
# FOREWORD

Using scholarships, athletics, and social activities the Lincoln students have achieved many goals, and we hope they will continue after we have gone.

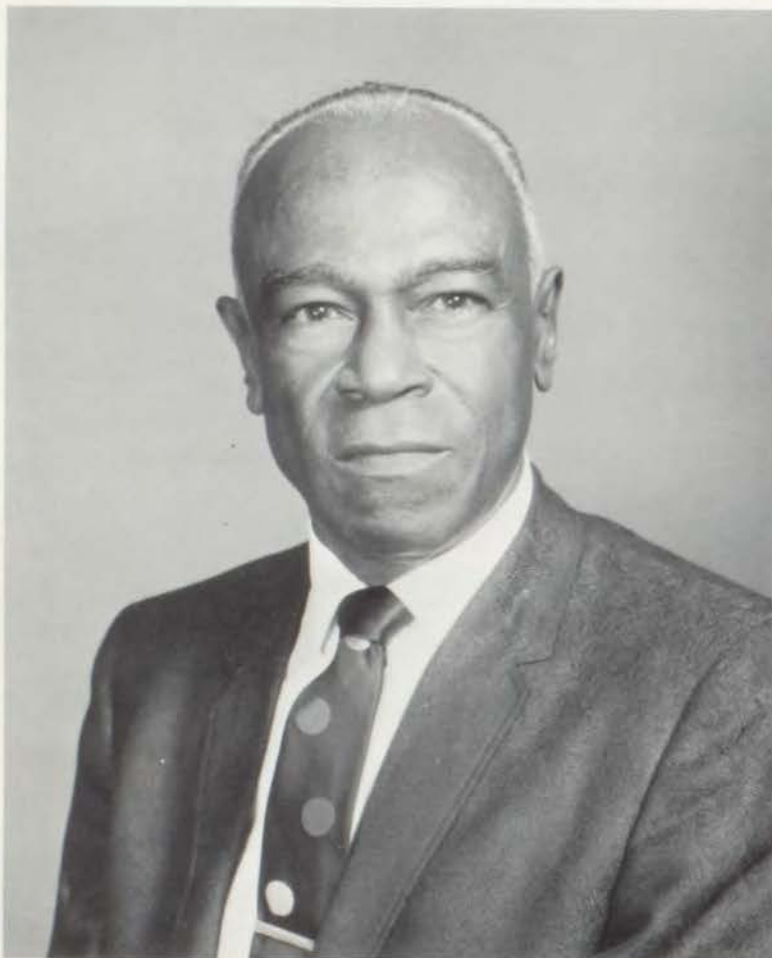

at least that's the way it seems

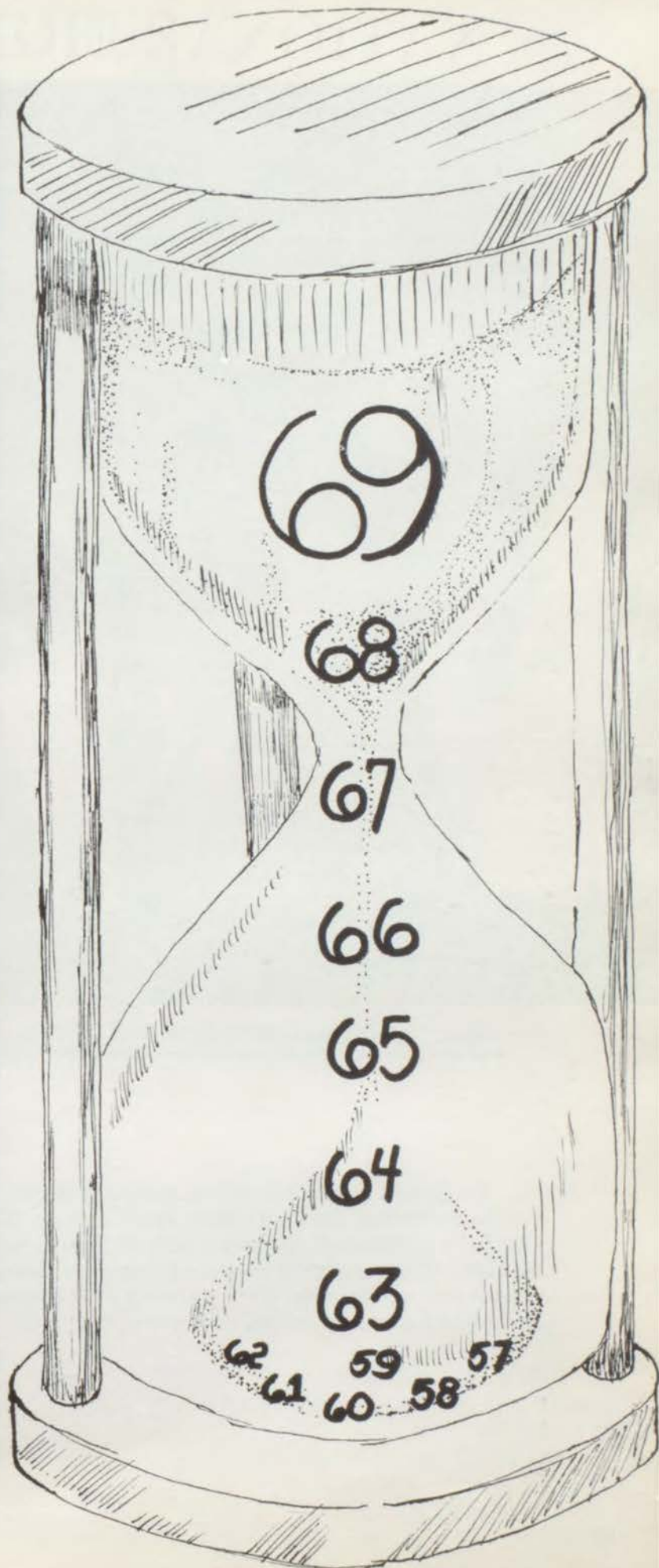

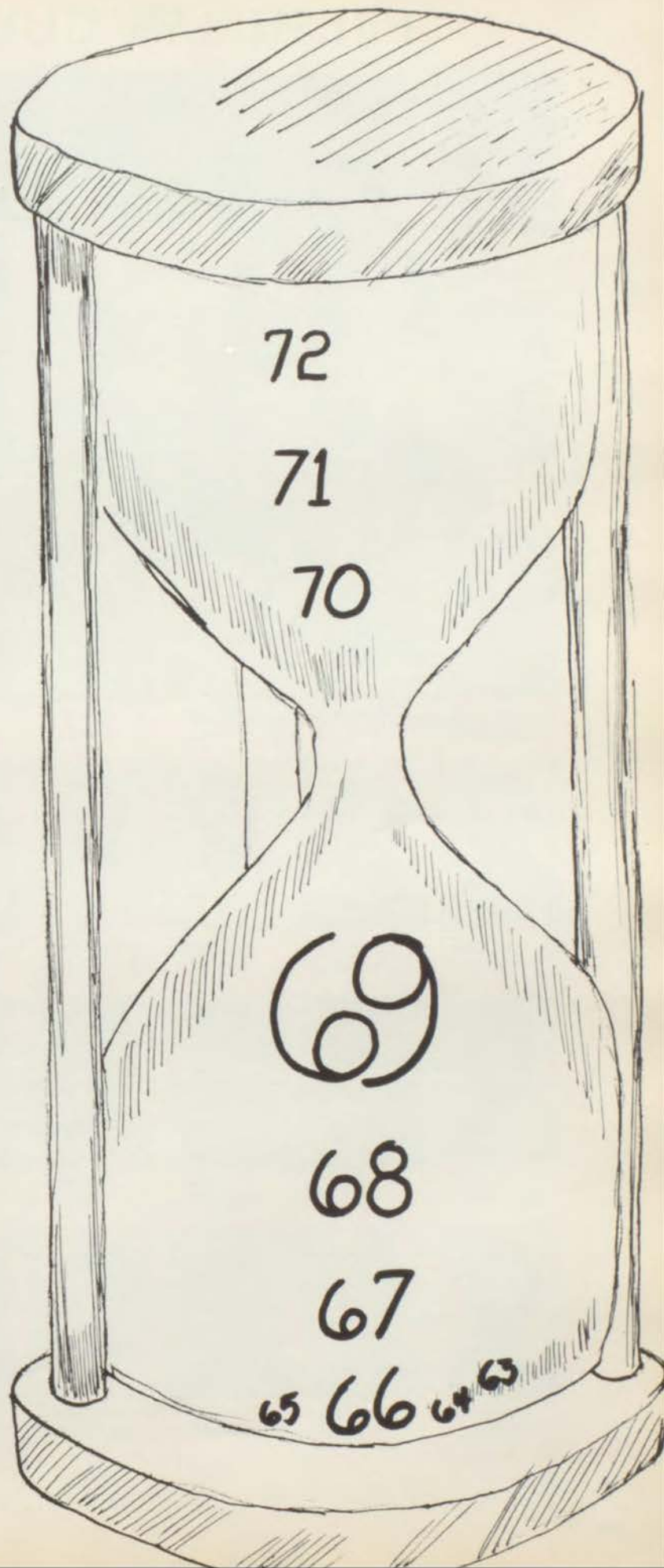
## PREPARING FOR THE FUTURE-- COLLEGE DAY
