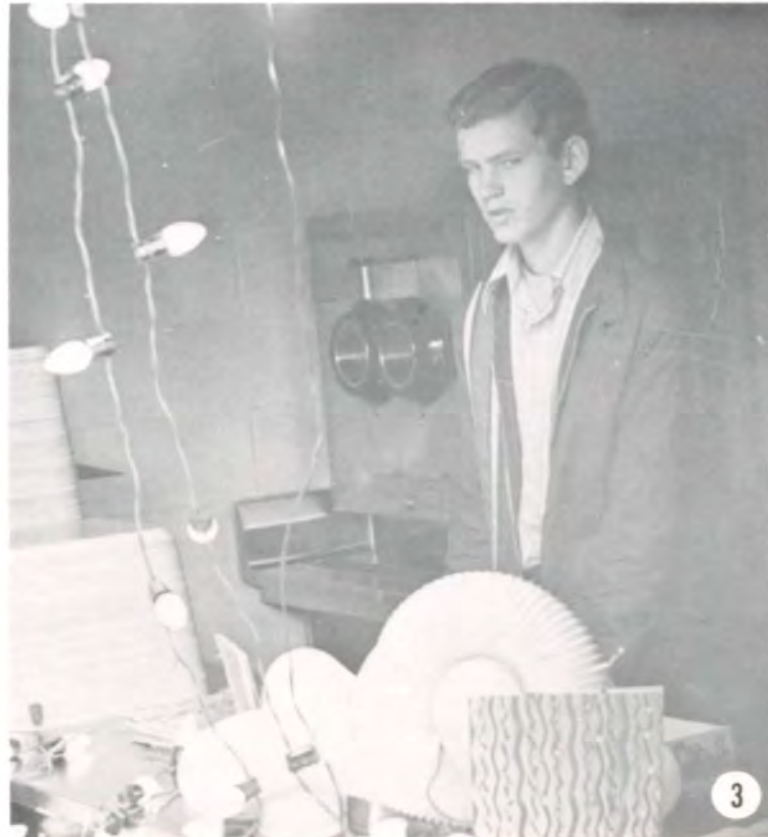

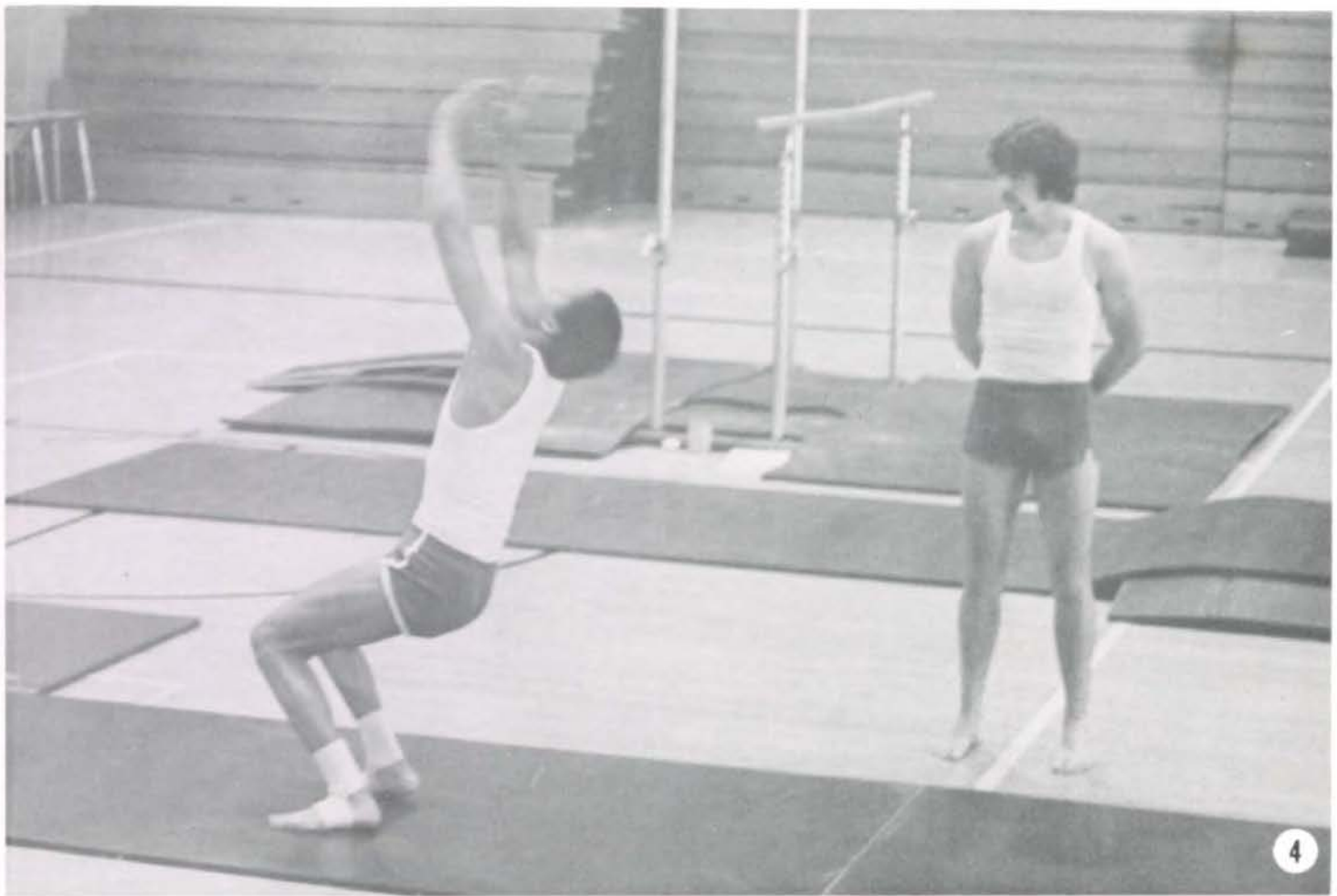

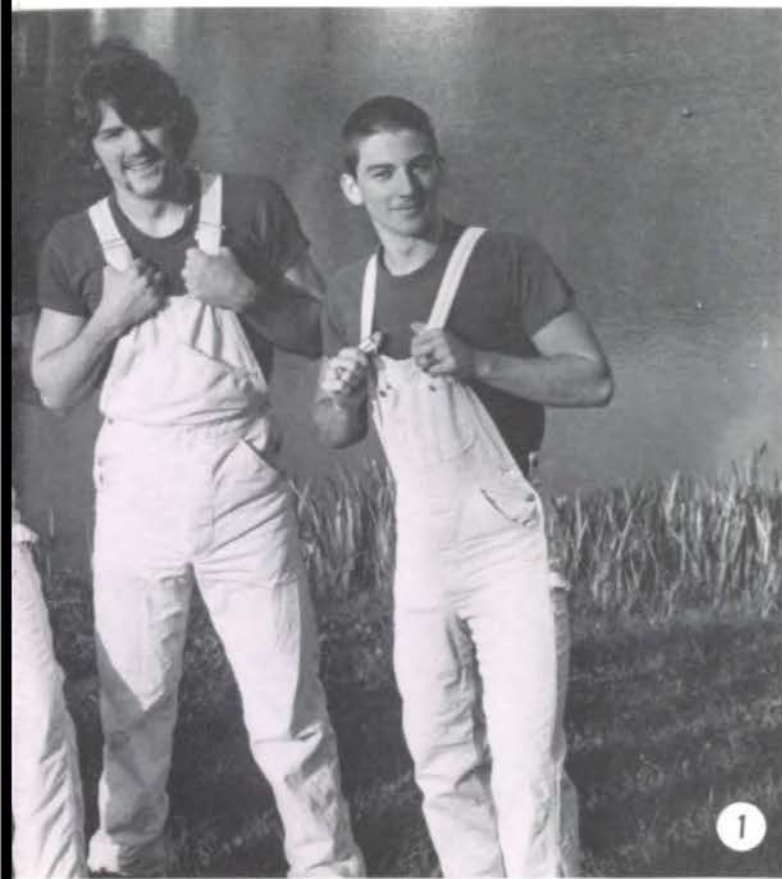

