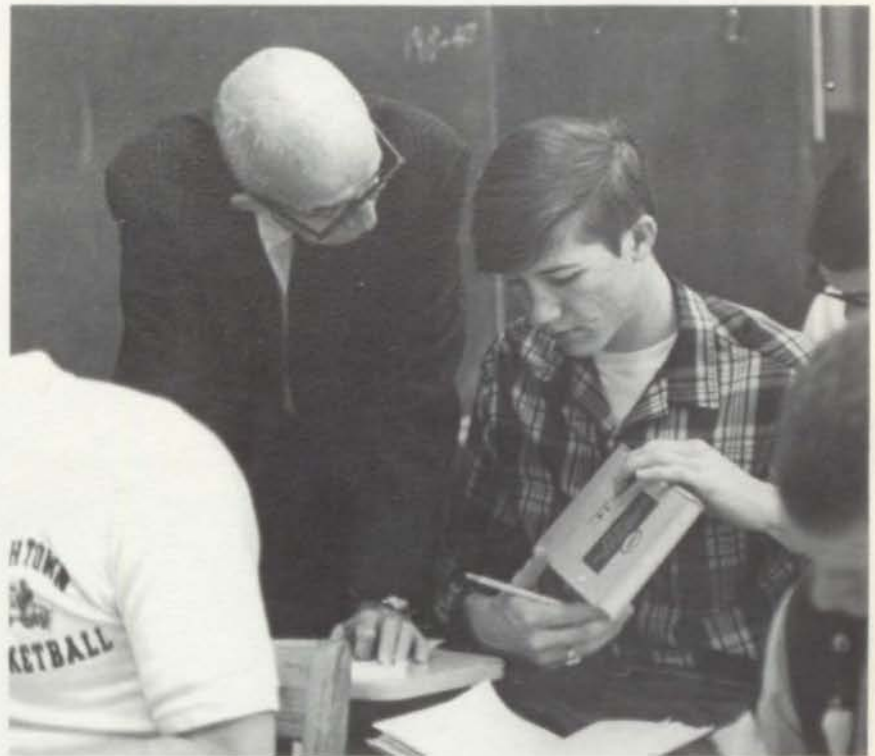
CURRICULUM

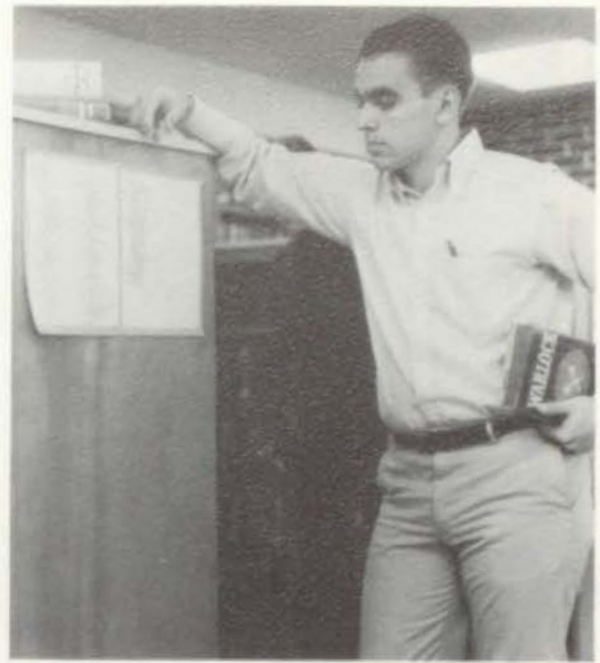
LANGUAGES

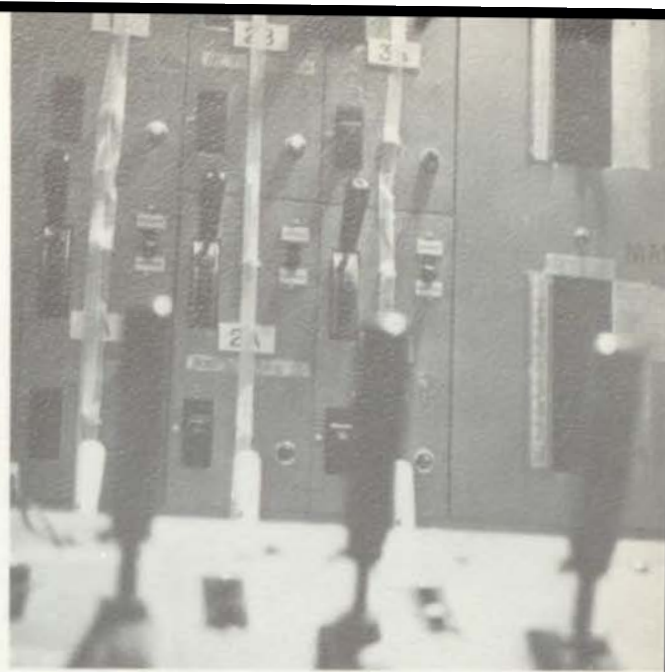

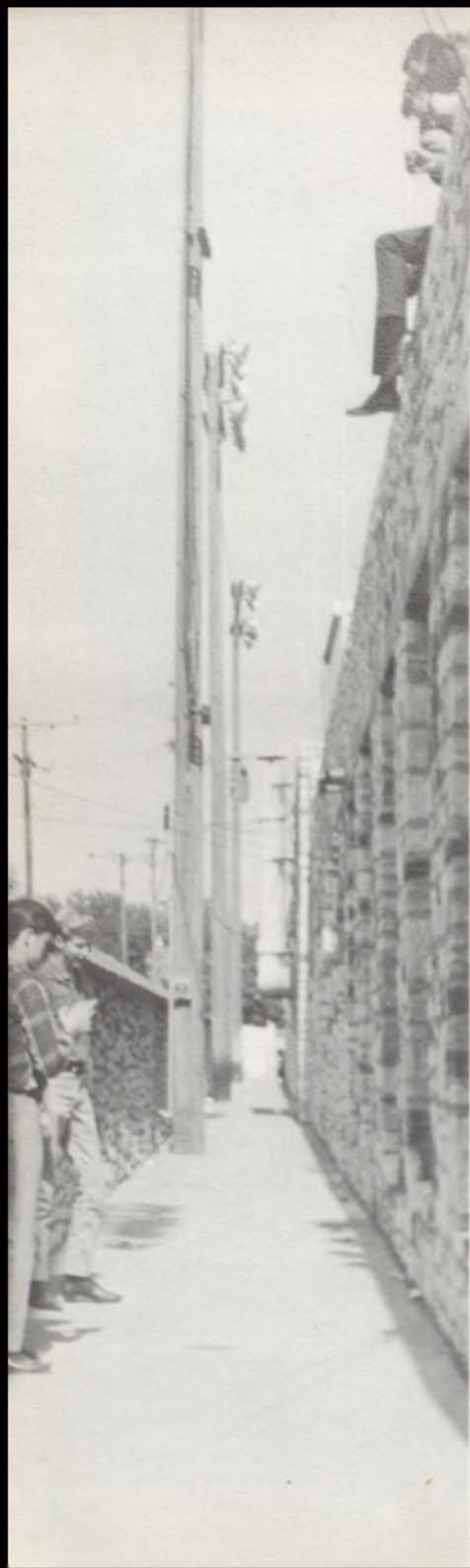

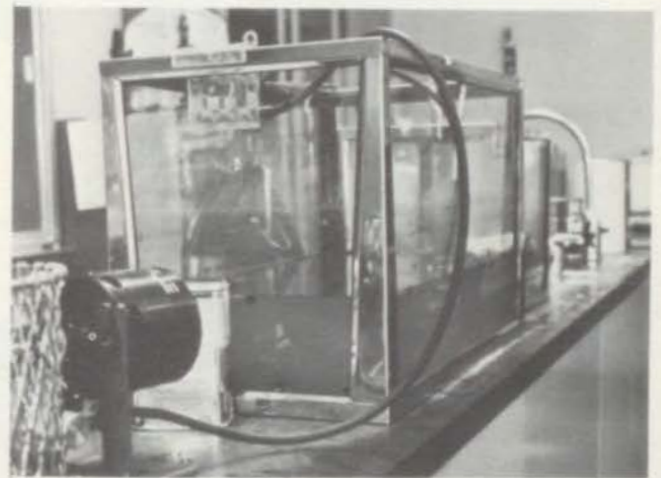

