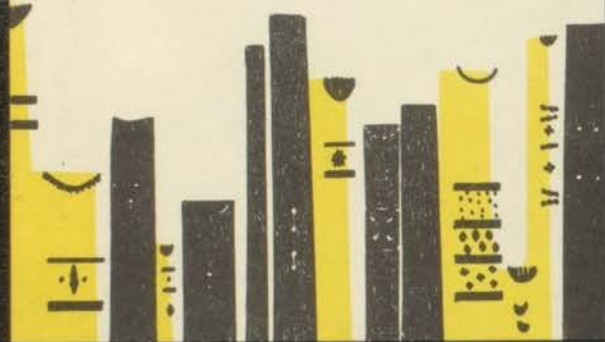

Scholarship, leadership, character, and service. Throughout our years at East these characteristics have been stressed.

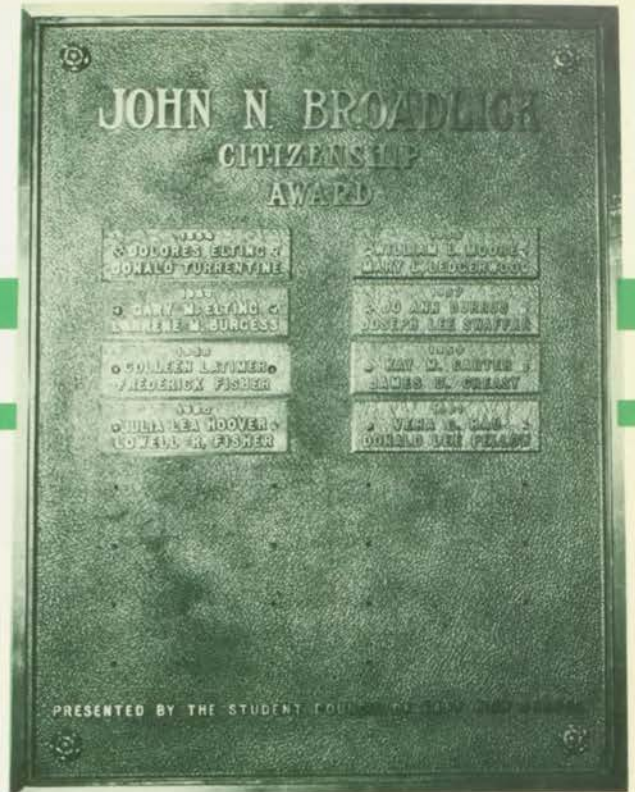
In every class we have learned the value of scholarship. We have learned to study correctly. We have discovered our talents and special abilities.

