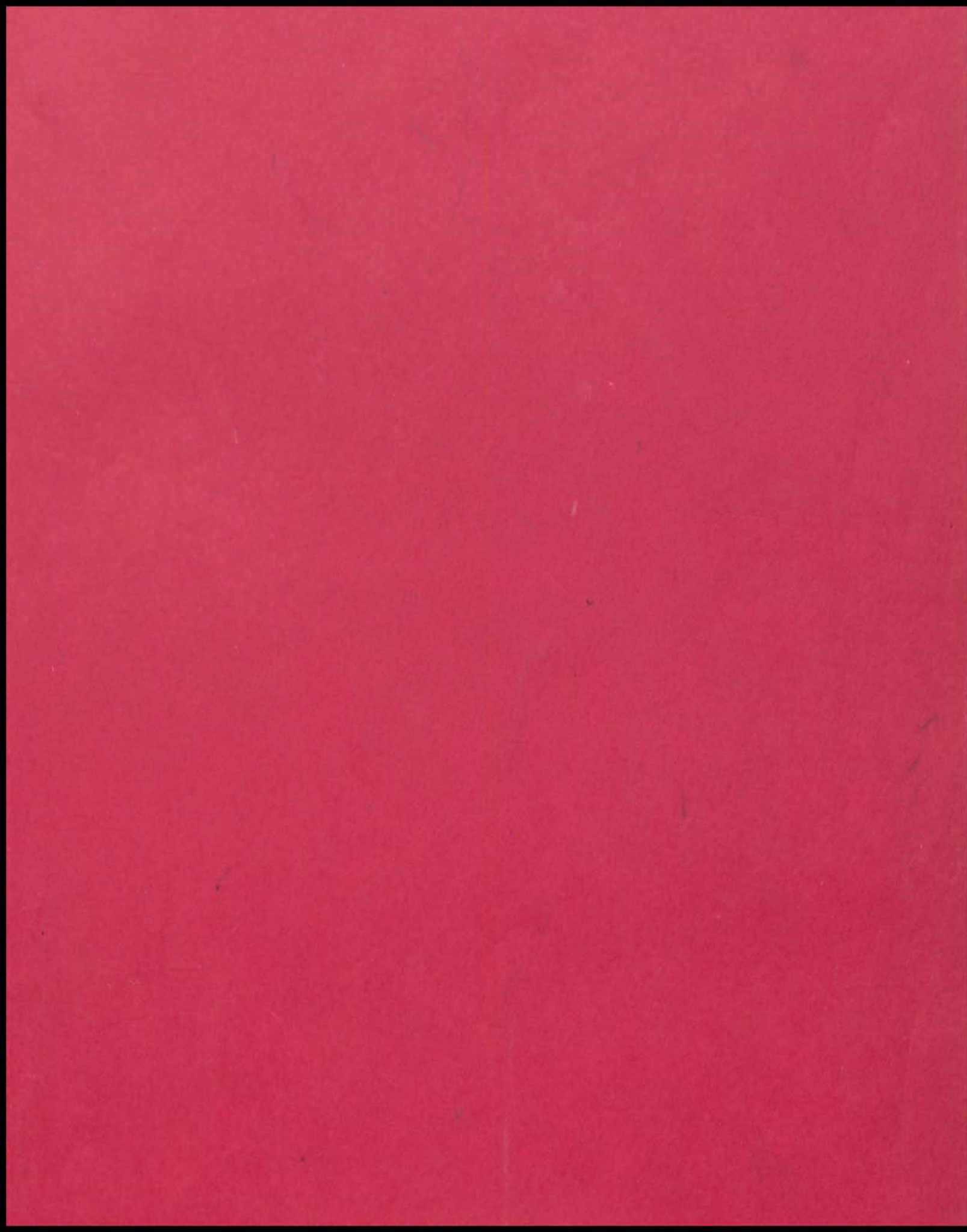

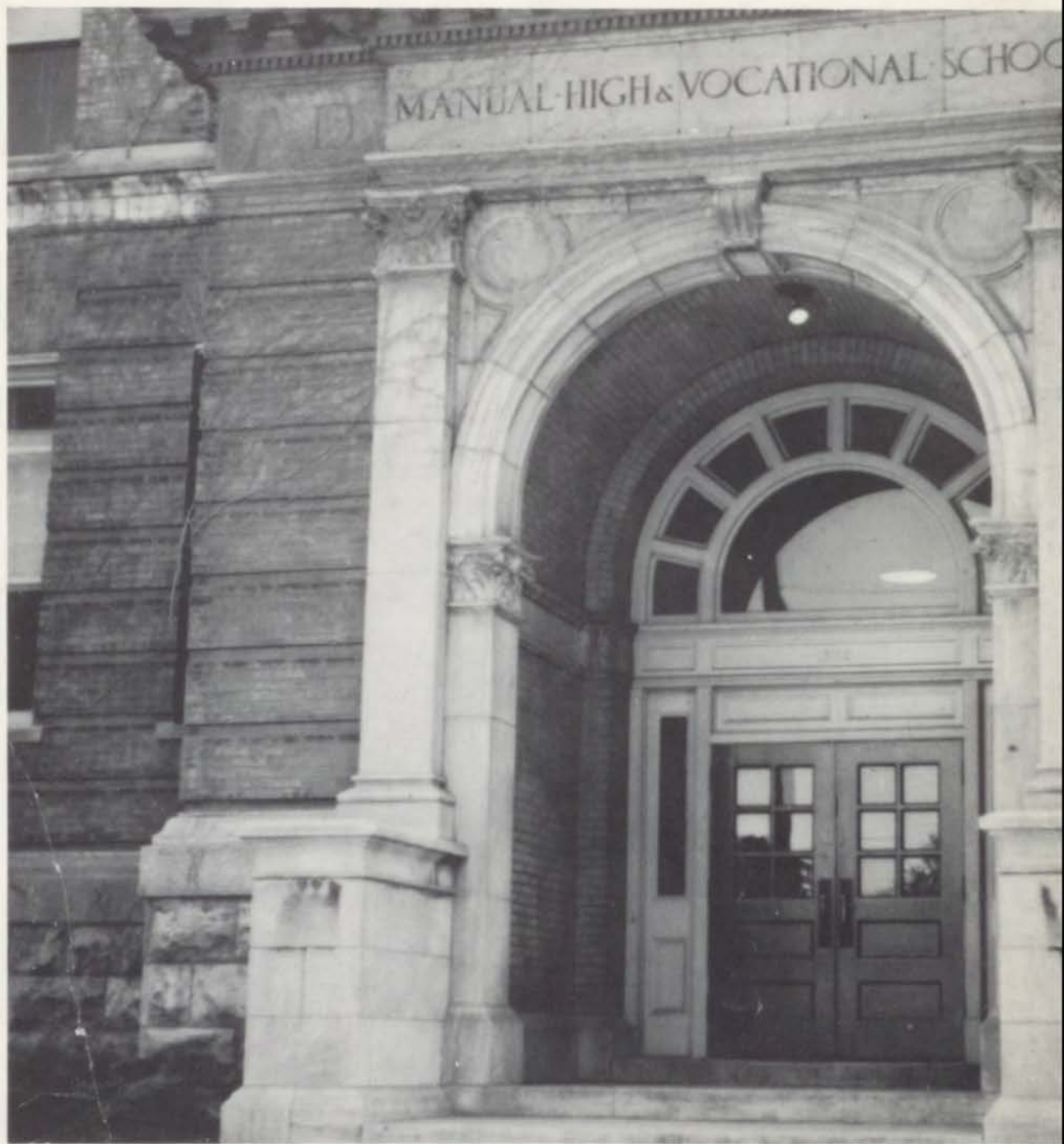

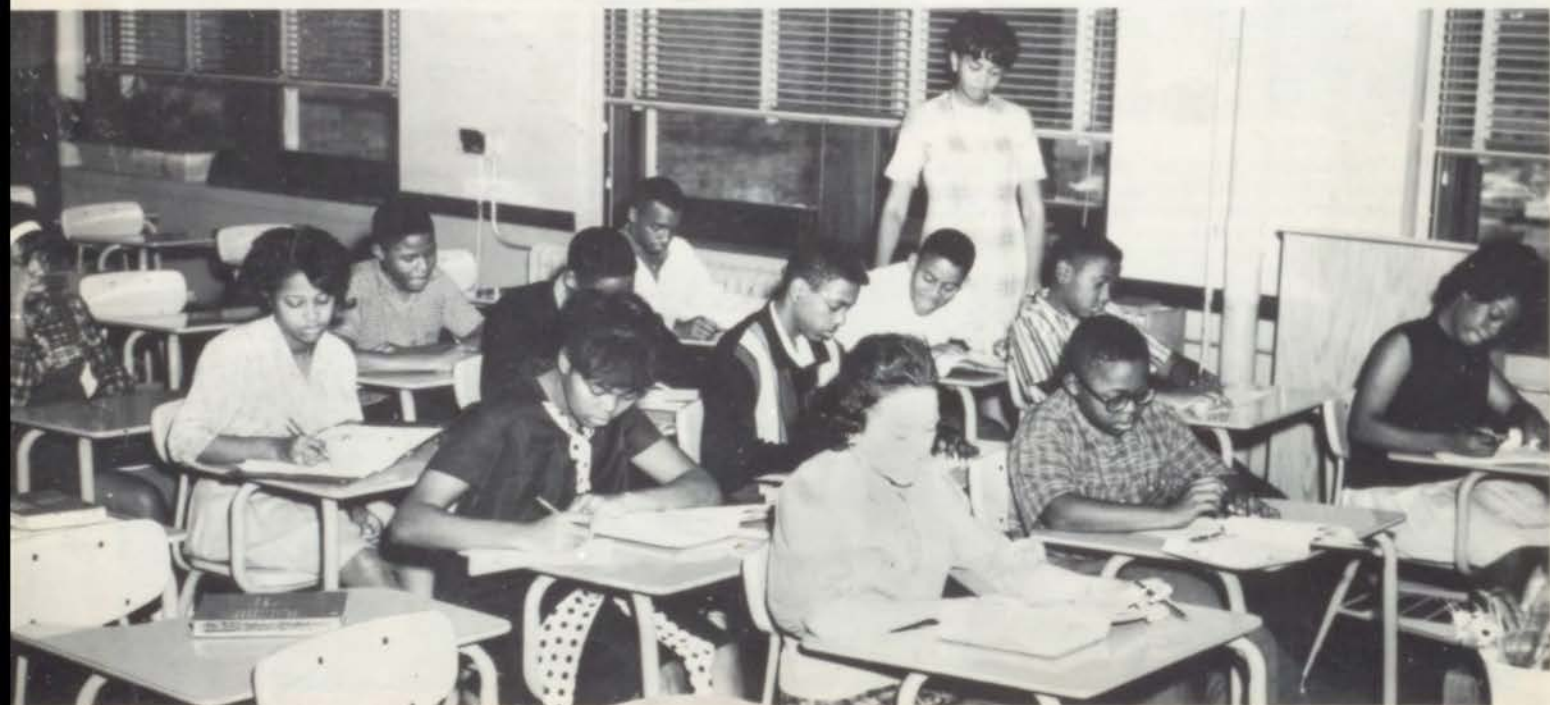

B.S.C.S. Classes in Biology.

The Biological Science Curriculum Study approach to biology is new at Manual.

The courses are designed to stress the importance of inquiry and investigation.

Students are encouraged to ask questions and think for themselves. These courses are being taught as pilot studies in five high schools

in the Kansas City School System. There are three approaches to biology in this area: Green Version or ecological, Yellow Version or molecular, and Blue Version or chemical.

We are using the Green Version at Manual, chiefly because it involves an appreciation of natural surroundings.



