



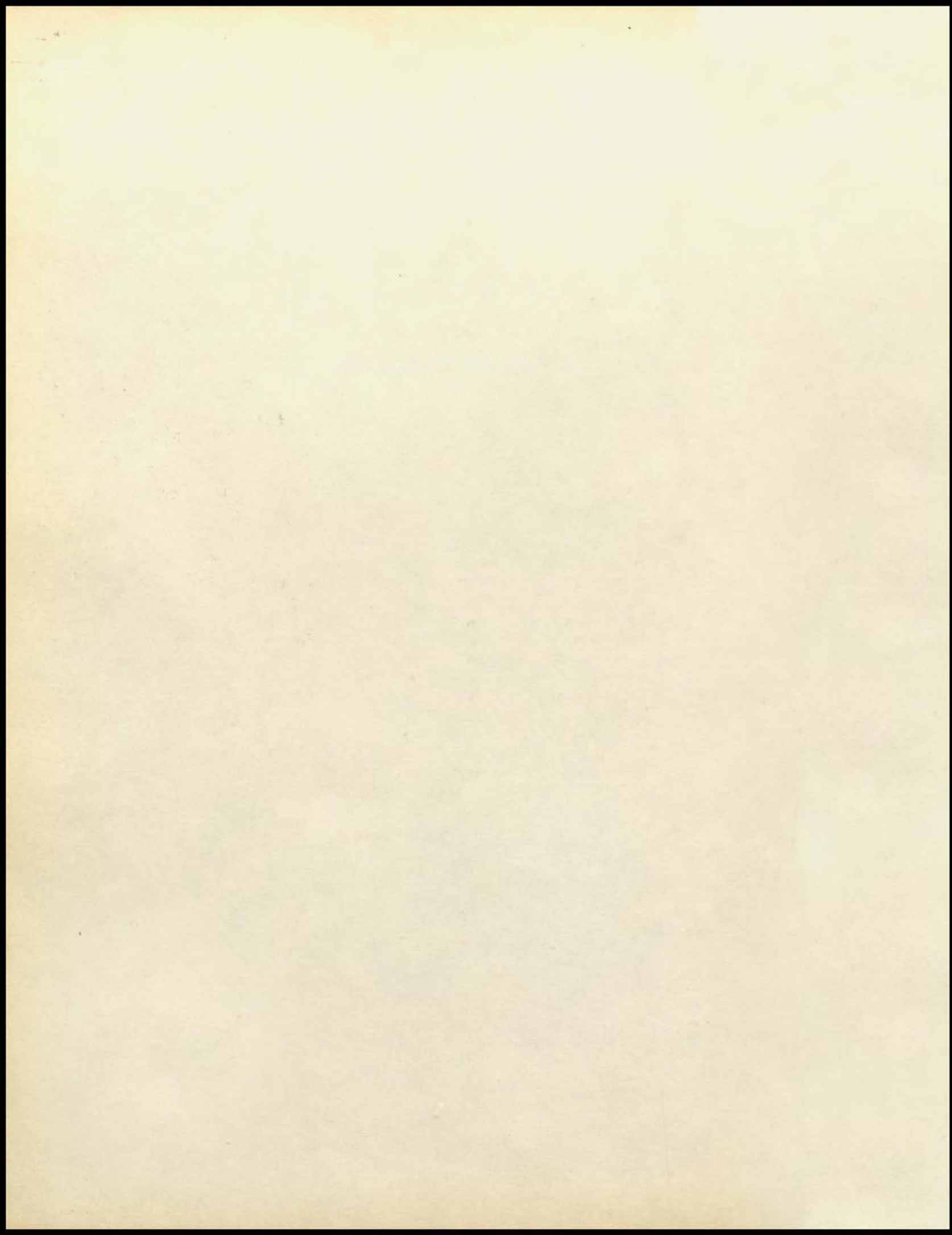

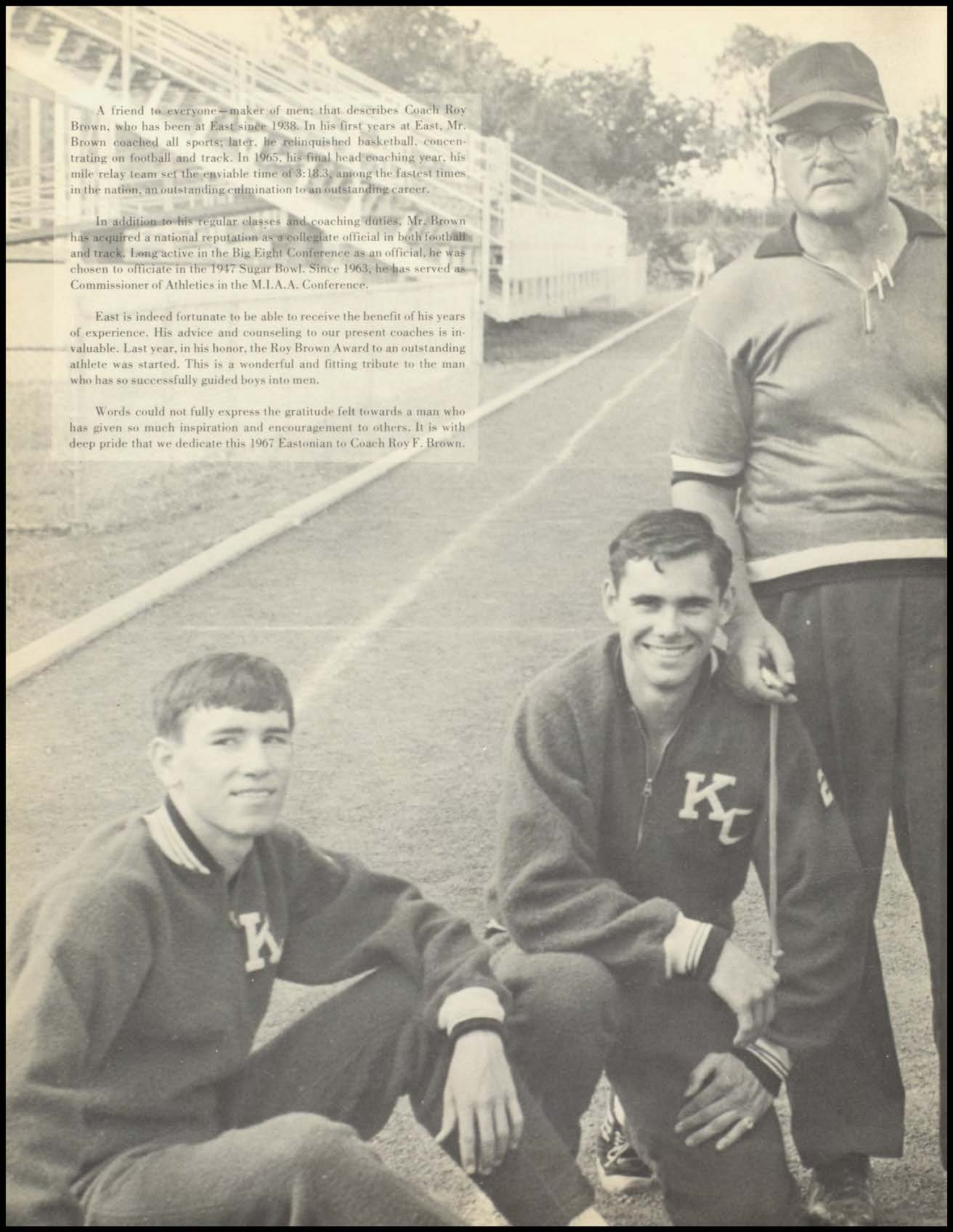

In his first years at East, Mr. Brown coached all sports; later, he relinquished basketball, concentrating on football and track. In 1965, his final head coaching year, his mile relay team set the enviable time of 3:18.3, among the fastest times in the nation, an outstanding culmination to an outstanding career.

In addition to his regular classes and coaching duties, Mr. Brown has acquired a national reputation as a collegiate official in both football and track. Long active in the Big Eight Conference as an official, he was chosen to officiate in the 1947 Sugar Bowl. Since 1963, he has served as Commissioner of Athletics in the M.I.A.A. Conference.

East is indeed fortunate to be able to receive the benefit of his years of experience. His advice and counseling to our present coaches is invaluable. Last year, in his honor, the Roy Brown Award to an outstanding athlete was started. This is a wonderful and fitting tribute to the man who has so successfully guided boys into men.

