A lot of things happened in '61--world-wide, national and local. The cold war got colder; internal strife was reported in various countries, both large and small; a new president of the United States was inaugurated; and a new governor of Missouri took up residence in Jefferson City. Kansas City public school teachers received a comparable increase in salary as the result of a school levy passed by an overwhelming majority of Kansas Citizens. Our superintendent of public schools reasserted the necessity of placing "Accent on Excellence" in order to provide the finest educational program possible for boys and girls in Kansas City.

It goes without saying that we at Lincoln were imbued with the "New Frontiers" spirit and the "Accent on Excellence" fever. A seriousness of purpose exemplified by our administrators and teachers had its effect on us. "The sky became the limit" as we dreamed, planned, studied and achieved. We took advantage of the old along with the new and better facilities provided for learning. A new peak in achievement was reached with the election of a Lincolnite as president of the All-City Student Council, the first Negro student to serve in that capacity. The R.O.T.C. unit won the coveted Kansas City Star Award for the most outstanding unit in the area. A faculty member gained recognition for outstanding work as a member of the Howard University Summer Workshop in Human Relations sponsored by the National Conference of Christians and Jews.

The "bitter with the sweet" came with the loss of the Interscholastic basketball championship held for four consecutive years.

Lincolnites and especially graduating seniors attest the fact that '61 was a good start for the '60's. Succeeding classes must endeavor to equal, if not surpass, this noteworthy beginning.