One of the most interesting investigations so far was the interrelationships of producer and consumer.

Each group of students prepared four tubes for study. The organisms used were snails which are consumers and elodea, a plant, which is a producer. Clara Black, from the second hour class is examining the organisms with hand lens while Carol Greene watches. George Smith, Ellen Harrell, and Roderick Ford are discussing some point of interest from the text.

The third hour class is doing a study of population growth using yeast. Part of the work includes the use of graphs, so Mr. A. O. Johnson of the mathematics department spent two days teaching semi logarithmic graphs. Doilnella White is rolling cotton plugs while Irving Harris examines a slide. Robert Bates and Cornelius Johnson are filling test tubes with media and Debra Hurt reads the directions.



Washing and sterilizing equipment is a very important part of this course, so everyone takes turns. Here in the fifth hour Jeanette Simmons, and Mark Roberts are preparing test tubes to be placed in the autoclave basket which is held by George Reece, Clifford Ann Collins and Richard Harris "pretend" to wash test tubes.



Students from the sixth hour class are beginning a special investigation on the growth of tomato and radish plants. These investigations carry extra grade points and are done during the student's free time. Rosalie Mills, Margaret Herron, Theodore Amrine, Glorine Cobb, and Donald Tindall are preparing soil in wood flats before planting the seed.

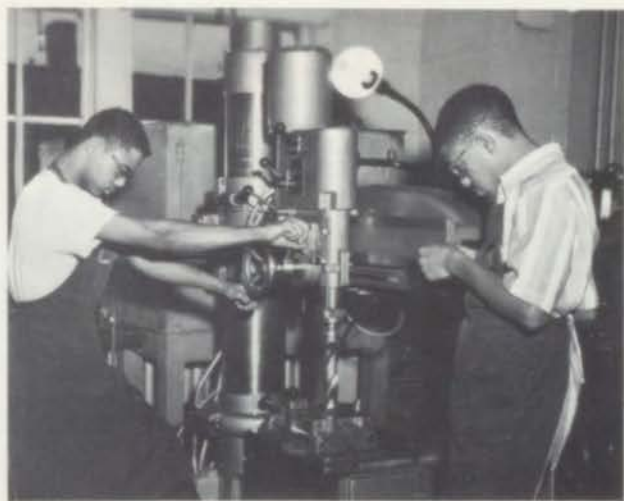
