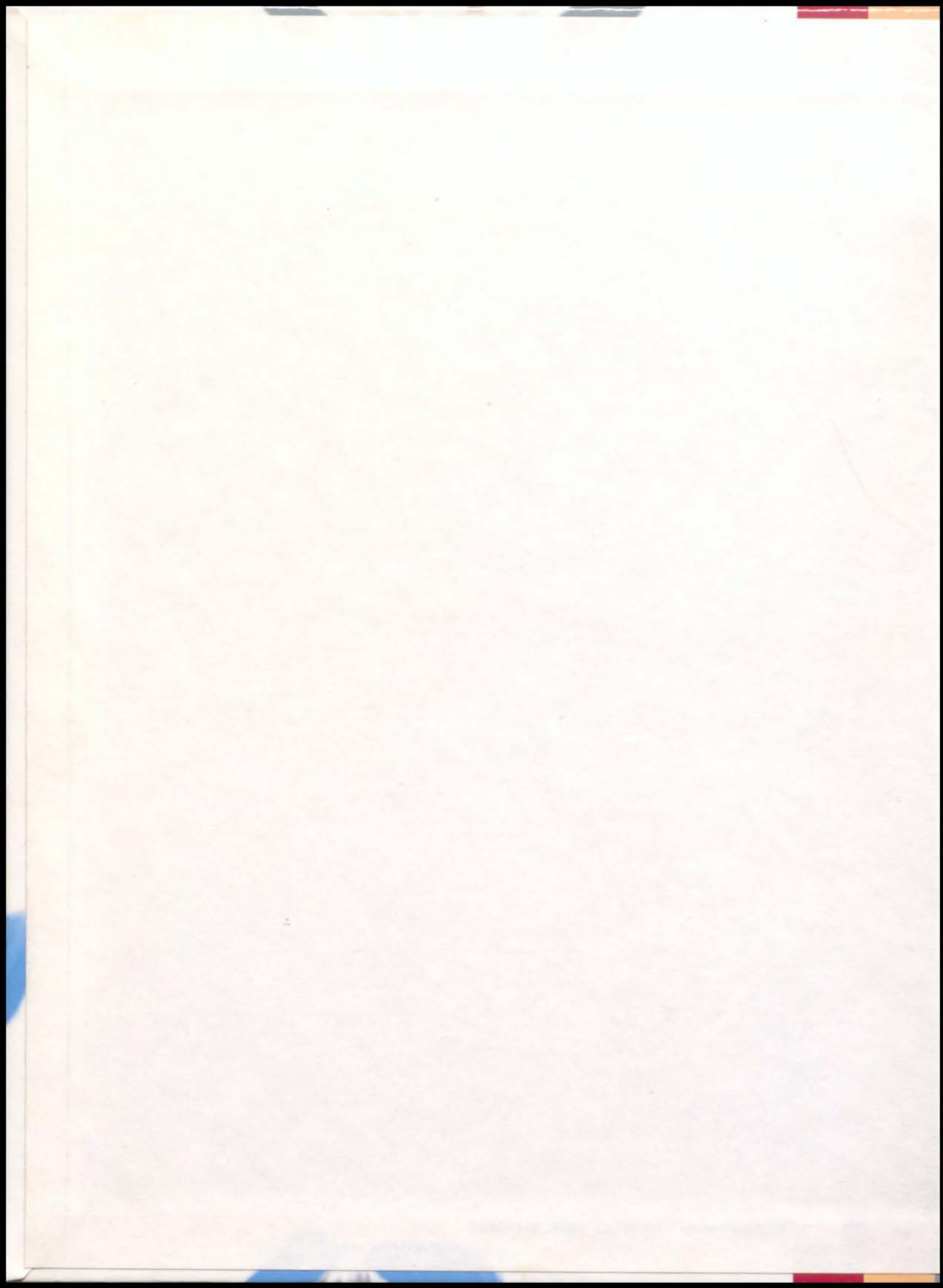