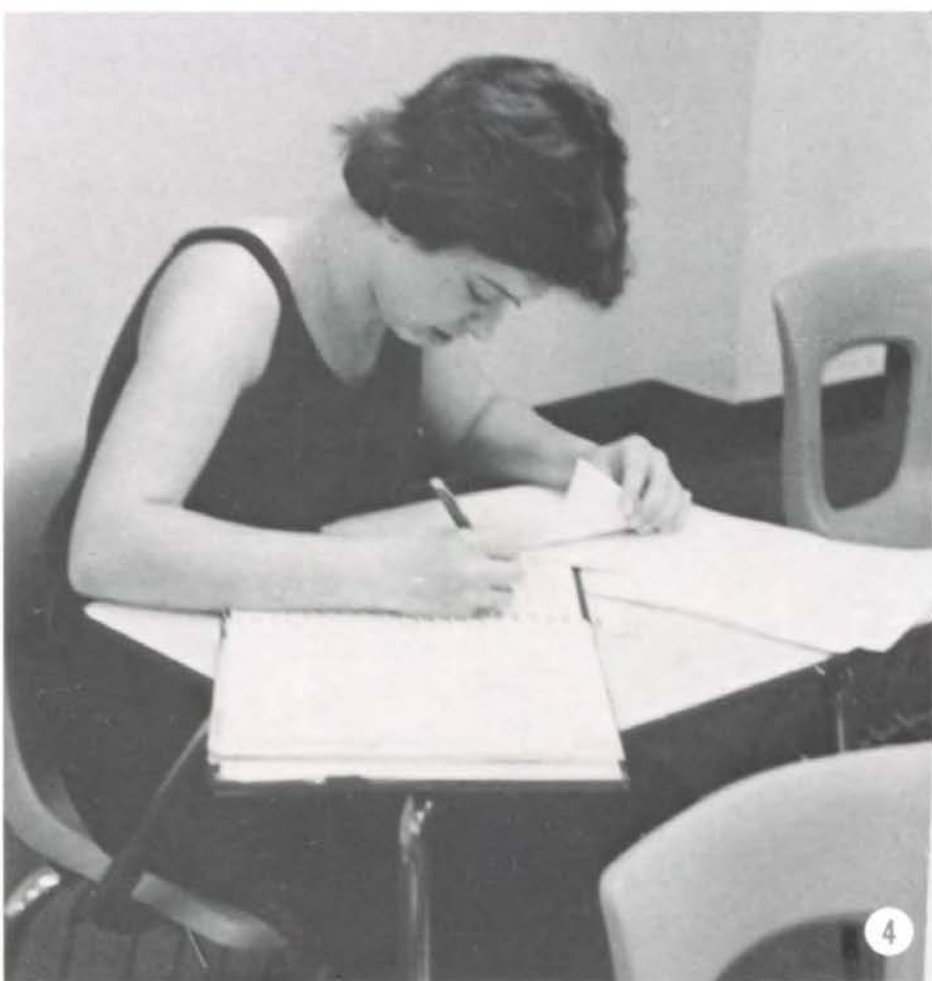
## Imaginative Writing Sparks Student Interest

