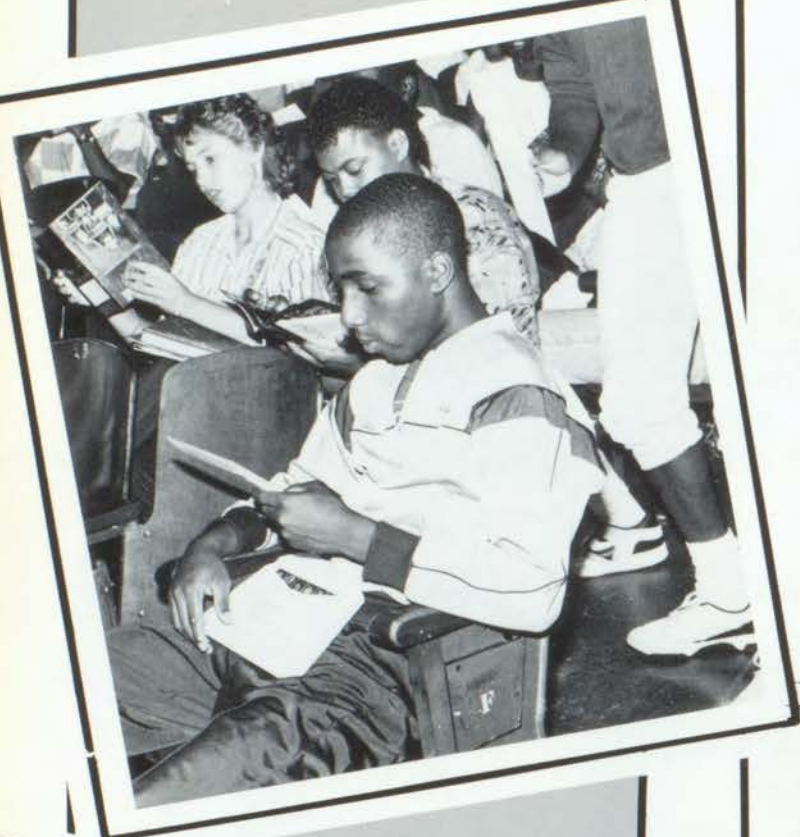

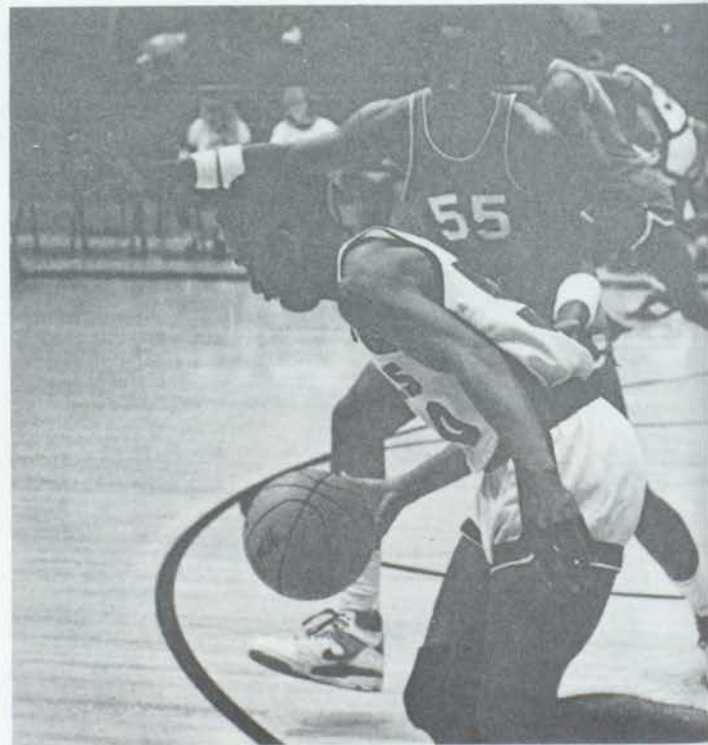

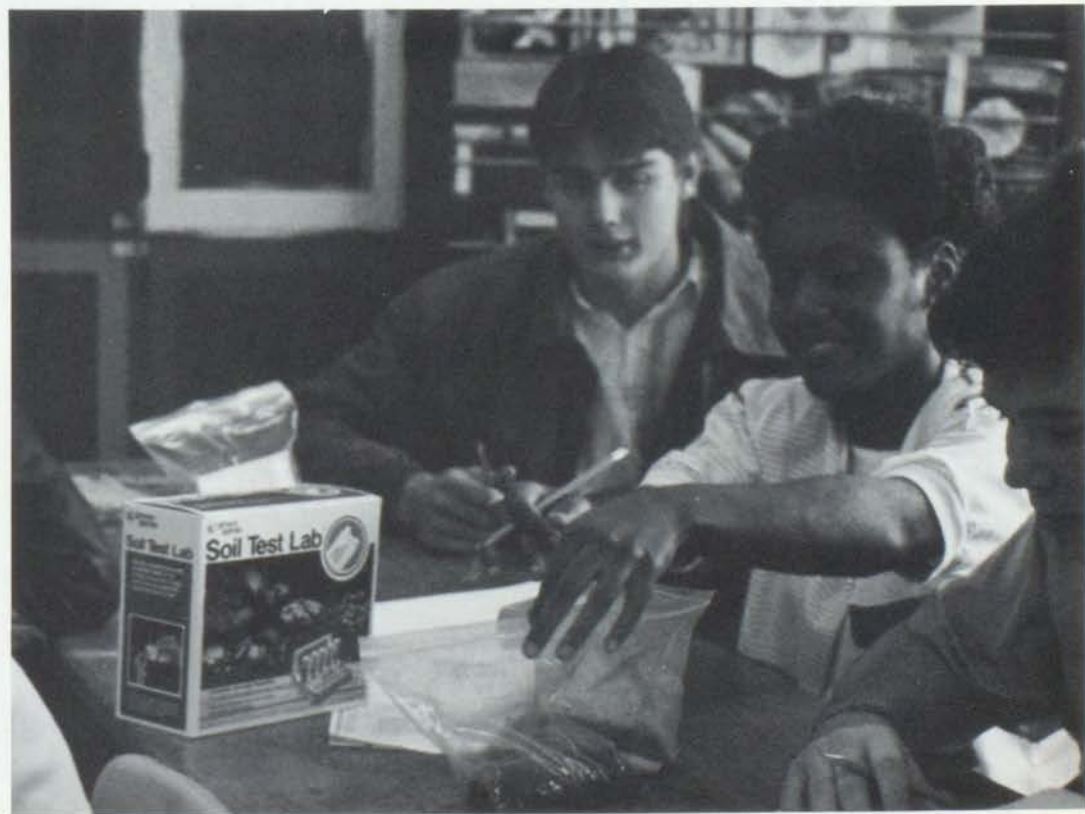
# *New and Improved Agriculture*

The program's goal is to award annually a minimum of nine \$2,500 scholarships. Two East students were awarded the scholarships, one in 1987 and again in 1988.

