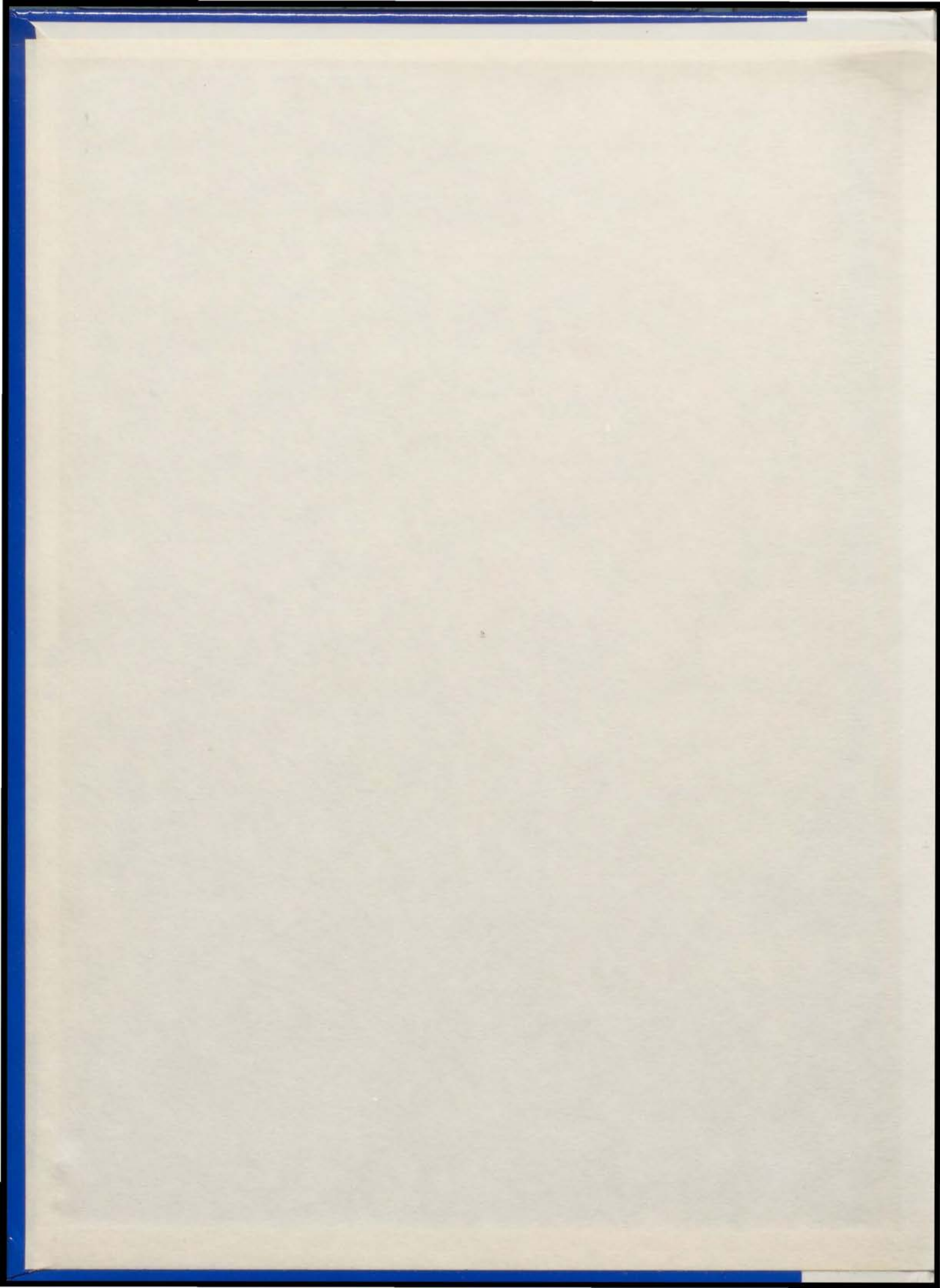

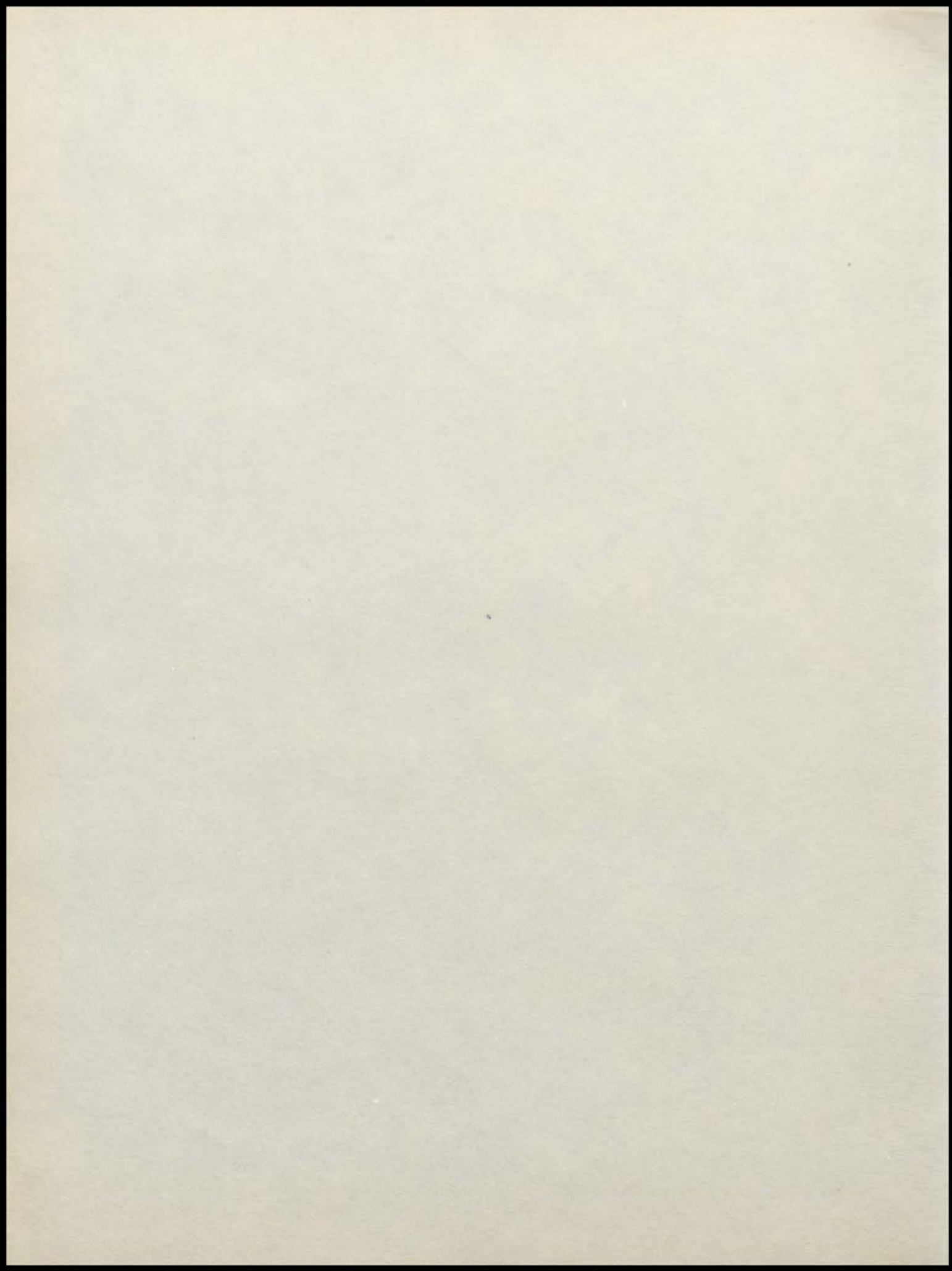

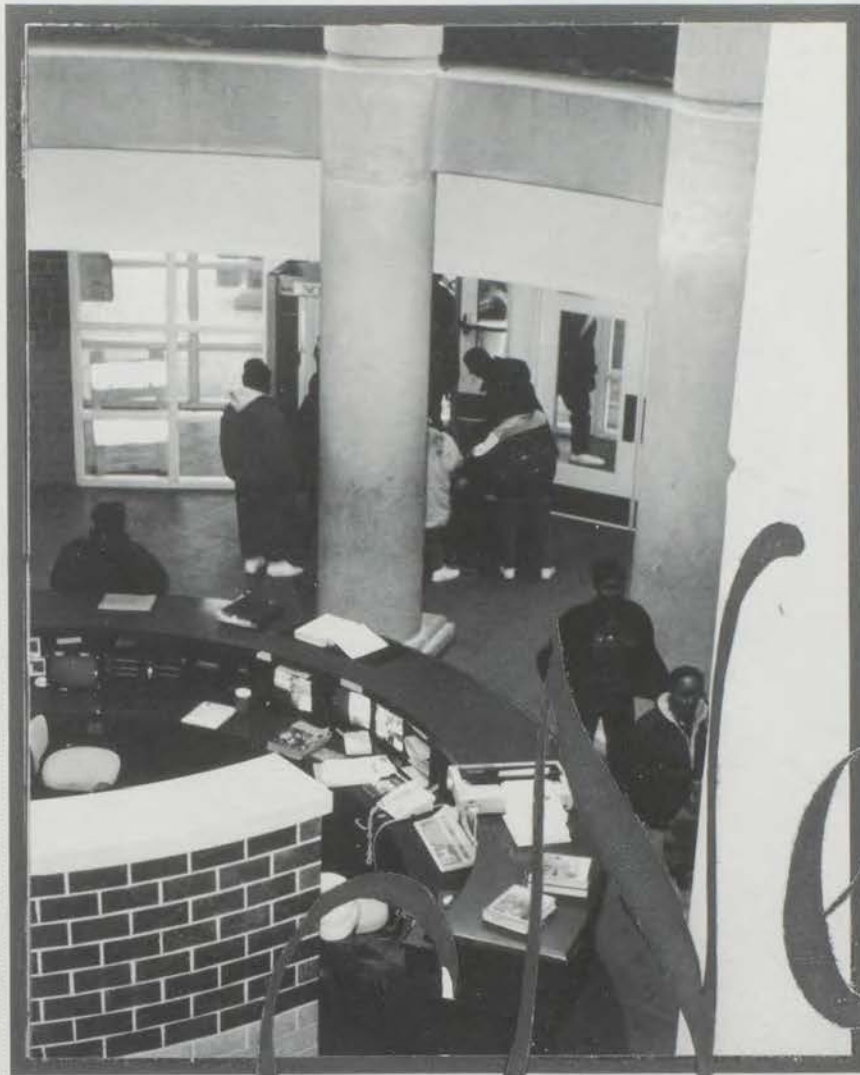

