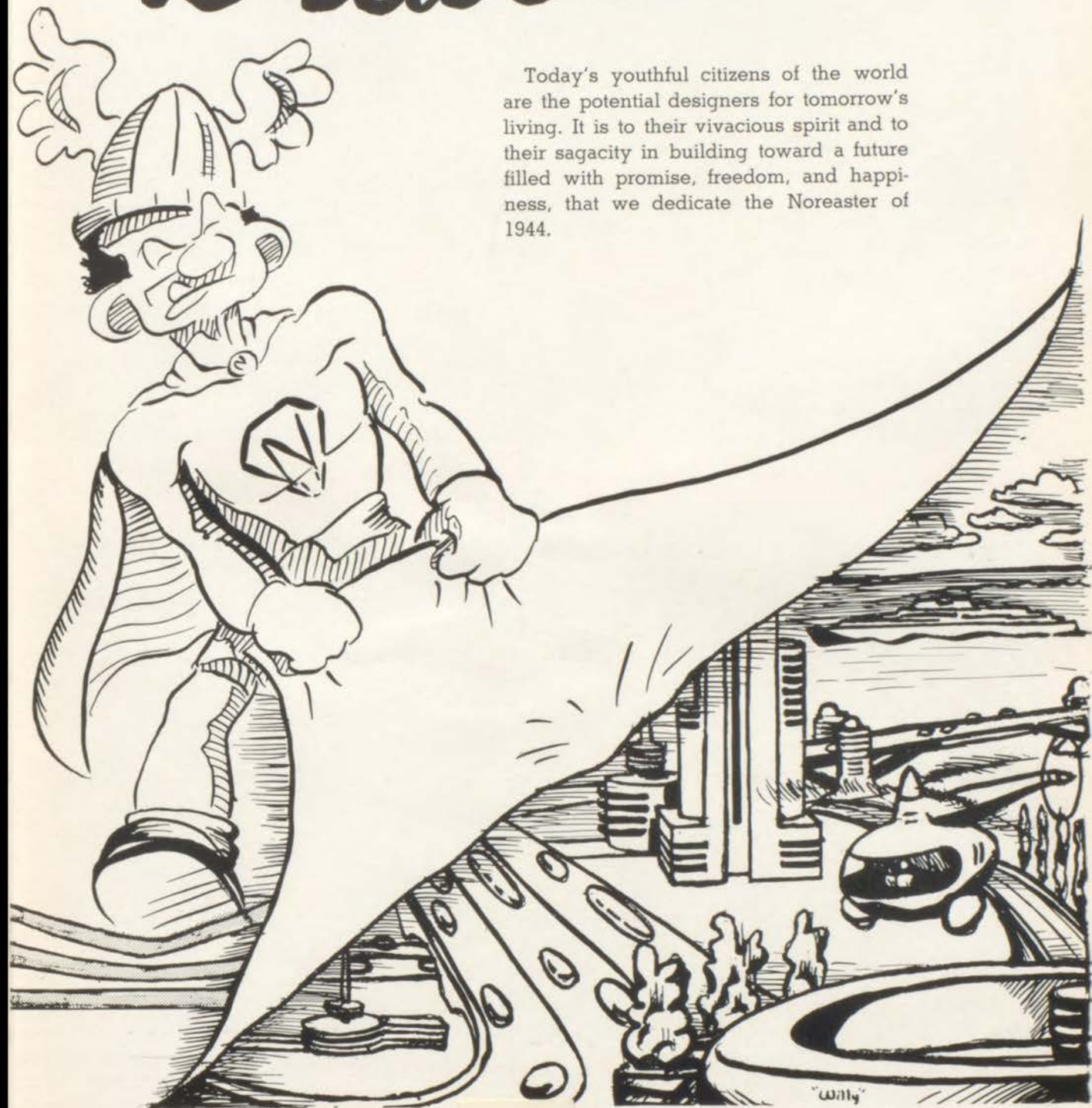
The gang plank is down and you are about to set sail via the 1944 Noreaster's Viking Voyage for all ports covered by the school year of 1943-1944.