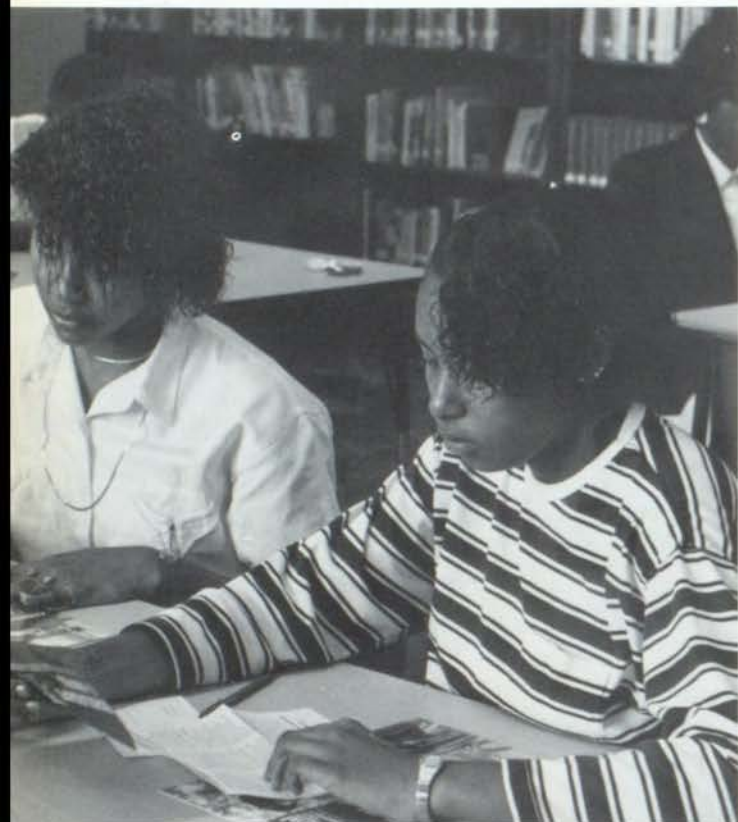

