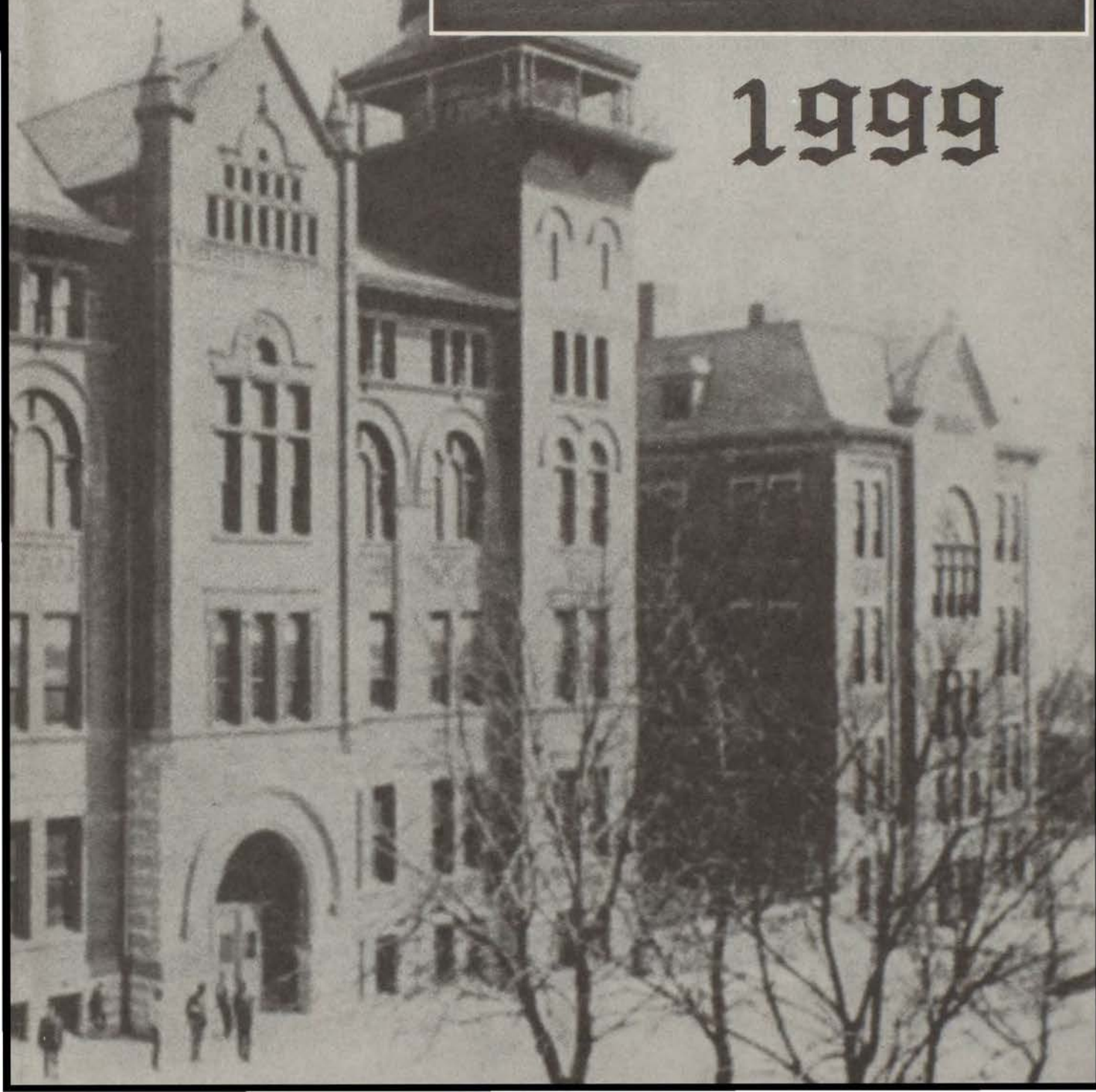

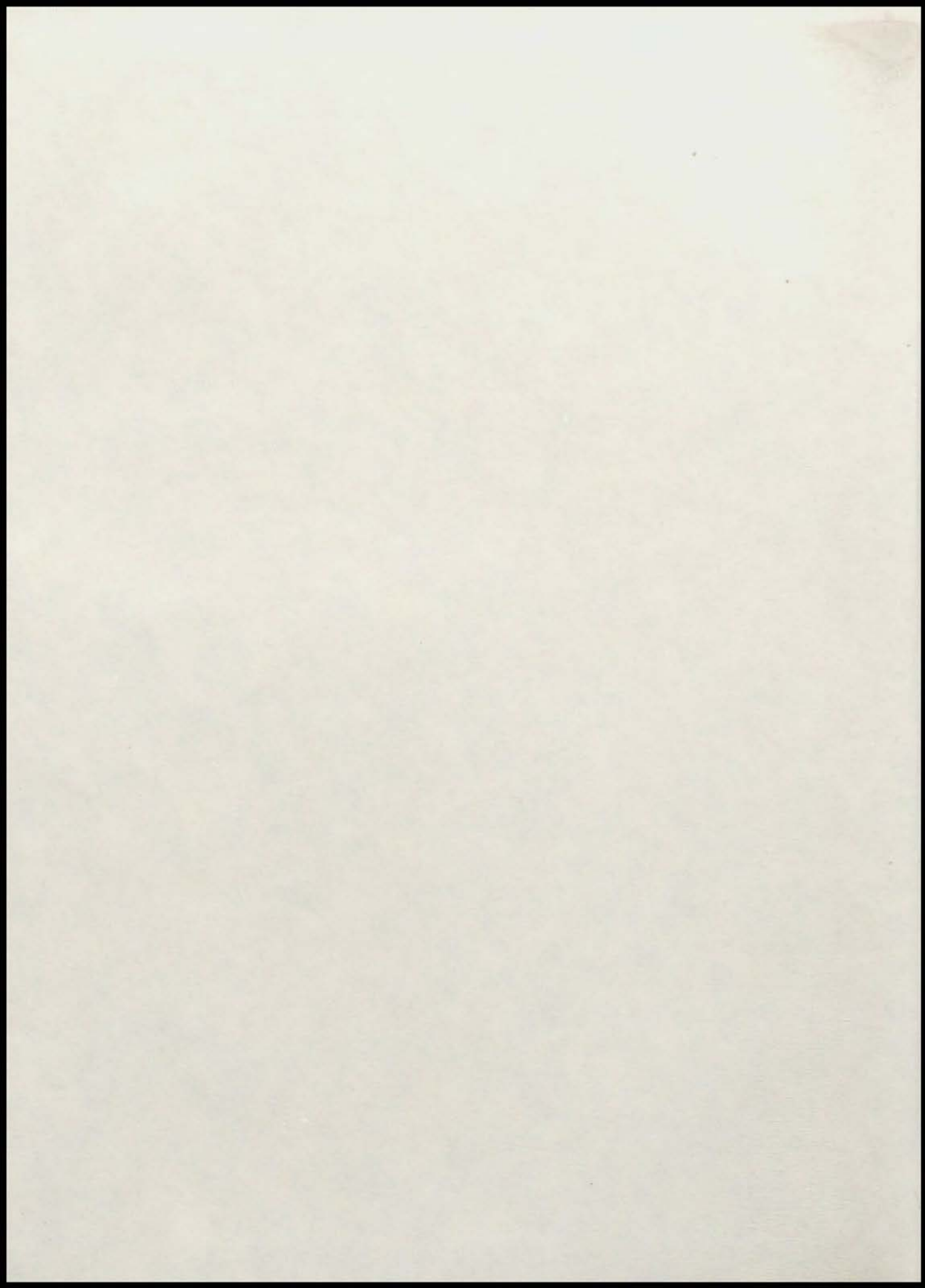

Jerry Cohen
Graduating Class of 1929

Cohen's life started in Europe. In the late 1800s his family moved to the United States in the great floodtide of the Jews. Along with thousands of other Jews, Cohen's parents left Russia and Eastern Europe in search of a better life.