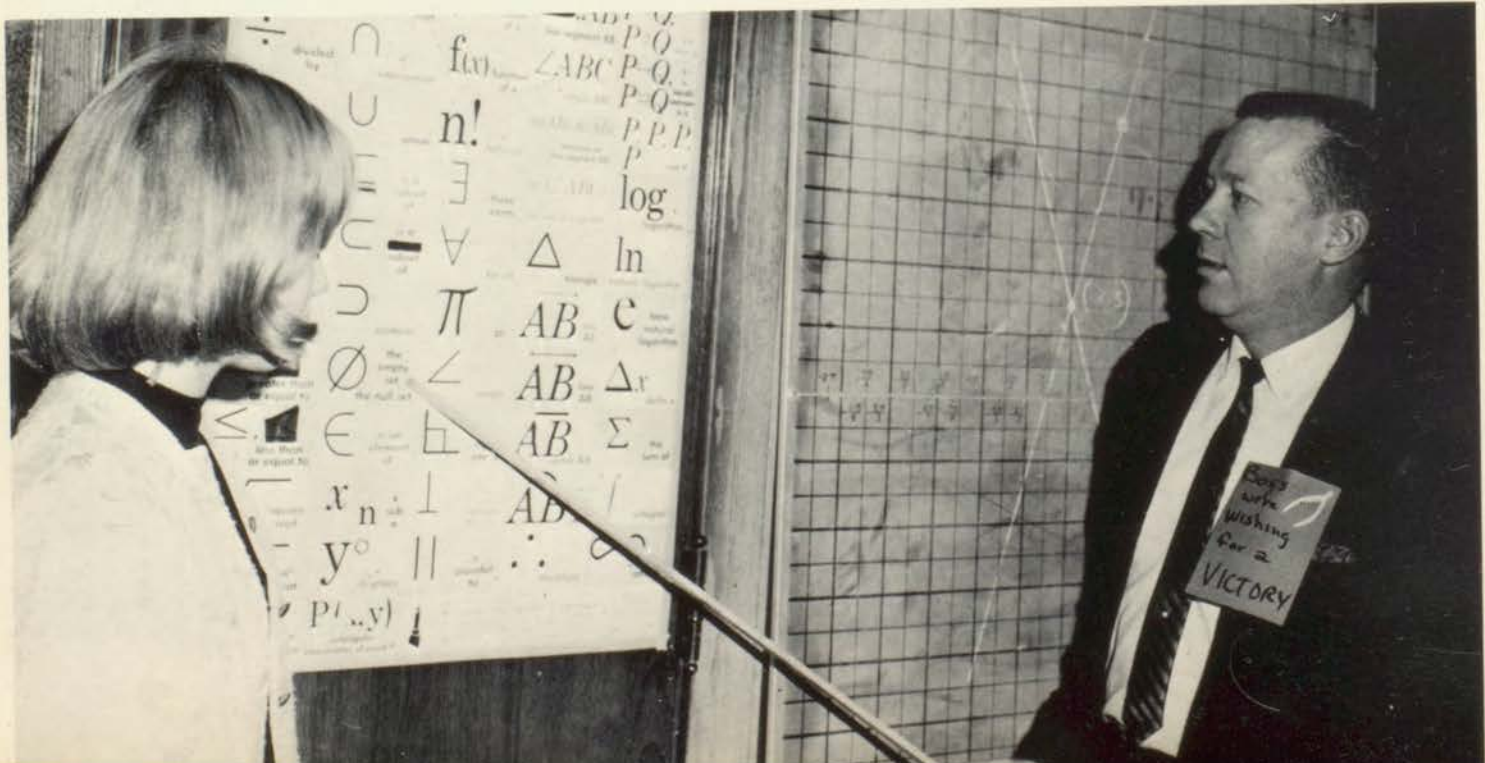
Math Stimulates

Basic Skills

Classes in speech teach students to express themselves to others more efficiently. First-year speech classes instruct students in making introductions, carrying on conversations, using the library, and other everyday, but often neglected, skills. Interested students may go on to public speaking and drama classes. In the area of fine arts, music, speech, drama, art, and language are among the courses offered to students at East. Besides learning basic fundamentals and skills, pupils in the art and music departments learn appreciation of the works and accomplishments of others. These classes broaden each student's education, and give him an opportunity for self-expression. The different talents of many young people are discovered and developed. The combined efforts of the fine arts classes produce most of East's successful school events. While the music and drama departments produce the talent and productions at East, the publicity is furnished through posters and signs by the art department.

The study of a language teaches a student not only to speak and write a language, but also to understand the culture and country of its origin. East offers three languages: Latin, Spanish, and French, under the direction of Miss McLaughlin and Mrs. Donnelly. The new language lab helps students increase their proficiency at speaking and understanding a language.

History classes give pupils a more complete understanding of our country, other nations of the world, and events that are taking place in our time.

