MRS. DOROTHY C. NOFFTZ, who helps our cafeteria customers realize their obligations. "Honesty is the best policy."

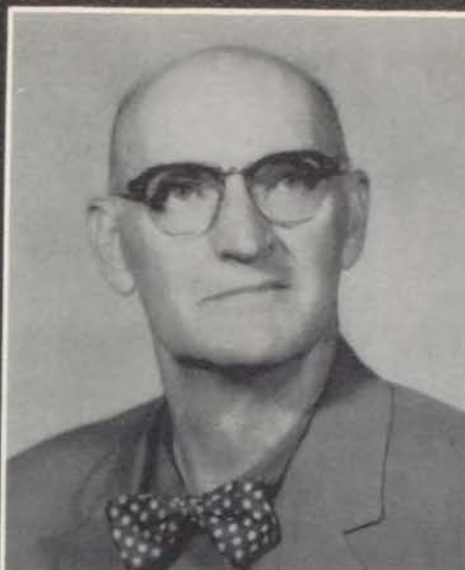

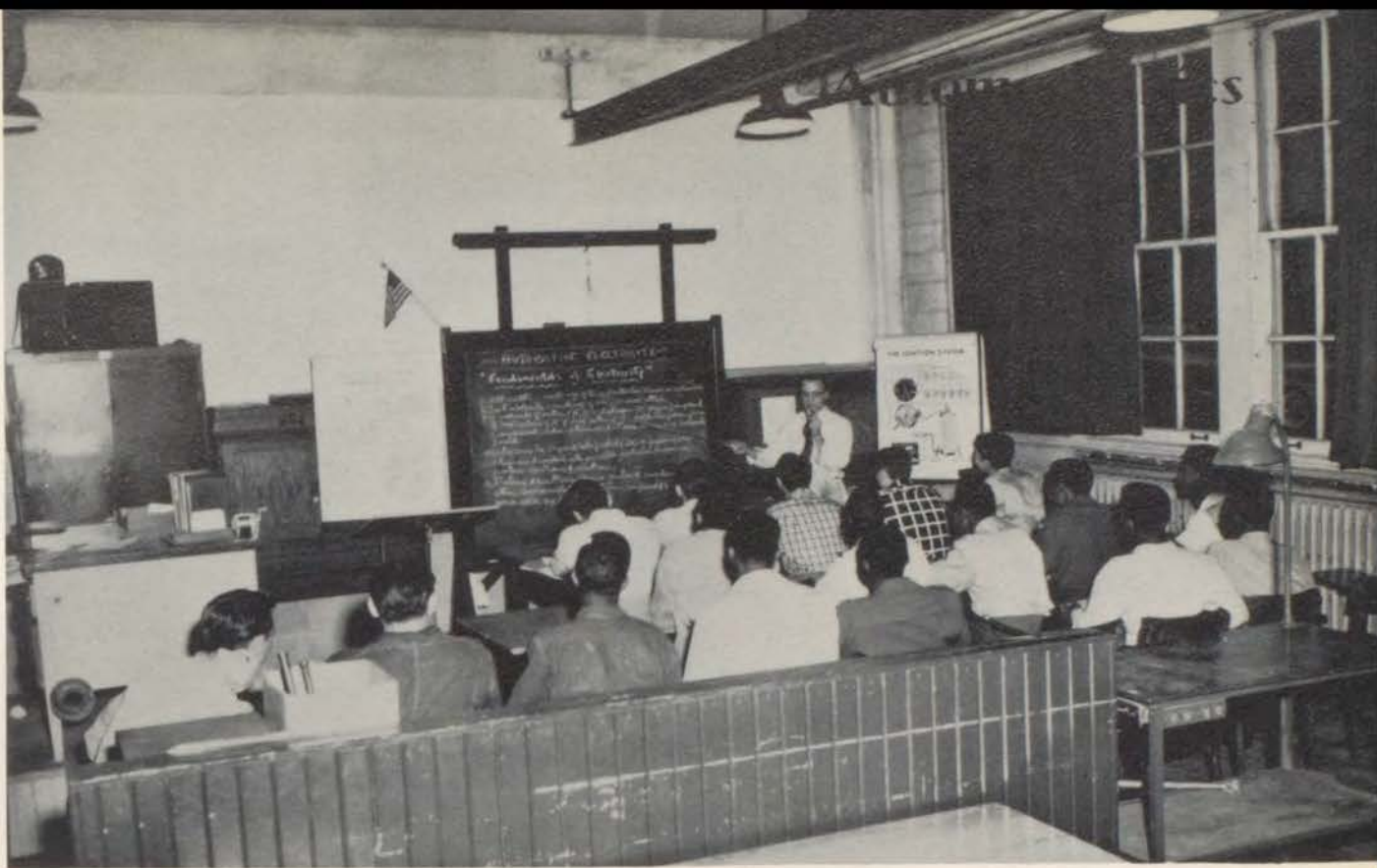

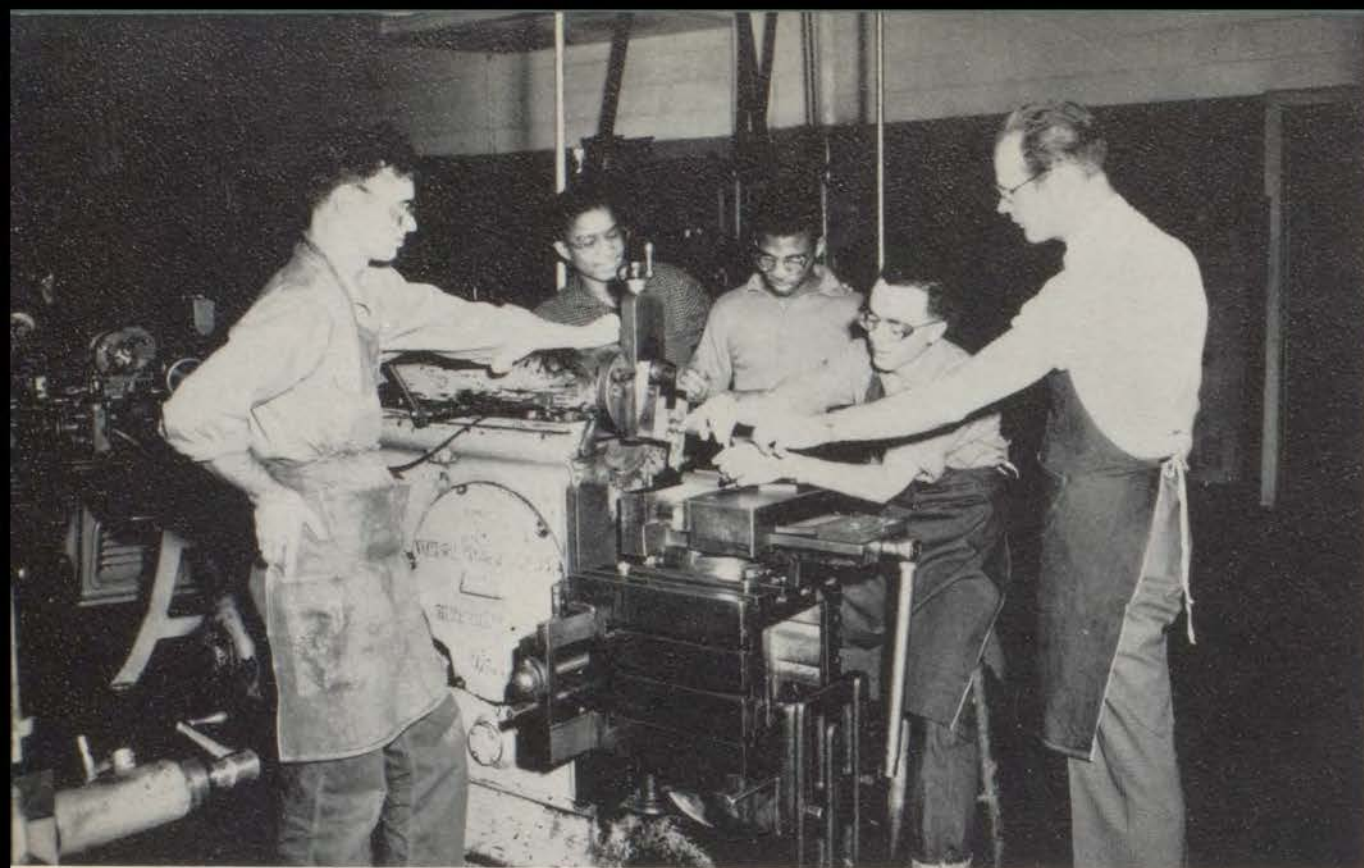

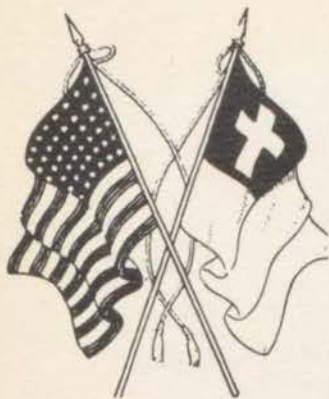