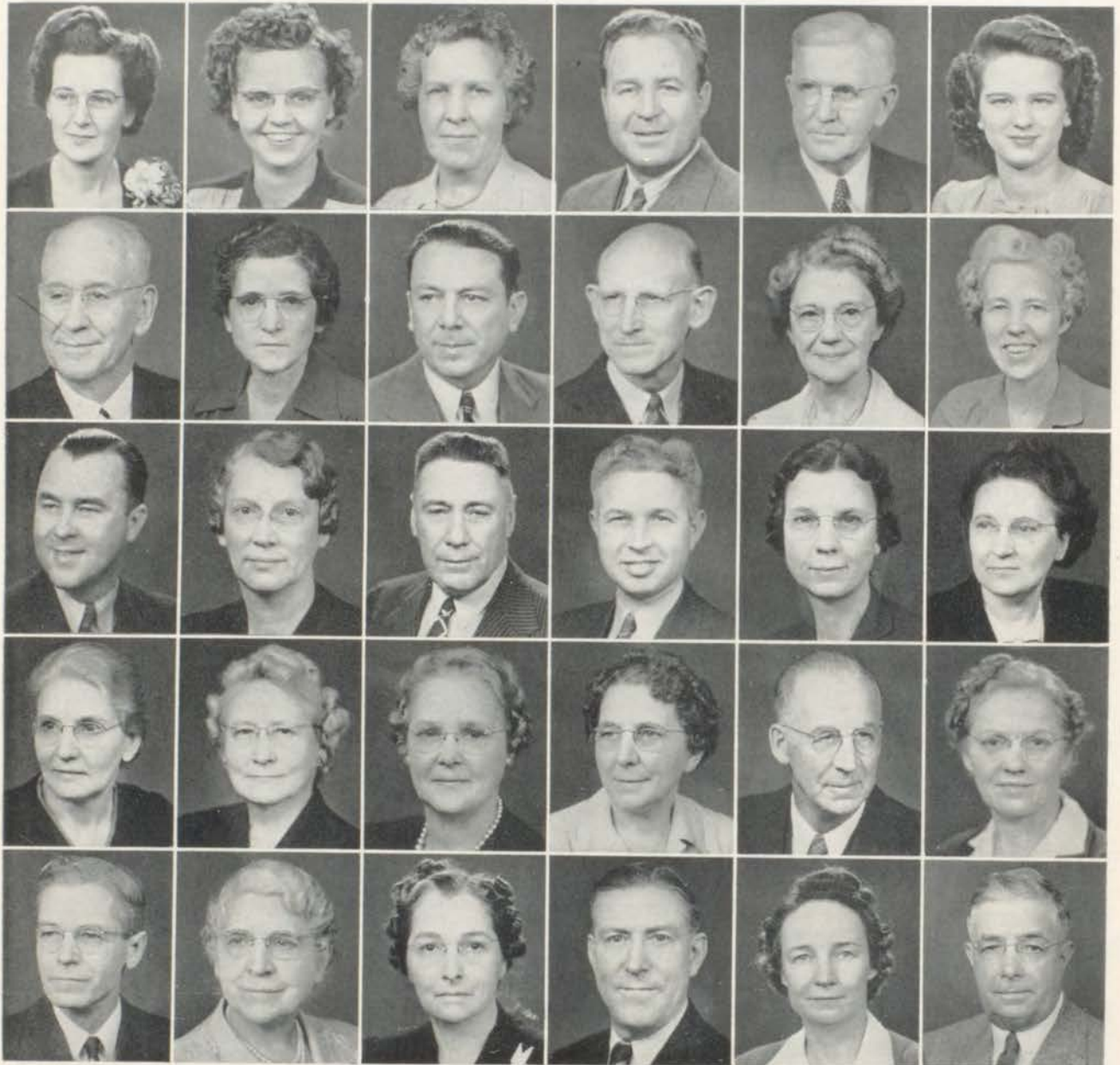

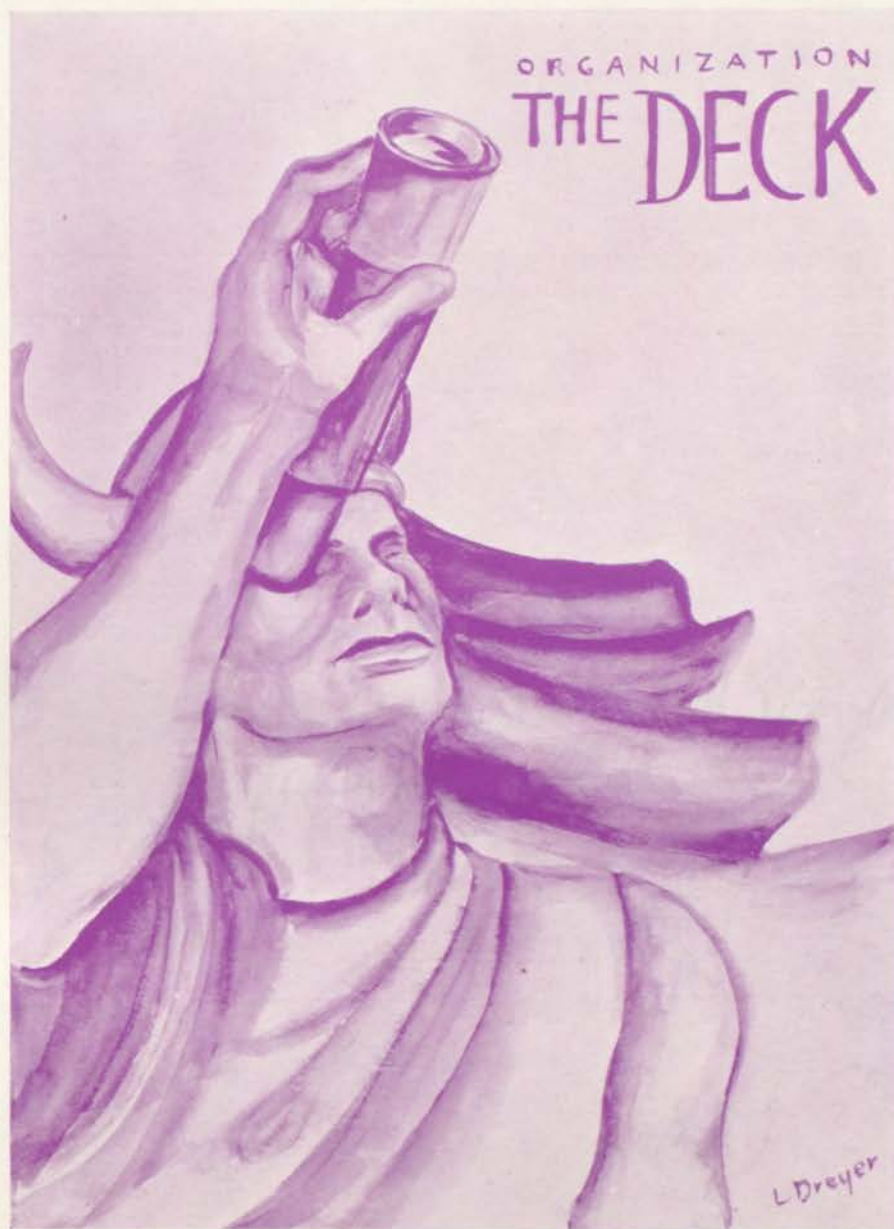

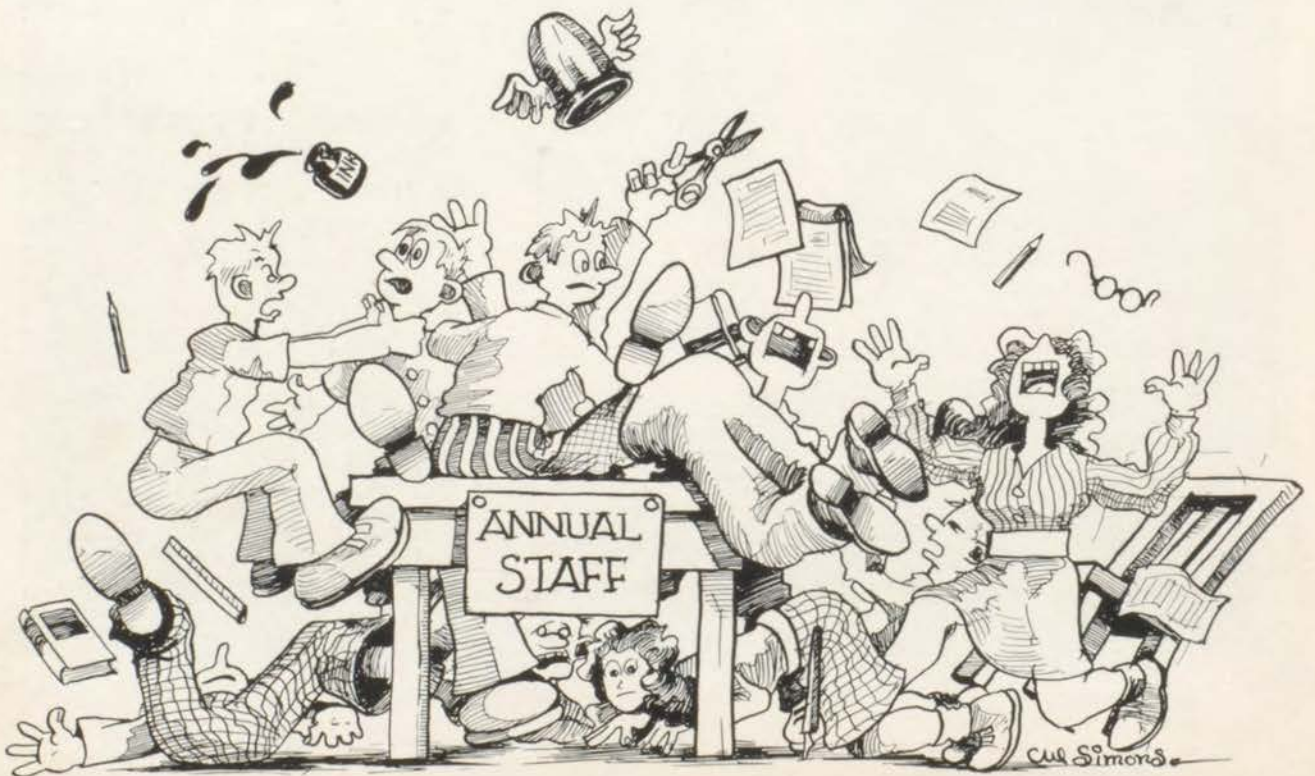

The Vikings, in playing an undefeated season, gave Northeast her second undefeated football team in its entire history, crushing all opposition with the exception of tying one game with Southwest. This game was played on a soggy field and the Indian touchdown came out of an interception. Northeast won its second straight victory over William Chrisman and also the second straight over Ward.

The Vikings used a powerful running attack to down Central, East, Paseo, Southeast, and Westport by at least a difference of two touchdowns.