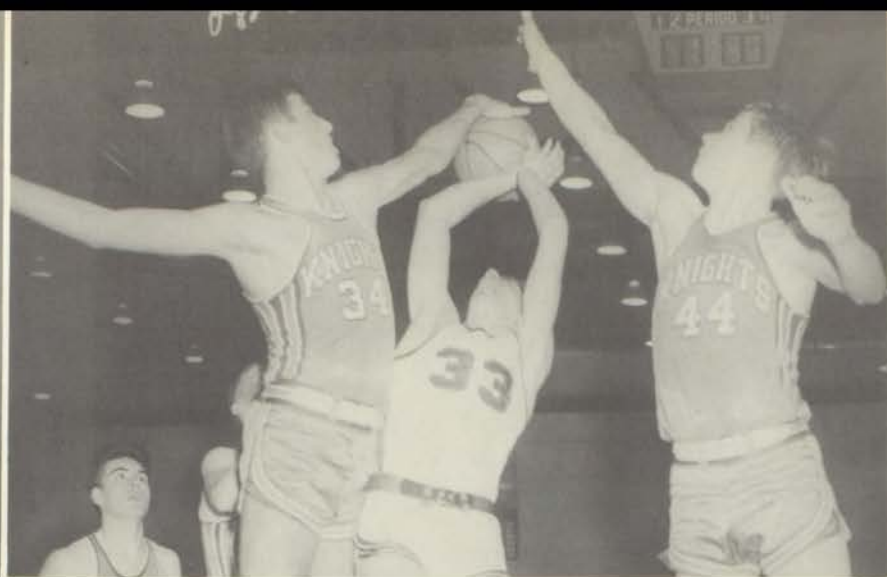

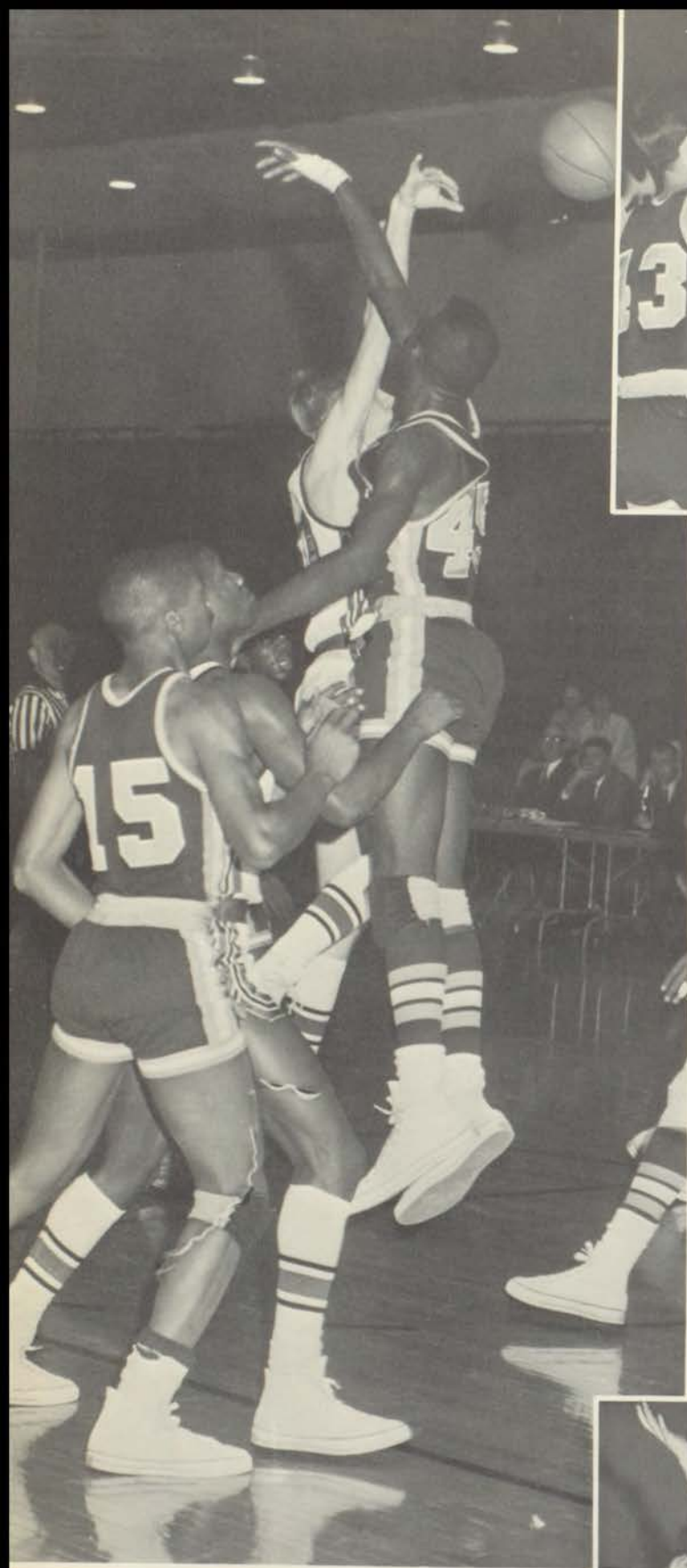

