East 13—Northeast 16

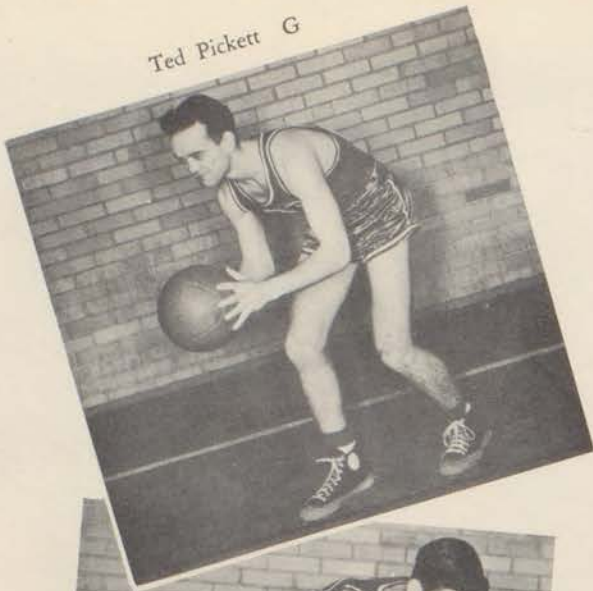

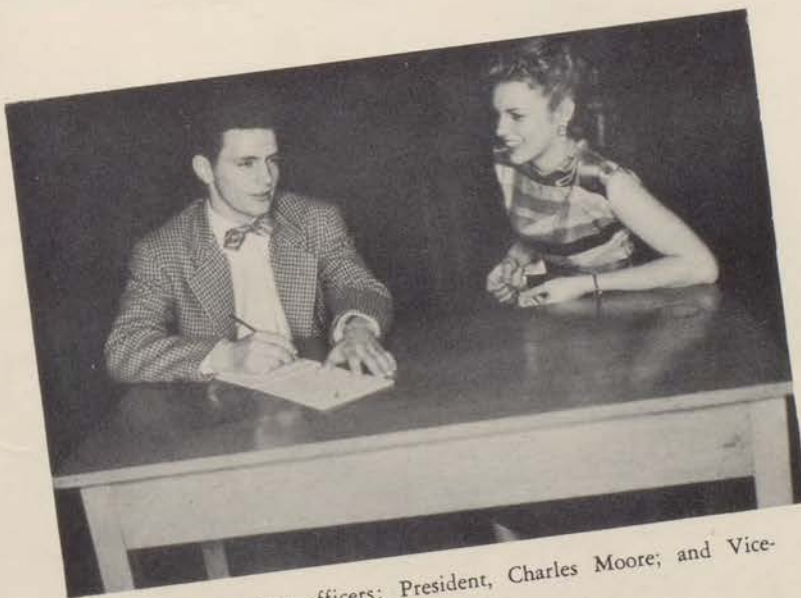

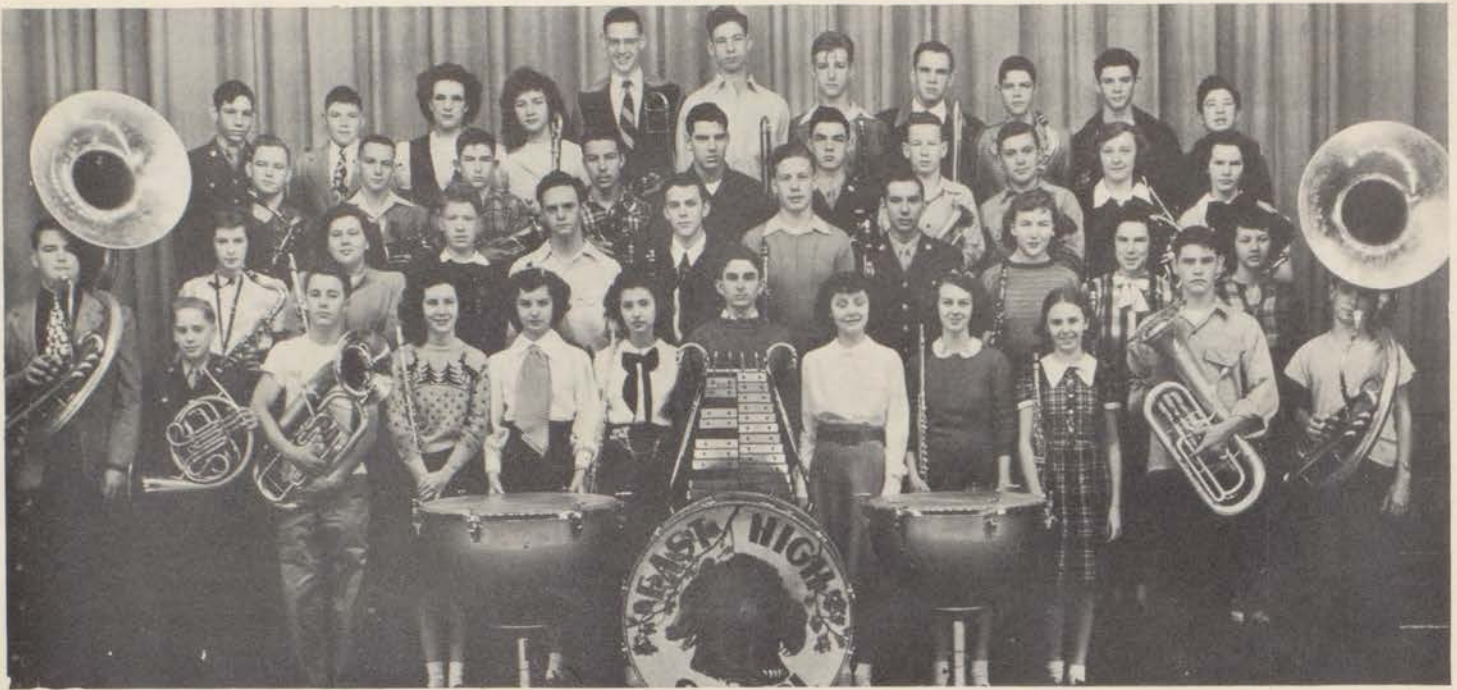