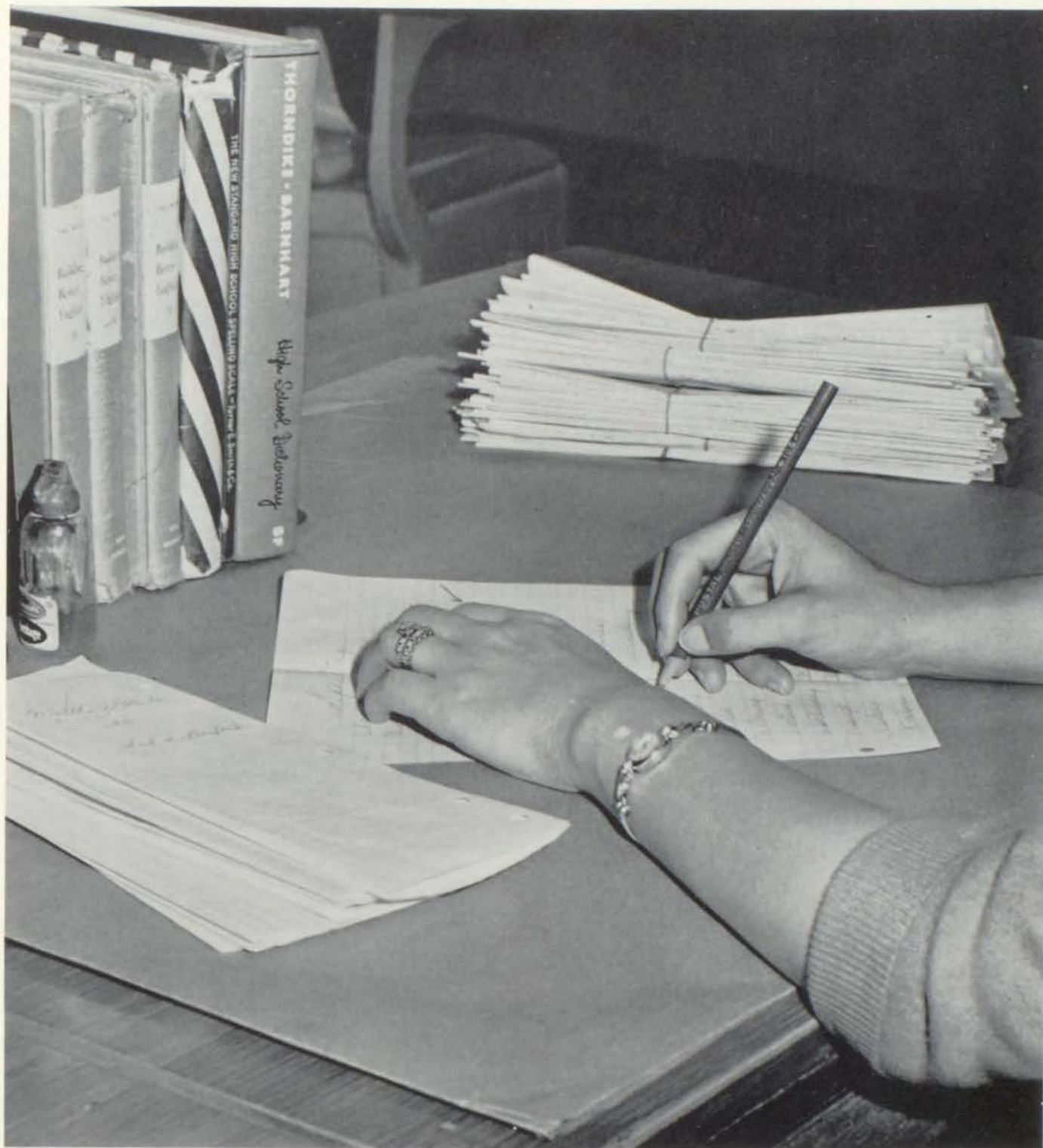

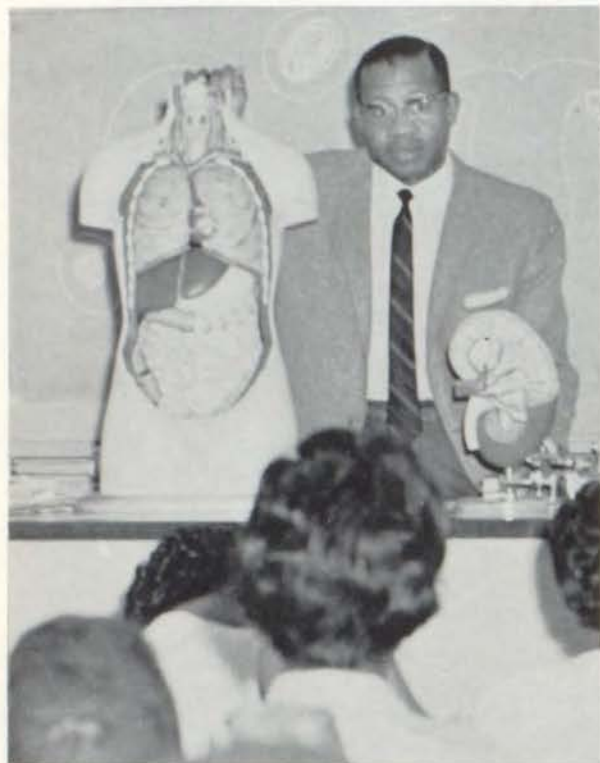

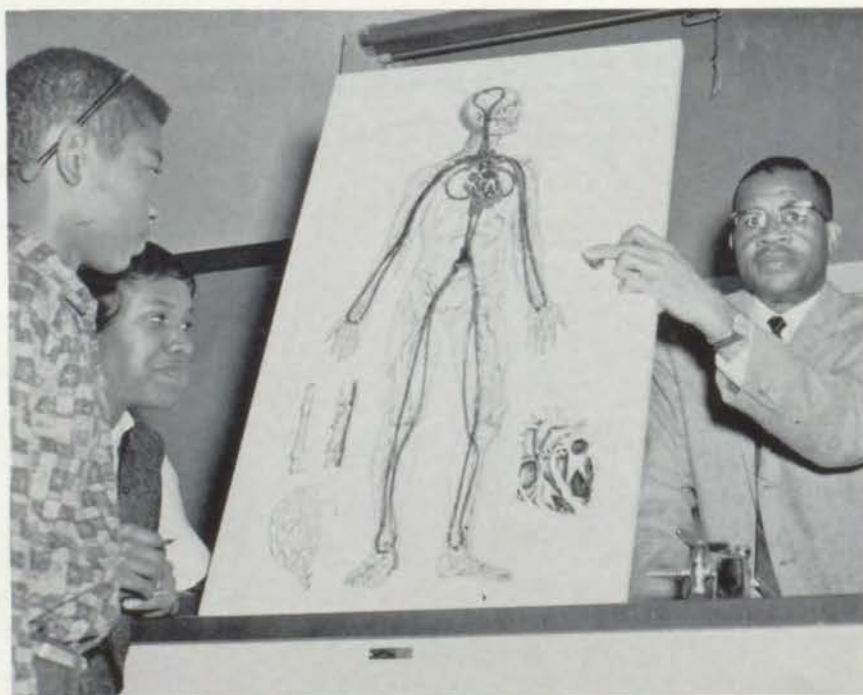
High School Science
