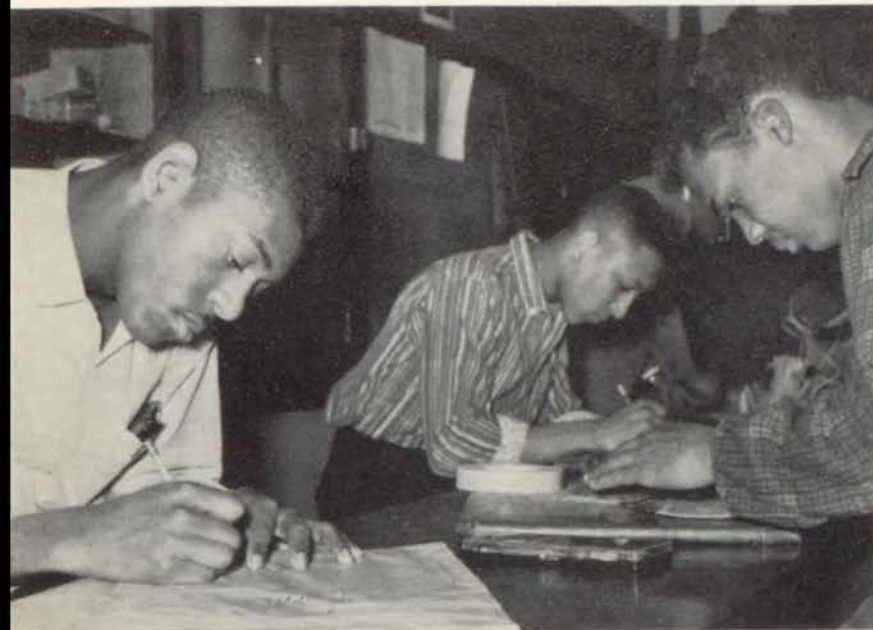

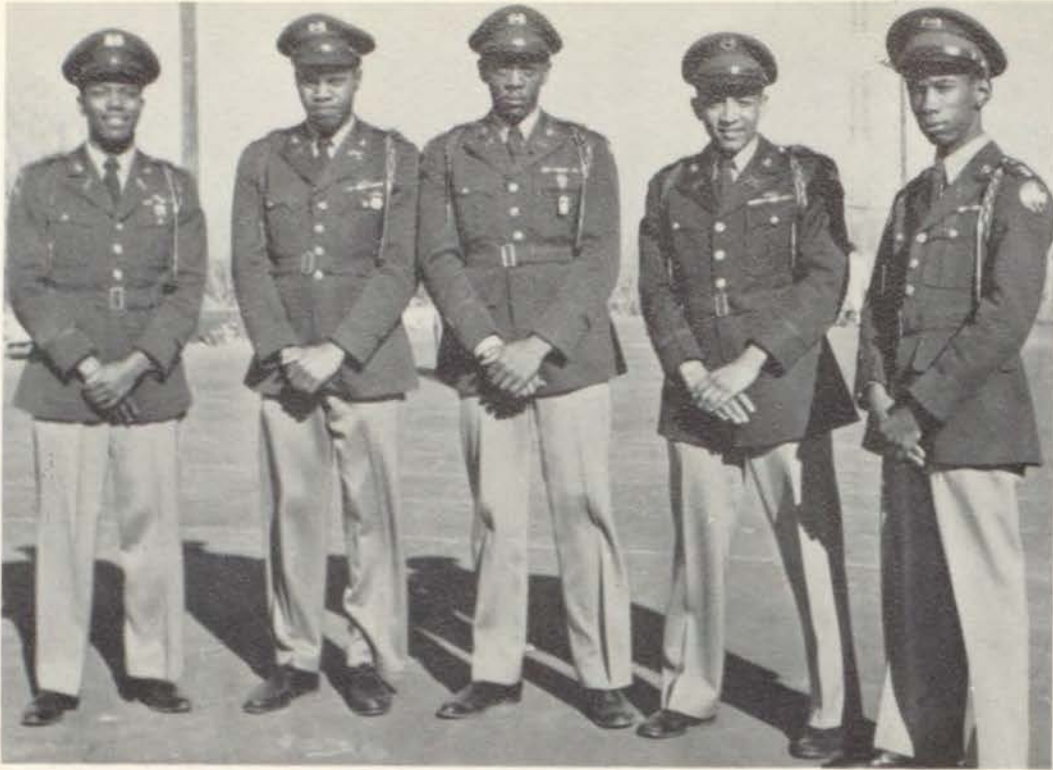