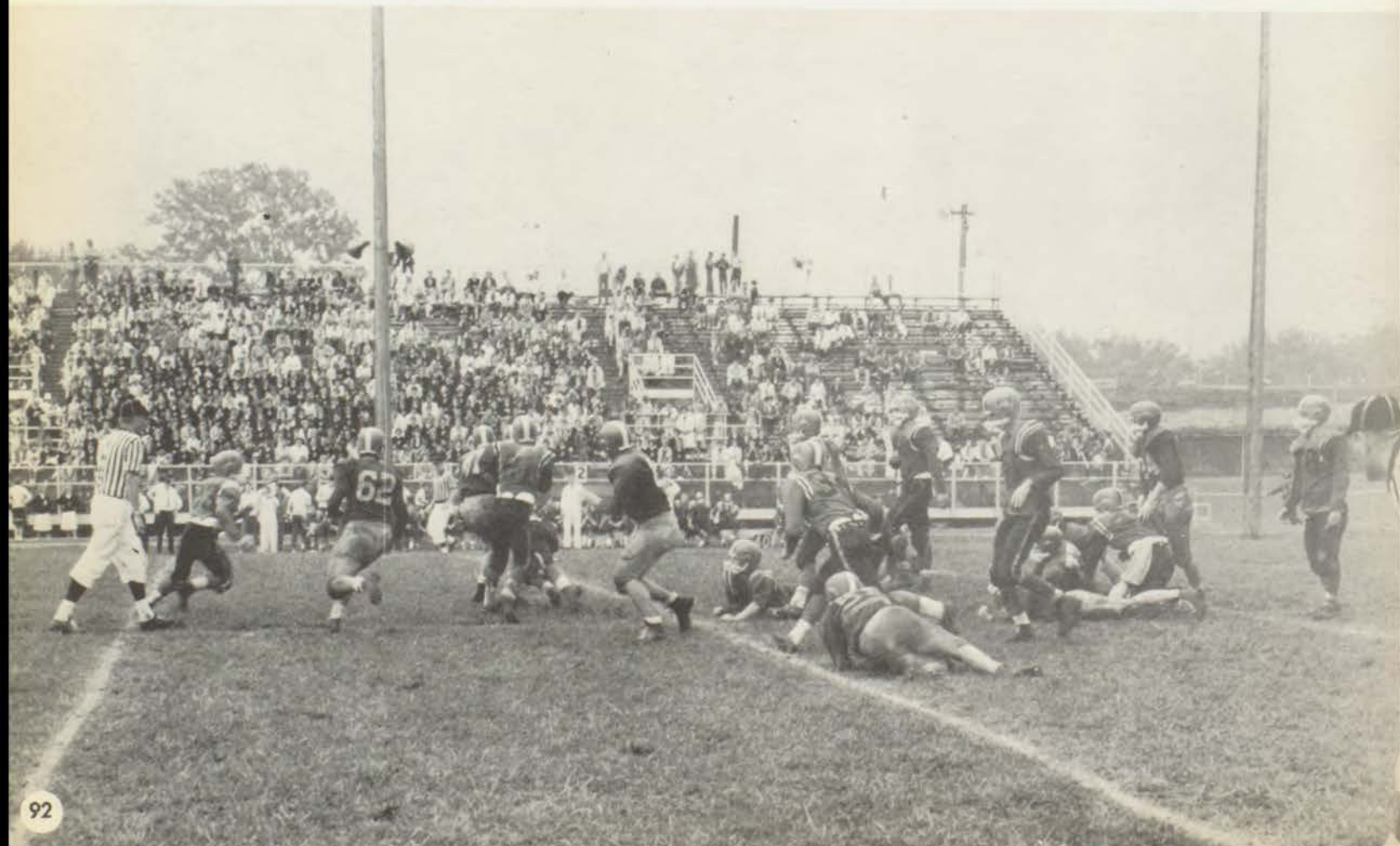
1961 Season Record

A graduate of East in 1933, his early training under Coach J. C. Cohlmeier, first East coach provided the background for Coach Sebastian's style of play, which became so familiar to followers of basketball, a system which netted him 152 victories against 144 losses in the 16 years he coached at East. Because of this sound display of fundamentals, East was always feared and became known for its ability to upset teams with better records.

This season of 1961-62 proved to be no exception, as the Bears went into regional play with a very poor overall record, only to provide two major upsets as they chopped down Park Hill and Van Horn, seeded third and second respectively in the North Kansas City state eliminations, leaving the Bears with a respectable 8-13 season record. Thus with a very average team, Coach Sebastian closed out his years at East, leaving behind only admiration and respect for his handling of boys.

As Coach Sebastian begins his tenure at the new intercity high school, which is to start as a junior high, he leaves many memories of outstanding teams, individuals, and performances. East will always remember him fondly.