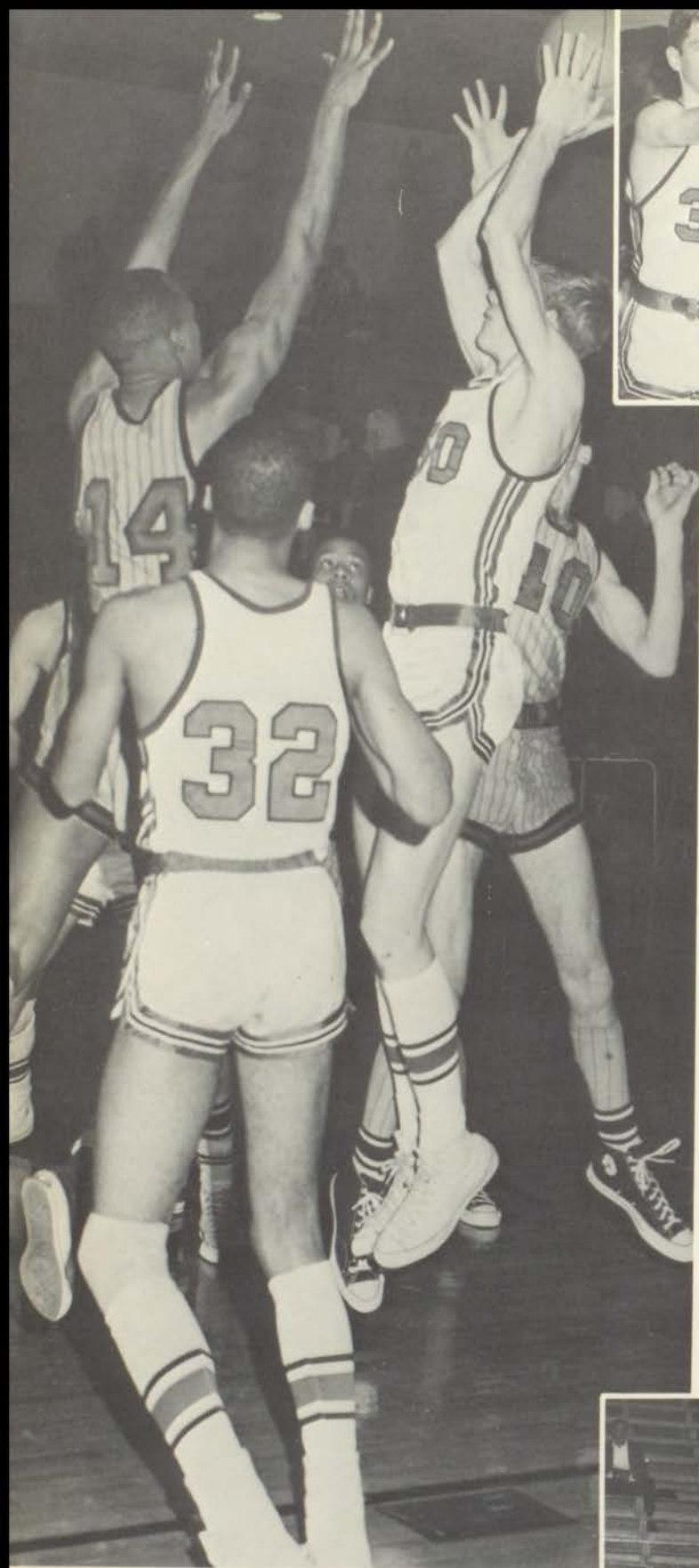

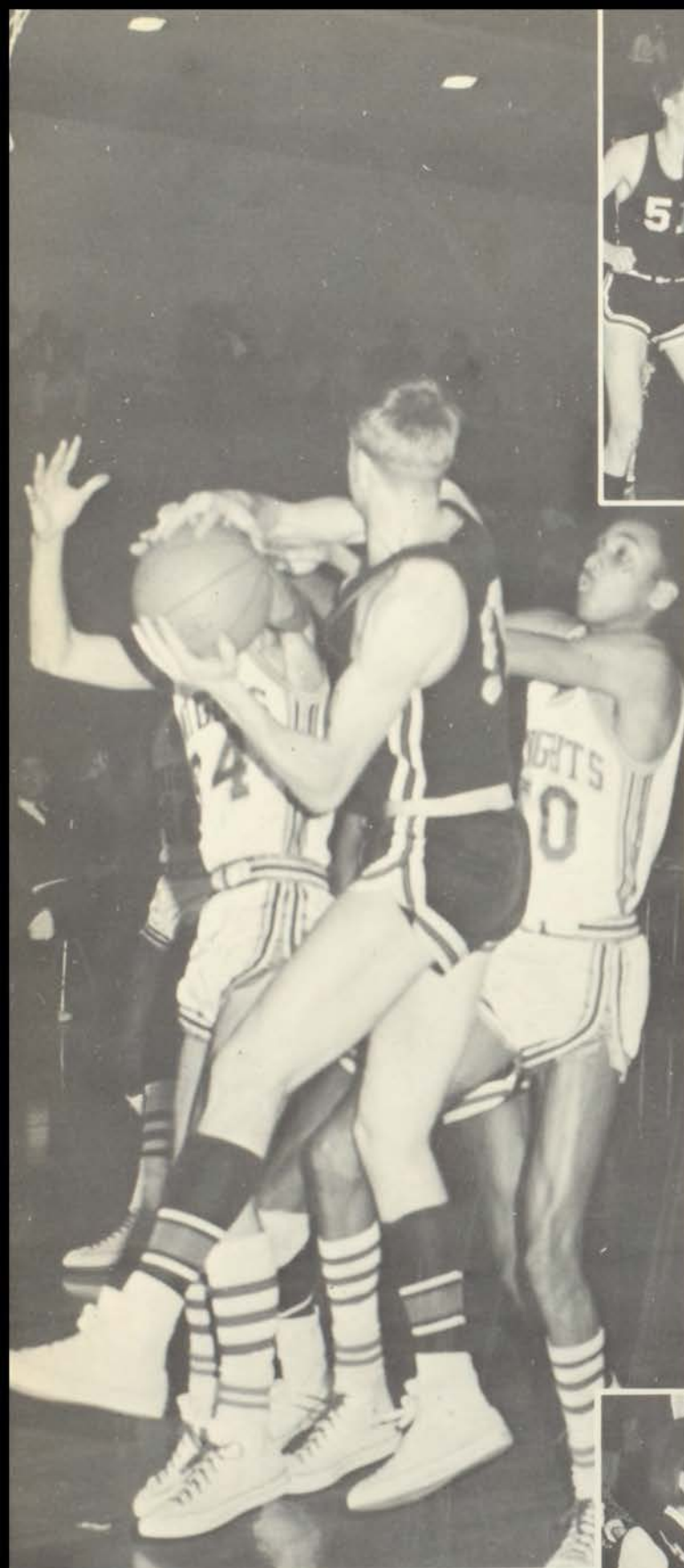

