


FORENSICS 1983






FATHER/DAUGHTER MOTHER/SON BANQUET & DANCE

In June, he will return to his home, Montevideo, a city in the southern-most part of Uruguay. Although he has already graduated from high school, he took a full schedule of classes at Loretto which included Computers, Geometry, Art, Politics, Philosophy, and U.S. History.

He had 3 years of basic English in High school but really learned to speak it well here. His high school, a 6-year program, required a uniform, no beard, and short hair. It was harder than Loretto and he had to pass a very tough exam to graduate. "At Loretto," he said, "the teachers care too much for you."

Rauls mother is a nurse, his father is a lawyer, his sister, who is 25, is a medical student, and his 17-year old brother is attending school in Texas with the Youth For Understanding organization. He will be returning to Uruguay at about the same time as Raul. His family apartment at home is one block from a beach on the Rio de la Plata, and he loves to go there when he is not busy. It is hard to say 'Hello, I'll be here for a year," and after that is over, it is hard to leave. It will be practically impossible to be able to see everyone again. It is hard to say goodbye to everything."