sophomores, we could clearly remember the feelings we had last year and were more than willing to put the freshmen through the proper initiation process ... sort of like passing the torch of

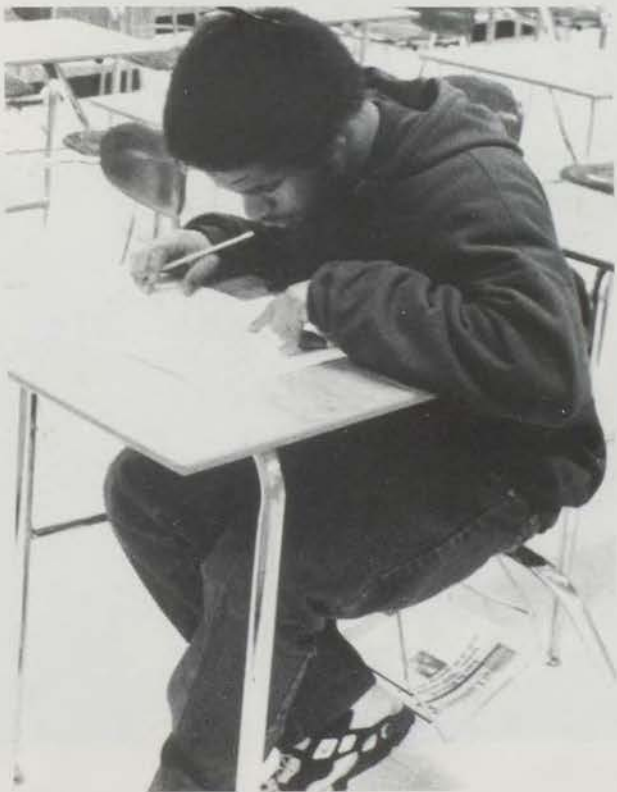

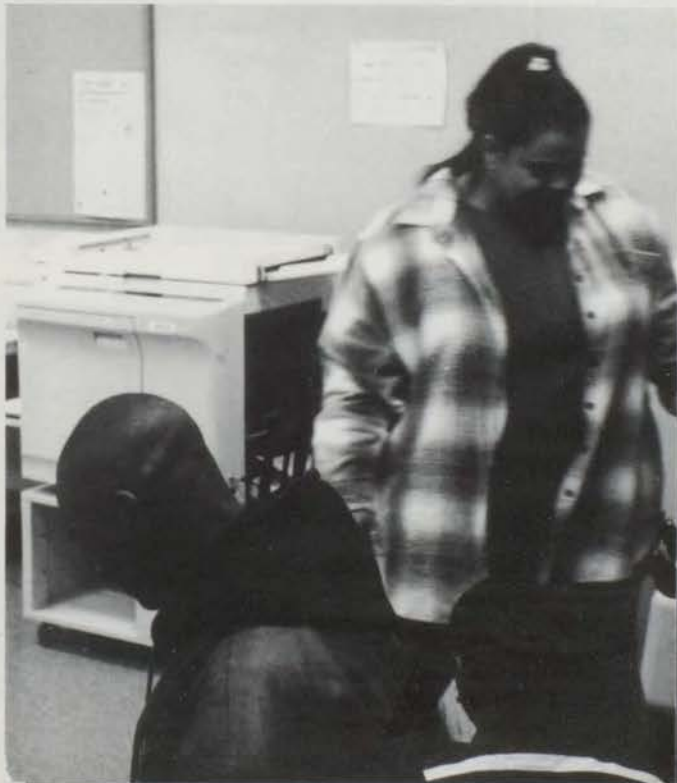