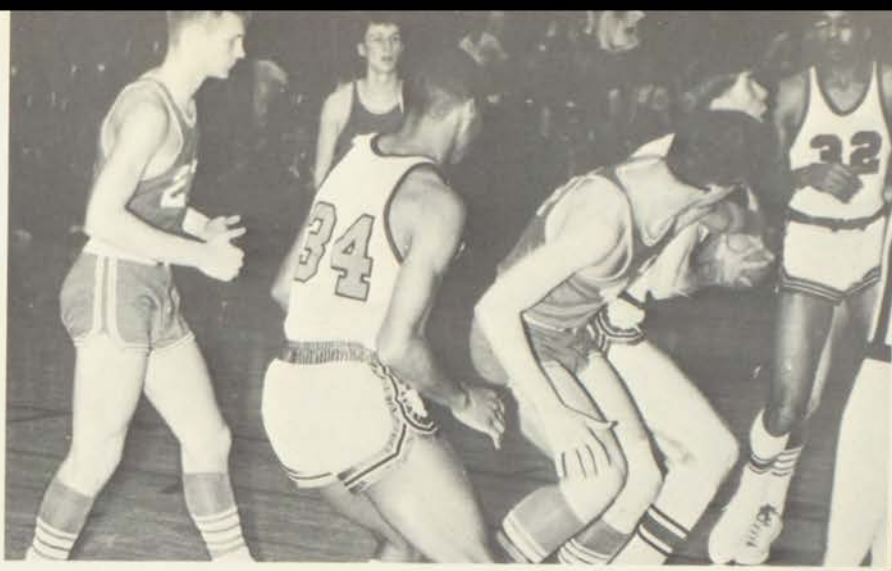

