





# Tracksters Take 2nd In K.C.K.L.

Despite weather postponing many of the track meets this year, Harmon's boys reeled off a number of impressive wins. The Harmon mile relay team of Bobby Scott, Randy Henderson, Eric Horton, and Gemit Williams took first with a 3:31.3 time at the Harmon Relays. This effort pushed the Hawks into fourth place. Fighting wind and rain, Harmon placed second in the KCKL. Kevin Harvey won big in the 120 yard high hurdles. Robert Brown scored a double win in the long jump and the triple jump. Mike Hobbs took first in the 880 yard run, and David Salas took first in the Javelin.

### 12/Girls Track

#### Ladies K.C.K. League Runner-up

The Lady Varsity Hawks won more meets this season than any other Lady Hawks track team since 1975. They brought home first place from the Schlagle dual, Harmon's own Mo-Kan Classic, and the Springfest. The ladies took second at the KCKL, fourth in regionals, and ninth in state.

Out of 19 points scored in state, Dimita Jones scored 18 of them: scoring first place in the 400 meters, and second in the 800 meters. Jones was the top scorer on the team with 138 ¼ points. Others did well too. Sophomore Janice Ussery finished with 134 ½ and Junior, Janice Rice scored 100 points.

Coach Jim Conoway noted that in events his lady hawks won 46 and lost 16. "Our Juniors should bring fame to Harmon," said Conoway.



#### Weekends Add Excitement to Lives of Students



#### Band Upholds Motto


With the motto, "The bitterness of sacrifice is worth the sweetness of success." J.C. Harmon Band Department's four outstanding aggregations had a proud year.







The Sketch Club is one of the most active in organizing the Harmon Art Fair in the spring.










When the Harmon faculty reported back to Harmon for another round of duties, facing them was a barage of criticism, government studies, reports, and political commentary about the nation's schools. Some reports stressed the need for more science training, fearing that this country was losing the arms race to Russia. Others stated that the real crises was that not enough language study was being accomplished and these studies argued that English training needed to be increased. Stiffer requirements, at the university level, higher pay for teachers, longer schools years were all proposed as remedies for American Education's ills. On the local front, continued low scores in reading and math compentency skills in Kansas City, Kansas Public schools brought the problem in focus. But USD 500 took steps to meet the problem. 
Computer literacy for every student became a goal this year. This move created a new department within the math department, and will necessitate a new supervisory position up-town. (continued on page 101)

Dr. Walter L. Davies observations were voiced in a letter to Dr. O.L. Plucker, superintendent of schools. Said Davies, "Criticism of public schools has been prevalent in recent months. Accounts of school districts dropping advanced academic courses because of lack of student interest and enrollment have been numerous.

An analysis of enrollments in the five high schools of Kansas City, Kansas refutes much of the criticism that has been directed our way.

In the English/Language Arts area, 758 out of 1500 are enrolled in English classes that are designed to be college preparatory experiences. This is equal to one-half the total senior enrollment. In addition, another 193 students are in Humanities.





Davies further noted that 825 students enrolled in advanced math classes. 113 were enrolled in Math Analysis, 70 in Pre-calculus, and 37 in Calculus and 505 in advanced algebra. Wrote Davies, "It is interesting to note that the computer labs in our five high schools are fully utilized with 633 enrollments in beginning classes and 194 enrollments in advanced classes for a total of 827.

Davies concluded that in computer education over a four year period, over 3300 or over half of all high school students would be in a computer program.

As of this year, Harmon requirers English 11, and the word went out from the counseling, that instead of enrolling twice a year, that enrollment for the full term would be a reality by the 1984, 85 school term. Such a move suggests some changes.