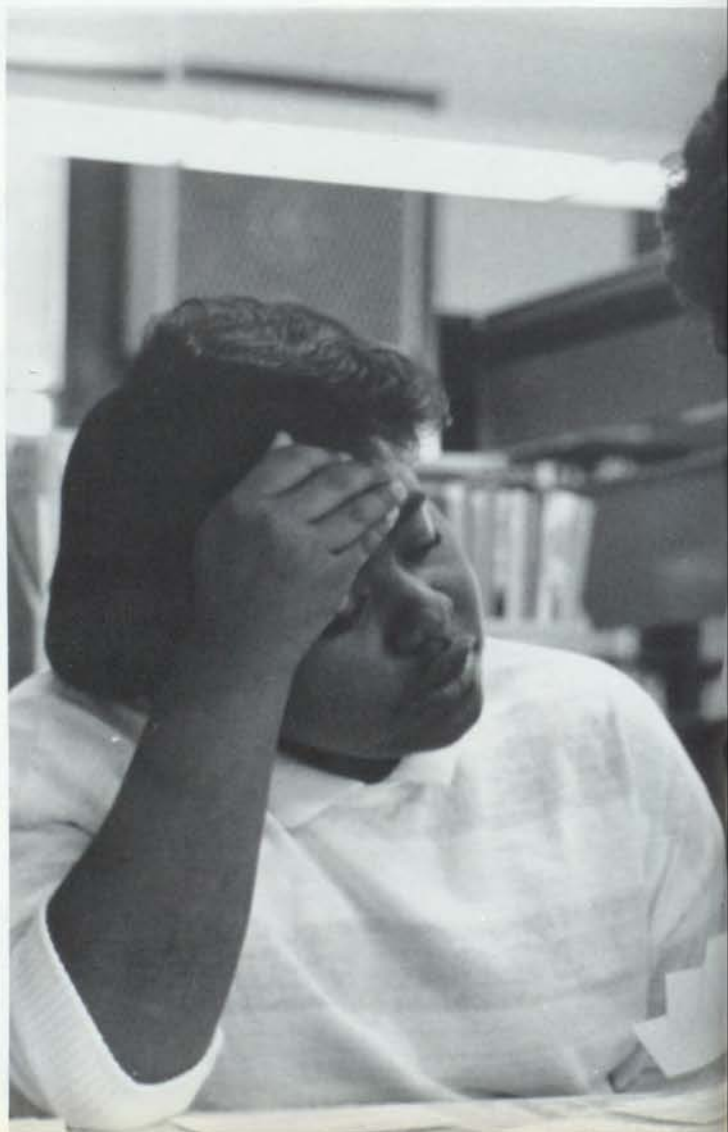
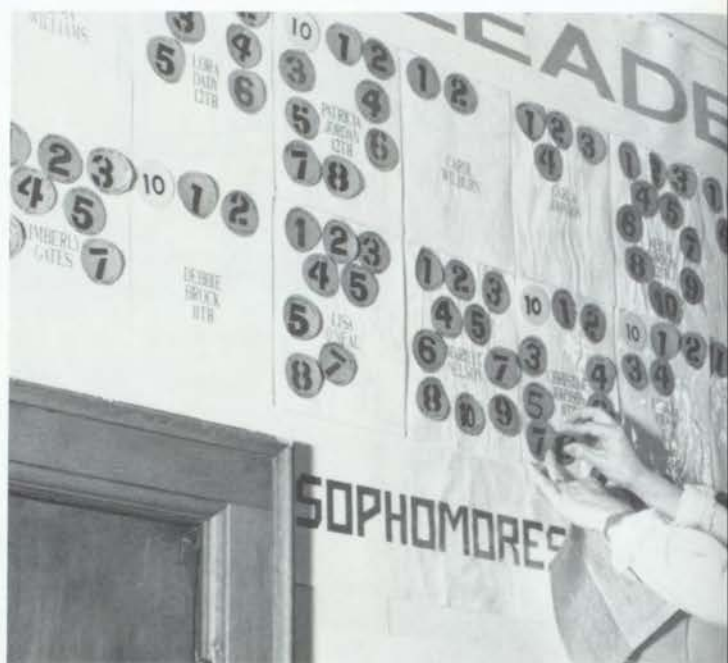

