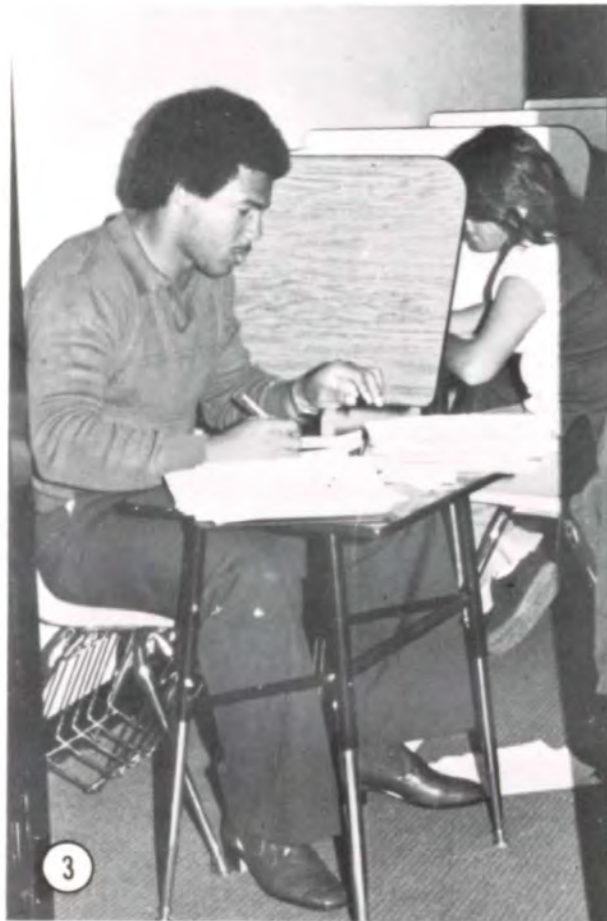

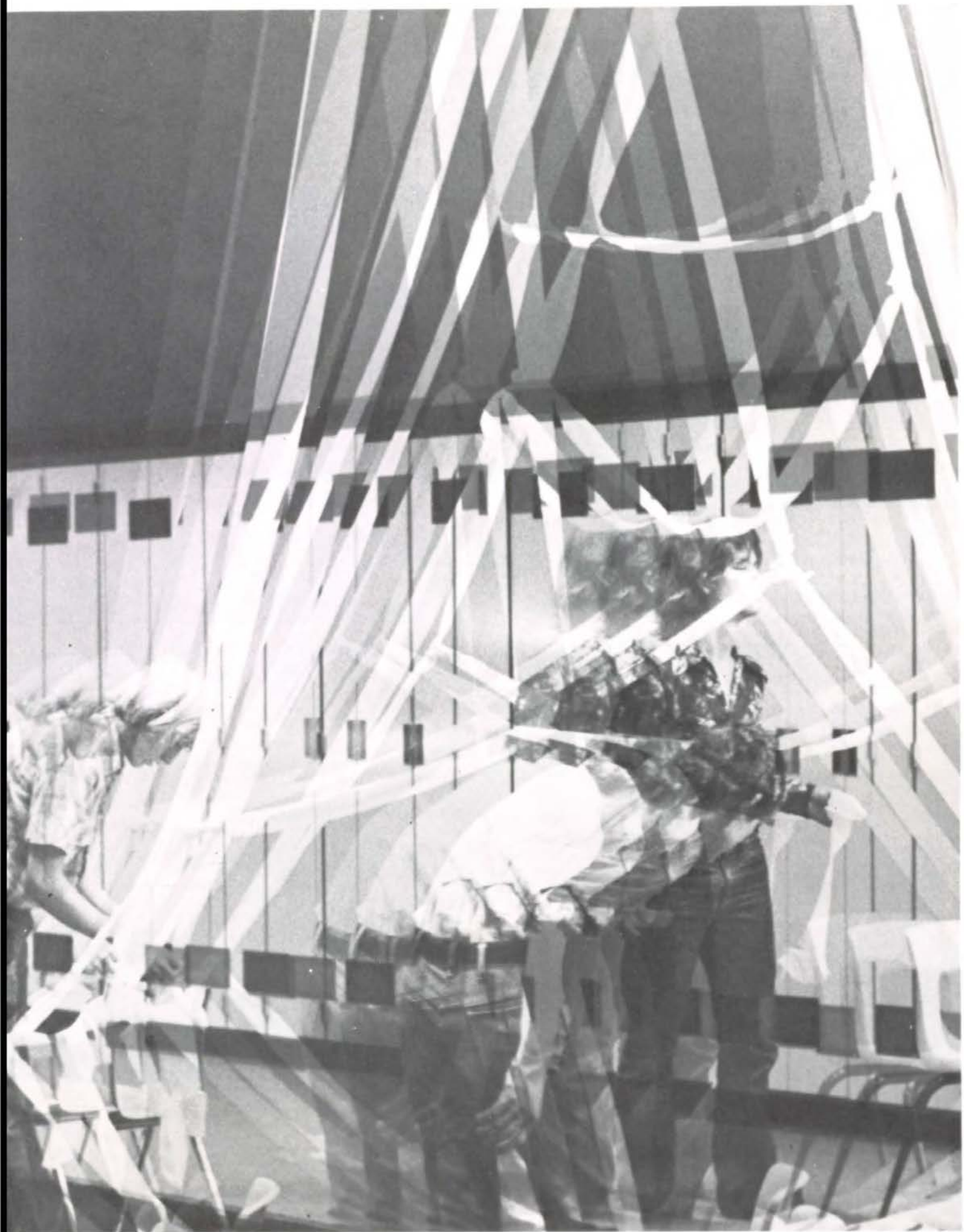

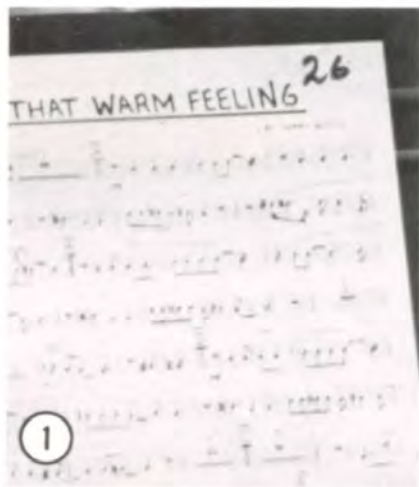
# Performing Arts

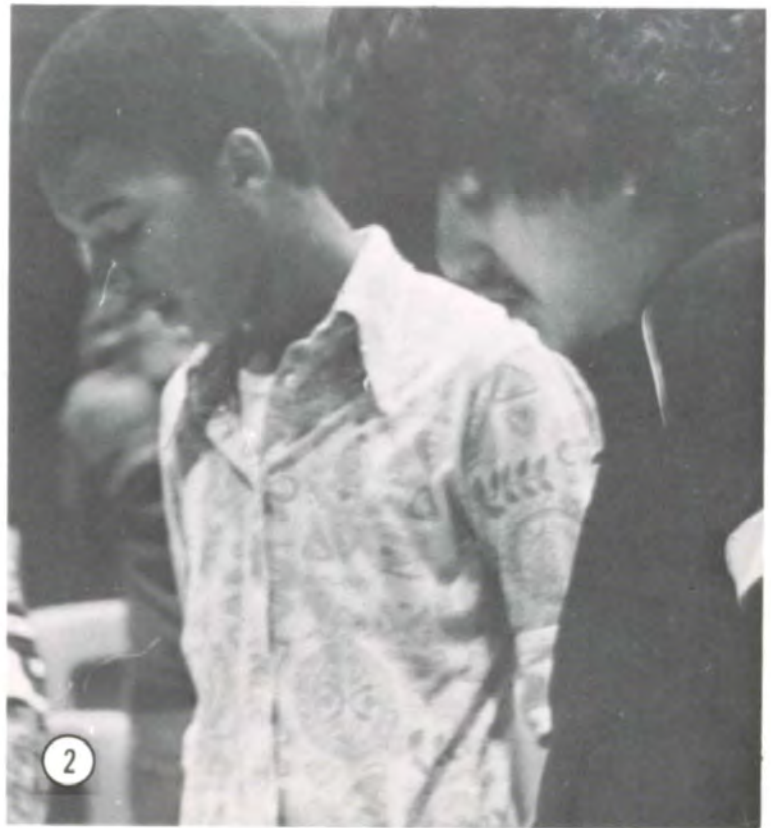


