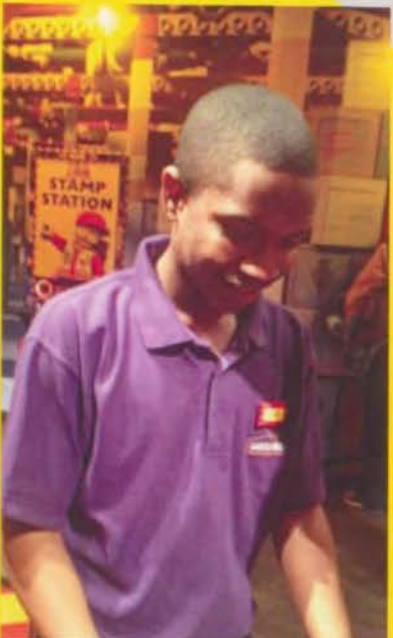

Everyone who walks through the doors of Lincoln College Prep carries their own distinct heritage. From the easternmost reaches of Asia, to the heart the European Union, all the way to South America, it's plain to see that Lincoln is an amalgamation of all different cultures, resulting in a unique high school experience. "The biggest difference in culture would be language," says junior Kira Siittig from Germany, "but since the USA is so diverse it helped me get accustomed to it." Other differences in culture can startle, and even frighten someone who is not accustomed to them, like Japanese student Shuma Fukui. "The security system and metal detectors scared me," he says, "I have never seen anyone carry a gun that was not a cop."

Not only are the students diverse at Lincoln, but the teachers are as well. For example, biology teacher Dr. Udokwu is from Nigeria in West Africa, where the native language is Igbo. This isn't the only language he speaks, however. Dr. Udokwu also speaks English, West African, French, and Pigeon English. "The only things I miss are the nice weather and the close relationships that I had," says Dr. Udokwu, "But I do not like when kids fight in my class. They look like monkeys!"

Dr. Udokwu isn't the only teacher from Africa at Lincoln. Mr. Diagana is from Mauritania in West Africa, where the native language is Soninke. He visits home once every two years to visit his family and friends, who still live there. "I really like it here," he says, "my favorite thing is the restaurant where they give you a bowl with rice." (Chipotle. He means Chipotle.)

Lincoln houses the most prestigious English department in the school district, where some of the most talented writers are born. Although the curriculum is very rigorous and demanding, it is also expressive and enjoyable.

The English department benefits students in a variety of ways. Many of the skills that are developed in the English classes are applicable to the other areas of study. Students also learn how to apply what they're taught outside of the classroom.

Devonne Robinson (8) said, "the books we read are hard to understand but I think we need to struggle through it and grow instead of always be stuck and always relying on our teacher to explain it to us, and this is also true with life struggles." 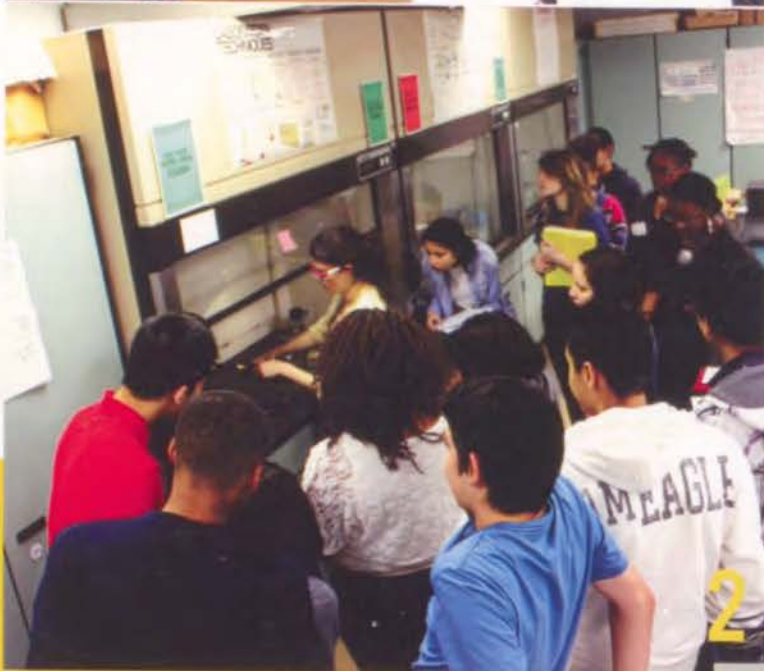