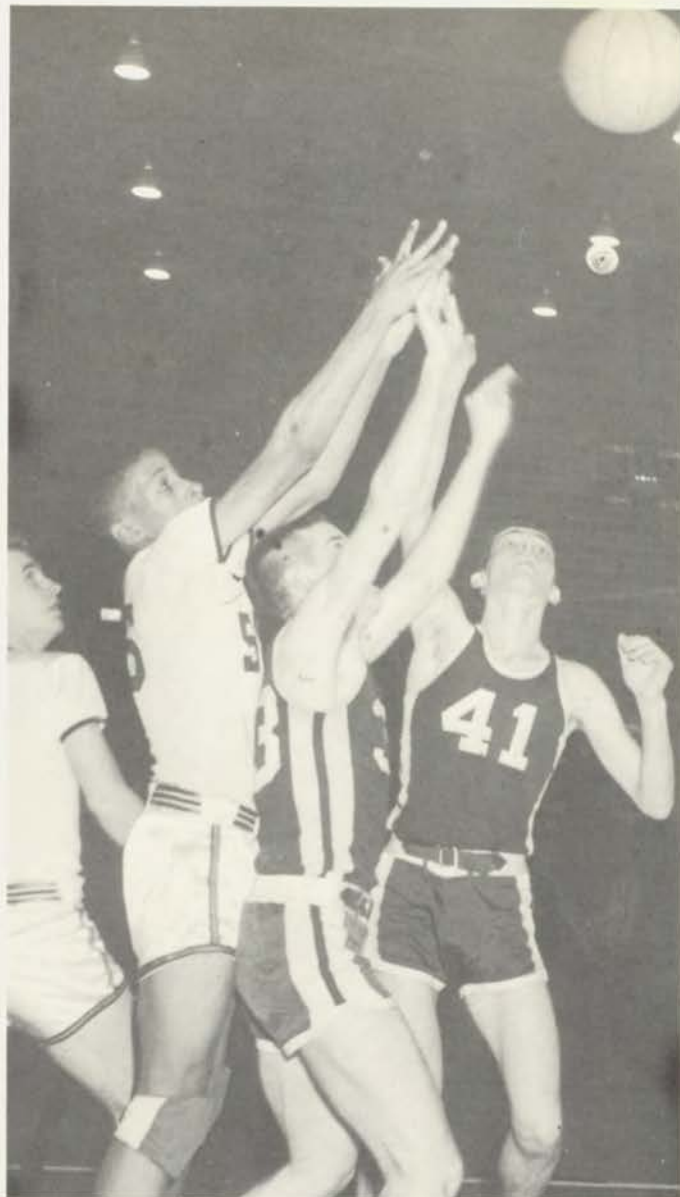

Bears Sprint Past Park Hill

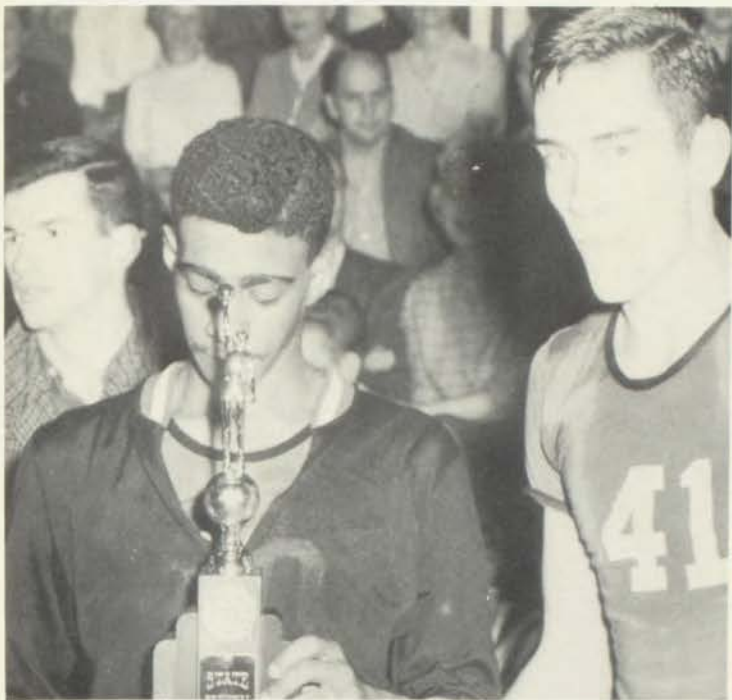

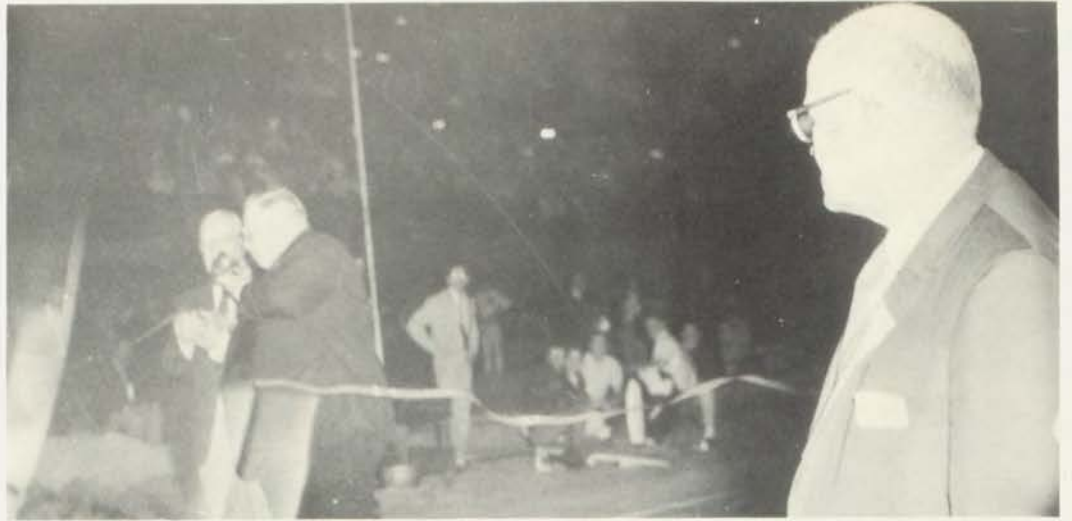

The Junior R.O.T.C. program is unequalled in its scope and purpose. Set up by the Department of the Army after World War I, this program gives the discipline and respect for appointed authority. The program is governed almost entirely by the cadet leaders who are closely supervised by the professional military instructor.

The range of the program is quite wide, covering basic military subjects at all three levels of instruction. The program closely follows that used in basic military training camps of the Army.

Successful completion of the three year program authorizes admission to the Army Reserve Program in the third pay grade (private first class) and permits students attending land grant colleges to be excused from one of the two years of compulsory military training if they so desire. All clothing and equipment is furnished free of charge by the Department of the Army.

In this time of need when the young men of our country are being called to defend the rights and beliefs of our country, this training can be of invaluable benefit to them.