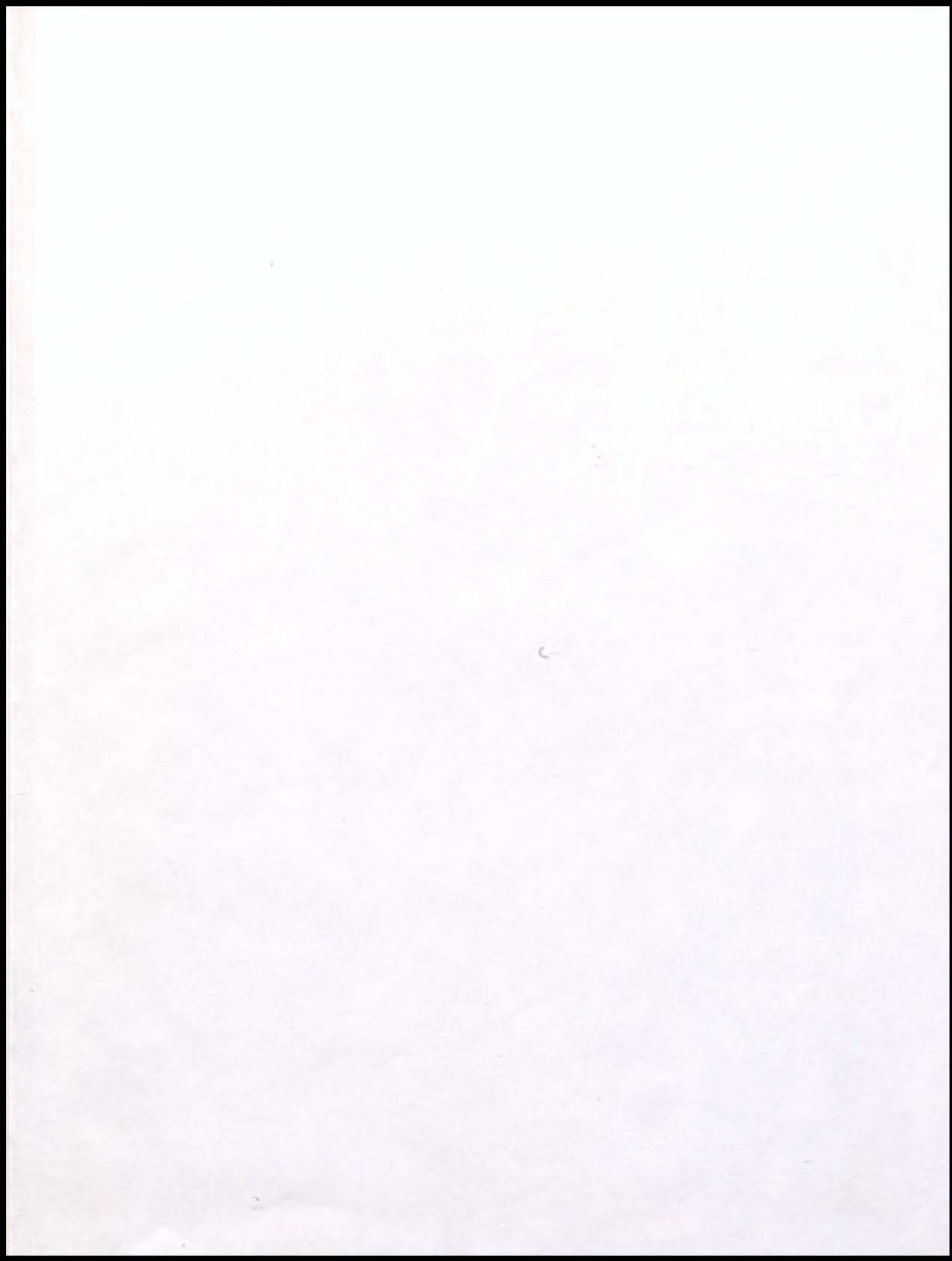


