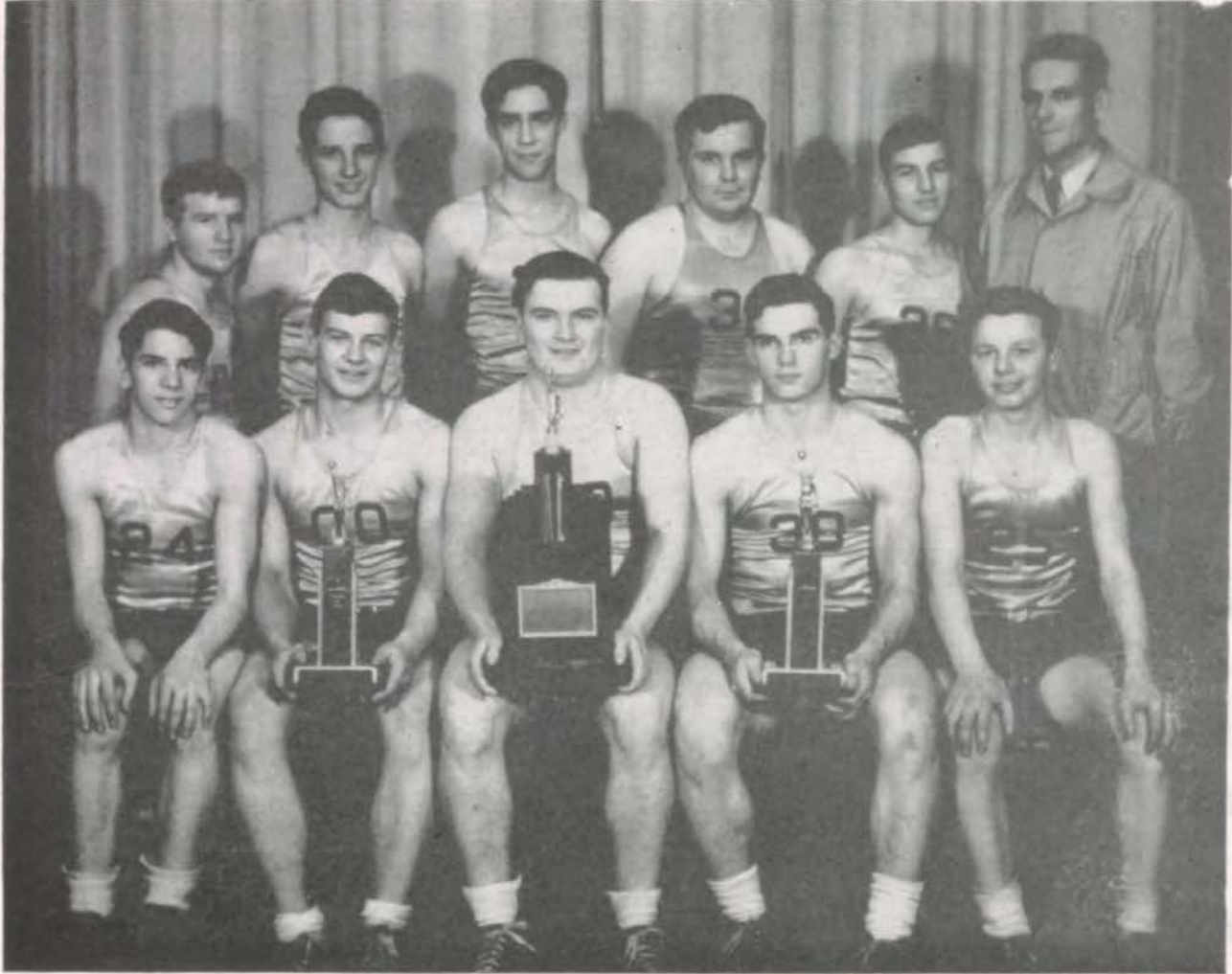

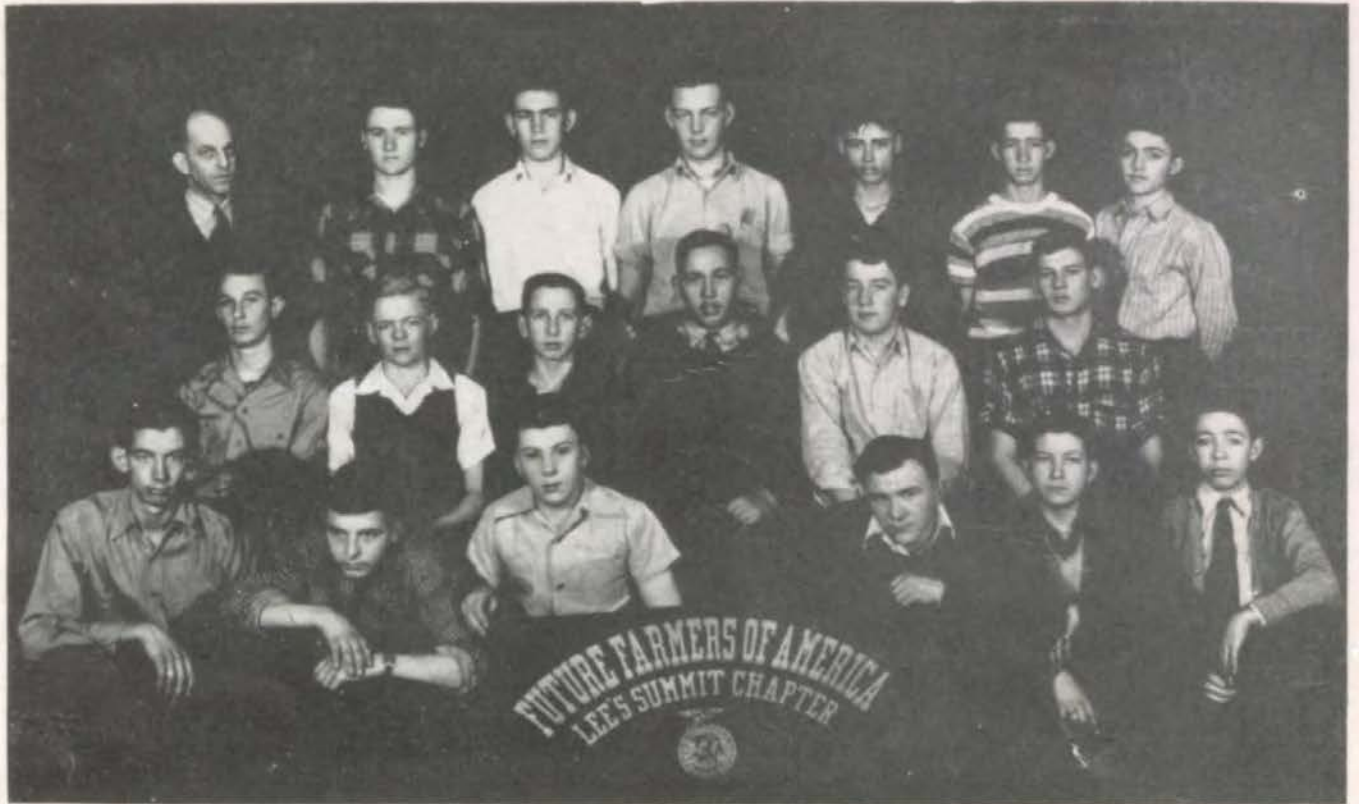
Related Science is a study of the various sciences as related to Home Economics.