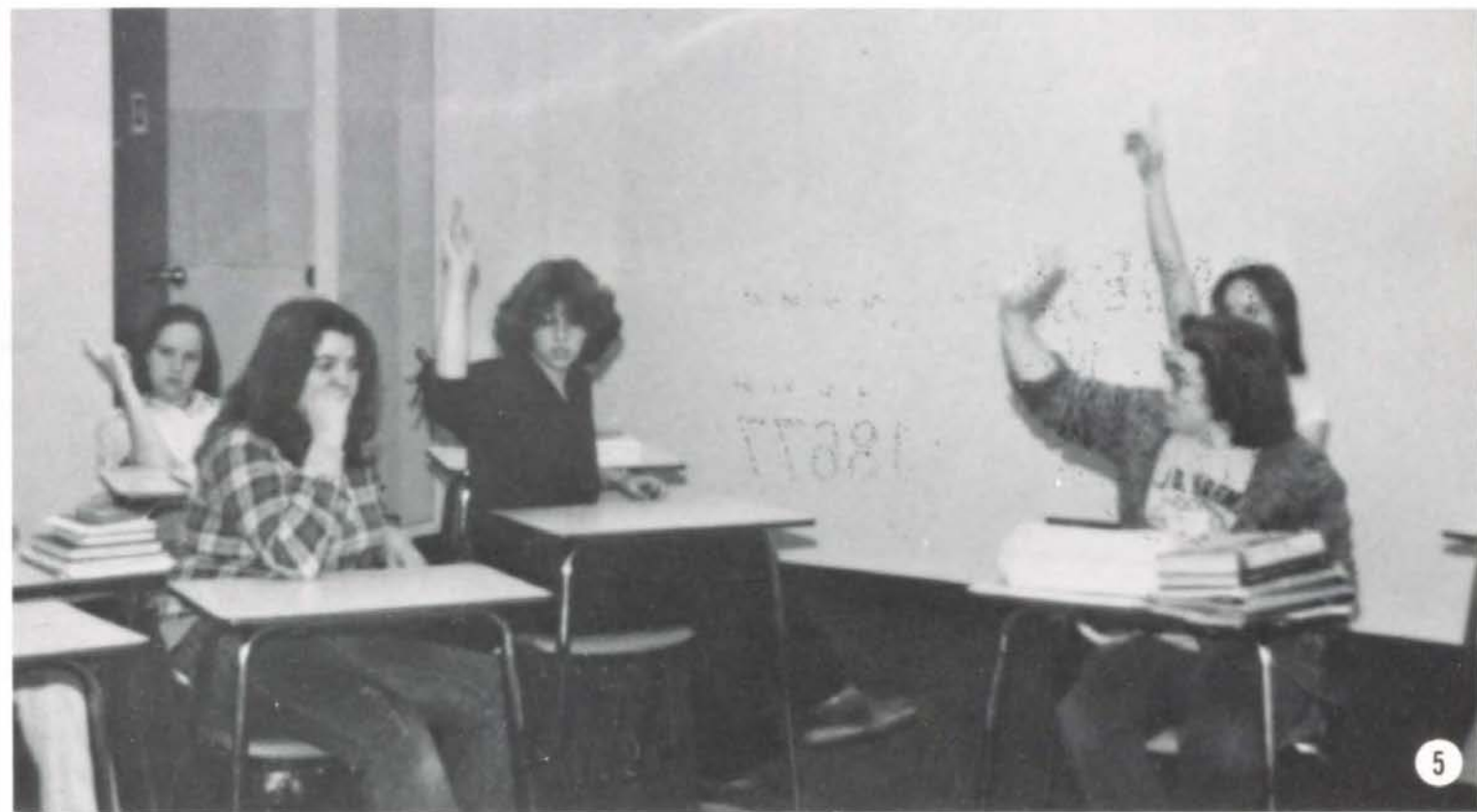
## German dinner treat for active members