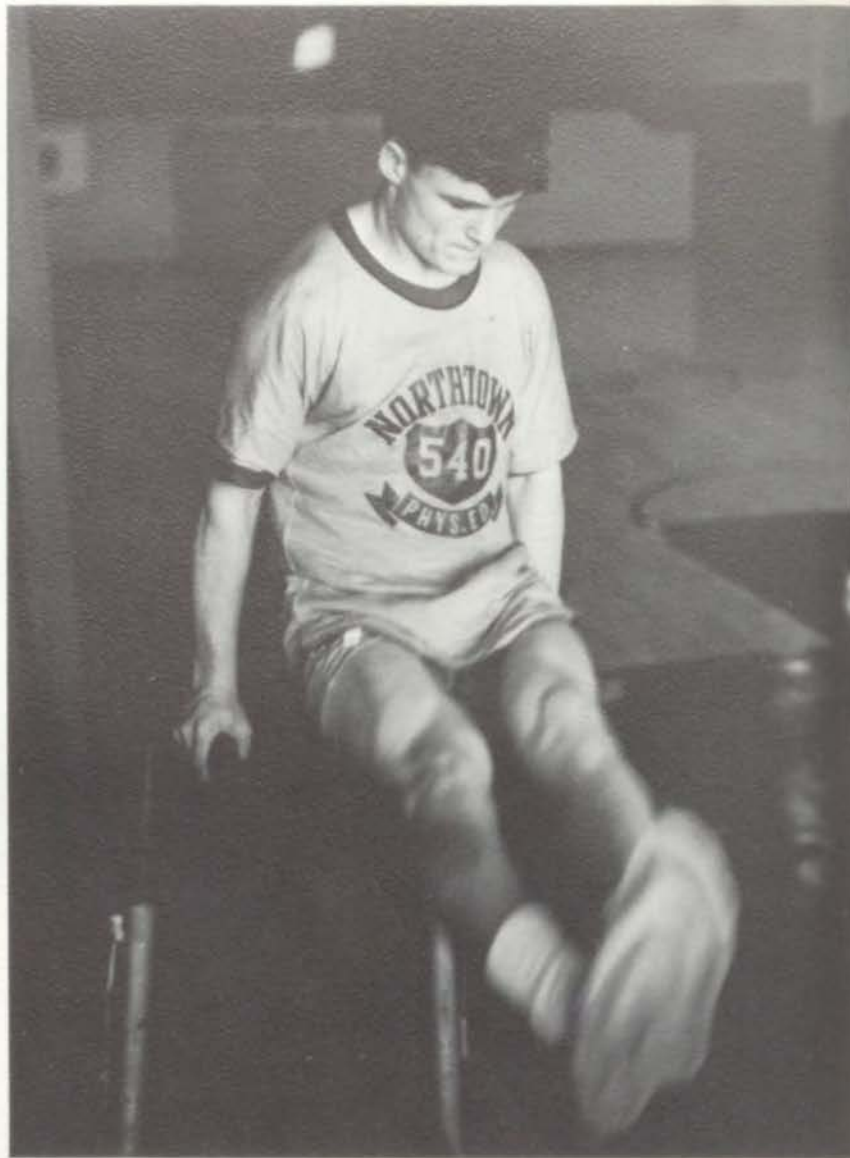

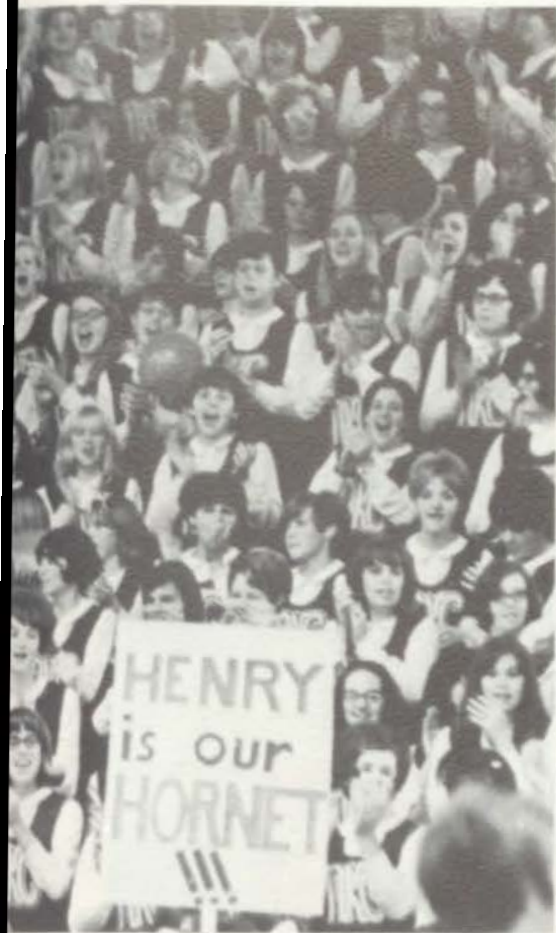

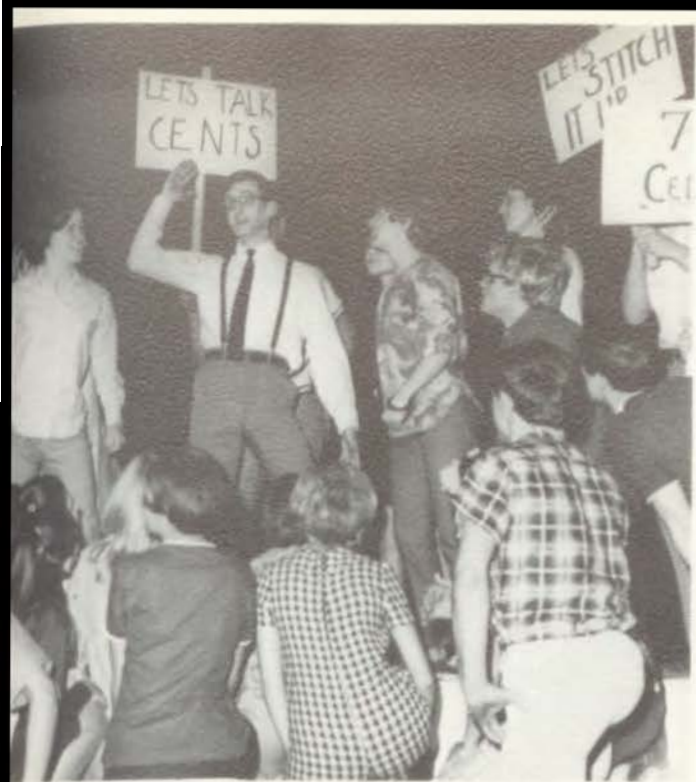

The following game proved frustrating to the Hornet team as the Ruskin Eagles defeated NKC 37-35 with a tip in at the final buzzer. The fight to the finish showed both teams hitting 35%. Hornet scoring punch was led by Tom Stout and Dick Young. It was another of the many close games in which Center defeated NKC. In two overtimes, the Yellowjackets managed to defeat the Hornet cagers 74-73. The William Chrisman Bears ran away with the game at their home court. The encounter started out very good, both offensively and defensively, but the Bears gradually racked up enough baskets to win a 64-53 victory.
