English Looks Ahead

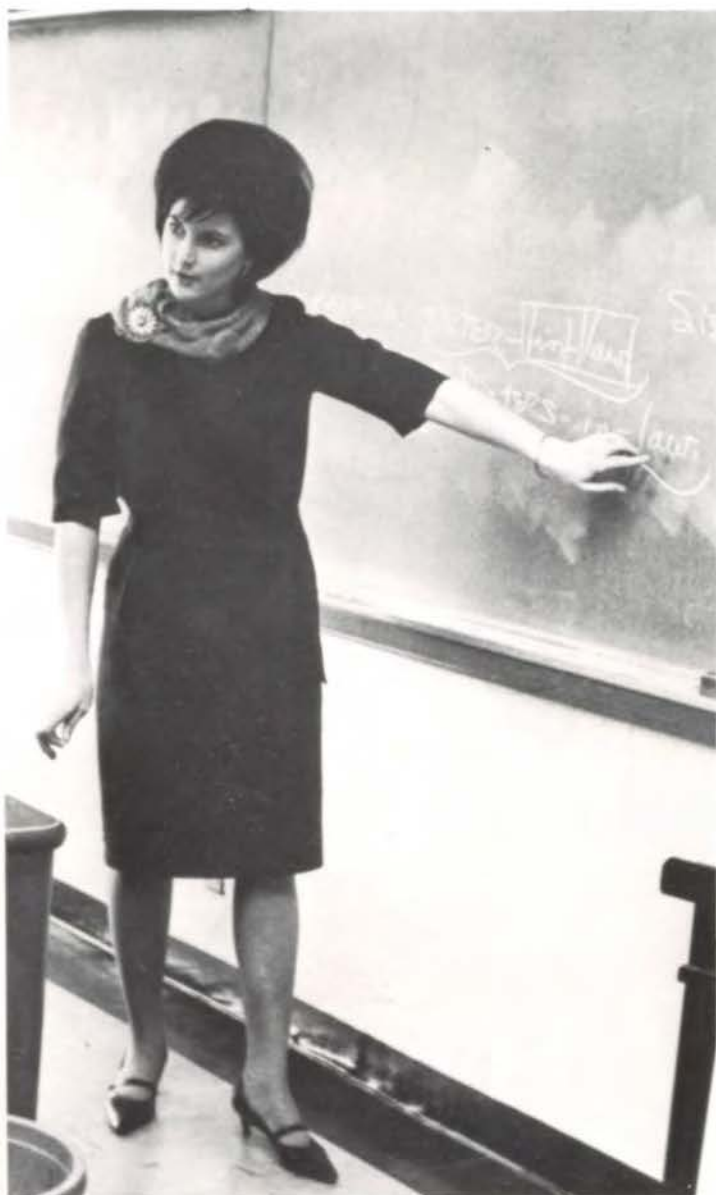

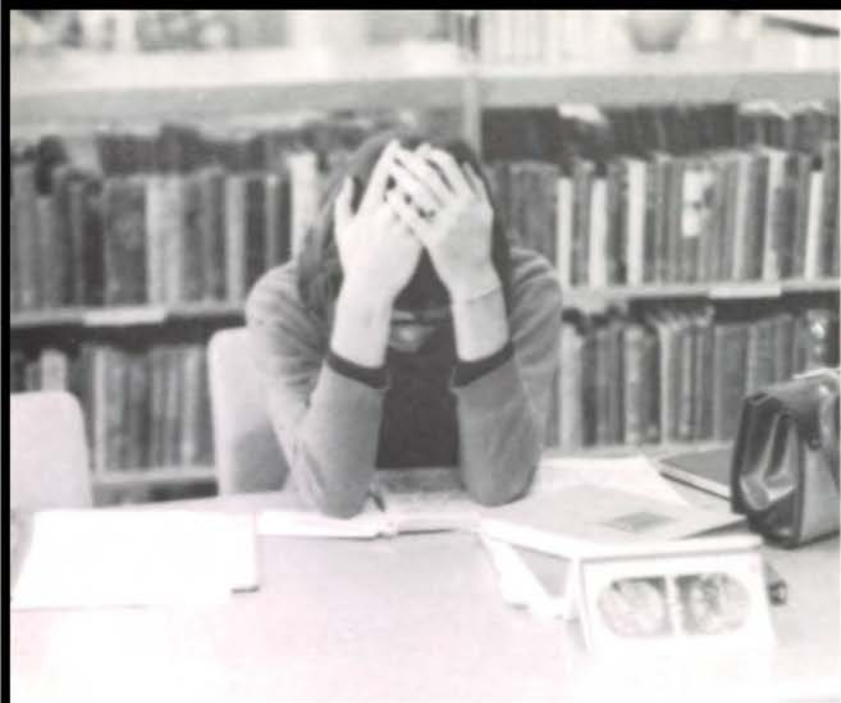

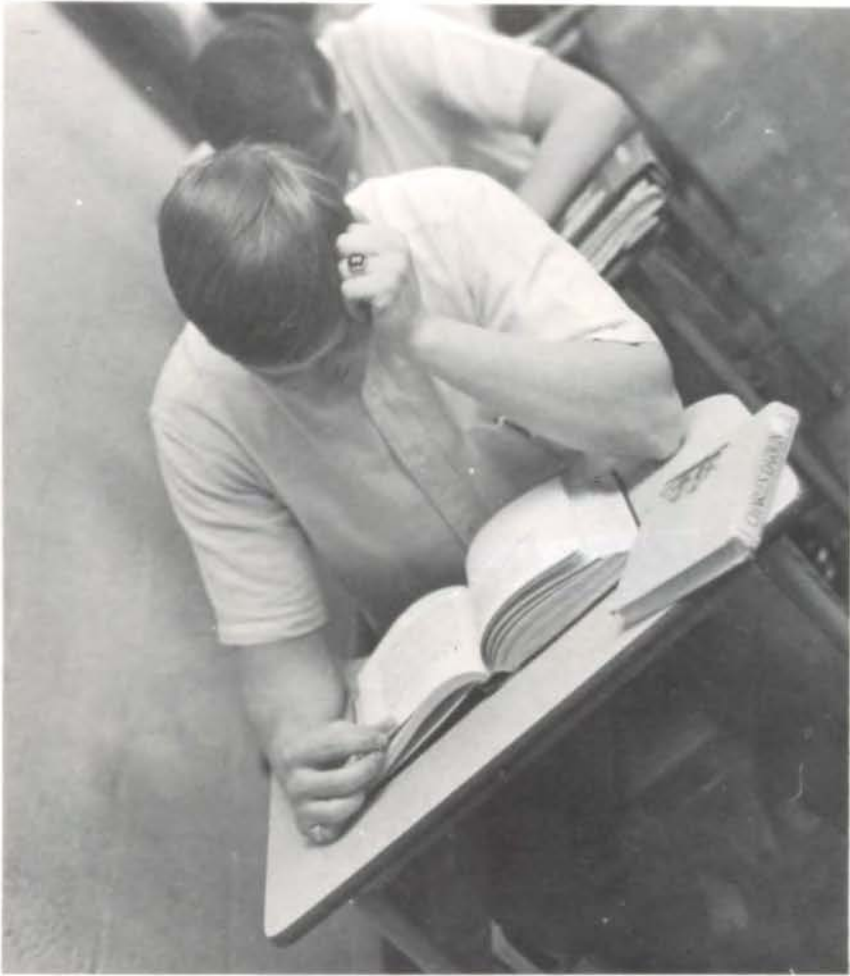

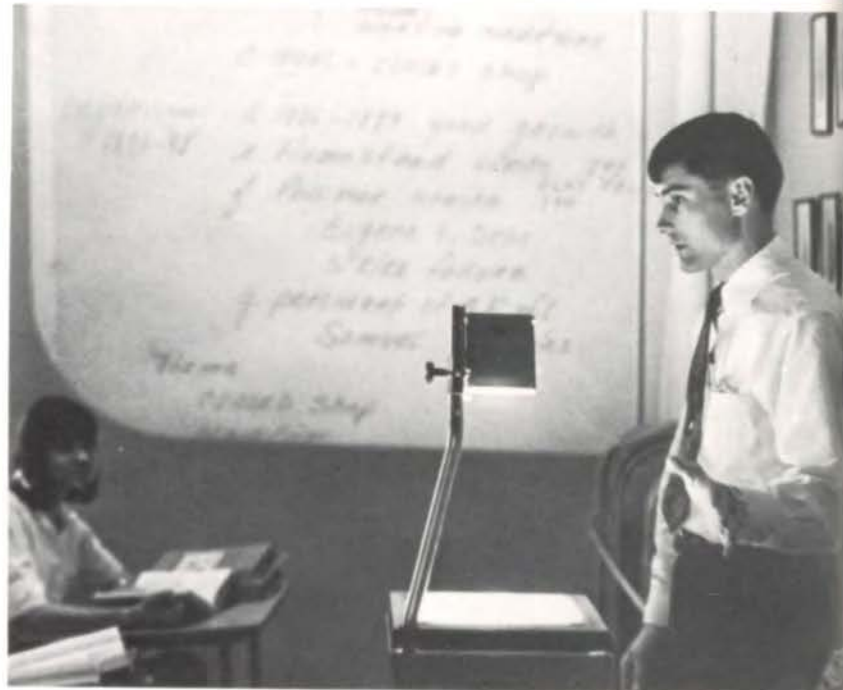

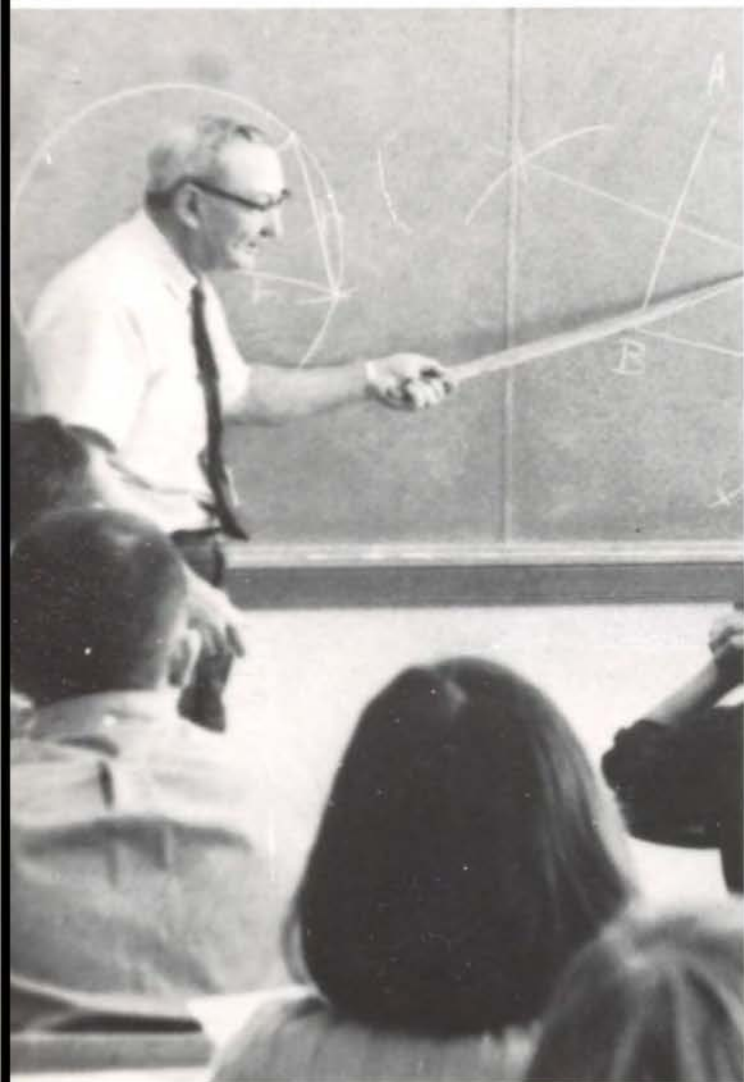

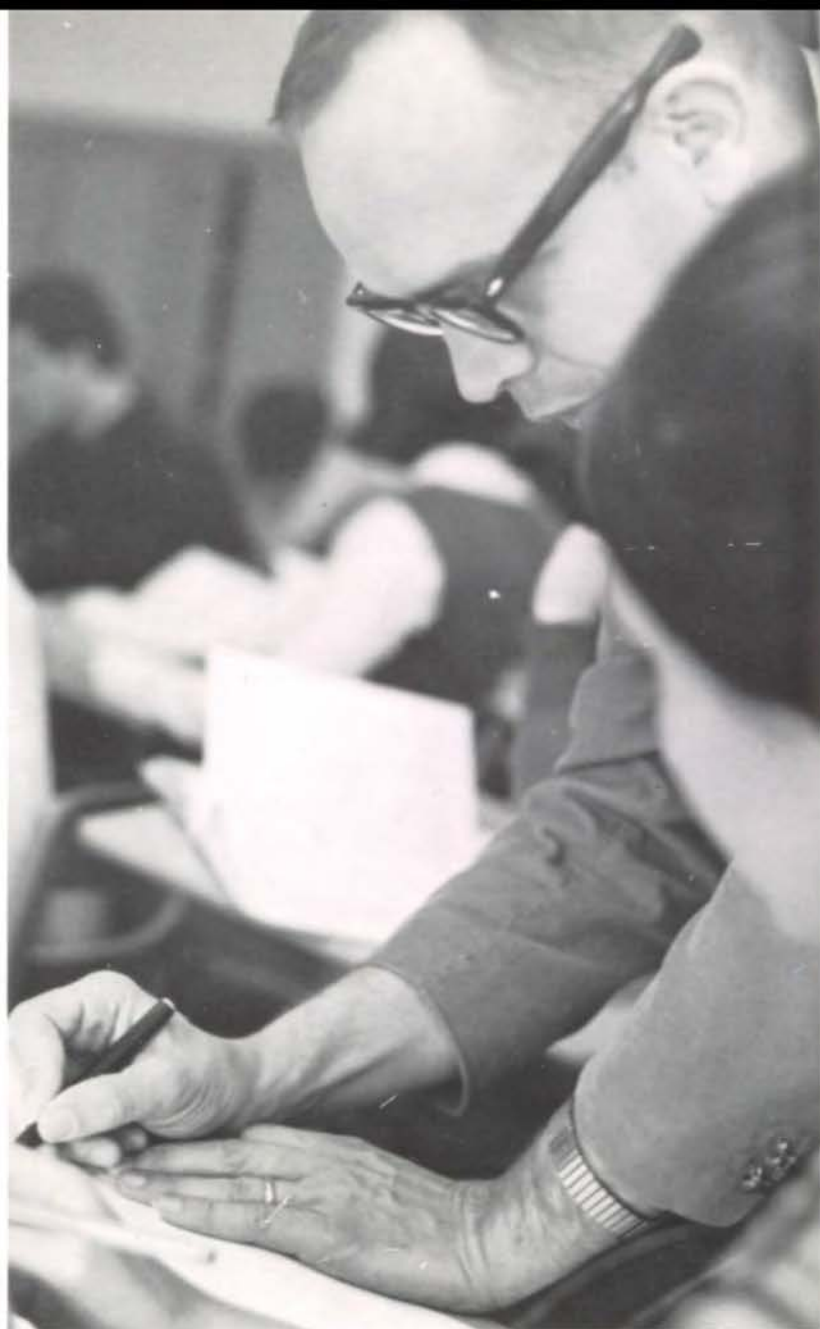

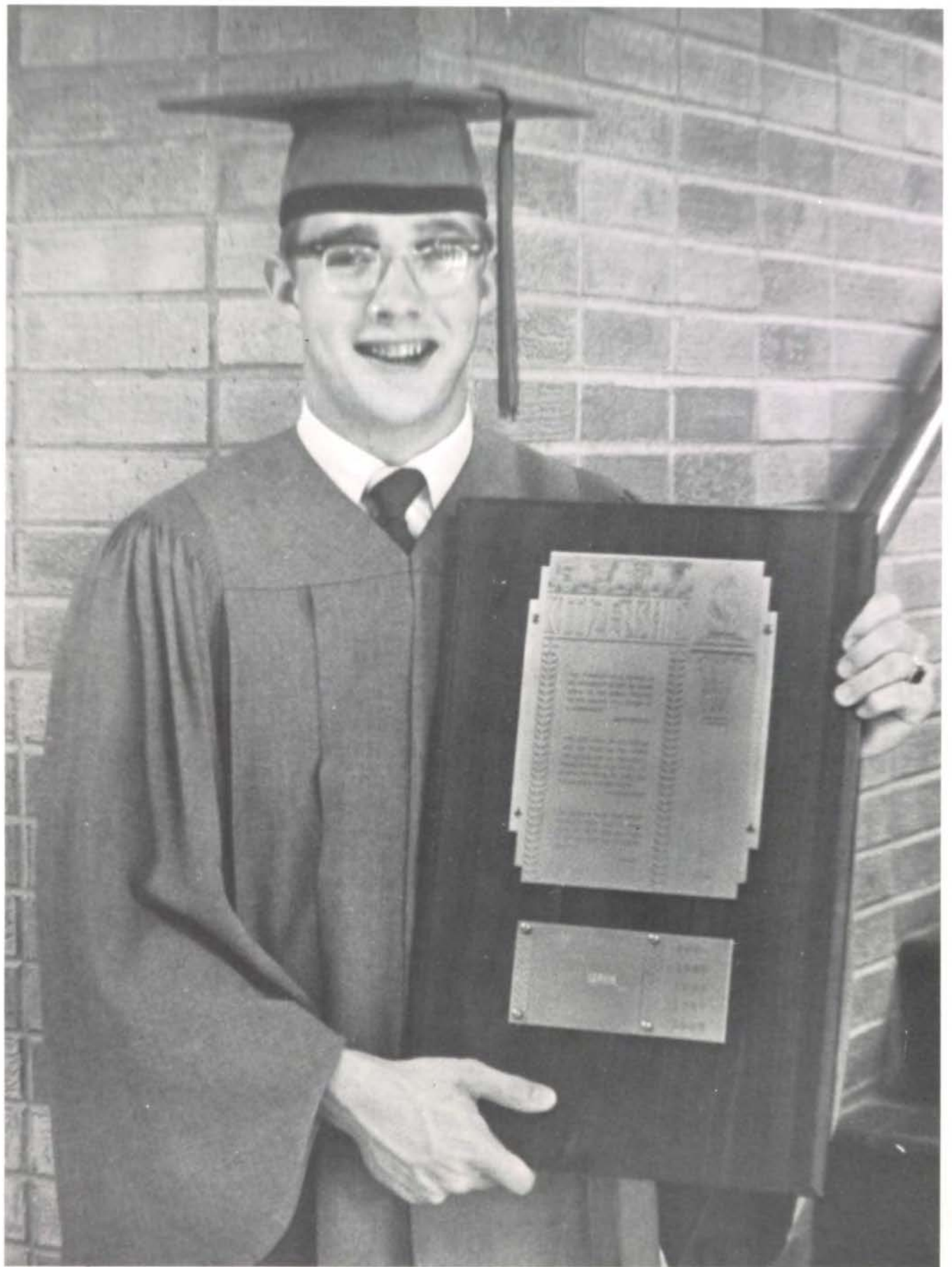

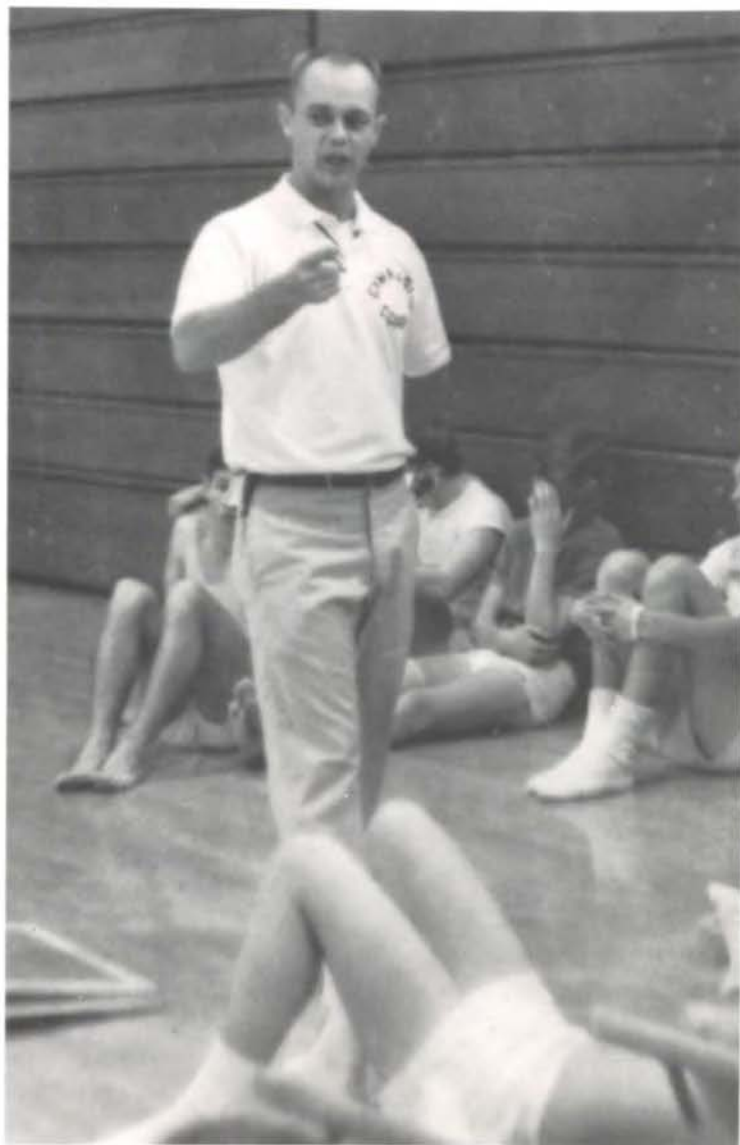