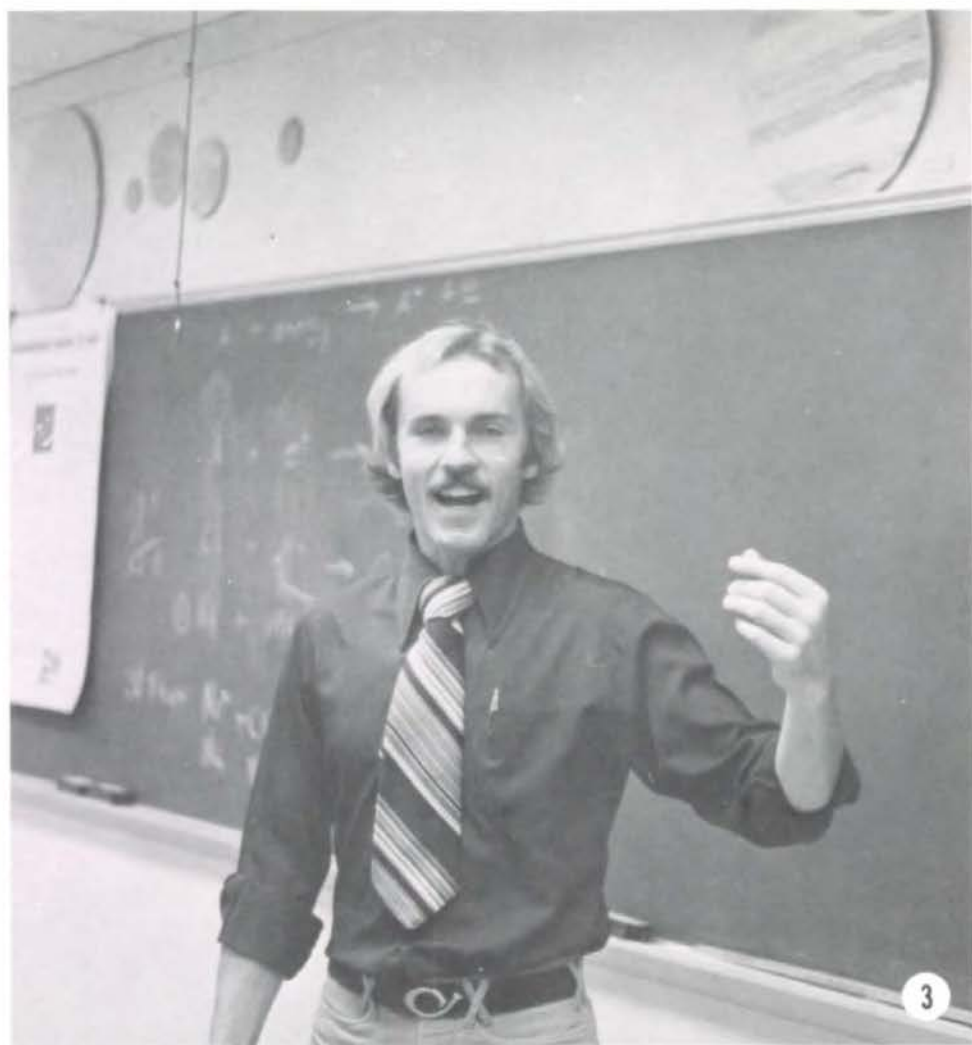
## Key Club Travels to Wichita

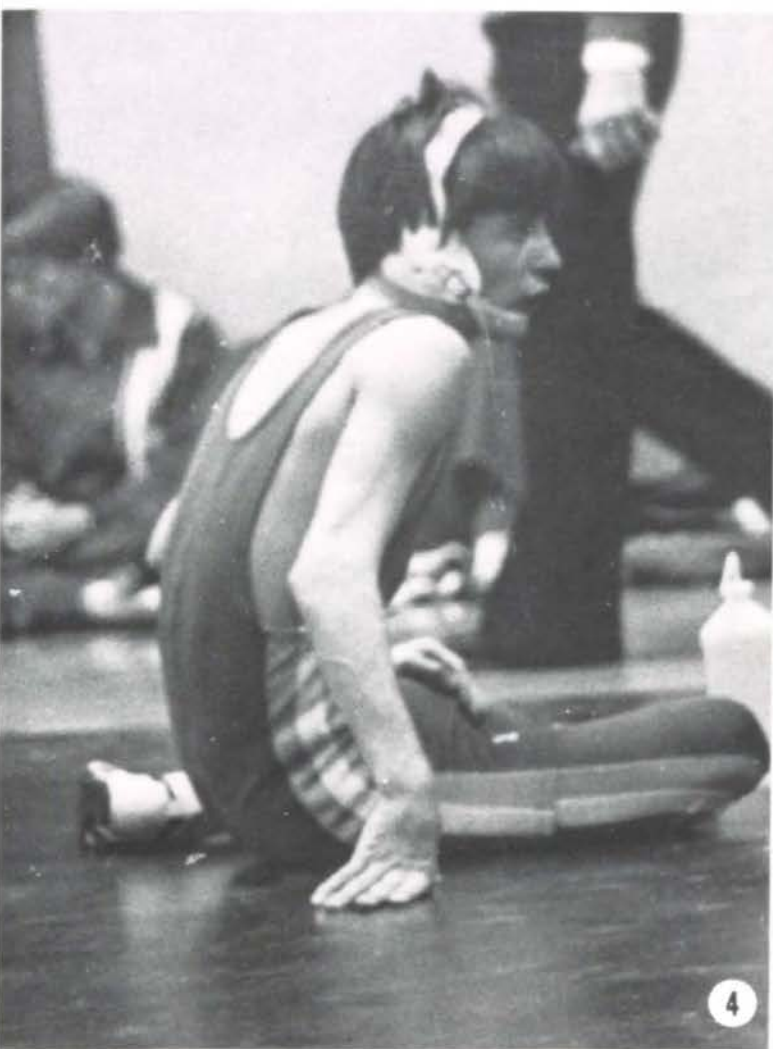

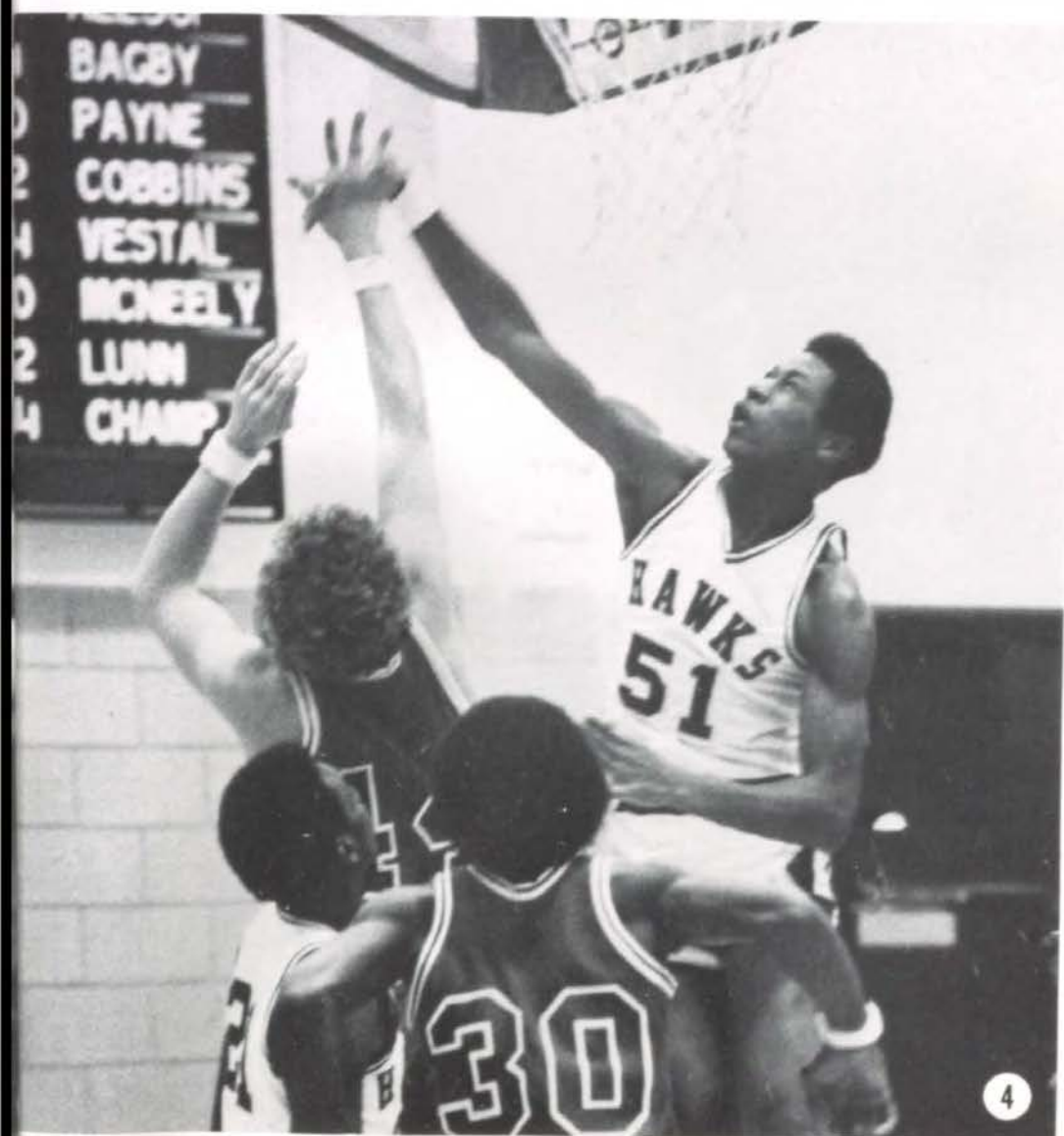