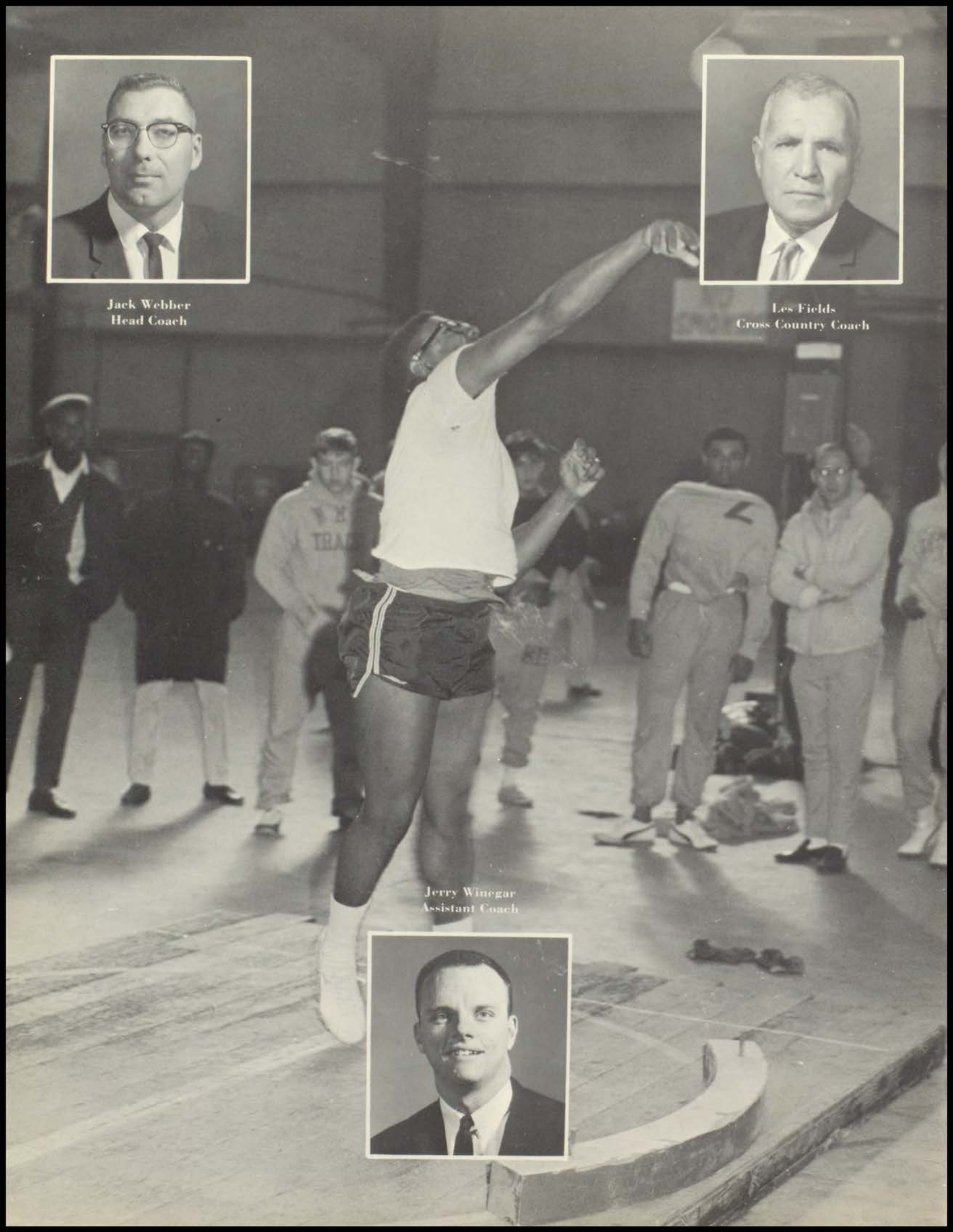

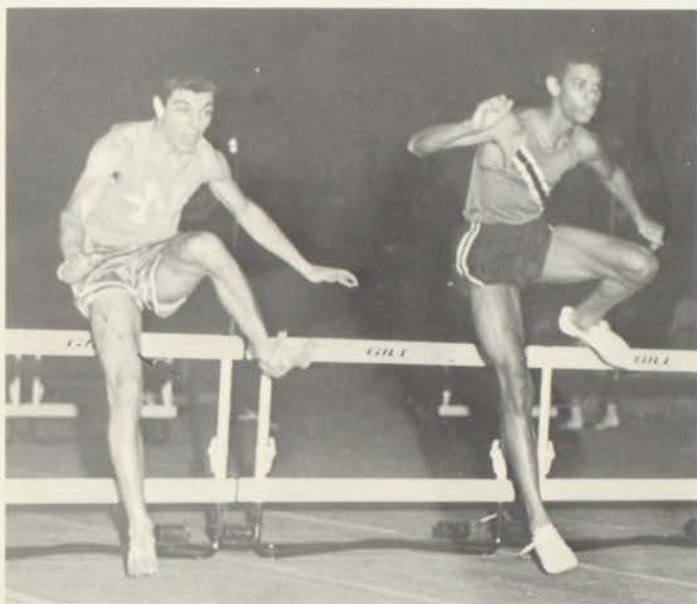