Three In A Row For Unprecedented Record

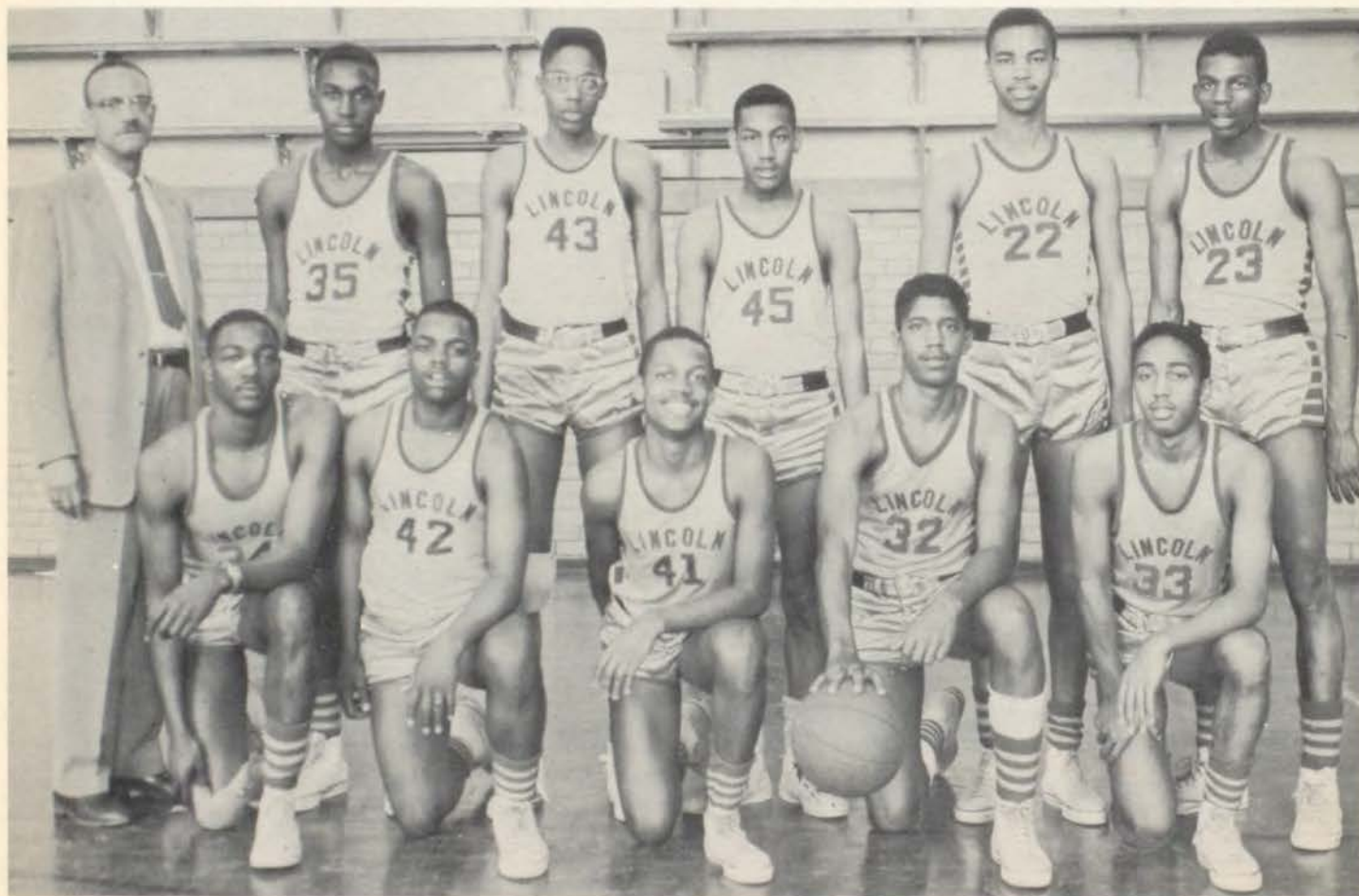