## "Today I'm a Reader" "Tomorrow I'm a Leader"

Have you noticed the unusual dots in the hall by the library? Guess what they represent? They are used for the big reading contest which is a competition between the different classes. The idea was invented by our own Librarian, Mrs. Carolina Jimenez. The main objective of the competition is to raise the students reading test scores. In order to participate in the program the students must sign a promise to read a book, not just some of the book, but the entire book. Then each student must make a summary of what he or she has read including the title, author, and main characters. This report must be signed by the student's English teacher and given to Mrs. Jimenez.

For each student, who participates in the reading program, the librarian makes a poster indicating the number of books completed, and displays it outside the Resource Center on the wall. When the student reaches ten books completed, the number ten appears on the poster and the reader receives a badge with this inscription; "Today I'm a Reader, Tomorrow I'm a Leader". At this point, the reader promises to bring other students into the reading program thus increasing the total number of students involved. As of this writing there are sixty-nine students actively involved. At the end of the school year, any student who has read at least ten

books will receive a diploma for his or her achievement. Mrs. Jimenez says, "This program is coming along smoothly and I'm so proud of the students at East High School who have participated in the reading program." We want to encourage everyone to participate in the coming year. Congratulations to all the reading participants who are Readers today and Leaders of tomorrow.

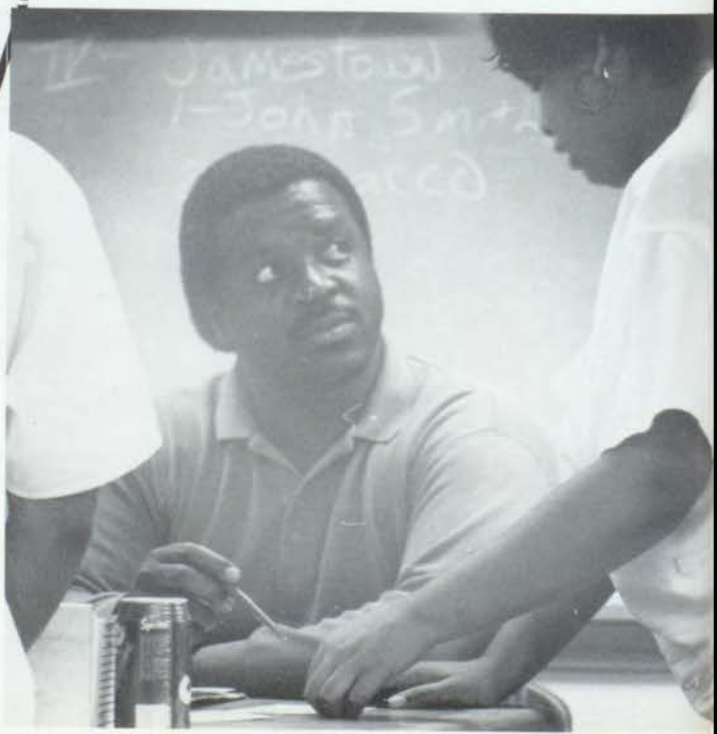
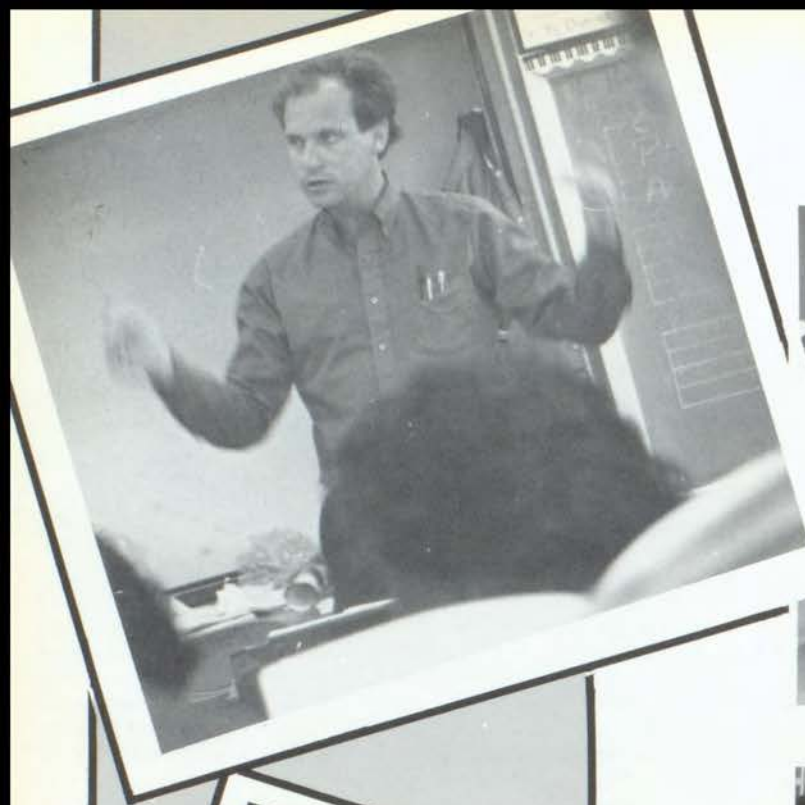

# 1989 Colophon

To produce 300 copies of the 144-page 1989 Eastonian Vol. 63, it took the co-operation and help of 29 staff members. Tom Mallot, the adviser; the Walsworth Publishing Company, represented by Johnna Tupper, and the Campus Photo Inc., represented by Jim Reed. Both production companies are from Marceline Missouri.

Out of 144 pages eight of them were in color which can be found in the Senior Section. On each division page there was a 20% gray used. Other pages throughout the book used 20% or a 10% gray with graphics. This year's cover theme, "Once Upon A Time," was chosen by the staff members. All pages were looked over thoroughly by the staff, and final checking went to the Editor-in-Chief Micaela Torres and Advisor, Tom Mallot.