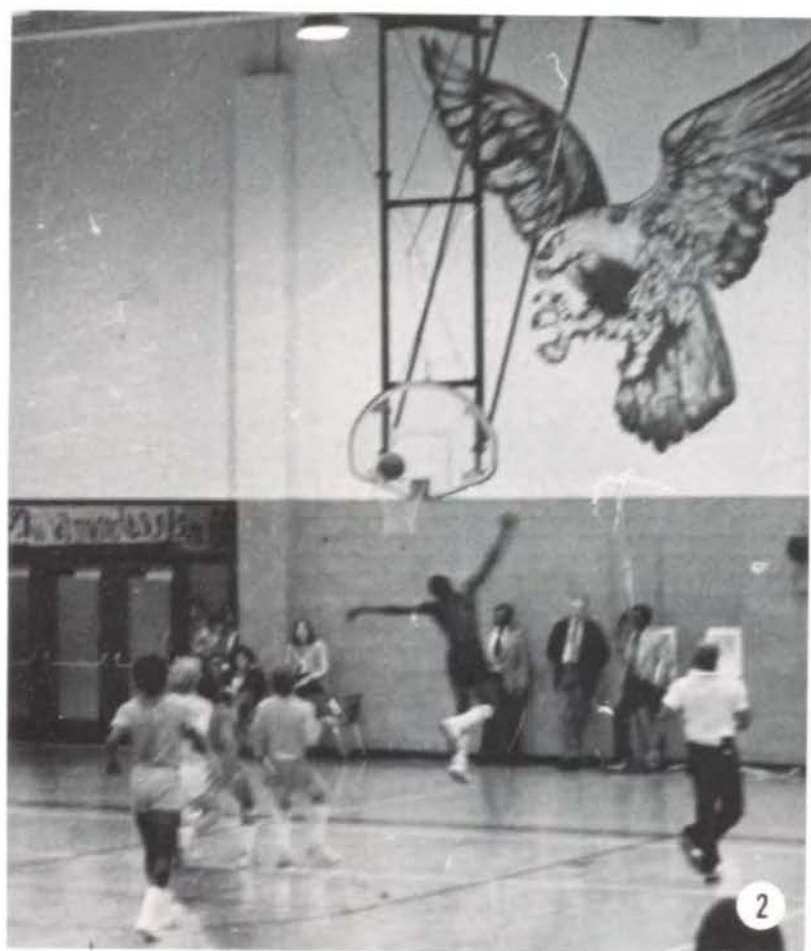

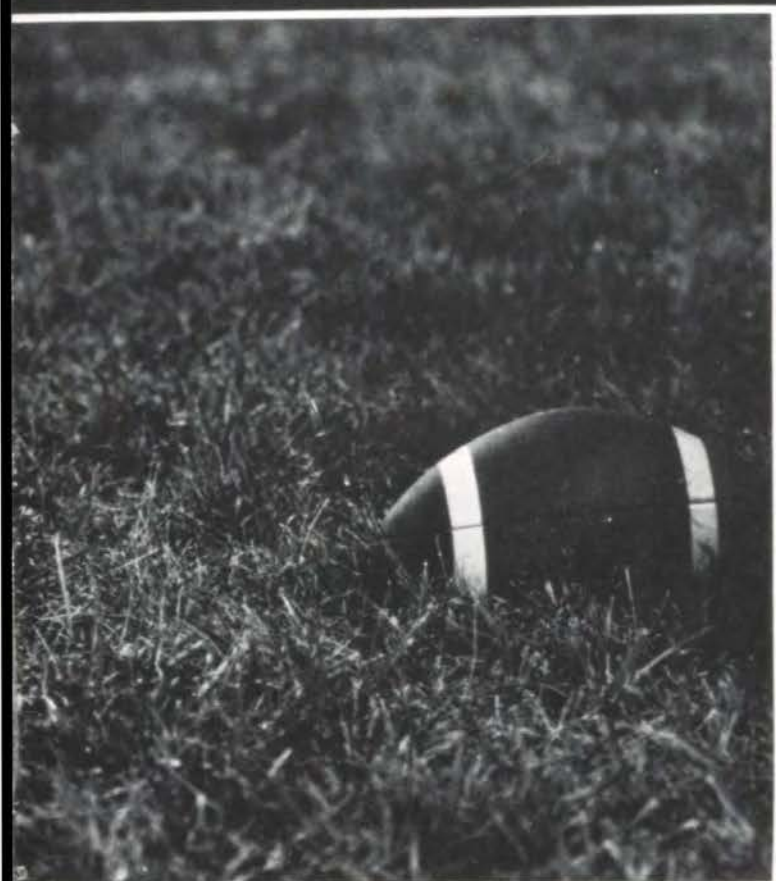
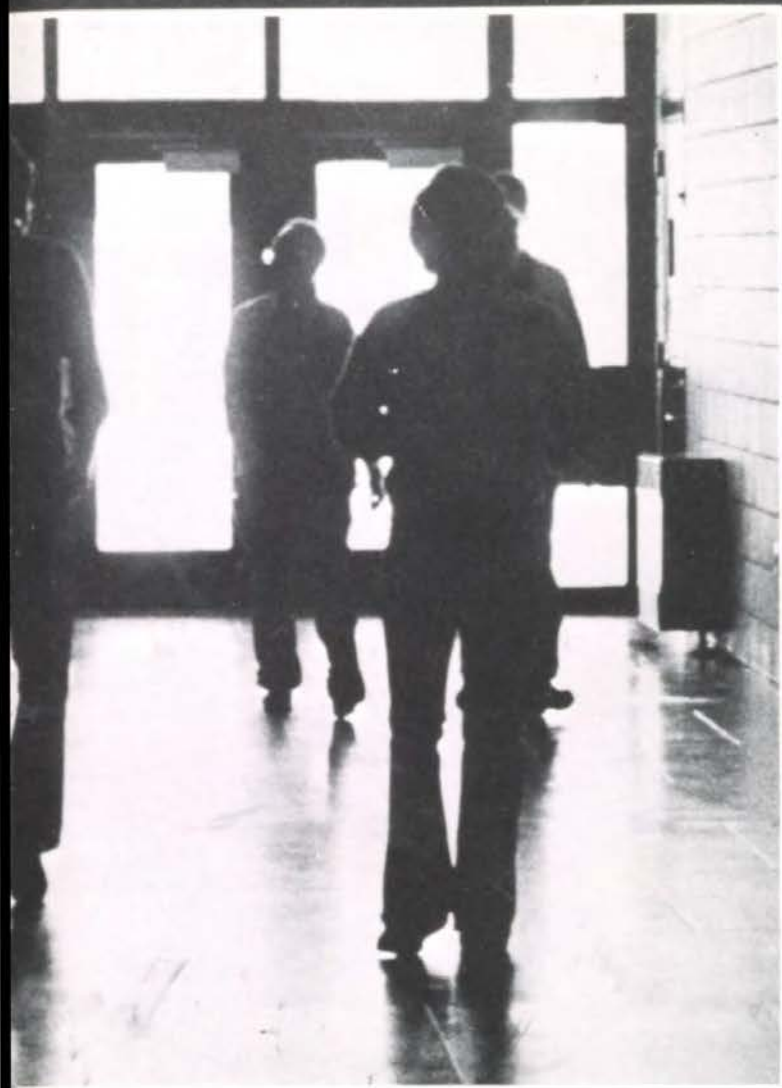


As once time enveloped us

And then our time together ends. Each goes their separate ways, some to reunite later, others to build their own individual lives, but all to remember the past.