## Singers Work Hard; Blanco Makes State Choir

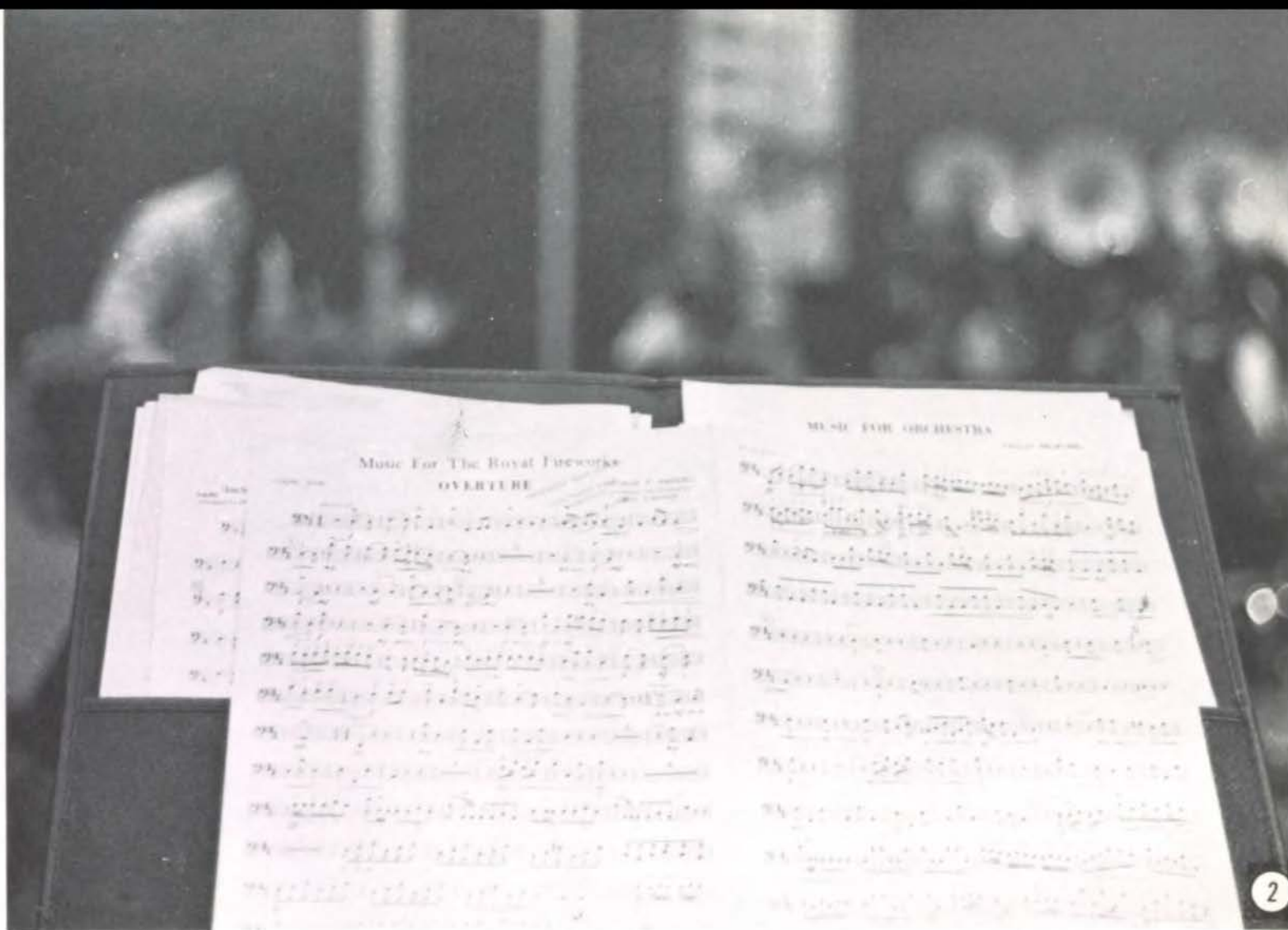
## Orchestra Plays Varied Styles

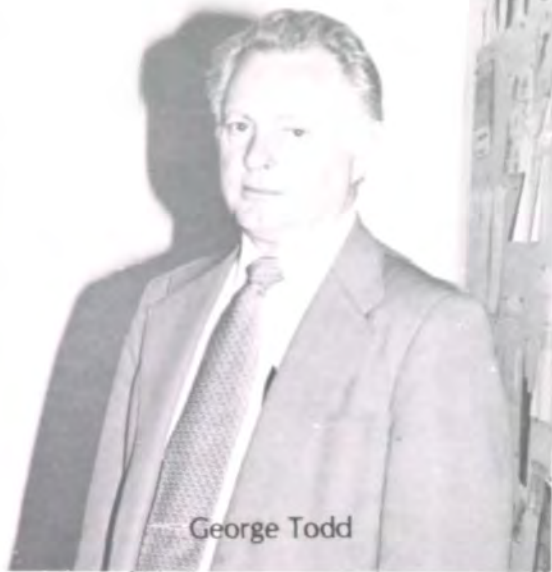
At the annual convocation for the Kansas City, Kansas staff, superintendent of schools Dr. O.L. Plucker stated that the decade of the 80's should be one of excellence. During a meet a team consists of at least five runners but can have as many as the meet allowed.