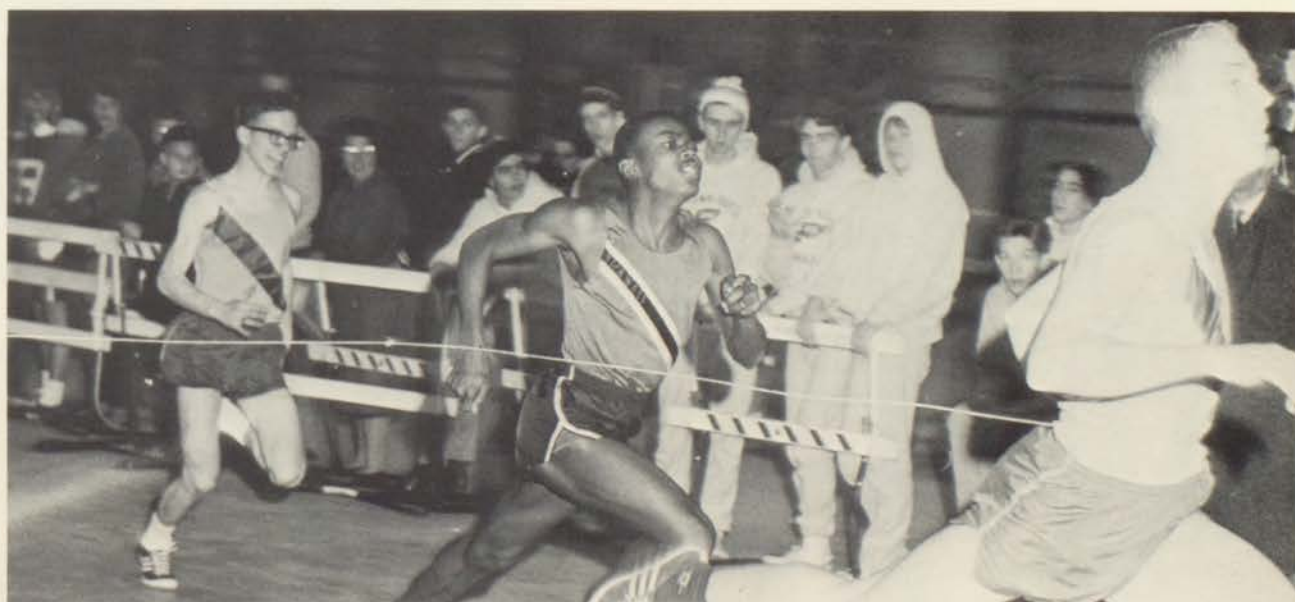

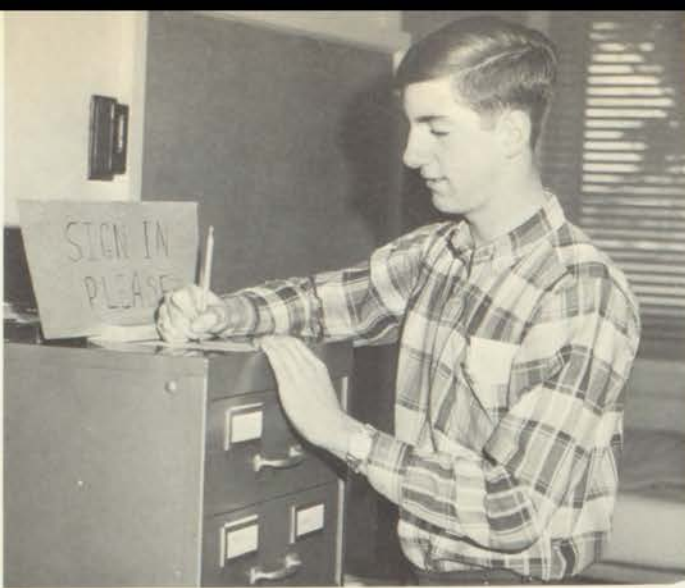