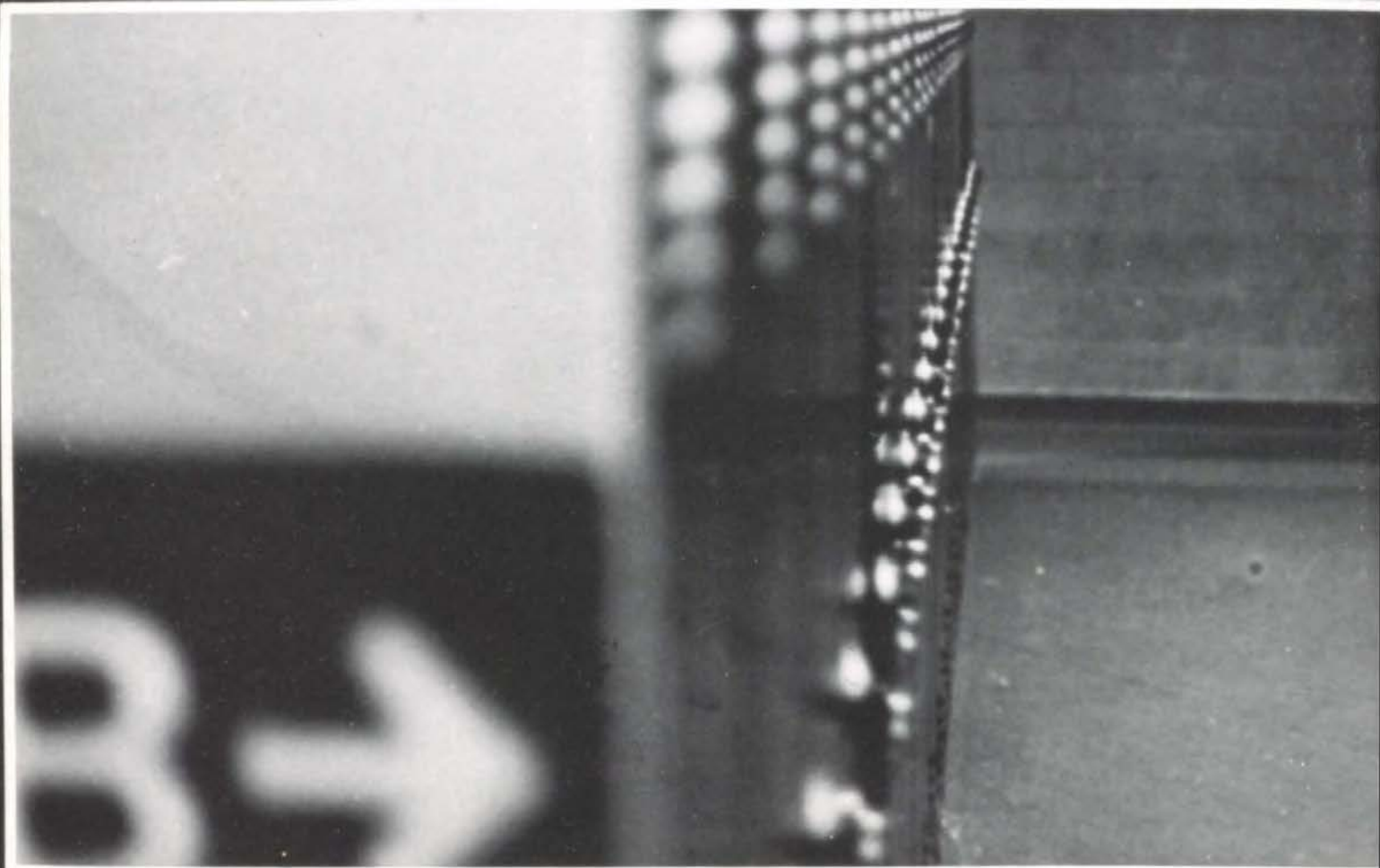

## A TIME TO REMEMBER by Edward Cunningham