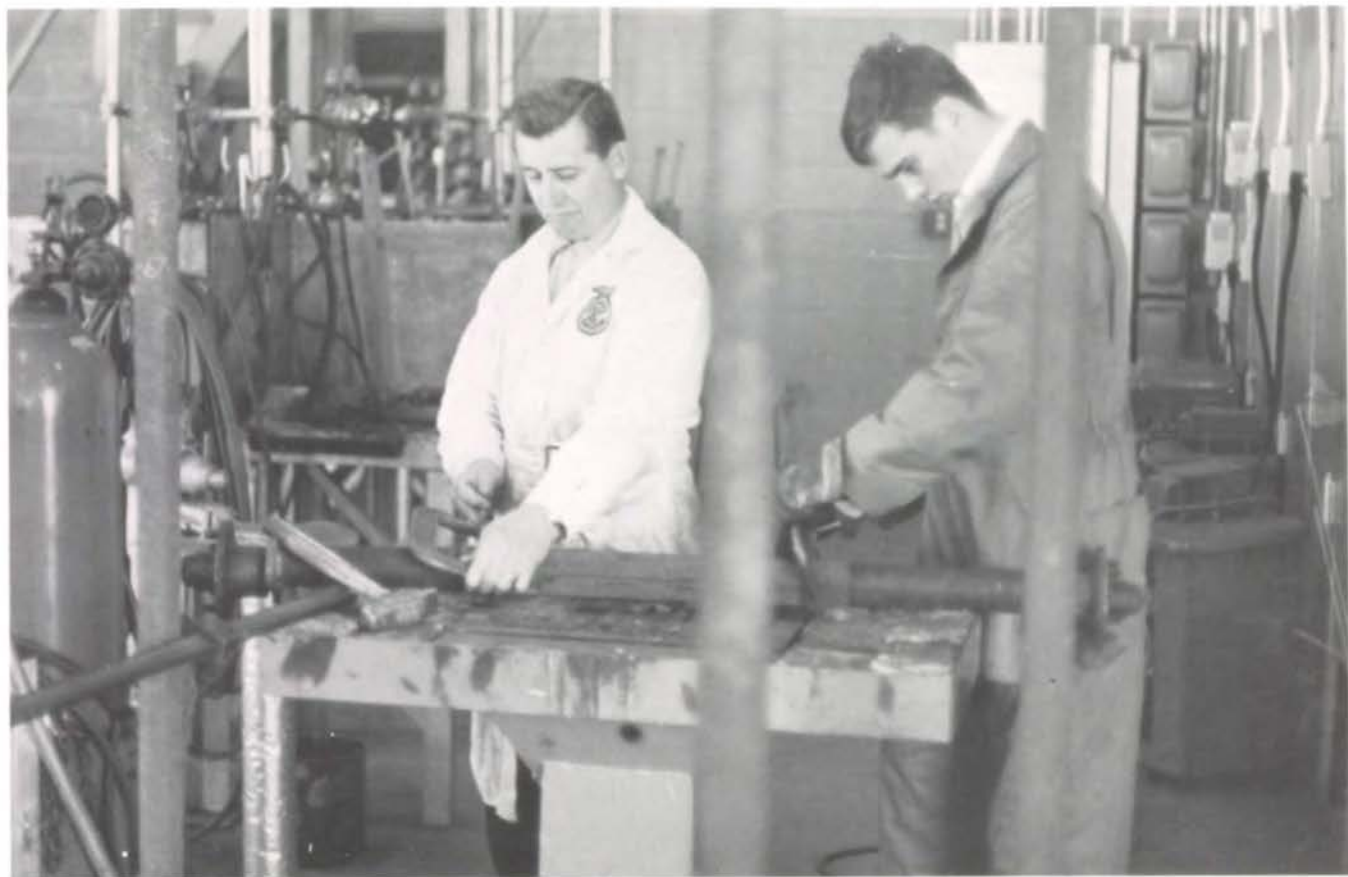

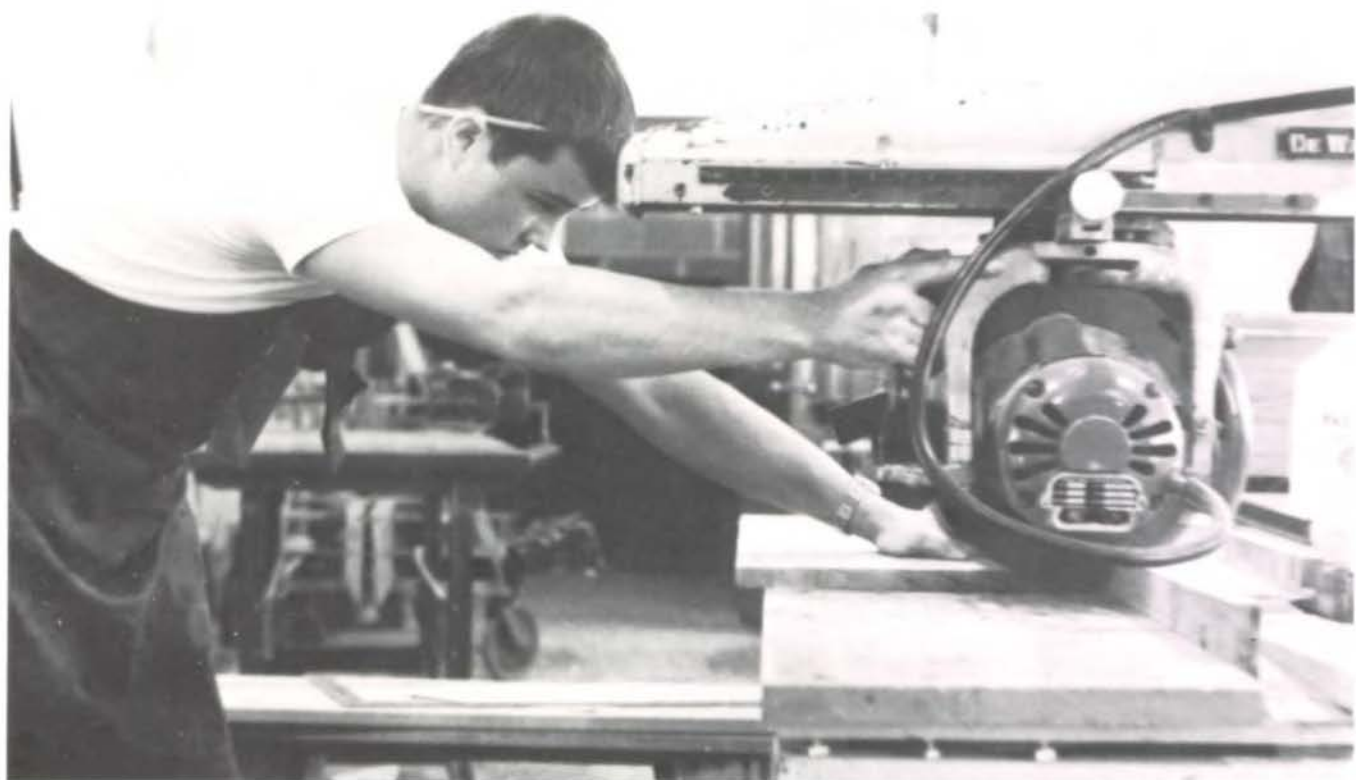

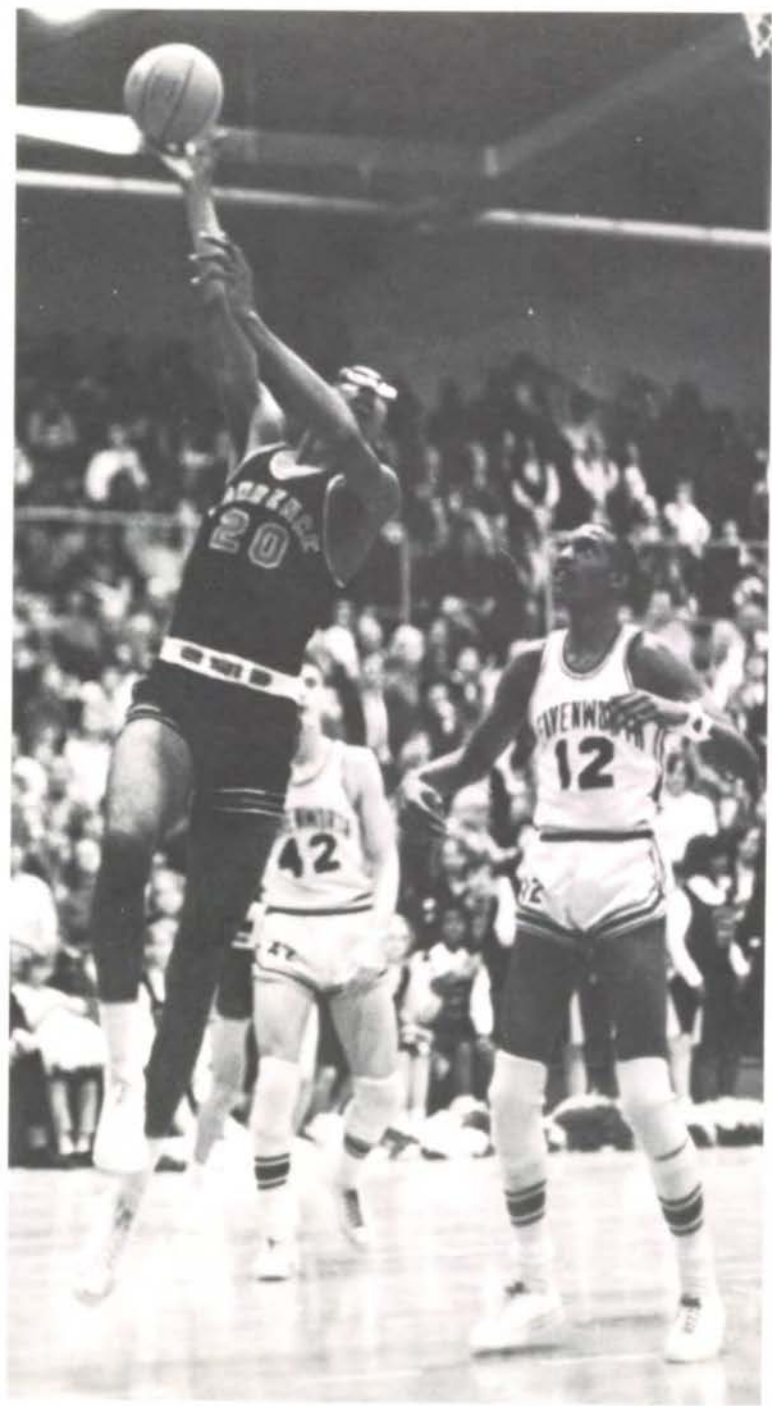

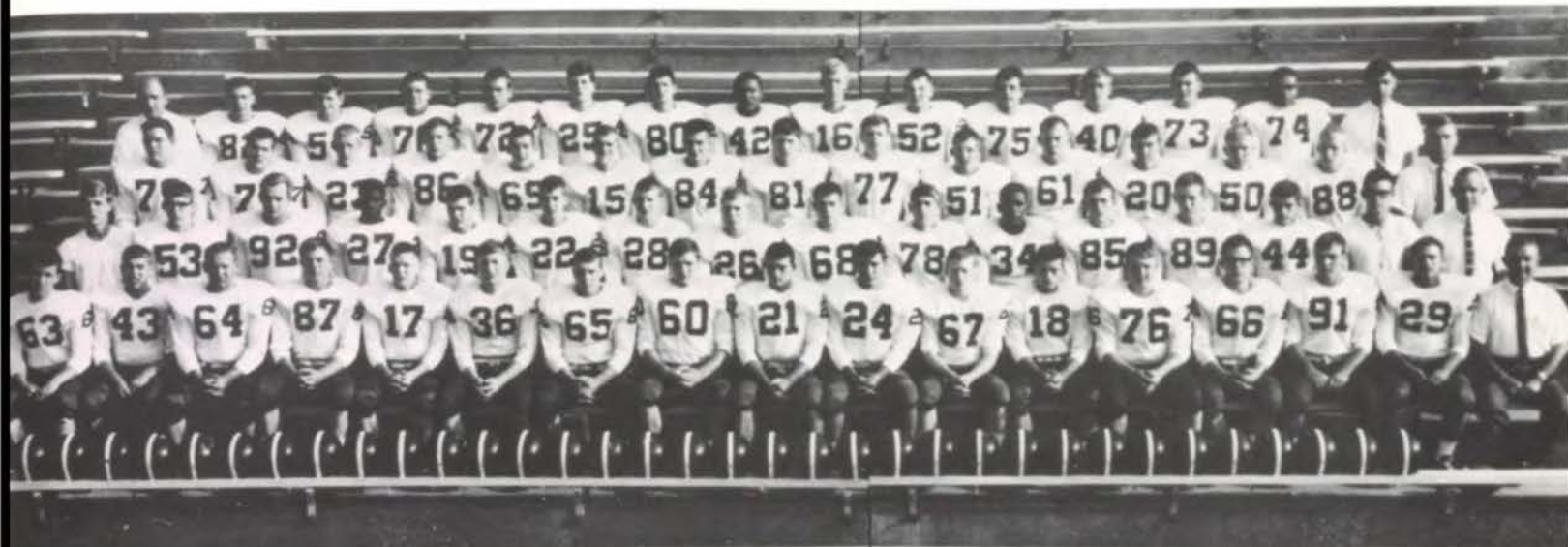

It was the year of the Lion, Lawrence Lion that is, as the Woolard-coached Cats powered through the 1966 season with a 9-0 record and the number one rating in the Class AA ranks as polled by the Associated Press.

It was the season of the big play and fancy tricks as the Lions pulled off coup after coup from a sack marked fundamental football. Overrunning Manhattan, Ottawa, and Hayden, the Lions gained revenge over Shawnee Mission North and Shawnee Mission East with 14-9 and 13-3 wins. Those two victories along with margins over Leavenworth, Wyandotte, Topeka, and Parsons were enough to vote Lawrence' King of Class AA Football.

Lions Win State

Coach Bob Manning and his state championship gymnastics team picked up title number seven with a stunning 110-93 win over the nearest competitor, Wichita South. The victory represented the first state title for coach Manning, a first-year mentor at Lawrence High School.

The Lions, led by all-around champion Ken Snow and Steve Mitchell, trailed at the half-way mark 62-55, but back-to-back wins by the two senior leaders paced the final margin of victory. Snow was first in all-around and free exercise, while Mitchell copped the parallel bars and long horse vaulting state titles.