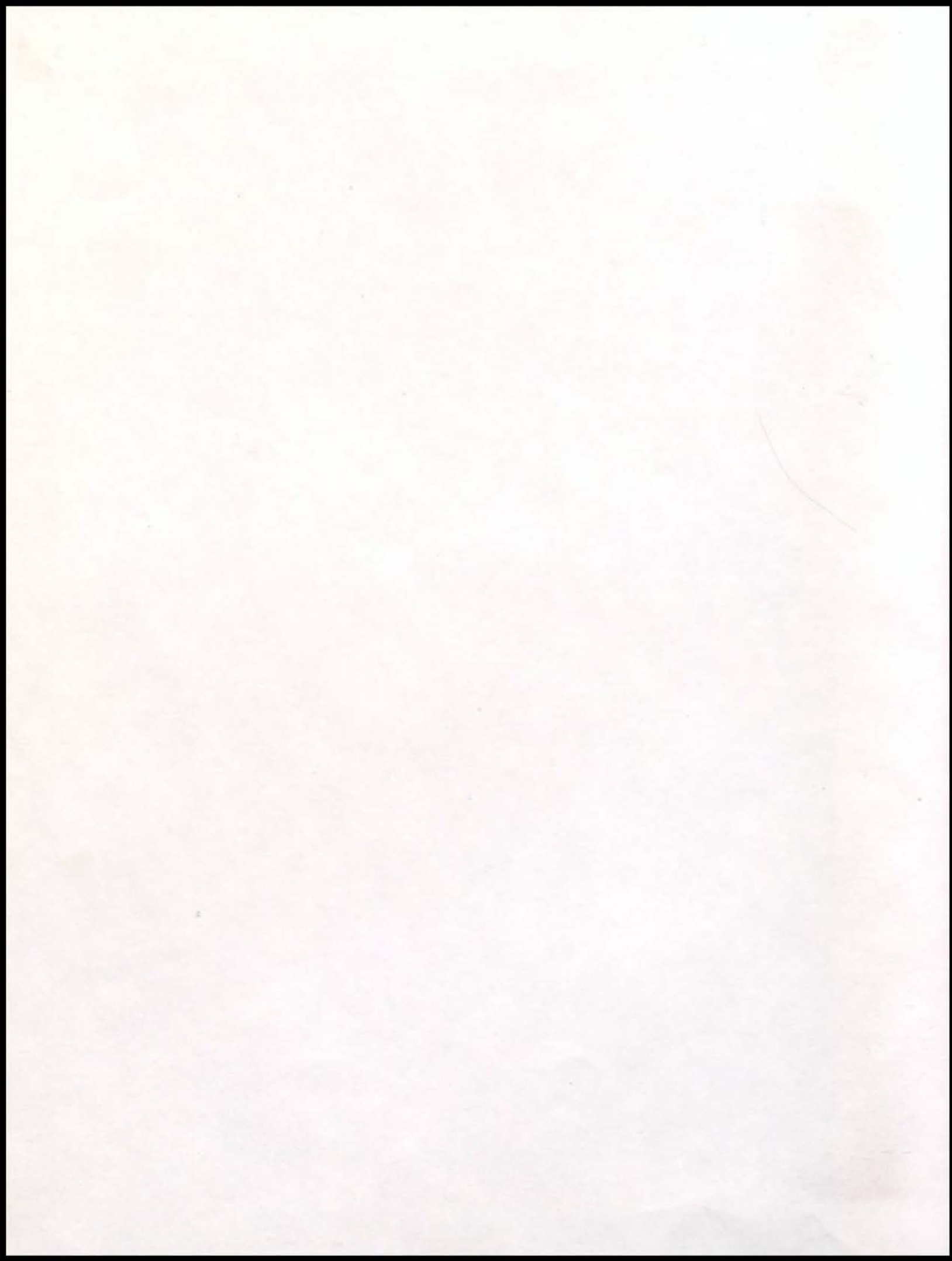

To My Lovely Lincoln Students,



Whether it's reading that book you have a quiz on the next day or perfecting the essay that was started a week ago, the English classes here at Lincoln exemplify why we are a college preparatory school. The course work students take builds on from the moment he or she enters at the middle school level up to when the IB English exam is taken as a senior.

At the middle school level, students begin with reading and analyzing texts such as *Taking Sides* or *The Witch of Blackbird Pond*. With each text students are tasked with doing assignments such as character sketches, plot maps, and theme charts. These activities are designed to further the students' knowledge on the ideas and messages the authors attempt to convey in the text.

At the high school level, the classes go in depth on what was introduced in middle school. For example, at the beginning of the school year one can find a freshman class building on essay writing skills while sophomores can expect to build upon poetry. Juniors begin the first part of the two-year IB English course with the second part completed as a senior. Juniors use techniques learned in the past for several finals prompted by IB: individual oral presentation, group interactive oral, and world literature paper. Seniors perfect their paper while going through the rigors of Mrs. Nguyen's class in preparation of the IB English exam with hopes of receiving college credit with an outstanding score. - Dimitric Edwards.