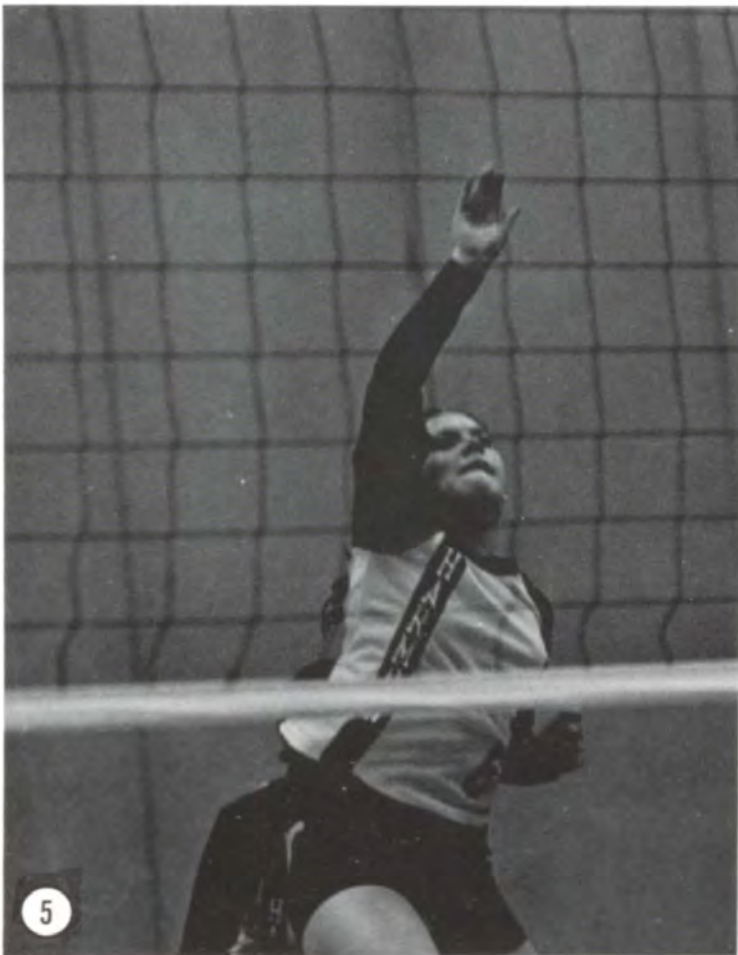
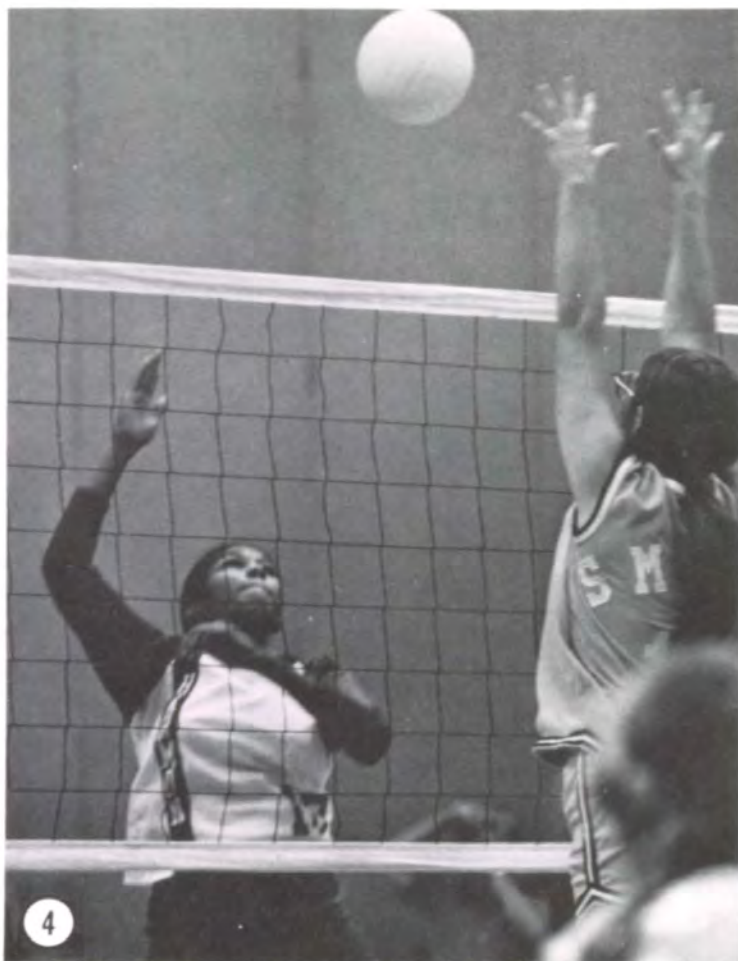
The course of a meet in High School is always set at two miles, laid out in a complicated maze of paths.