After his family arrived in America, Cohen remembers his father meeting with other immigrants, teaching them how to read and write English. At a young age Cohen had a near death experience. Shortly after birth Cohen caught typhoid fever. The doctor thought that he would not live another day; but, one day after calling another doctor for assistance, the

doctor noticed Jerry had gotten better miraculously.

Jerry Cohen attended Central High School in 1925. Cohen says that the greatest impact on his life from his years at Central was ROTC. He joined ROTC because he felt that he wasn't good at sports. "Since I didn't feel that I was a great athlete" Jerry said, "I enrolled in the ROTC program." ROTC gave him a sense of discipline and the value of obeying the rules, as well as other facts of life.

Attending Central was said to be one of the best decisions that were made in his life. He had excellent mathematics skills, and he loved manual training. Manual training taught him how to print well, which has been very useful to him. At Central, Cohen also learned typing and filing skills. At the age of 15 Cohen graduated from Central with the class of 1929. After graduating he attended a Junior college where he majored in mathematics and accounting.

Cohen's experience at Central made a great impression on his life. "Schools were not the kinds of places they are today with all the troubles, but places where parents, teachers, and children cooperated in trying to give a good education. It was a real pleasure to go to school in those days. I would hope the schools of today can develop a similar atmosphere, an atmosphere in which children can work together in a spirit of cooperation for the good of all."

In 1938 Cohen started his own business selling stencils for mechanical duplicating systems. He credits his success in life to the discipline of a public school education. Cohen is a good example of how anyone, if they work hard enough, can succeed.

It is with great pride, that the yearbook staff of Central High School, in its Centennial edition of the *Centralian*, honors Mr. Jerry Cohen, and his beliefs in a public school education.