Coach E. A. Markey won his second championship in his seven years of coaching at Northeast. He started the season with eight lettermen, including a backfield of speed and brains, combined with a strong line and built a winning team. The offense was built around the "T" and single wing formations.

The team had the best and fastest defensive line in the city, only 25 points being scored against them. While on

the offensive, using the four ace backfielders, Hull, Viers, Katzman, Dykal, and then Townsend, Northeast scored some 126 points in eight league and non-league games.

As his partner, Lyal Viers used his sturdy body and his swiveling hips to be chosen the most valuable football player of the Interscholastic League, and was therefore awarded the Nigro Notre Dame Trophy.

During and immediately after the season, Northeast lost two of its football heroes. Emil Dykal, full-back, joined the navy and Rex Hull, quarter-back, chose to enlist in the marines. Our best wishes go with these boys.

Northeast has six returning lettermen, and several big and powerful sophomores on which Coach will call to help defend our championship.

"Oh, just a little ruff on stuff; want to stop and buzz for a small interval of the clock?"

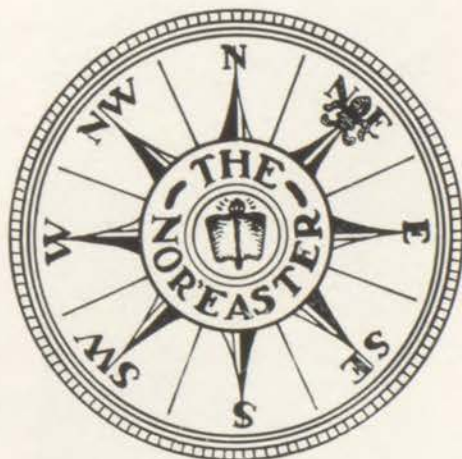
Sure, demons, what's steamin'?
