Board and Administration Vital to Smooth Functioning District

The 1973-74 school year opened with an enrollment of 14,169 students in the district, dispersed among 14 schools.

In the regular bi-weekly meetings the six Board Members established policies concerning educational matters and made decisions in the areas of budgeting of funds, formulation of curriculum, and the addition of new programs and services to expand the quality of education in the district.

Working along with the School Board to carry out its policies and regulations was Mr. Tom Foraker, Superintendent of Schools, a position he has held since 1959. Keeping the district schools operating smoothly was Mr. Foraker's chief concern. Assisting him in this capacity were the two Assistant Superintendents of Schools, Dr. David De Helms and Mr. Joseph Nesbit.

Principals Attempt to Fulfill Student Needs


According to Mr. Lawrence, the atmosphere at Hickman Mills in 1974 was basically positive and relaxed in nature. He cited several reasons—good, informal relations between students and teachers, the abundance of educational equipment made available to students, and the shift from a college preparatory curriculum to one also providing courses for the more vocationally-oriented students.

He did feel that one area that could have been improved was the communication between the administrators and the students. He wanted students to know that his door was also open to them, not only to faculty members and parents.

On the subject of school spirit, which some individuals felt was lacking at Hickman Mills, Mr. Lawrence thought that perhaps outside activities of students, such as jobs, and the unity problem inevitably present in such a large school both contributed to a lessening of school spirit from the previous year.


Math Helps Develop Reasoning Skills

The basic purpose of the Mathematics Department was to help the students organize their thinking and discipline their studies.

Math students, whether in Introduction to Algebra or in Trigonometry, attempted to grasp the concepts of their problems rather than just trying to get the right

answer. Mathematics helped the students understand why rather than teaching only the processes needed for arriving at the right answer.




Science Involves Many Facets of Learning


dations course. Music students had courses such as Advanced Winds and Mixed Ensemble available to them, while drama students could go into areas of Debate or Tournament Forensics.

Our Air Force ROTC unit at Hickman Mills was one of 275 similar units in the nation. All aspects of aerospace, both civilian and military, were studied. Training in leadership abilities and in the responsibilities of citizenship was an important part of ROTC. Special benefits in the form of college scholarships and a higher rate of pay in the Armed Services were available for those students who successfully completed the three-year program. Special field trips to KCI and to Municipal Airport were included, giving students a chance to learn about general aviation operations.

The aim of the Physical Education Department was to develop coordination and promote the practice of good sportsmanship through participation in team sports and intramural activities. The basic fundamentals of each unit were stressed rather than proficiency in the intricate details of the sport. The addition of several new units such as archery and badminton to the curriculum added a different dimension to the gym classes.

Teaching students to drive safely was the ultimate goal of Driver's Education. Correct procedures for basic skills such as starting the car to the more advanced techniques of freeway driving were presented in the classroom. Students were then able to apply these methods during supervised in-car-practice periods. Some of these practices were during class hours, but students also had to devote after school time to gaining more driving experience. Developing in students a sense of the responsibilities undertaken when driving a car was another aim of the Driver's Education instructors.







There were three main objectives of a high school counselor; to guide the student in his academic life; to provide counseling to ease adjustment to personal problems; and to aid each individual in his choice of a vocation. The Counselor's office was much more than a place to have schedules adjusted or talk about gradepoint averages—it was a place to discuss freely any topic of personal concern, because all confidences were strictly maintained. The Guidance Department sponsored such projects as college representatives and group counseling. Mrs. Frazier felt that awareness of the full scope of the counselors services was too often lacking. All counselors strongly encouraged all students to take full advantage of these services. As Mr. Anderson stated, "Ideally, there exists between student and counselor a type of on-going, continuous relationship which lasts throughout the entire high school career." 











Dramatists Put It All Together




Metric Week Measures Up



It was hoped that the week would increase the students' awareness and understanding of the metric system.



Long hours of sweat, hard work, and "giving it all you've got" paid off for the Cougars, for they finished with a 7-3-0 record in this, their second year.






Intramurals Give Variety of Activities


Finally we arrived at the last chapter of the book: Graduation, but there is a sequel to this book, title unknown.