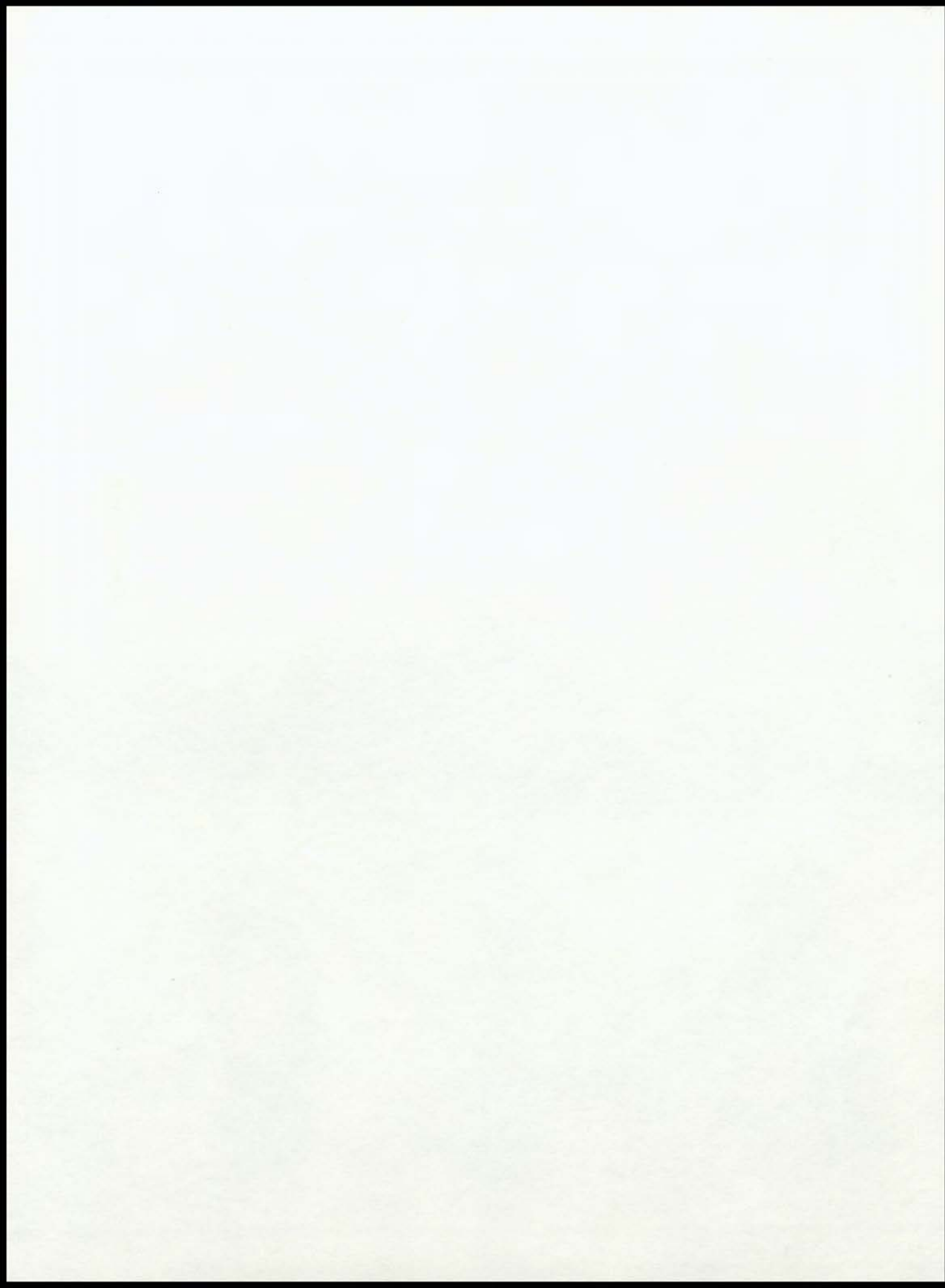
