They work on a job in an occupation of their choice, they may confer with the school coordinator about their problems, they may obtain a full-time job with their present employer when they graduate and they earn some money for current school expenses.

Salesgirls, officeworkers, grocery clerks, food service, telephone operators, nurses aides, and photographer's assistant are some of the work experiences represented. The reports from employers have been very satisfactory this year.