Locomotion During labs

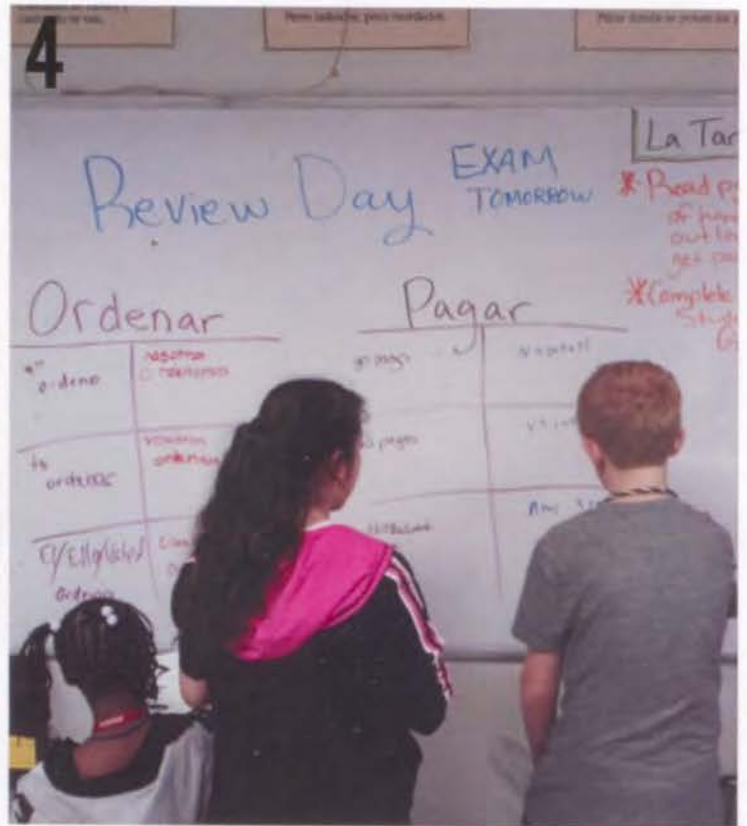

LEARNING HISTORY WHILE MAKING IT

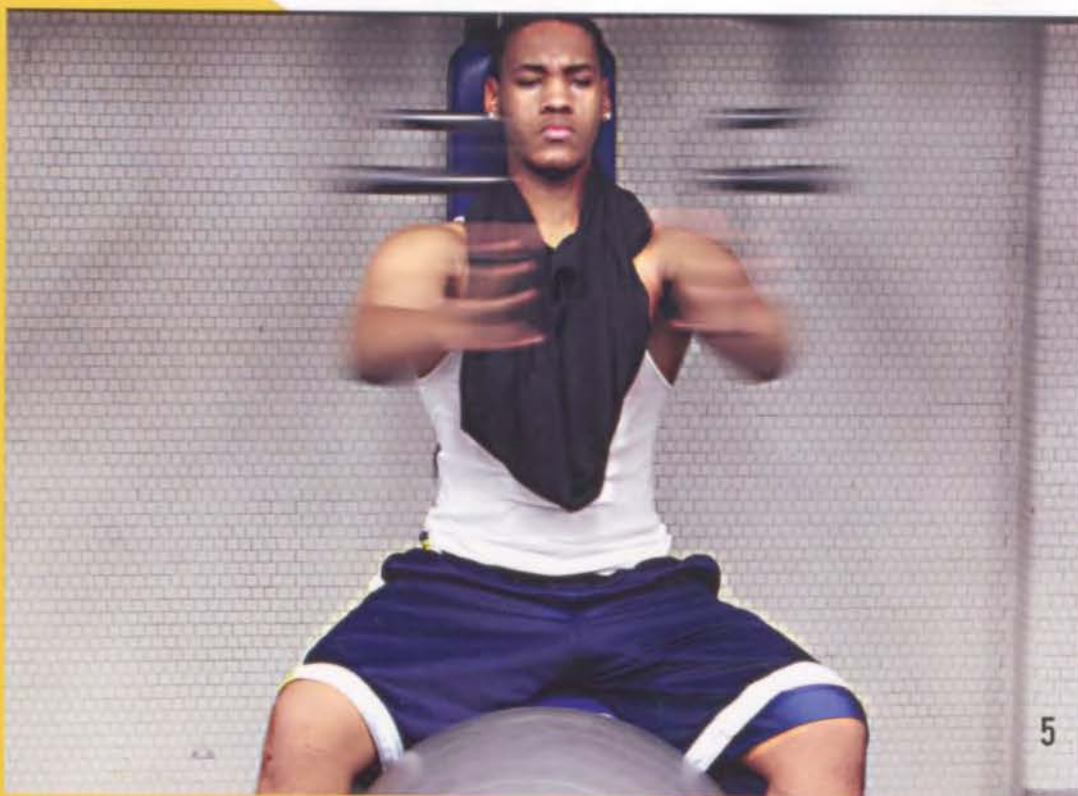