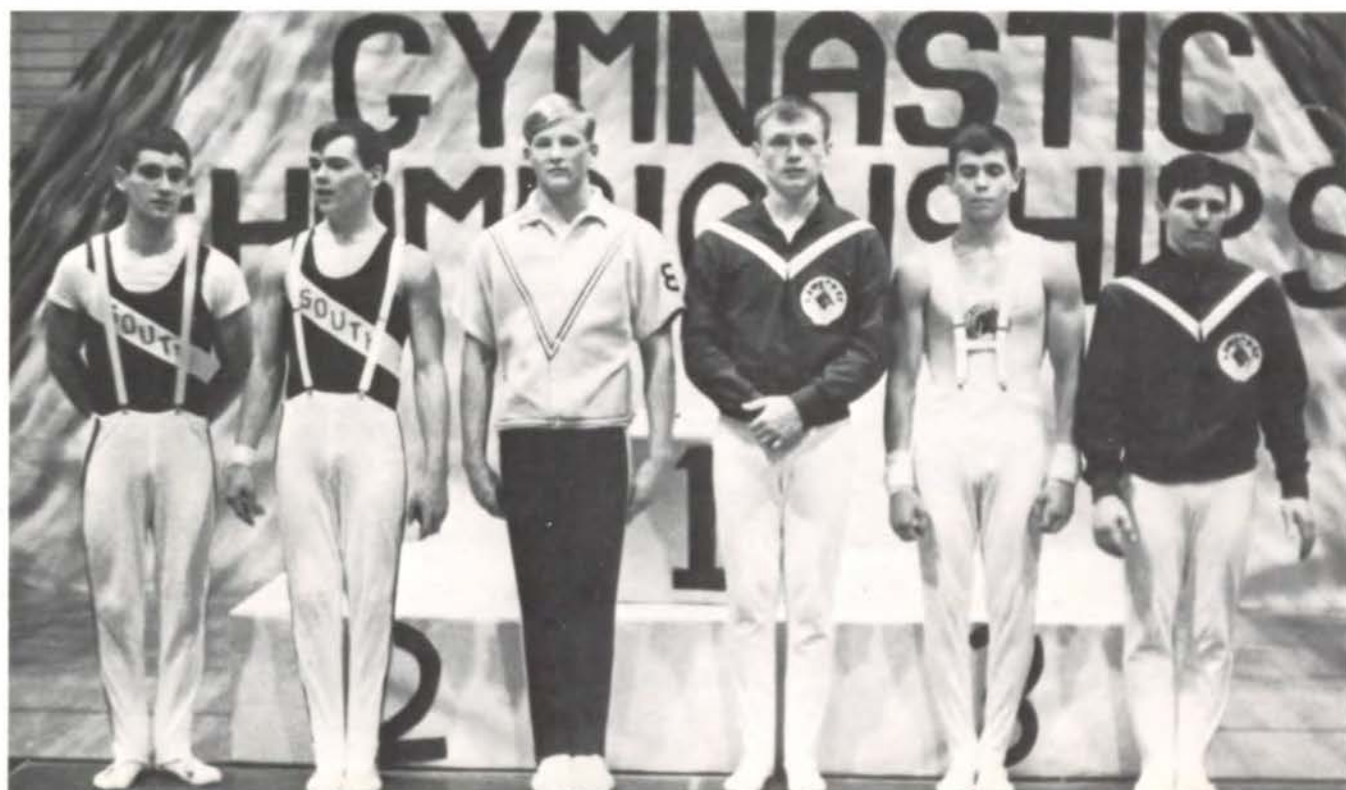

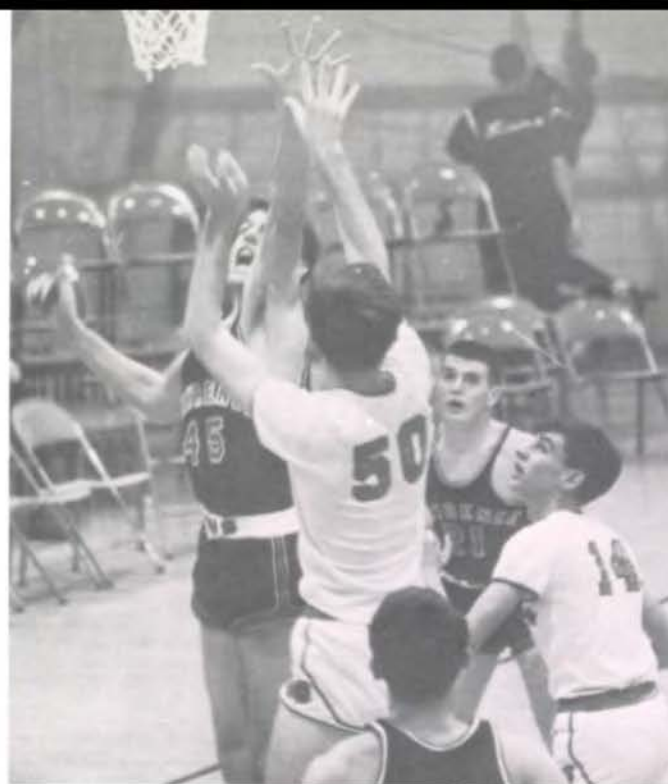

Miller Voted All-State

Tom Miller received All-State status from the Kansas City Star and the Topeka Daily Capital for his efforts during the 1967 basketball campaign as he led the Lions to a 16-5 record. Miller, 6-9 was the tallest of the elite group and carried a 16.8 average for the year. Chip Maxwell received honorable mention All-State.

A new record was established by Tom Miller as the giant chucked in 704 points in two years of play for a 16.4 average to become the highest average and highest point producer Lawrence High has ever had. The former record holder was Ralph Light who hit 15.16 and 637 points and Bill Royer with identical credentials.

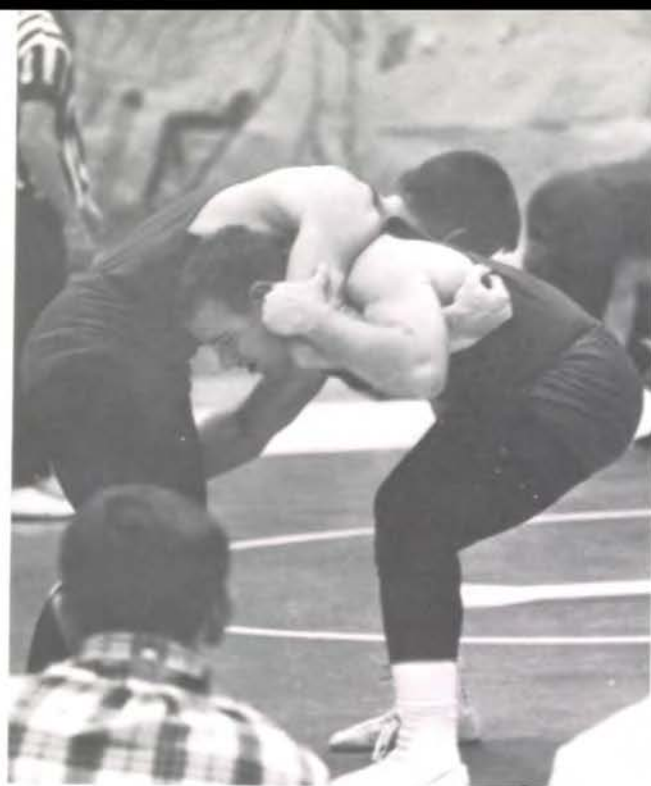


Mike Harris, "B" pivot, scores with a reverse layup against Manhattan as he scored in the double figures in every game this season except six.