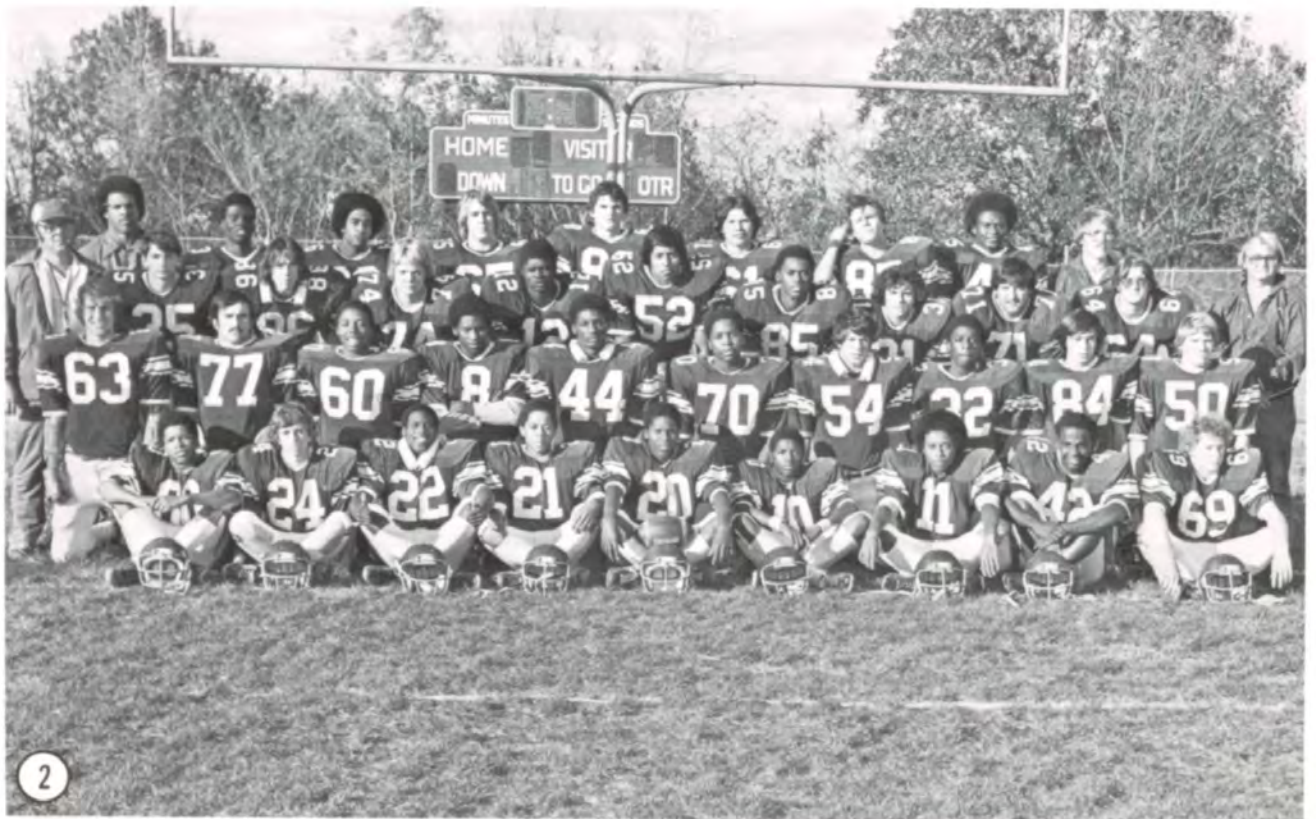

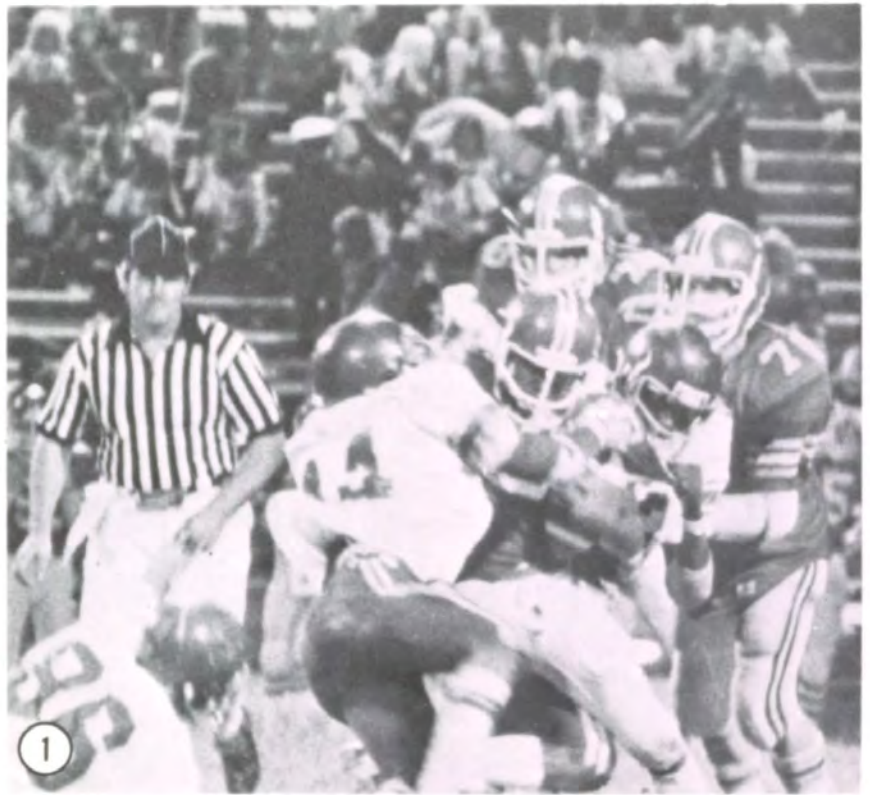


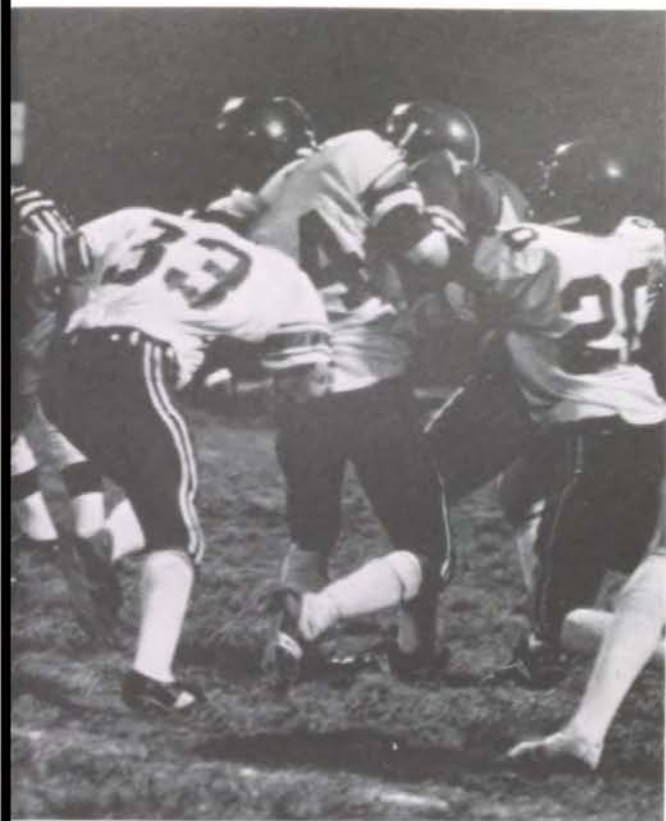