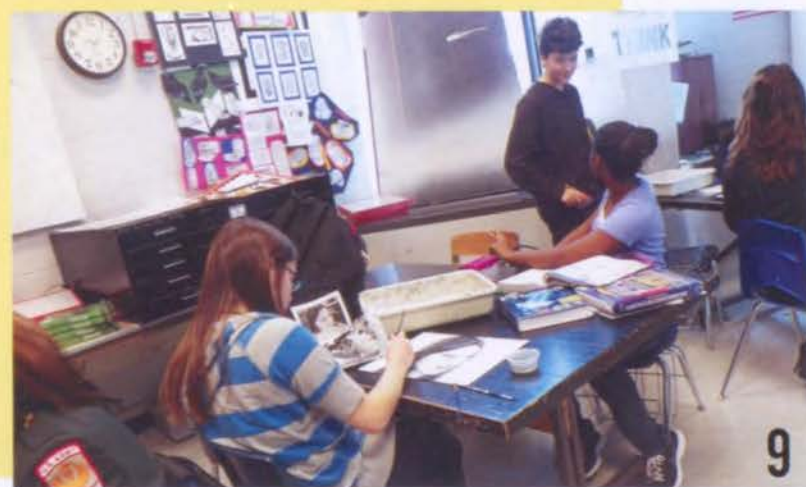
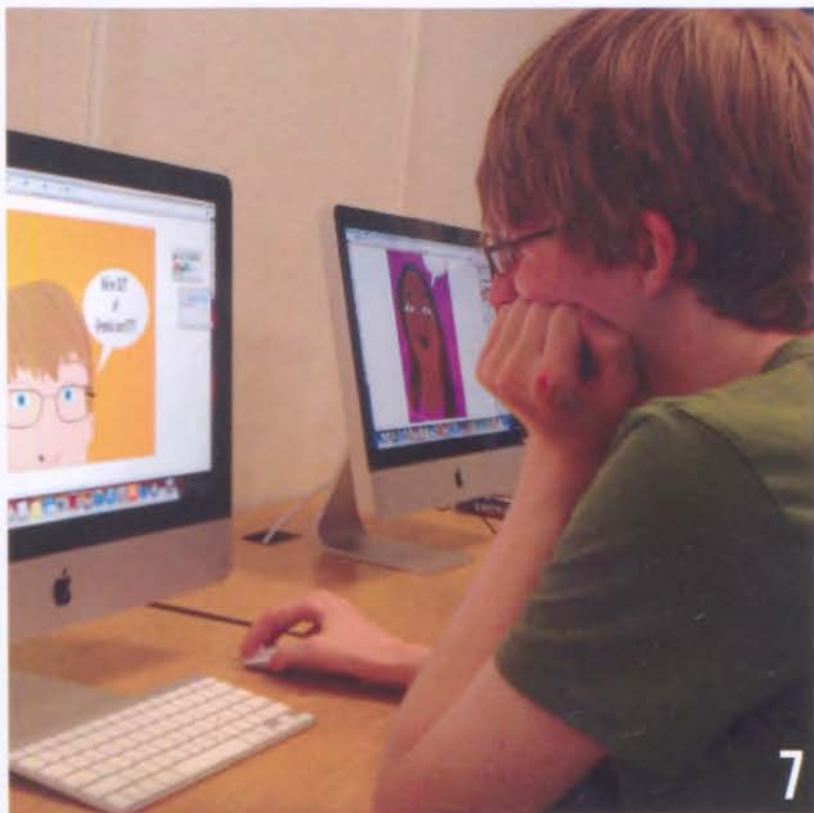
LCPA VISUAL ARTS