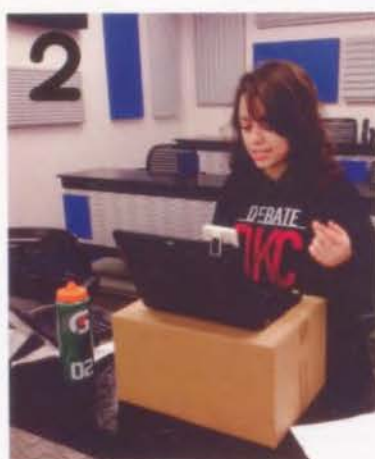

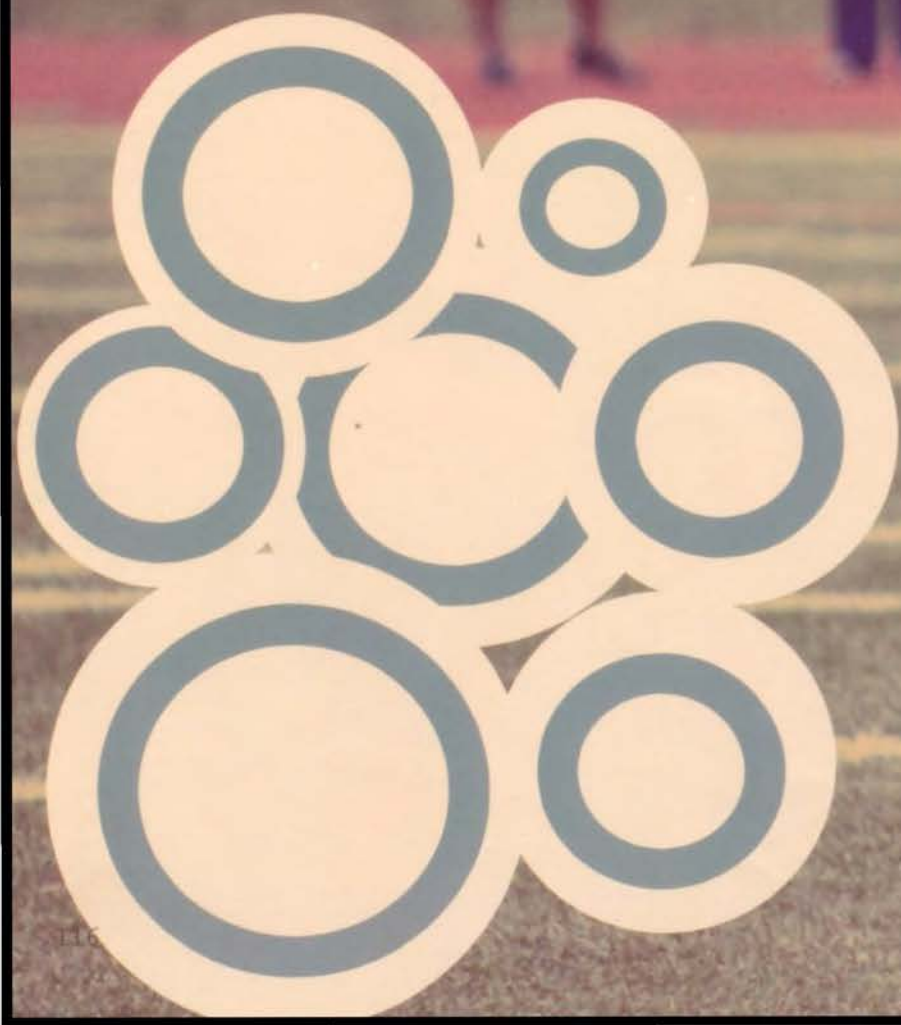

After complaints of an unsafe playing environment, the Kansas City Public Schools renovated the IL Stadium in the summer of 2013. "We have been hopeful to improve this field for many years. Thanks to the NFL, the NFLPA, and most especially the Kansas City Chiefs, we are not only creating a place for young people to compete in football and other sports, we are also helping create community and making our neighborhoods better and stronger," said Stephen Samuels, Greater Kansas City USC's executive director.

This stadium, formally known as the Bryan Field, at Interscholastic League Stadium, opened on October 18, 2013, supplying fans with grandstands that seat up to 1,600 fans, a smooth artificial turf playing field, a running track, concession stands, locker rooms, press box, sound system, and scoreboards for the players. This project took about eight months to complete, costing more than 5 million dollars. The funding came from the district's capital improvement fund as well as a \$200,000 donation from the Kansas City Chiefs.

"Playing at the new IL Stadium gave the players a lot of pride and I think made them play harder," said Coach Newell. The LCPA Blue Tigers ended their season victoriously with a victory over their competitor, Central, with a score of 57-20, and taking the IL title. The Varsity football team also received a Chiefs football from the team in honor of them earning "Team of the Week" for Metro Sports. "Their success did not come easy," says football captain Justin Dixon (12) "Practice was intense Coach (Henry Newell) was not playing around." Their hard work and dedication paid off in the end though, as they were also announced Team of the Week from The Negro Leagues and ended their season undefeated.

Coach Henry Newell was also recognized by the Kansas City Chiefs as "Coach of the Week" for his work in prepping these players. When asked how he felt being the new coach, he responded "It was an easy transition since I knew the players already. The players bought in last summer to what we were trying to build." The JV Football team also benefited from his coaching, winning all their games and also concluding the season undefeated.

