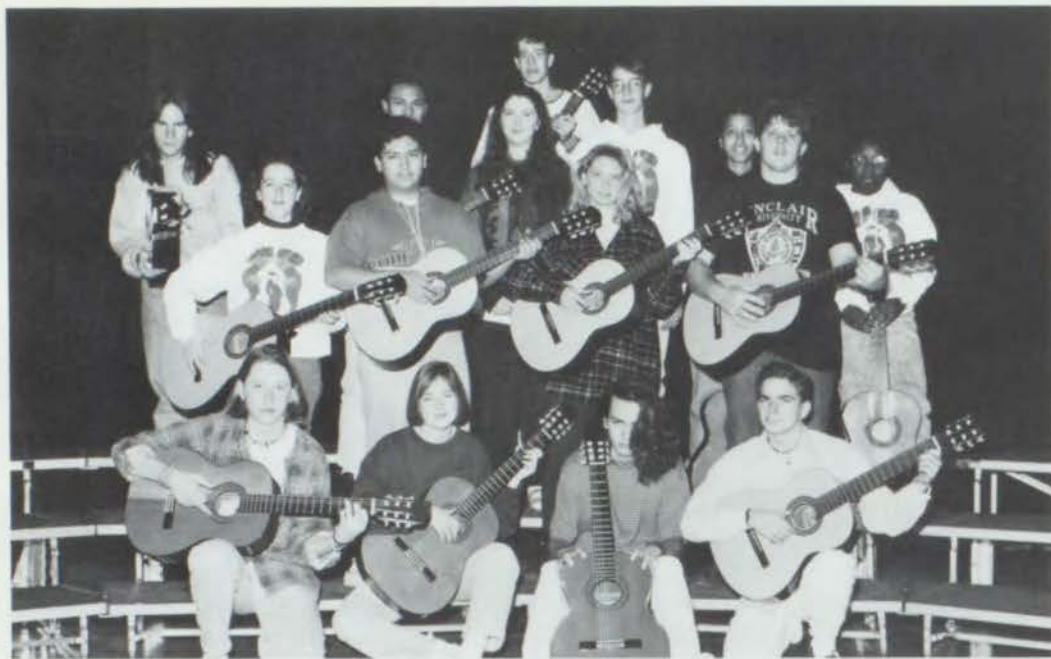

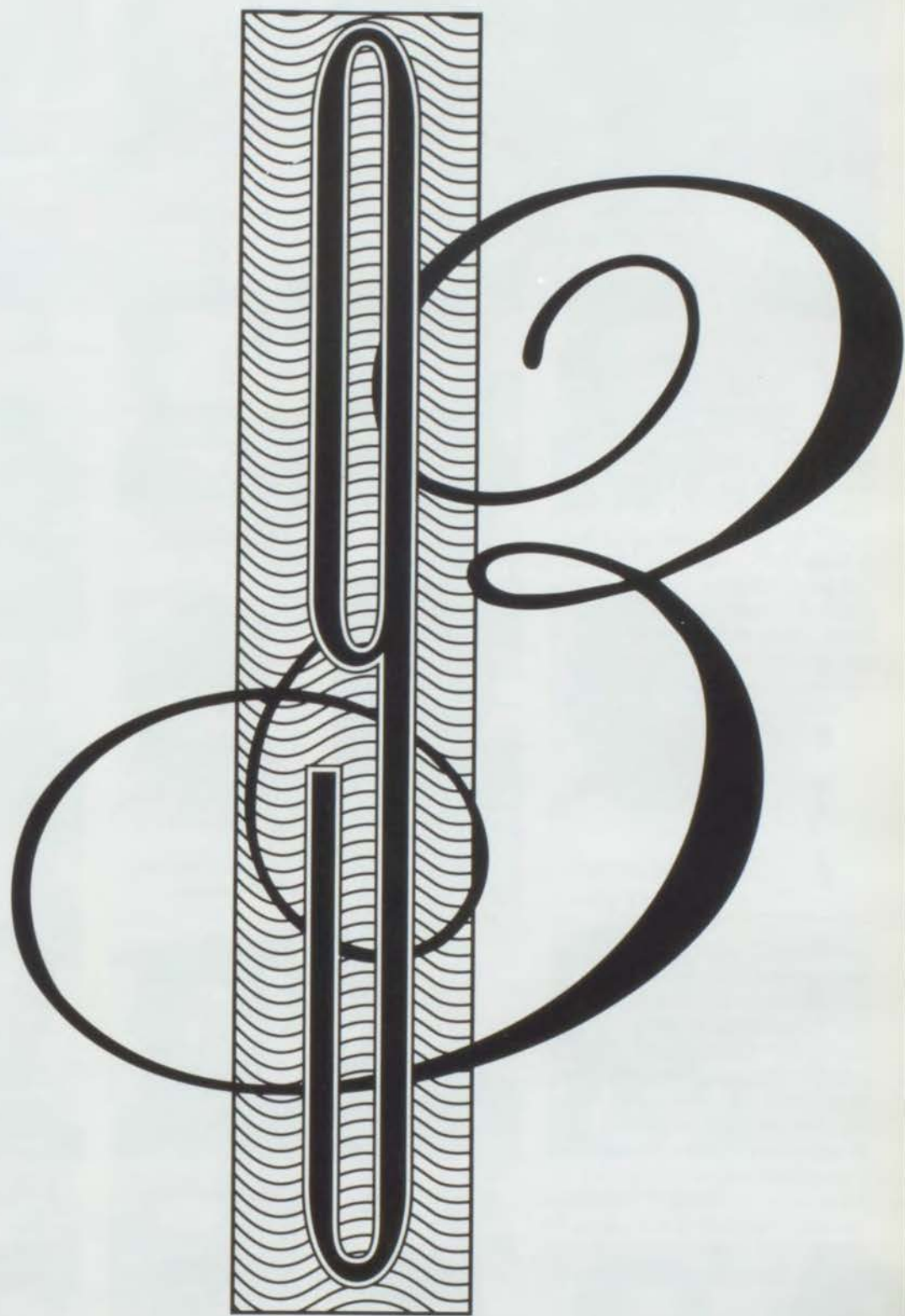
More and more changes are taking place in Russia and I'm afraid that I'll not recognize my country after coming back.