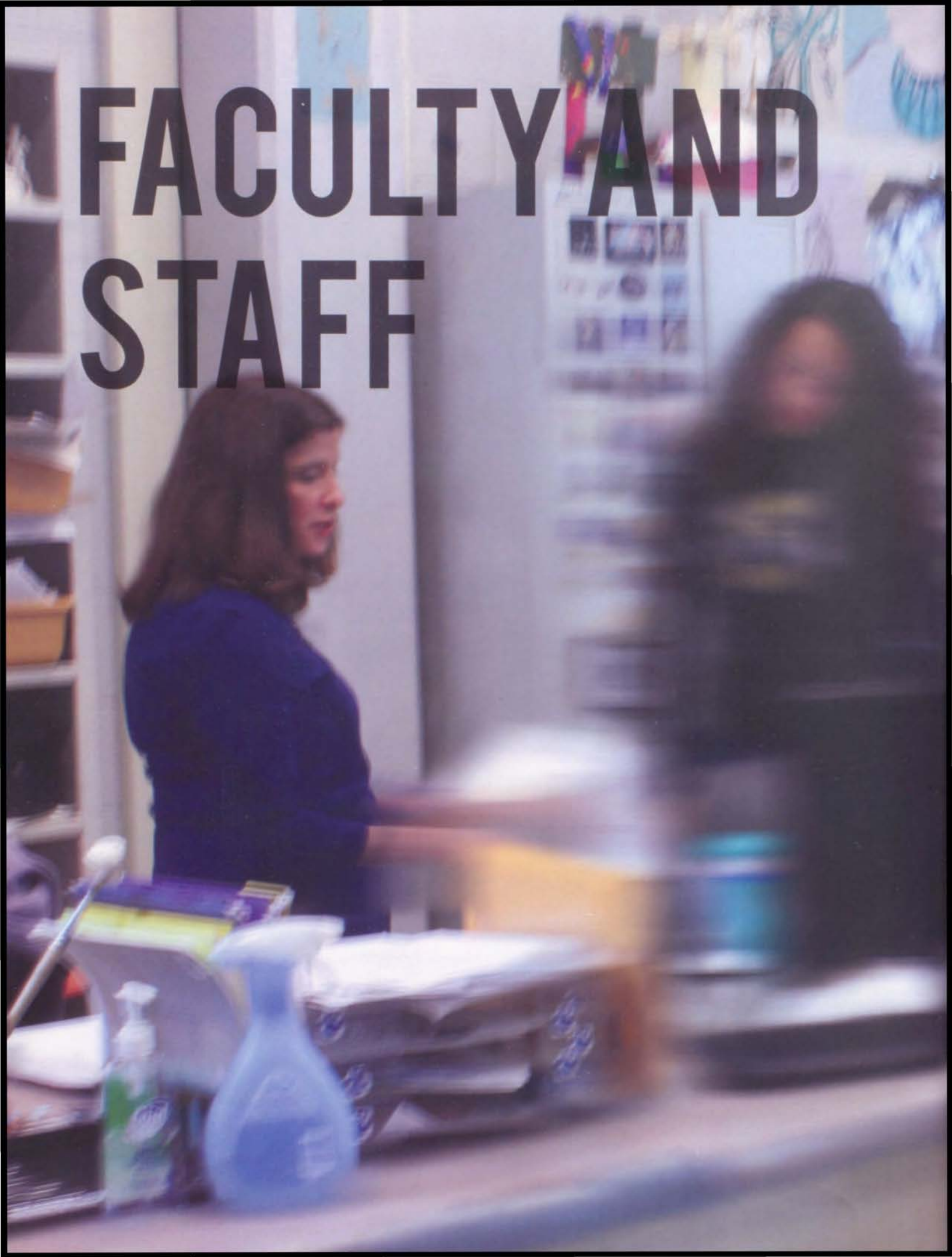

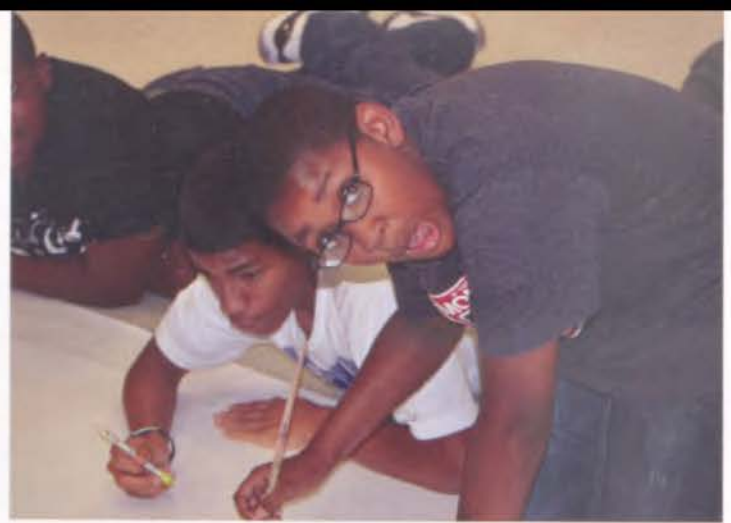