## Varsity Finishes With 3-6 Mark

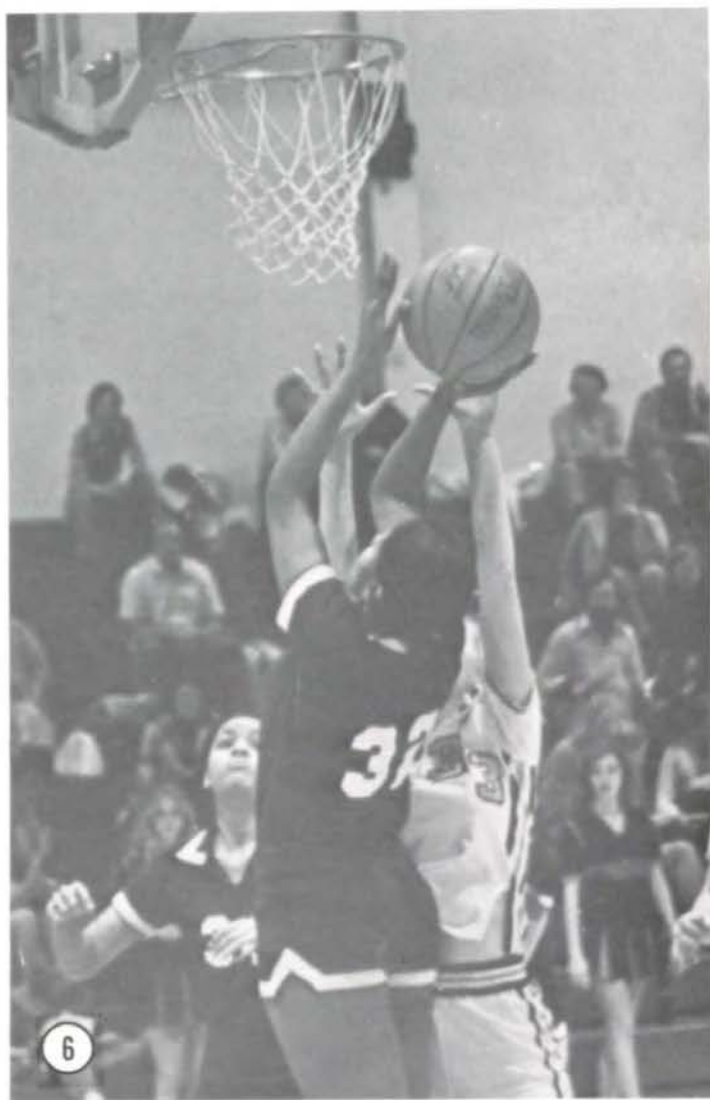
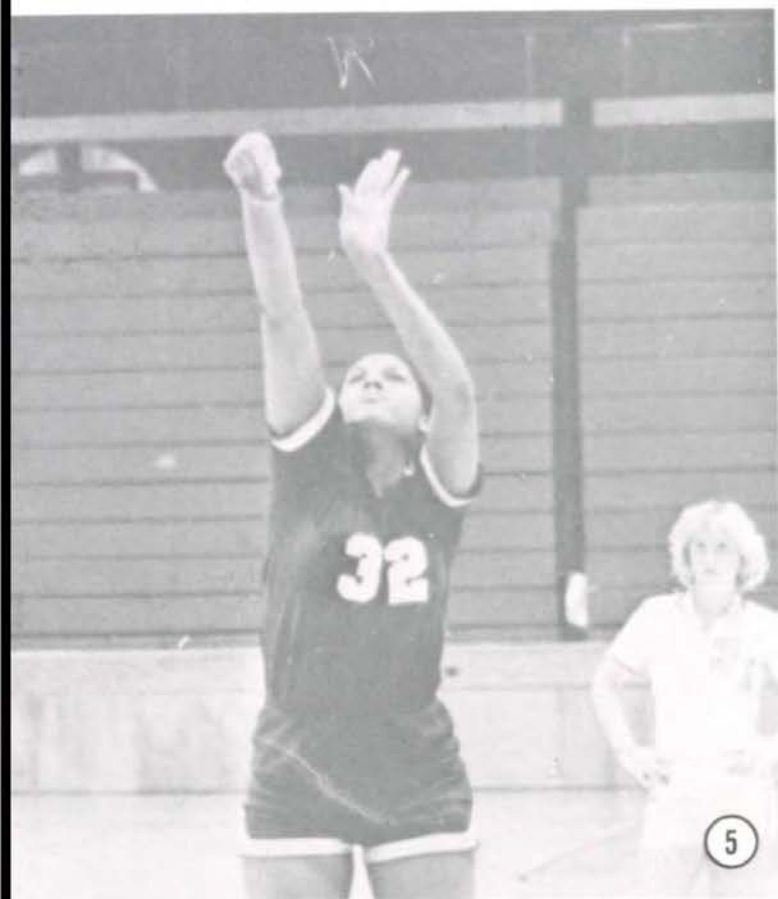