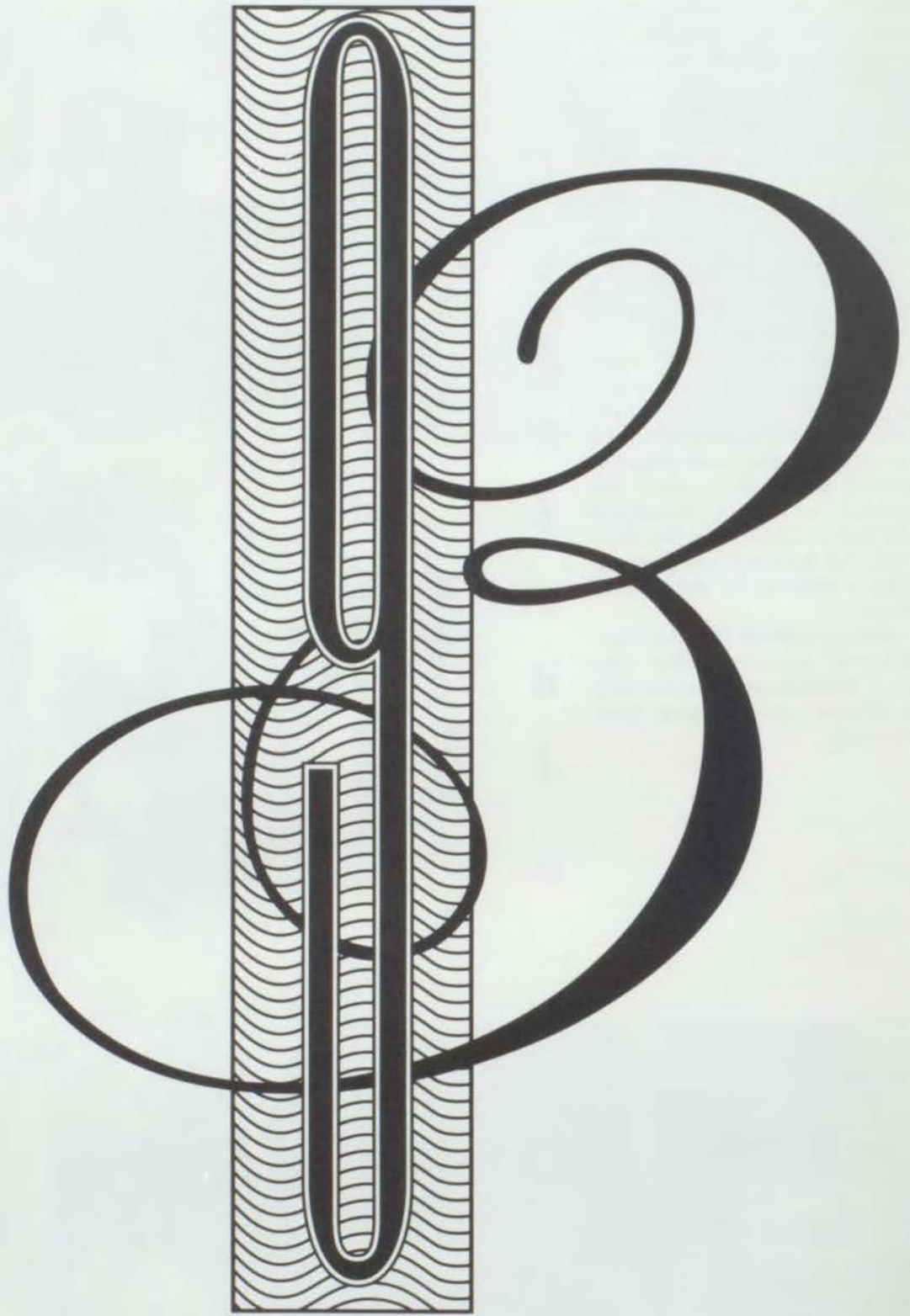
Middle school hip-hop fashions are very similar to the high schools. They include such fashions as Malcolm X caps, combat (Jodeci) boots, and colored jeans.