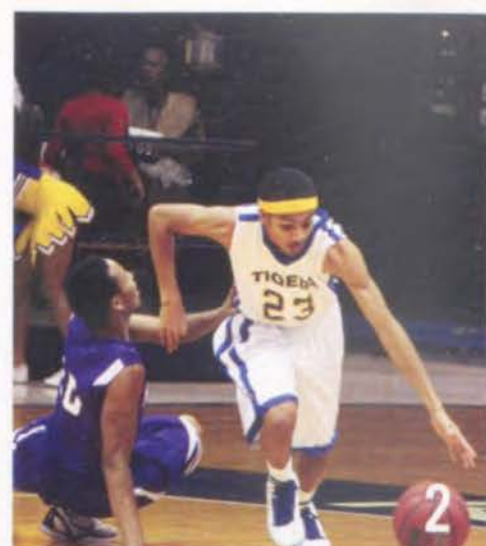

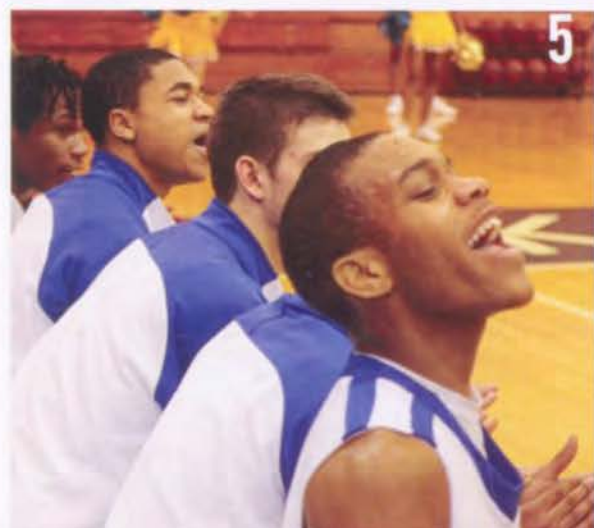

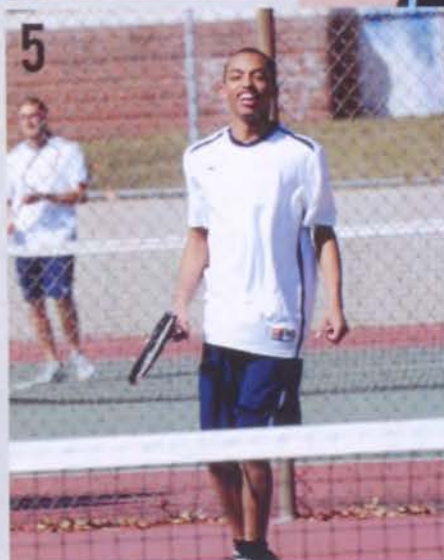