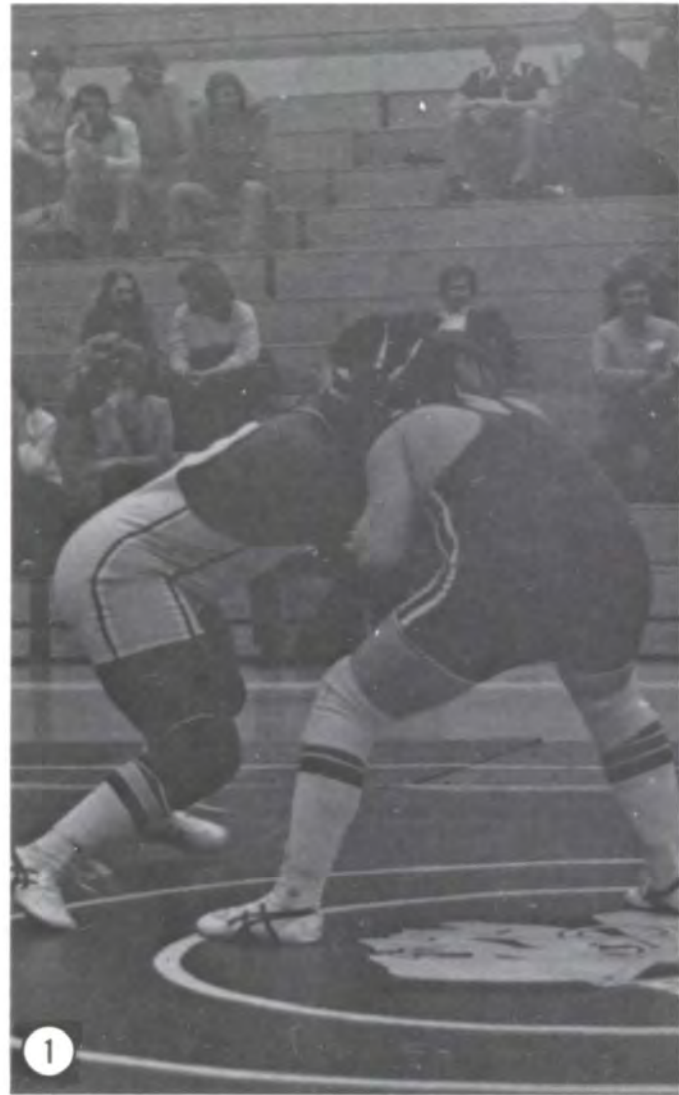

## Wrestling is Tough Sport

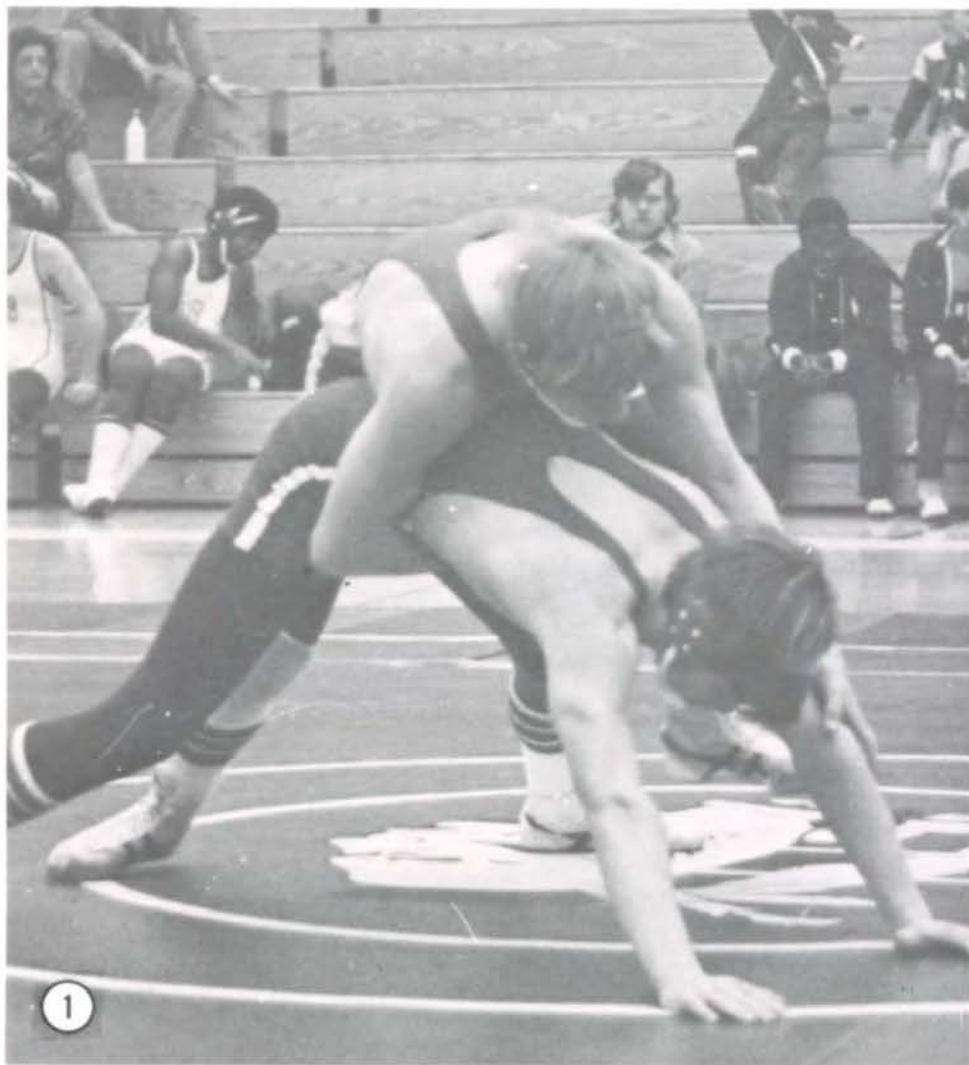

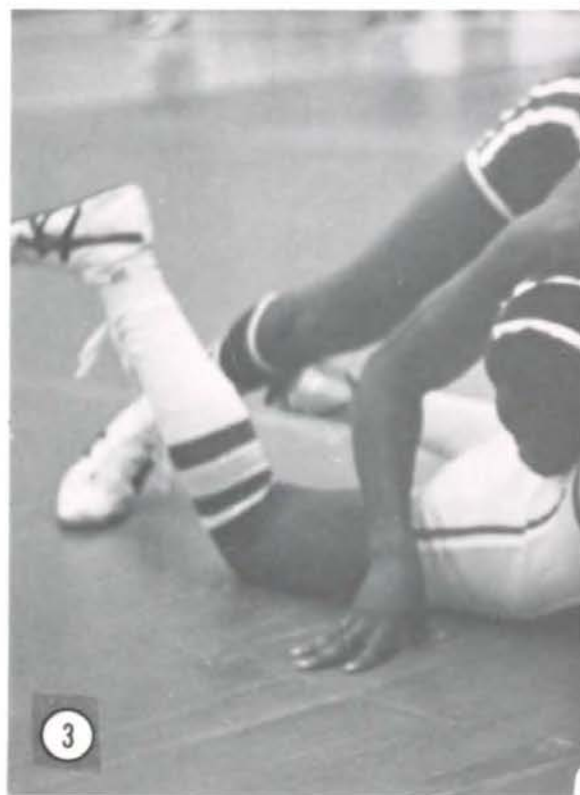