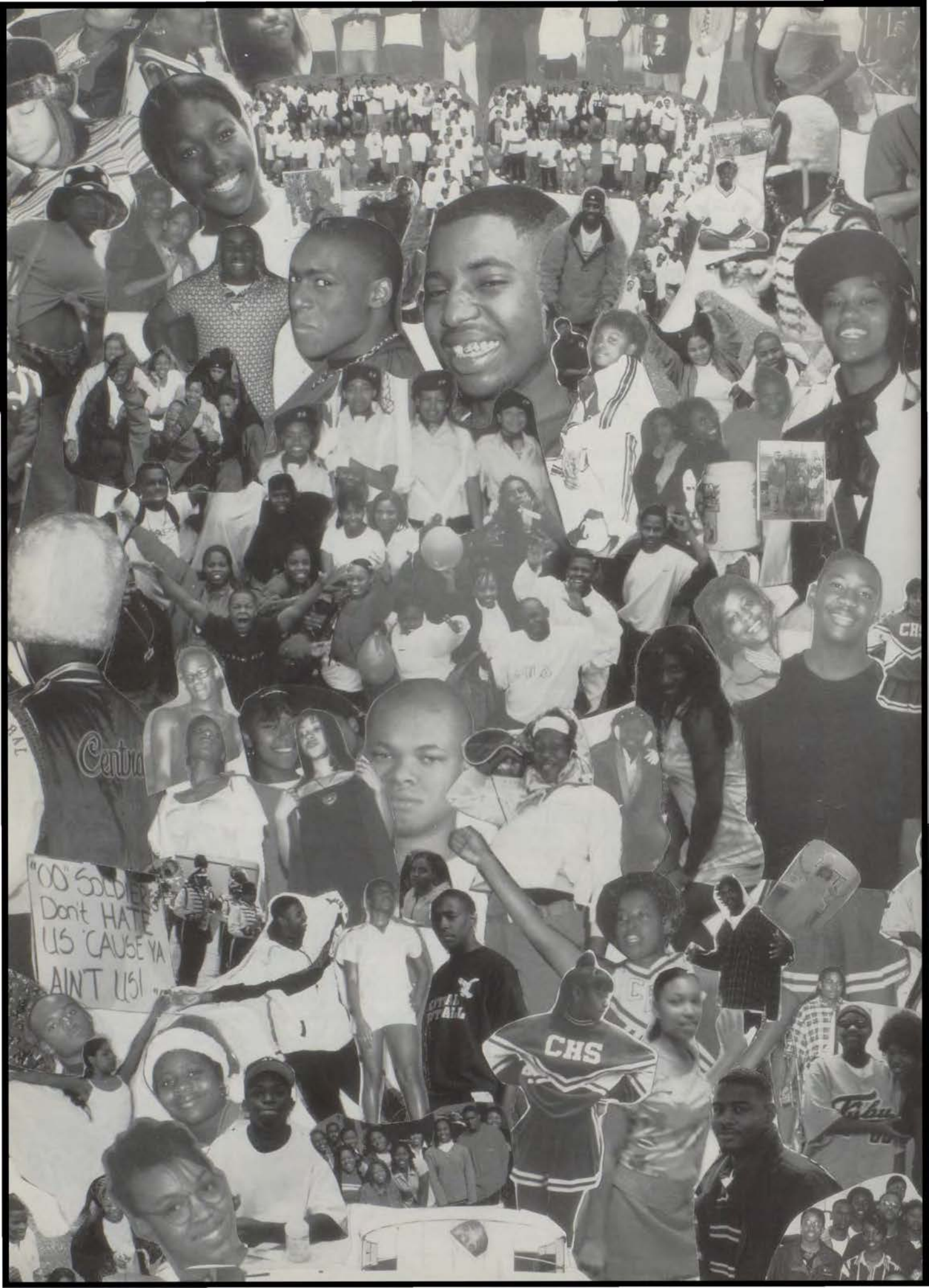
School Creed

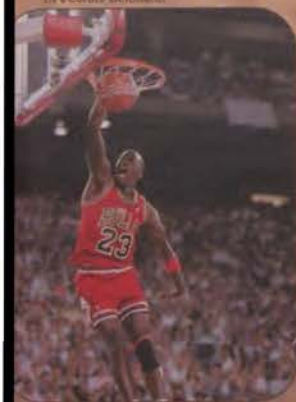

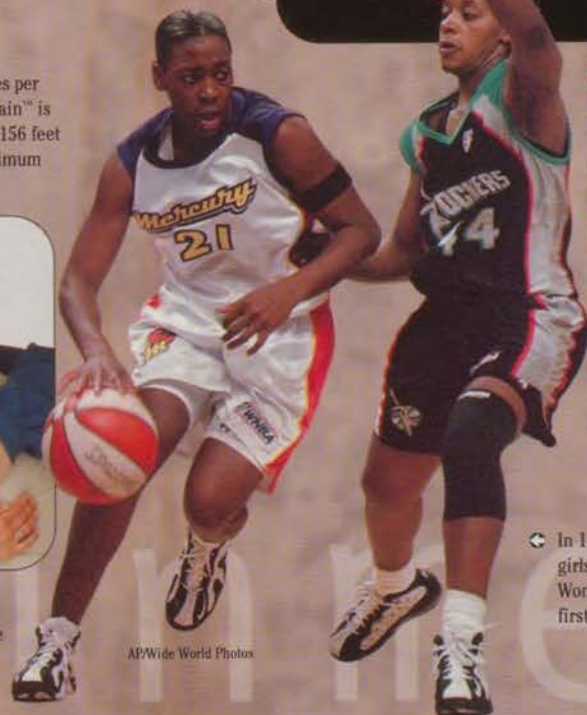