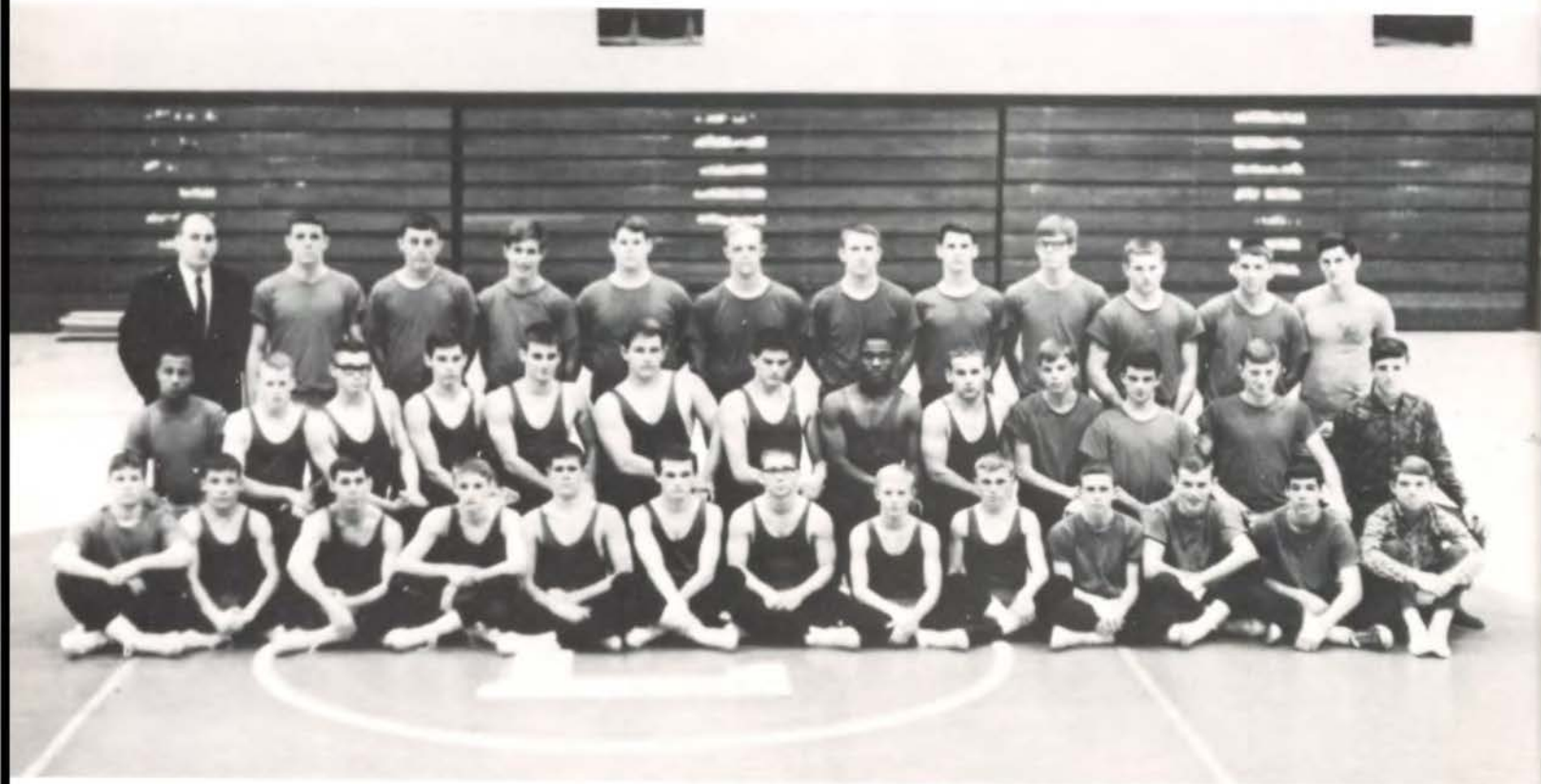

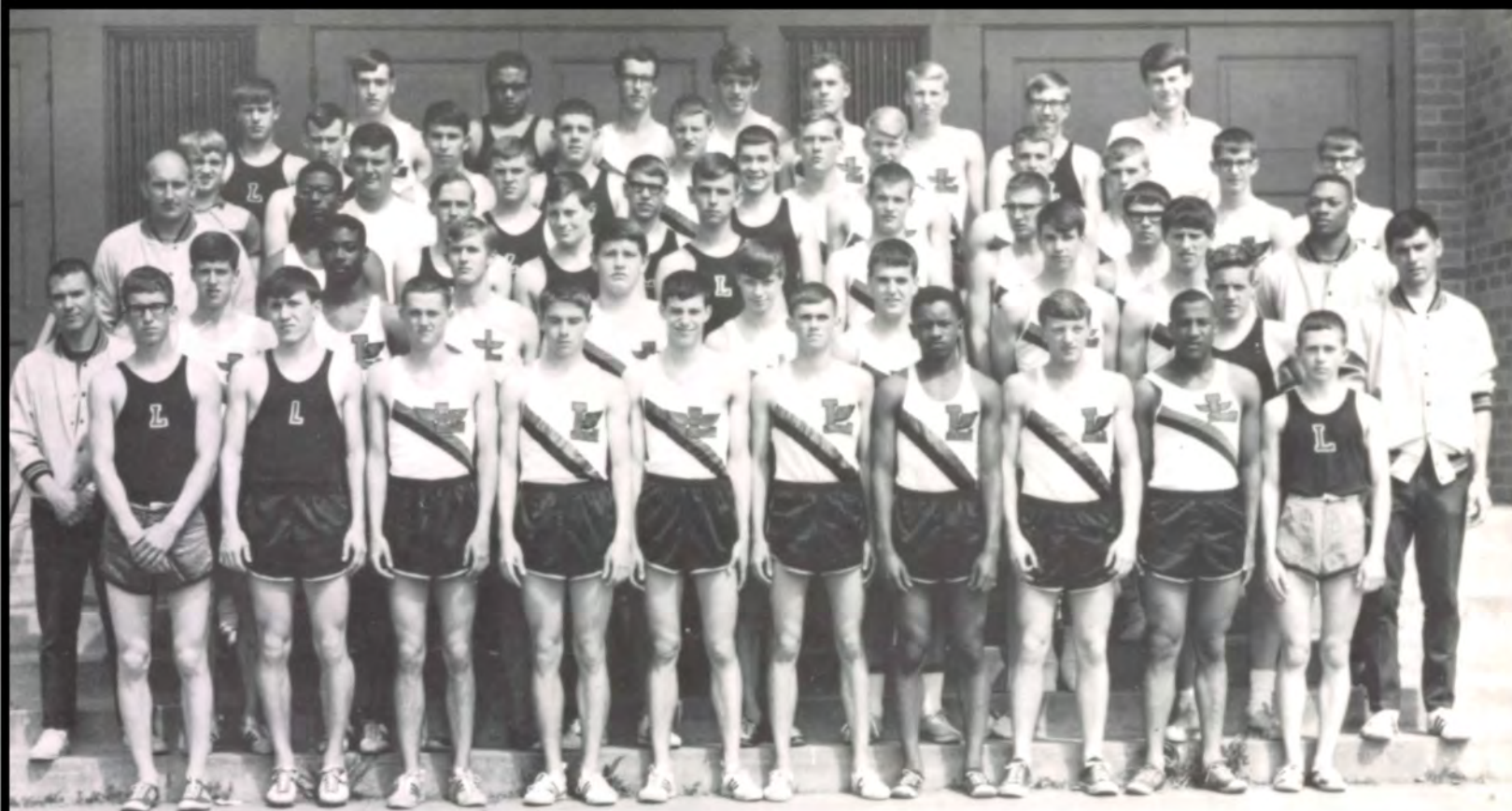
Lawrence broke the mile relay record and tied the mile run record and the 880 yard mark.