Track and Field

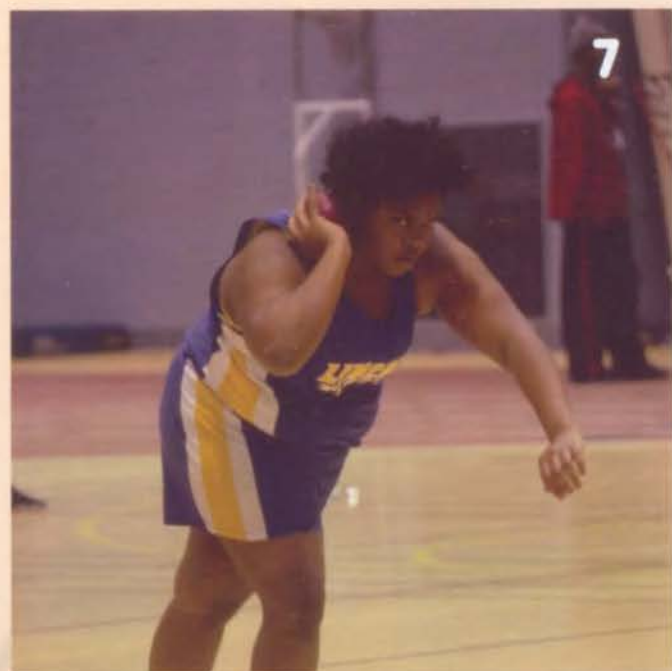

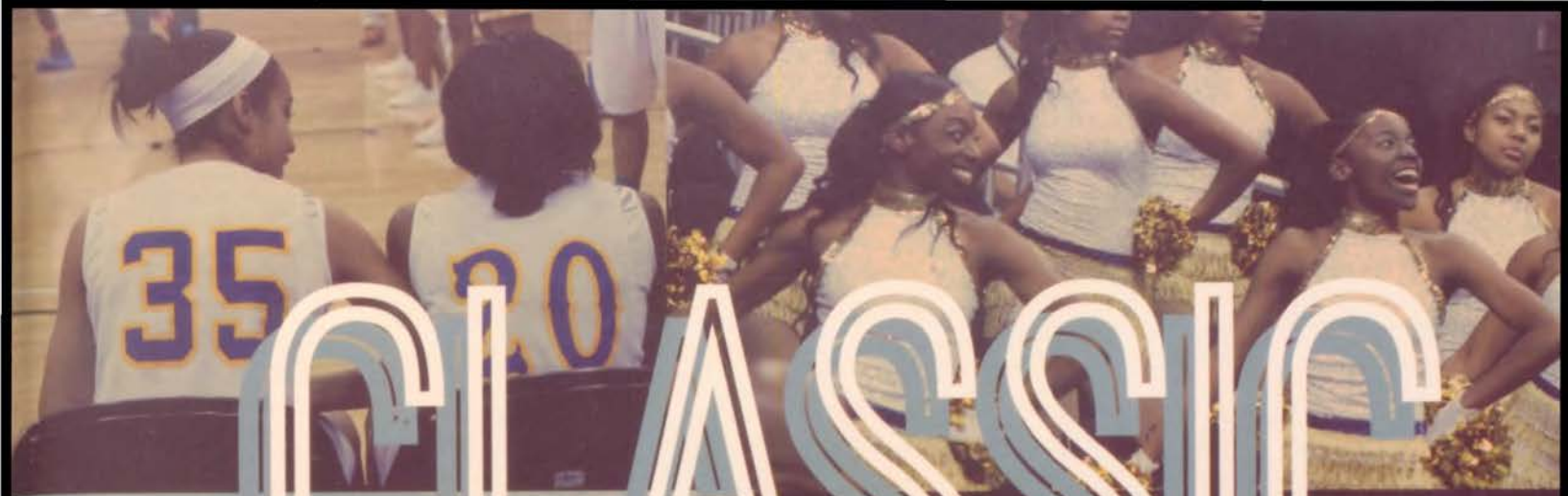

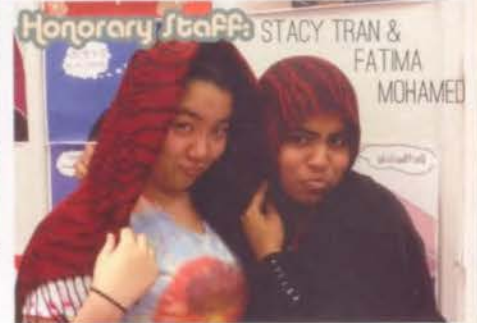
