## Clinic Bombings

An array of anti-abortion bombings have taken place over the last year. Over 24 abortion-related facilities were bombed in an affect to protest by the anti-abortion groups across the country. The most dramatic of these was in Pensacola where on Christmas Day between 3 and 4 a.m. 21 year old Mathew Goldsby and 21 year old Jimmy Simmons bombed three such facilities. The first of their bombings that morning was at the Ladies Center, Inc., which had been bombed six months previous forcing them to their new location. Bombings at Dr. Bo Bagenholm's office and the most damaging of them all at the office of Dr. William Permentor which left only a little more than ashes. Goldsby's fiancée, Kay Wiggins was quoted as saying it was "a gift to Jesus on his birthday." Wiggins and Kathy Simmons both 18 were also arrested on charges of conspiracy and aiding abetting the Christmas bombings.

Instead of ruining the event the rain showed the heartiness of Kansas City spirit. People still went on with their high spirits through picnics and fireworks.

During the day crowds wandered among nine stages and watched 125 acts performed by 350 entertainers.

Kansas Citizens also had their chance to show how much pride Kansas City has for it's country with flags being seen from all over. Kansas City really got it's patriotic spirit across.

The night ended with a typical July 4th celebration, a fireworks display.

## Miss America Looses her Crown

Vanessa Williams, the first Black Miss America was crowned September 17, 1983. Three days after her crowning, news came out that she would be featured in the September issue of Penthouse.

Mr. Guccione, publisher of Penthouse Magazine, said he bought the photographs from a free-lance photographer, Tom Chiapel and that they were taken before Vanessa was crowned Miss America. Vanessa had worked for Mr. Chiapel as a makeup artist and receptionist.

The publisher said that he did, in fact, have a model release signed by Miss Williams, which made it legal to publish the photos.

When Vanessa was given the title of Miss America she had to sign a



contract with the pageant making her sole agent during her reign. The contract also contains a moral clause which is "the maintaining of the dignity of the crown of Miss America."

## McDonalds Massacre

In the eyes of four dozen people gathered at triumphal golden arches at 4 p.m. on July 18, 1984 the worst one-man massacre in U.S. History occurred. The assailant, James Huberty, an unemployed Security Guard. Among the dozens of people were three boys on bicycles, a family returning from vacation, a trucker on his coffee break, a pair of grandparents ordering take out food, 14 employees. Less than an hour and a half later, 19 of them were wounded and 21 were dead or dying. In the days that followed, the statistics began to reveal that the oldest person killed was 74, the youngest eight months and that two of the women were pregnant, and that Huberty used three weapons, a 9mm Browning automatic pistol, a 9mm UZI semi-automatic rifle and a 12 gauge pump shotgun. He fired 257 rounds. He himself was killed by a .308 caliber bullet fired by a SWAT sharpshooter. This unbelievable tragedy left a mask of an unforgettable horror for its witnesses.



## Berhard Goetz (Subway Gunman) hero or not?

Is Berhard Goetz a hero? Is what many New Yorkers were asking after the New York man shot and wounded four youths, after they had tried to rob him on a New York subway. The victims were Troy Cantey and Darrell Cabey both 19, Barry Allen and James Ramseur 18. Cantey and Allen sustained relatively minor injuries, while Ramseur suffered multiple wounds, and Cabey, with a pierced lung and a damaged spine was paralyzed from the waist down.

After the shooting occurred the vigilante disappeared into the dark tunnel leaving behind four wounded youths a subway full of shocked people. For nine days New York police lost sight of the gunman but on the tenth day after the shooting Goetz walked into the Concord NH police station and told the officer on duty "I am the person they are seeking in New York". Following the arrest, Goetz had numerous hours of conversations with authorities which remained disclosed. Goetz later raised \$50,000 and freed to await possible indictment. But the question still remains is he a hero or not?

## EAST HIGH CELEBRATES BLACK HISTORY MONTH

During the month of February, East High School celebrated Black History Month to honor blacks who have made contributions to the society.

The planning committee for this occasion invited black leaders from the community to come to East and visit with the students. Having felt that it would be a unique experience for the students.

Black History is a Mystery, was a special feature designed to involve students in the program. They were given an opportunity to answer questions about leaders both black and white, past and present. Awards were given for those who answered the questions correctly.

The program for the month was as followed: February 4-8, Blacks in Education; February 11-15 Blacks in the Arts; February 18-22; Blacks in Science and Math and February 25-28, Blacks in Business and Government.

## Baby Receives Baboon's Heart

Baby Fae became the longest surviving human recipient of an animal heart October 26, 1984, and drank from a baby bottle as a baboon's heart beat in her chest for a fifth day.

The infant, whose real name was never public, at her parents request, was in serious but stable condition.

On Friday, October 26 when the controversial transplant was performed the infant was within hours of death because her own heart was severely underdeveloped, doctor said. Baby Fae's operation had raised controversy among doctors and scientists when the transplant team confirmed it had not sought a human organ and later learned that the heart of a 2 month old baby was available the day of the baboon transplant. But an Organ Donor Group, which at first said the heart was available later said it wasn't until after the transplant.

## - Music Scene -

Not since four Beatles, from England, invaded America's shores has music seen more colorful, exciting and eventful year. Music saw the rebirth of many greats including that "Private Dancer" Tina Turner, and the discovery of new talent such as "Crazy" Prince.

Kansas City was entertained at live concerts by a range of talent that spanned over years of music: From the blond that has more fun Rod Stewart, to the girl who wants to have more fun, flame haired Cyndi Lauper.

One concert brought nation wide attention to Kansas City. The "Jacksons Victory Tour" kicked off at the Truman Sports Complex, July 6, 7, 8. It was billed as the most expensive, extravagant, and exciting music event in history. It was also the most controversial. Complaints about ticket cost, the "lottery system" used to sell tickets, and other problems abounded. But when the smoke cleared, all in attendance enjoyed the show, which was more than a concert. It was almost a festival of music which will probably never happen again.

Another concert of major importance was held by Bruce Springsteen, widely acclaimed and highly controversial rock 'n roller, whose career has been up and down over the years. He has never enjoyed a more successful year than this. Gearing his music toward problems facing young America, he has seen his music confused by such high ranking officials as President Ronald Reagan, who mistakenly thought "BORN IN THE USA" was a song hailing the glories of America, when in fact it has been adopted by the Vietnam Vets as their theme song because it deals with the problems they have faced since returning from that conflict. But most of all, Bruce Springsteen has lit a fire in the hearts of many, and if nothing else made them begin to think about their country again.

Prince was advised by doctors to cut his tour short. And that is exactly what the rock star did. In February Prince and the Revolution with Sheila E., postponed the originally scheduled concert in Kansas City, March 20 and to April 17 and 18. Shortly after Prince then cancelled the April dates. Prince's doctor advised him to end his tour immediately because he was exhausted. The 32 city tour began last fall to promote his smash album "Purple Rain" and also his new release "Around The World in a Day". The tour ended April 7th at the Orange Bowl in Miami. Three other cities including Kansas City remained on the tour.