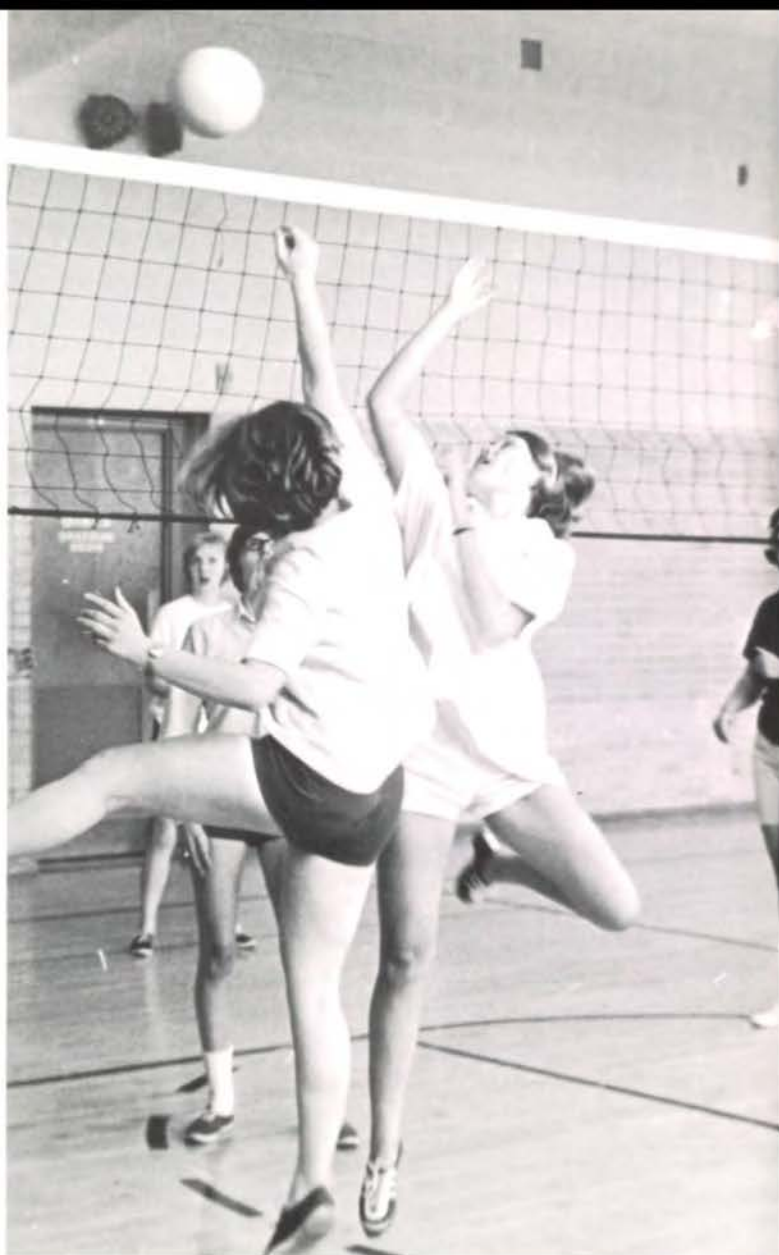

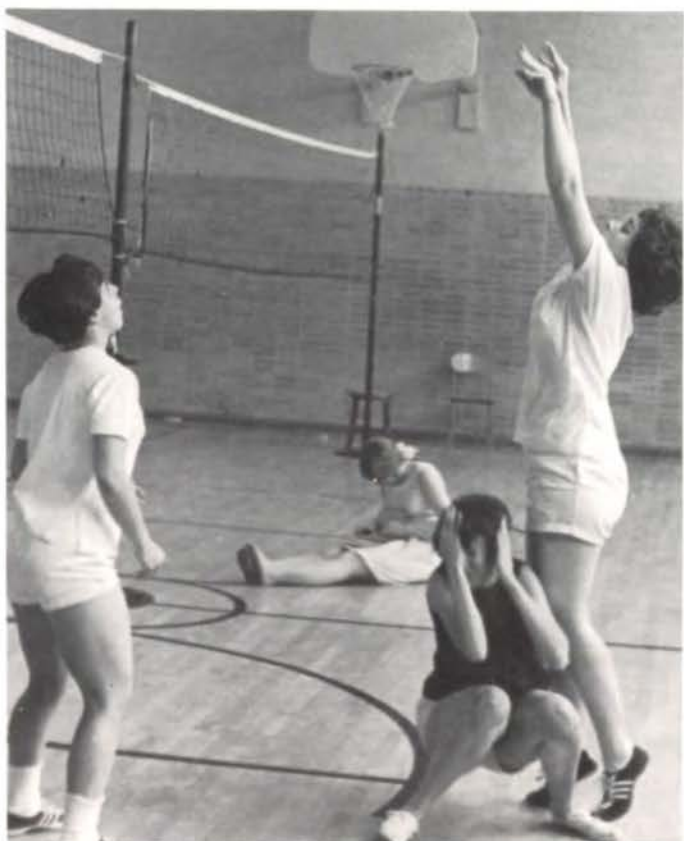

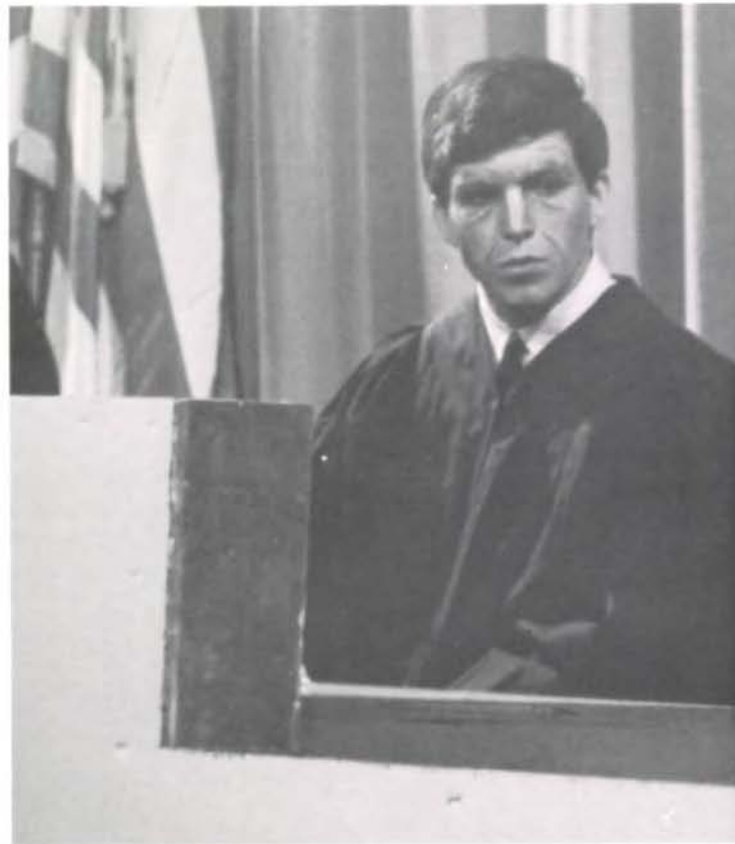