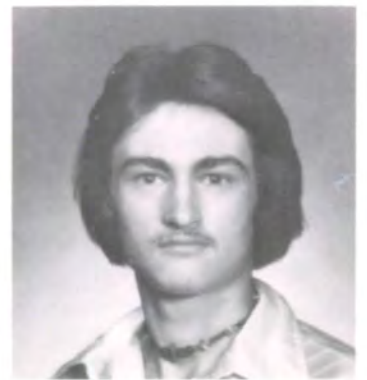

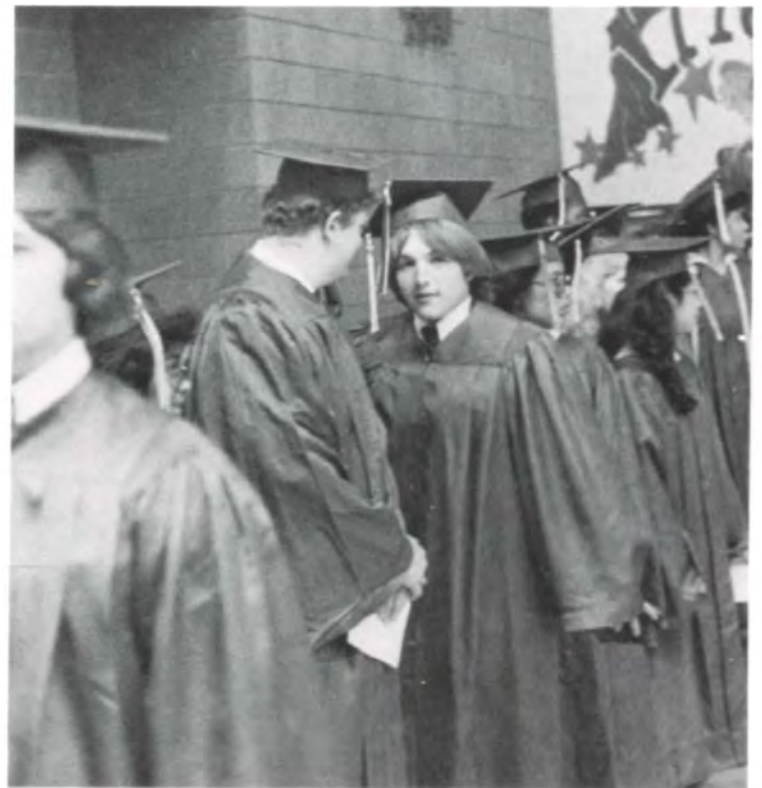




## Graduation Honors Three Seniors