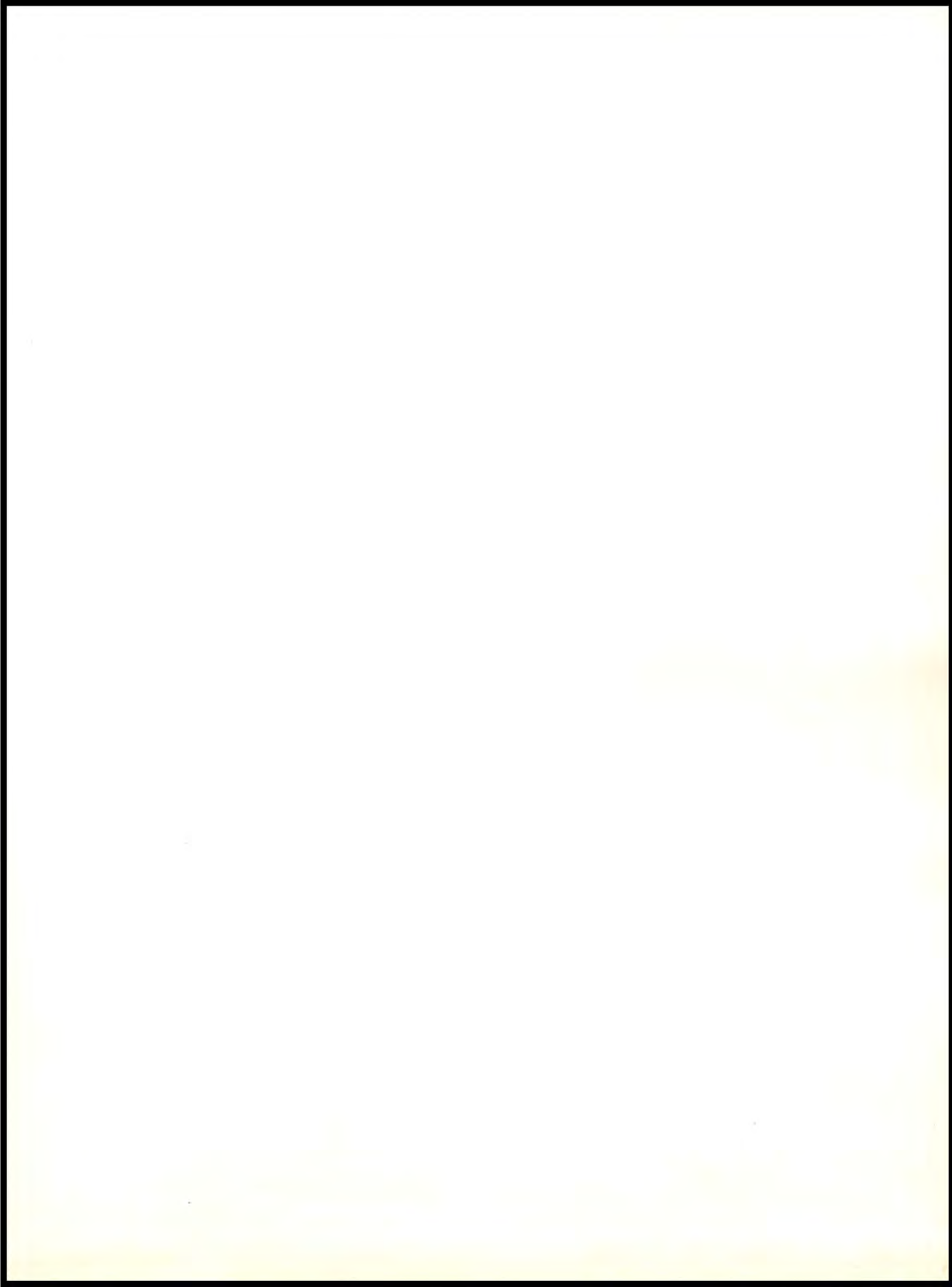

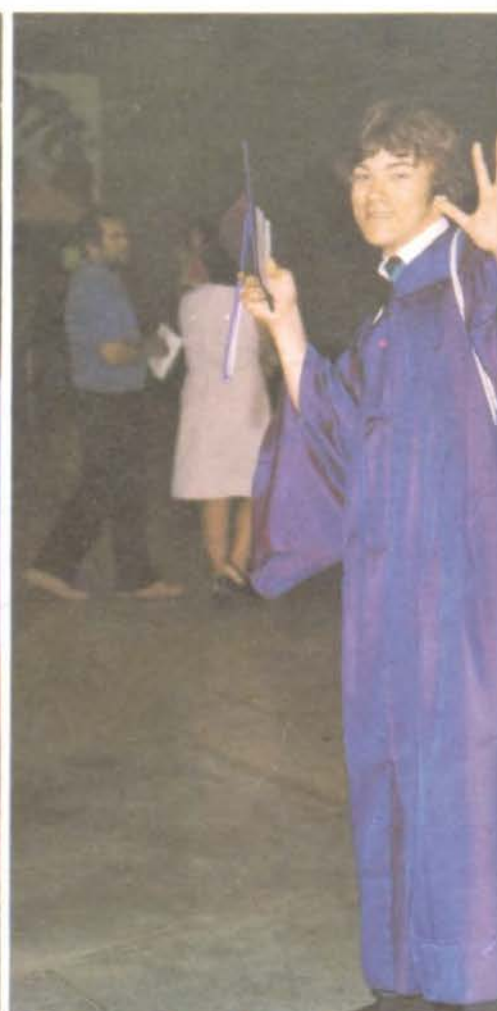

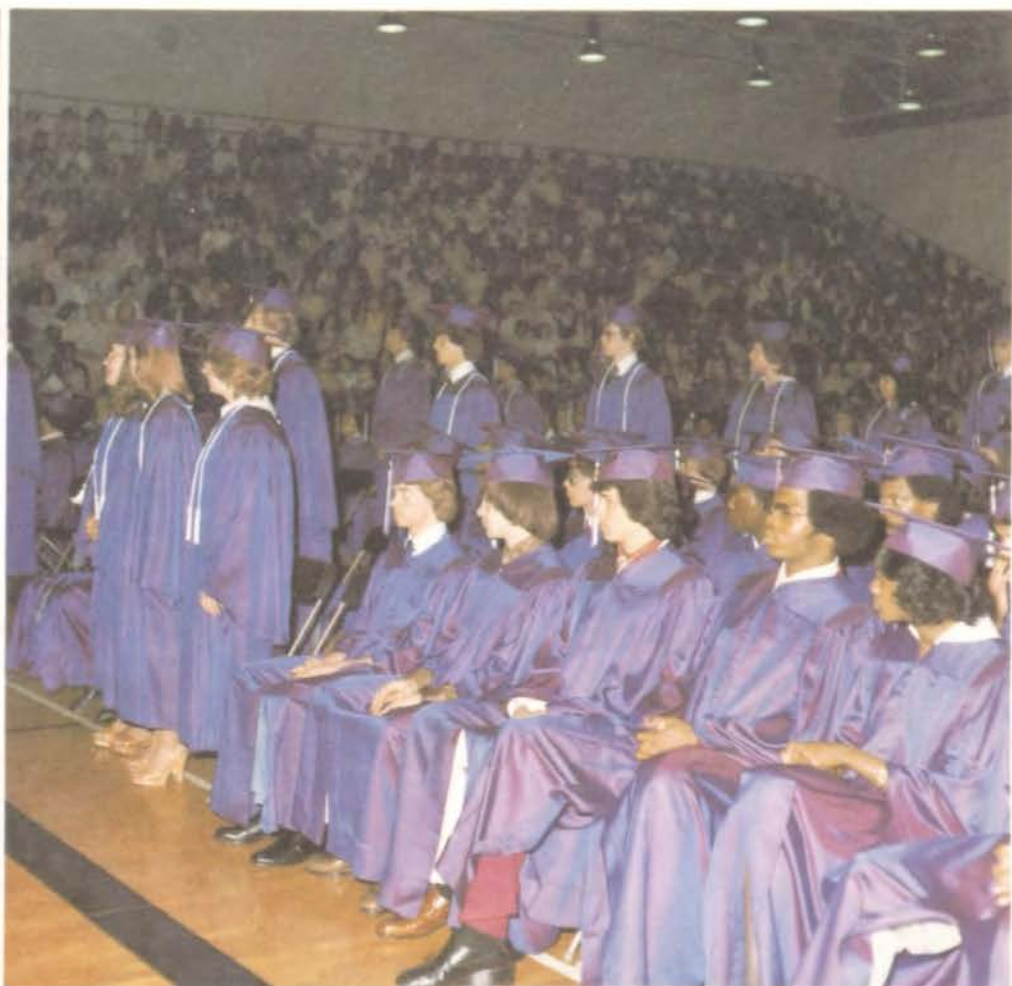
